MUFON 1996 INTERNATIONAL UFO SYMPOSIUM

This year's Symposium was held in Greensboro, North Carolina at the Holiday Inn Four Seasons. The estimated attendance was more than 700.

The Saturday, July 6 session opened with a welcome to all and greetings from MUFON Director Walt Andrus. The first speaker was Capt. Kevin Randle, whose topic was "Does pop culture affect our views?" Briefly, he stated that science fiction literature and movies could influence our perception of abduction. Mr. Randle was followed by John S. Carpenter, who spoke concerning "The significance of multiple participant abductions." The significance of these cases occurs when attempting to apply traditional explanations and findings -- the data gathered do not support such theories.

Chris Styles from Canada then spoke on "Shag Harbor in perspective" about the site of the alleged UFO crash in Nova Scotia on October 4, 1967 and the result of the investigation into this alleged crash, which investigation is not yet concluded.

Jeffrey W. Sainio analyzed photographs in his presentation of "X - Files, Lies and Videotapes, a Photo Video Update." Vincent Di Pietro's "Evidence of life beyond the Mars Face" detailed and analyzed photos taken by "Viking" which suggested the possibility of life on Mars both in the past and at present.

Budd Hopkins appeared with "The sixth witness to the Linda Cortille abduction case" -- but this was a disappointment. There were no new elements presented; if there are new findings, "they will be in his next book." Linda Cortille was there in person, stating she "wished it had never happened to me," but acting like a prima donna.

Most interesting was a report by A.J. Gevaerd from Brazil on "The current Brazilian UFO flap." This could be a biggie! It may be more important than Roswell! On January 20, 1996, in Varginha, Minas Gerais state, the Brazilian Army allegedly captured two aliens alive. There were many witnesses to this capture.

Philip Mangle from England again presented "The Roswell film footage" of Ray Santilli fame; a probable hoax.

Dr. John Mack followed with "Studying intrusions from the subtle realm; how can we deepen our knowledge?" He stated that the aliens are trying to prevent us from destroying God's work. They conduct an outreach program for spiritually underdeveloped humans. Love is the core of the cosmos and its creative power. Our science became a form of religion.

The session on Sunday, July 7, opened with Carlos A. Guzman Rojas' "A chronology of UFOlogy in Mexico" spanning the era from colonial times to the present. He presented a dozen interesting cases, including teleportation.

John White's "UFO - search for an overview" warned of a danger from gods from outer space and beseeched us to worship only a true, universal God.

Antonio Huneus presented "A reference guide to foreign UFO documents" and how foreign governments react in issuing UFO-related information. Dozens of countries were analyzed, but his allotted time expired before he could finish. This was unfortunate, as this item was interesting and informative.

Dr. Roger Leir presented "Medical and surgical aspects of the UFO abduction phenomenon" and analyzed retrieved alien implants.

Because I had to catch a plane, I missed Dr. Bruce Maccabee's lecture on "Accelerations," but this seems to be self-evident.

The next Symposium is planned for Ann Arbor, Michigan. The Greensboro Symposium went well, but I am glad to be back home in Arizona.

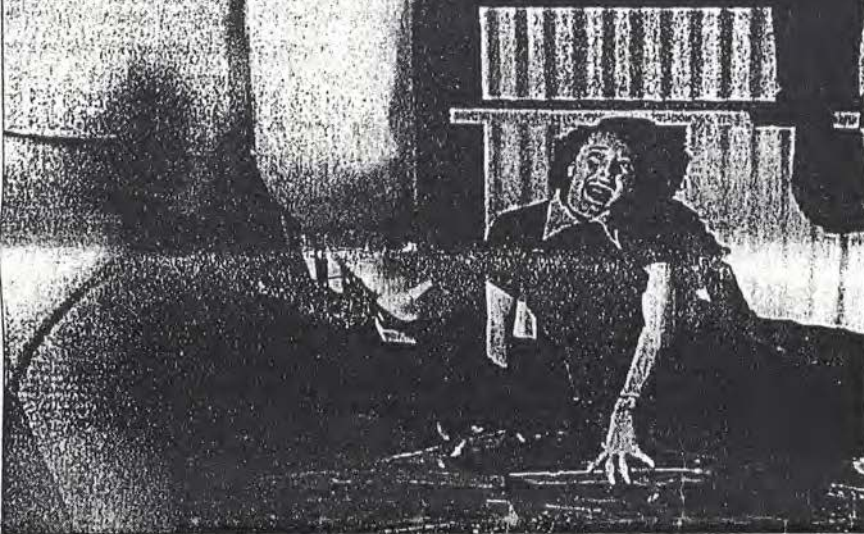

You can't prepare to fight an enemy you don't know

WASHINGTON — The aliens waged War of the Worlds in 1938 by radio. They invaded again in the 1953 film version. They're coming to destroy us this summer in *Independence Day*.

And the Earthlings still have no response plan?

That's right. There's no strategy. No scenario. No hot line.

Operation Kick-Some-Alien-Butt just doesn't exist.

"Our policy is, if someone has (an alien) sighting and they feel they are in imminent danger, they are to contact their local authorities — the sheriff, the police," says Air Force Lt. Col. Mack McLaurin, who handles UFO inquiries for the Pentagon.

In other words, if, as in *Independence Day*, someone were to observe intergalactic battleships raining fireballs onto the White House and Capitol, causing them to vaporize, the proper response would be ... to call the D.C. cops.

To true believers, this might seem a cavalier

response. Our federal government — which still stockpiles the helium it would need to wage blimp warfare — has absolutely no strategy to prevent invading aliens from slicing up our cities like so many Thanksgiving turkeys.

No plan, says the White House. No plan, says the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

No plan, says the Secret Service.

No plan, says McLaurin — at least not since 1969, when the Air Force scrapped Project Blue Book, its official UFO response program. "How can we develop a plan to guard against something we can't even prove exists?"

Today, inquiring minds must go all the way to California for an answer of any type, to The Planetary Society that cosmologist Carl Sagan founded in Pasadena. Thomas McDonough, who directs the society's Search for Extra-Terrestrial Intelligence (SETI) project, says there is no plan

"anywhere in the world to deal with invasion by aliens." Why? Because aliens won't just drop in. They'll call first.

"It's so much easier to send information than schlep around the galaxy in a ship that uses more energy than our entire civilization," says McDonough.

With that in mind, there are scientists all around the country who spend their days scanning space for alien radio signals. And when The Call finally comes, they have a nine-step protocol for answering it.

It's the "Declaration of Principles Concerning Activities Following the Detection of Extraterrestrial Intelligence," and it's three pages long.

Here's the condensed version:

► Confirm, confirm, confirm. Don't announce an alien contact until you're sure it's not a stray satellite feed from Home Shopping Network.

► Call the United Nations, which has an Office for Outer Space Affairs based in Vienna, Austria.

Let's hope that office gets back to the aliens more efficiently than they got back to USA TODAY — it took two phone messages, two faxes and three e-mails to get this response, from a Dr. Hans Haubold:

"The United Nations Office of Outer Space Affairs (UN OOSA) is not involved in any effort to address the topics of Search for Extraterrestrial Intelligence (SETI), UFOs or alien invasions. None of the 185 member states of the United Nations have addressed the above topics within the deliberations of the United Nations General Assembly."

(That's UN-speak for: No plan.)

► Don't call back. Any alien contact, the protocol instructs, is a matter for "international consultations." The idea here is to make sure an excitable scientist doesn't run off and make a bad first impression.

All in all, a pretty reasonable set of instructions.

But what if the aliens decide not to call? What if they just show up, itching for a fight, like some belligerent drunk crashing a party?

No plan.

Scientist John Pike really doesn't think an *Independence Day*-style invasion is in the stars: "The odds are pretty slim of somebody building a starship simply for the purpose of coming here and blowing up the White House. I think the space people have better things to do."

But if aliens did choose to invade, "There's just no way of meaningfully anticipating what we'd be faced with," says Pike, director of space policy at the Federation of American Scientists. "Are we dealing with deathstars or battlestars? Do they have cloaking devices? Do they want to eat us? Are they pod people? The number of scenarios you'd have to plan for is close to infinite."

As a practical matter, he adds, the U.S. military could retarget its missiles toward incoming spacecraft, but that probably wouldn't work, leaving the only invasion response a global cry of "uncle."

"Apart from pre-emptive surrender, there probably wouldn't be too much you could do."

Political leaders and space invaders

Official Washington may have no response plan in the event of an alien invasion, but that doesn't mean some political leaders haven't envisioned an invasion.

On Dec. 4, 1985, in an address to the students and faculty at Fallston (Md.) High School, then-President Reagan spoke of a summit meeting discussion with then-Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev.

"I couldn't help but say to him (to) just think how easy his task and mine might be in these meetings ... If suddenly there was a threat to this world from some other species, from another planet, outside the universe," Reagan said. "We'd forget all the little local differences that we have between our countries, and we would find out, once and for all, that we really are all human beings here on this Earth together."

Meteorite may hold proof of life on Mars

'Startling discovery' of organic molecules

In what some scientists say may be the most spectacular discovery since humans first gazed skyward at other worlds in our solar system, NASA and Stanford University researchers say they have found evidence that life may have existed on ancient Mars.

The researchers have identified organic compounds and certain minerals that they conclude "are evidence for primitive life on early Mars" in a meteor that fell to Earth from the "Red Planet."

"This could be answering the question everyone's been asking since they first saw the planet Mars," UCLA planetary scientist David Paige said. "Could there be life there?"

"If they are right, it's one of the most important discoveries of the 20th century," said Bob Gregory, a geologist at Southern Methodist University. "Mankind has been looking for evidence of life someplace besides Earth for forever."

The discovery of the first organic molecules ever seen in a Martian rock is being hailed as startling and compelling evidence that at least microbial life existed on Mars long ago, when the planet was warmer and wetter. The molecules found in the rock, which left Mars about 15 million years ago, are being described as the fossil trace of past biological activity.

In a statement issued Tuesday, as unofficial word of the discovery spread, NASA Administrator Daniel Goldin confirmed that scientists had "made a startling discovery that points to the possibility that a primitive form of microscopic life may have existed on Mars more than 3 billion years ago."

A detailed description of the research, conducted at the Johnson Space Center in Houston, is to be given at a NASA news conference today in Washington. The journal *Science* is publishing a full report on the work in its Aug. 16 issue.

A draft of the *Science* paper, written by a team led by David S. McKay of the Johnson Space Center, identified the telltale compounds as polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons, called PAHs, which often have biological origins and are associated with coal and diesel exhaust, and the minerals magnetite and iron sulfide, both of which are related to bacterial action on Earth. In addition, they found some carbonate globules that are similar in texture and size to materials produced by bacteria on Earth.

These PAH molecules are common on Earth, and many of them have biological origins related to bacteria. They are abundant, for example, in ancient sedimentary rocks, coal and petroleum.

The team found microscopic "ovoid and elongated forms" in the meteorite that resemble some bacterial fossils in rocks from Italy, except that the ones in the meteorite are less than one-tenth the size of the earthly microfossils.

"The PAHs, the carbonate globules and their associated secondary mineral phases and textures could thus be fossil remains of a past Martian biota," the researchers concluded.

Although the authors of the paper were under orders from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration not to talk before the news conference, scientists familiar with the research spoke in unusually enthusiastic terms about the work.

One scientist called the results "unequivocal." Another said it was one of the most stunning discoveries in the solar system in recent decades. But they cautioned that it would take more research to assess the full implications of the discovery for the longtime quest for extraterrestrial life.

David C. Black, director of the Lunar and Planetary Institute in Houston, praised the research as being "very, very cautious" work that would not have been possible two or three years ago, before new analytical instruments for electron microscopy were available.

"The signs are all consistent with biological activity," he said.

Reservations about the interpretation of the discovery were expressed by Jack D. Farmer, a geologist and paleobiologist at the Ames Research Center in Mountain View, Calif.

"It gives us a lot of compelling reasons to go back to Mars," he said. "But it doesn't tell us anything definite about life. It's interesting, but not convincing."

Author-scientist Carl Sagan of Cornell University, who has studied and written for 40 years on the importance of such a discovery, said, "If it is truly a microfossil from ancient Martian history, it is a transforming discovery in the history of science. Not just that, but it provides a profound perspective on our place in the universe."

The only way to confirm the discovery, according to Sagan and others, is to go to Mars.

NASA plans to launch two Mars missions this year: Mars Global Surveyor in November and Mars Pathfinder in December.

A planetary scientist who heads one experiment scheduled to be launched toward Mars this fall, Phil Christensen at Arizona State University, predicted, "People are going

to remain pretty skeptical about this.

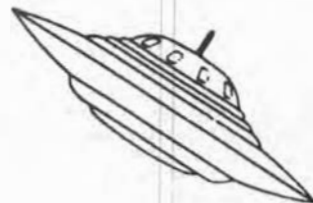
"Even in Earth rocks, identifying fossils that old is pretty tricky."

Tim Swindle, a planetary scientist at the University of Arizona, has examined samples of the Allan Hills meteorite, which was found in Antarctica in 1984. He said the chain of evidence is strong that identifies the rock as coming from Mars.

"You could take all the rocks from Mars together, and they would fit in your desk drawer," Christensen said. "To think that one would have significant signs of life in it is mind-boggling. If it turns out to be true, it's beyond anyone's wildest dreams to find fossil life from Mars here on Earth."

Because of its possible scientific and philosophical ramifications, Goldin briefed President Clinton and Vice President Al Gore last week about the discovery. They were reported to be "excited" about the research.

The meteorite bearing the organic molecules is one of only 12 identified as having come from Mars.

BEYOND A REASONABLE DOUBT: PROOF OF EXTRATERRESTRIAL CONTACT

Peter Gersten was a criminal defense trial attorney dealing mostly in homicide cases in New York before moving to Scottsdale. He also represented UFO organizations in lawsuits against the CIA and NSA (National Security Agency) for classified UFO documents. In 1977 he brought suit against the CIA in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia on behalf of Ground Saucer Watch, an Arizona-based UFO organization, pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act. Pursuant to this lawsuit, in 1979 the CIA released over 900 pages of documents relating to the UFO phenomenon.

Mr. Gersten formed his own organization, Citizens Against UFO Secrecy (CAUS), and brought suit in 1980 in the same District Court against the NSA for the release of 135 UFO-related documents which the NSA had refused to release. This lawsuit was dismissed by a Judge who felt "the need for secrecy far outweighed the public's right to know." Mr. Gersten has also represented Betty Cash and Vicky Landrum in their lawsuit against the Air Force.

He has written a fictionalized UFO story based upon his experiences in the past and in the future.

Mr. Gersten will present a three-part program on the following topics:

1. My story, the Ultimate Secret
2. Status and Strategy of FOIA Lawsuits
3. Destination Moon Project
