Hundreds of UFO enthusiasts sighted in Ports.

PORTSMOUTH — Peter Geremia doesn't deny that there are some "kooks" involved in the UFO arena, but as head of a statewide UFO organization, Geremia says he can attest to the opposite as well.

"I'm not saying we don't have our share of kooks," says Geremia, director of New Hampshire's Mutual UFO Network which held its annual conference for about 400 attendees in Portsmouth Sunday.

"But you have kooks involved in all subjects... and I dare say in the last 10 years we've had more good, qualified people become involved... it's been a quantum leap," he said.

Geremia cited individuals such as Dr. John Mack, a Harvard University psychiatry professor, and Dr. Steven Greer, a North Carolina physician, as examples of people who have lent credibility to the field.

Both spoke during the conference Sunday at Yoken's Restaurant as people from as far away as Florida and Canada — some who have witnessed UFOs, some who haven't — crowded in to share information.

Geremia, who said he has not personally witnessed a UFO sighting, defended the group in light of comments by famed UFO abductee Betty Hill of Exeter upon her "retirement" from the UFO business at last year's conference.

When asked the reason for her retirement, Mrs. Hill, who claims to

Tales of alien abduction

400 UFO believers hear stories from the outer limits

PORTSMOUTH — A Weare woman stood in the foyer of the Yoken's Restaurant conference center yesterday and fished a cigarette out of a crumpled pack of Cambridges. She lit it, and began to talk about the 15 to 20 times she has been abducted by space aliens.

"They're here and they're real," said the woman, who wore a name tag but asked not to be identified. It's hard enough living with the knowledge of being used as a guinea pig by beings not of this world without having your neighbors know, she said. "We might as well get used to it. They're real, oh my God are they real."

The woman was one of about 400 people who paid up to \$55 to attend the sec-

ond annual New Hampshire Mutual UFO Network conference yesterday in Portsmouth. The all-day conference was called "Presenting the Evidence" and featured several speakers, including a Harvard Medical School psychiatrist who has treated dozens of alien abduction cases, and Budd Hopkins, who lists among his accomplishments the creation of the Intruders Foundation, a support group for UFO abductees.

If the big brains and research were represented by the speakers on the stage, the personal stories of close, closer and closest encounters were in the audience. Every direction you turned someone was relating a tale of his or her

UFO activity has increased in the past few weeks

We should all be ready for increased activity

Nov. 27 1992

A man living in Goffstown came home after working the night shift. At 2:20 AM he decided to go outside on his porch. He observed two white objects moving together heading in a South Easterly direction. He ran into the house to waken his wife. On the way up a set of stairs he fell making a loud noise. This also woke his son. They all went outside to watch the objects as they moved off towards Manchester. The objects were described as egg shaped moving with the large end toward the front. This case is still under investigation and is not completed at this time.

Nov. 27 1992

At about 11:00 PM a man in Portsmouth was writing a letter in his third story apartment. After finishing his writing he turned off the TV set and turned off the lights. At exactly that instant he heard a machinery grinding sound. He looked in the direction of the sound and saw a large set of brilliant white and red lights moving slowly over the apartment building. At that instant the sound stopped. The trapezoid shaped object could be clearly seen silhouetted against the lighter sky. It is estimated at about 50 feet wide and 60 feet long. The object had a blinking or pulsating red light in the center of body. The object was about 15 feet from the witness and about 15 feet over the roof of the apartment. It slowly glided out of view. This man is a long time resident of Portsmouth and very familiar with the aircraft in the area including the military planes from Pease AFB and the presidential helicopters often seen in the area. He is positive what he saw was not a conventional aircraft. This case is still under investigation and is not completed at this time. An interesting side story to this case is at about the time of his sighting the man's Son who was staying at a residence not far from the apartment had a strong feeling his Father was calling him.

Dec. 8 1992

A woman in Campton was called to the window of her home by her 15 year old daughter to see a UFO. Time was 11:10 PM. They saw blue and white lights in the South Eastern sky. Every once in a while they saw a red light. The lights remained at the same distance but did move up and down. Her husband also saw the lights. She watched until 12:20 AM and then went to sleep. Her husband got up at 3:00 AM and the lights were gone. The next night the same pattern of lights were seen but further away. The entire pattern of lights pulsated. She could make out a "V" shaped when the lights were dimmed.

Dec. 2 1992

A man in Sidney Me. video taped two UFOs as they darted across the sky at high speeds. Others also reported the lights at about 9:30 PM. Maine state director for Mufon Bob Mac Kenna made contact with the individual who shot the video and will keep us informed.
