FLYING OBJECT SHOW CAPTIVATES AIRLINER CREW--Five crew members of a Canadian Pacific Airline jet passenger plane flying from Lima, Peru to Mexico City saw a UFO about 2 a.m. on December 30, 1966 while flying at 35,000 feet off the coast of Peru, just south of the equator. The passengers were all asleep. The skipper, Capt. Robert Millbank said he saw two lights on the horizon to the left of the DC-8's nose. "They were twinkling with the refraction of the atmosphere and at first I thought they might be stars. But there shouldn't be two stars together. As I watched, the two lights were getting farther apart and moving toward us. If it had been a plane, I thought, the lights might have been red and white or red and green, but they were both white." The skipper said he then saw one of the lights pulsating, indicating it was changing in intensity. "Then I saw two beams of lights coming from the lights and shining upwards in a V-shape," he said. "Then the two lights appeared to be descending and levelled off at our aircraft." Millbank reported that his second officer, John Dennis Dahl, and the other crew members began watching at this point. The skipper said the object got bigger all the time and at one point shot out a trail of sparks like a rocket. Millbank said he tried hard to believe the object was an aircraft or a satellite re-entering the atmosphere, but it was pretty obvious it wasn't. "Then it seemed to be getting closer and we could see a string of lights in between the two white lights," Millbank said. "It then levelled off at our left wing tip and, in the full moon, we could see a shape between the two lights which appeared thicker in the middle. It stayed there for a couple minutes and then disappeared behind the aircraft." Millbank gave a radio report from the aircraft on the sighting and filed a written report to aeronautical authorities in Mexico City shortly after landing. Millbank said he didn't believe in flying objects. However, he said what he saw was a strange phenomenon that could be what people commonly call a UFO. Other members of the crew were navigator Mike Mole, Purser Joseph Lugs and pilot trainee Wolfgang Poepperi.

STRANGE SPIRES SIGHTED ON MOON--Strange spires--never seen before--showed up November 22 on a photograph of the moon taken by the Boeing Lunar Orbiter 2. A National Aeronautics and Space Administration spokesman said the area (750 by 550 feet) had six protuberances. The largest appeared to be 40-75 feet high and about 50 feet wide at the base. At Caltech's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, California, a spokesman said: "One looks like the George Washington Monument. Some of the smaller ones look like upside down ice cream cones." The unusual spires appear on a photograph of the fourth of 13 potential landing sites for American astronauts traveling to the moon. If not formed by natural causes, then why were these odd structures thrust high above the moon's cratered surface? Boeing, the builder in Seattle of Lunar Orbiter, said it could not comment. The National Aeronautics and Space Administration said it would not comment on what the unexpected pinnacles may portend. NASA later released to Sen Warren G. Magnuson (Dem. Washington) what was described as a "minimal description" of what can be seen in one of the

lunar photos. A spokesman at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, California said: "There are small white dots which cast rather lengthy shadows. In one photo frame there is this one, very tall, pinnacle and four shorter ones. They appear almost like an antenna array." If they are indeed antenna towers, the spires would appear to be an indication that some intelligence has been or is at work on the barren lunar surface. It is beyond human comprehension that any life could exist on the rugged surface of the moon, devoid of water or a breathable atmosphere as we know them on earth. And yet there has been speculation that living creatures may have existed on the earth satellite at one time, when it was more hospitable. The few who have believed there might be life on the moon now have contended the moon creatures may have learned to survive in natural or artificial caverns deep within the moon.

THREE UFO'S SEEN RISING FROM FIELD--Last Christmas morning an Oregon couple reported they sighted three UFO's taking off from a field south of Monroe, Oregon. Clyde Brooks, 45, and his wife, Joyce, 36, told Benton County sheriff deputies the sighting occurred about 3 a.m. just south of Monroe, 20 miles south of Corvallis. Brooks said the sighting occurred when he and his wife were returning from exchanging gifts with relatives. His wife had become ill and they had stopped by the side of the road. Brooks said, "I was standing by my car and all at once there was a whoomf...a flash and three objects were going up from the field. The motors were deafening. I slammed my hands over my head...it hurt my ears. Then, it couldn't have taken two seconds, they circled around way up and lined up in a row and the sound stopped and they just stayed there...We didn't know what to do so we came home and woke up our kids and made them go out and look and they saw them (the objects) up in the sky just standing or hovering. 'What is it? What is it?' they asked me. I didn't tell anyone about it because people would think I'm crazy. I thought I'd better tell someone so I got ahold of the sheriff's office." Brooks said all four of his children saw the objects. They are Ronald, 19, Barbara, 15, Donald, 14, and Gary, 13. The couple described the objects as no bigger than a passenger car in size when they took off in a reddish-orange flame. Once they were in the sky they could only be described as objects. Brooks said he couldn't describe the objects better when they were close because of holding his hands over his ears from the sound and the bright light. He said he felt no heat from the blast off but its force threw him back on the trunk of his car.

FARMER OBSERVES FLYING OBJECT--John Nelson, who farms on the west side of Lake Sarah southwest of Garvin, Minnesota, no longer is a skeptic that he once was about UFO's. While plowing at 2 a.m., November 25, he was frightened by a mysterious, lighted disc-shaped object about 40 feet in diameter and 8-10 feet thick, as it hovered over the corn stalks in back of him. It made an eerie noise like the whirling wind, faint white light beamed down over the field in back of him about 200 yards away, and then headed off to the east and Nelson lost sight of it. Some minutes later, the weird UFO came back again, from the west. It hovered over the corn stalks, then lifted straight up and once again swirled off high toward the east in a red glow.

TV SHOW ENDS, REALISM BEGINS--It could have been coincidence that 9-year-old Billy Waldman spotted the UFO just as the TV program, "Lost In Space," was drawing to a close on December 28--but Billy and his mother aren't so sure about that. "Billy yelled and drew my attention to this brilliant object which was hovering right outside our front window,"

Mrs. Georgette Waldman said. "It was only visible for a few seconds but that was long enough to convince me that there are such things as flying objects." Mrs. Waldman placed the sighting of the UFO at about 7:45 pm, half-way through "Lost in Space." She agreed with Billy's description of the UFO as being "about 20 feet across, circular, and flashing red, yellow and orange lights on and off. It hovered outside our window then shot up and away into the sky at tremendous speed," Billy said. "Mrs. Reynolds, a neighbor, saw the thing at this time and she was really scared." "As it climbed, it seemed that small pieces broke off and the whole object seemed to smoke," added Mrs. Waldman, 40. "During the time the thing was visible our TV picture was distorted, as if by static."

BRAZILIANS 'BELIEVE' IN UFO's--"There is no flying object controversy in my country," said Brazil's top UFO investigator Dr. Olavo Fontes in an exclusive interview in New York in November. "Too many people--thousands --have seen these objects at close range in Brazil over the past 16 years And there have been many dramatic incidents, including a number of brief landings, power failures directly attributable to the presence of these objects, and cases in which people have had to be hospitalized after suffering burns and other injuries apparently caused by these things." A prominent physician in Rio de Janeiro, Dr. Fontes is a professor at the National School of Medicine and an officer in leading societies. For the past 12 years, he has studied the widespread reports of UFO's in Brazil and has personally investigated over 300 cases. He has just concluded a visit to the United States where he conferred with leading scientists and government officials concerned with American UFO investigations. He was invited to the U.S. to participate in closed discussions designed to establish closer cooperation between interested members of the world's scientific community to study the UFO phenomenon on a global scale. The initial meetings were held in Chicago under a cloak of secrecy. Dr. Fontes is particularly concerned with the reports of UFO's over military bases, power plants, reservoirs, and fresh water sources. "These objects, he said grimly, "have systematically visited and perhaps examined three areas most vital to our civilization--our water supplies, our power systems, and our military resources. During one flurry of sightings in Brazil, they appeared almost simultaneously over 33 important centers of communication, railroad junctures and key highways." He refuses to speculate on the possible origin of the flying objects but he suggests that the present buildup of reports indicates that they may be nearing their ultimate goal...contact. "We may have all the answers within the next three years," he says.

HE'S NOT LAUGHING AT UFO STORIES NOW!--Robert Blaine of Villard, Minnesota is a believer now. It's all the result of a wierd experience the Villard superintendent of schools went through December 9 while on his way to Kensington to attend the Villard-Kensington game. If I hadn't had people with me who also saw what happened, I don't think I would have said a word to anyone," Blaine said. "I'll tell you we were pretty well shock up." Riding with Blaine in his car were Mrs. James Galvin, Billy Smith, 13, and three of Mr. Blaine's children, Jerry, 11, Tom, 10, and Andre, 7. About two miles east of Farwell on highway 55 around 7:30 pm, the motor of the Blaine car suddenly died and his lights went out. Suddenly to his left Blaine said he saw an orange flash about the level of the hood and so close to the car he said "I swear I could have reached out and touched it." Then he also saw tiny beads of lights cross in front of the windshield. Mrs. Galvin said she also saw an orange and red flash go by the drivers side of the car about the level of the window.

In darkness, Blaine coasted the car for a short distance on the highway without lights. Then, without warning, the car engine started again and the lights came back on. "I thought at first when the car engine died that something was wrong with the engine and that we'd have to hike to Farwell for help, and it was cold outside. But then when the engine started up again, I was really startled. We didn't stop to see what happened to that light or what it was or where it was going. When that car engine kicked in again, my first thought was to get out of there and keep moving. Now that I think back about it, I should have been more curious, but it happened so quickly that I obeyed my first instincts. I don't mind telling you we were pretty shook up when we got to the game."

MORE UFO'S SPOTTED NEAR SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA--A group of Lemon Grove residents, including a non-believer, reported sighting UFO's between 8:30 and 9 p.m. on December 19. William H. Gilchrist, who is a pilot, said he has been skeptical of these objects for several years, but admitted seeing the bright orange symmetrically-shaped objects. "I don't want to be typed as a screwball," Gilchrist said, "but I can't discount what I saw. It's beyond my knowledge. There were no sounds, no running lights or beacons like on an airplane." Mariano Salcedo was the first to report the objects. He and nine other persons witnessed three glowing spheres. Donald R. Carr, a senior mechanical engineer said he spotted 15 UFO's. "I'm satisfied that they are some type of intelligently controlled vehicles," Carr said. "I think they are extraterrestrial." Carr said the objects he saw could not have been balloons. He said the objects were a brilliant orange color. One of the objects, spotted at 9 p.m., "appeared as an elliptical, sharply defined shape about 1/4-inch apparent length through binoculars." He said the object was surrounded by an orange aura about four times the size of the object. "It seemed to repeatedly divide into two objects," he said. After being visible for about five minutes the object "dropped three sparks or spheres of yellow-orange light, flickered, and disappeared about 10 degrees north of zenith." Carr said another object appeared about 11:10 p.m. The brilliant orange faded to yellow and divided into two distinct objects, Carr said. It became almost invisible through Carr's 16 X 50 binoculars. Then, Carr said, it suddenly reversed direction, became bright yellow, accelerated to meteoric velocity, and disappeared. It was visible for about three minutes, he said.

UFO'S MAY BE REALITY, IOWA PROFESSOR ASSERTS--A university professor called on fellow educators to face the possibility that flying objects are real and they will have to be explaining them in the classrooms. Dr. D. H. Bragg, associate professor of education at Drake University, said his purpose is "to alert the teaching profession to the fact that there is a strong possibility that the flying object controversy is about to enter the classroom as a social, scientific, and perhaps political and cultural problem of major implications in our world." Writing in the current edition of Midland Schools, official publication of the Iowa State Education Association, Bragg noted that the Air Force has awarded a \$300,000 contract to the University of Colorado to conduct a study of unidentified flying objects. Bragg said some experts have presented "what appears to be documentary and convincing evidence" that flying objects are real and represent the work of intelligent beings from outer space. If the Colorado study should support this theory, Bragg said, "the possibilities for future space travel and contact with superior civilizations become no longer science fiction, but head-spinning realities."

UFO ACTIVITY NEAR NAVAL AIR STATION--Flying objects were sighted in Horsham Township, Pennsylvania near the Willow Grove Naval Air Station and along Route 202 in Doylestown, Pennsylvania on November 20. The first was seen at 10:45 a.m.; the second about midnight. In Horsham the disc was seen slightly above the trees near the Willow Grove Naval Air Station. Seen through the windows of a house, the disc was gone by the time the observers got outside. It was described as white, or silver, with the morning sun glinting on it. Because of the distance, the disc looked only six inches high as it hovered slightly on edge above the woods. The UFO seen in Doylestown was described as the size of a huge full moon, and seen from behind the wheel of a car, the object was white when seen in Doylestown, but turned "orange in color, like the kind you see on hot summer nights" when it got farther away. There was no full moon at the time. The person who saw the object was driving alone on Route 202 from Doylestown and said the disc was moving ahead of the car, at about the same speed, 40 miles per hour, and seemed headed toward Lansdale. "It looked like a full moon with the top of it covered by a cloud."

KANSAS COUPLE RELATES SEEING UFO NEAR GROUND--A Rooks County, Kansas couple, Mr. and Mrs. Ed Riffel were returning to their home northeast of Stockton, Kansas about 10:15 p.m. November 15. When the Riffel's were about five miles north and a half-mile east of Stockton, they saw lights which appeared to be not too far distant. At first the couple thought the lights were in the school house and thought some sort of a meeting was being conducted. But they soon discovered their error. The school house was dark and the lights appeared nearer than they had thought. The couple related seeing two rows of windows with five windows in each row and they could see two sides of the object, which looked as if it might be 20 feet off the ground. The couple related that moments later the object appeared to have six sides. There was a flashing light on top and on takeoff, two other lights appeared. After the object started moving, it crossed the road in front of the Riffel car but neither Mr. or Mrs. Riffel could say how close it was, although they said it didn't appear to be very far and didn't look as if it were more than 10 feet above the ground. After recovering from a slight shock, the couple decided to follow the object. Mr. Riffel said he was traveling about 75 miles per hour but that the UFO was greatly outdistancing him and it was soon out of sight. Mr. Riffel says he wishes now that he had got out of the car and listened to see if he could hear a noise, but that he didn't think of it at the time. He also has a feeling now that the wire fence on his place which he thought hunters had cut down may have been done by the UFO plowing through it as there were certain peculiarities and he never could quite figure out why hunters would cut out so much of it.

'FIREBALLS' REPORTED IN ALASKA SKIES--About four persons in the Palmer and Anchorage, Alaska areas reported seeing a huge fireball in the sky near midnight on December 11. A party told state police in Anchorage that the "fireball" appeared to fall in the Scenic Park area near the mountains. Reports from Palmer said the ball was seen over the Lazy Mountain and Knik Glacier areas southwest of Palmer. On the following night, Mrs. Hubert Bruton said that a large "fireball" chased her along the Palmer highway. Mrs. Bruton described the object as "a big old orange ball." She first caught sight of it, she said, in the rear view mirror of her car as she was going home about 11:45 p.m. All of a sudden the object appeared, she said, and after about 30 seconds it was gone. Her immediate reaction was one of fright. She said the thought flashed across her mind; "If I don't get out of here, it's going to catch up with me. That's all I can tell

you. I was scared stiff," she said. In reviewing the incident, Mrs. Bruton said the UFO appeared to be about three or four feet in diameter. It hung on the road at about headlight level at an estimated 100 feet behind her. It was "just a big ball of fire" and much "too vivid" to have been merely a reflection, Mrs. Bruton said. The object left a vivid impression on Mrs. Bruton's mind. When she got home, she sat in her car honking her horn until her two boys came out to escort her into the house. "They both laughed as boys 16 and 17 will do. They both thought I was crazy," she said.

MORE FLYING OBJECTS REPORTED OVER OKLAHOMA CITY--On the night of October 26, Oklahoma had a sudden upsurge of UFO activity, with the majority of the sightings reported in the Oklahoma City area. At about dusk, Don Hinshaw and Ken Cole sighted several objects. Cole said at first they could see two objects, but a minute or so later they saw three more, making the total five. The estimated altitude was about 1000 feet as they turned southward toward the city of Moore. At 6:30 p.m., Mrs. Linda Gerstner who lives in Moore sighted the UFO's. She said the objects circled Moore and then headed toward Del City to the northeast of her position. Mrs. Gerstner relates that there were six objects and that they were about the size of a dime at arms length. Mrs. Gerstner and her neighbors watched the objects as they changed formation from a straight line to a V formation, and then back to a straight line formation. At 6:40 p.m., Mary Hassell of Del City said she saw the six bright objects flying in the vicinity of southern Del City, coming from the direction of Moore. She described the UFO's as being six white disc-shaped objects with a bright light that changed from red to blue-green. The Hassell family and neighbors watched the six objects for approximately 25 minutes as they flew back and forth over Tinker Air Force Base, and Will Rogers Airport.

AERIAL PHENOMENA OVER EAST AND NORTHEAST STATES--(Publication of this report was delayed for lack of printing space)--Residents of northeastern United States set police switchboards abuzz on April 22, 1966 with reports of mysterious flying objects. The UFO's were first sighted at 7:10 p.m. in a vast area stretching across New York state to Burlington, Vermont and as far east as Portsmouth, New Hampshire. Westover Air Force Base in Chicopee, Massachusetts told police that it tracked an object or objects on radar until they disappeared. Curtis L. Hemenway, director of the Dudley Observatory in Albany, New York said he thought the objects were meteors. Hemenway admitted, however, "If I was an astronomer on Mars when Mariner IV went by and someone called me to ask about it, I'd probably have given the same line." Around 7:30 p.m. another series of telephone calls were received by the news medias. Ray Beauchemin of Burlington, Vermont said he was outside playing basketball with his son when he heard a sizzling sound like a blow torch. He said he looked up and saw an object "right over the trees." Gary Turnbaugh of the same city said "an egg-shaped object flew right over the backyard. Also reporting they saw a weird object were the sheriff and district attorney of Essex County, New York. More reports came in at 7:45 p.m. and again at 8:45 p.m. State Police at Malone and Watertown, New York reported sighting a UFO at 9:30 p.m. A flying object with orange and red blinker lights was seen by a Skerry, New York woman over her house at 3:05 a.m. the following morning. Mrs. Nelson Sancomb said she was awakened by a whirring sound and when she looked out of the window she saw the lights between 50 and 100 feet over her house. "It sounded like the whirring of a blow torch," she said. Five persons in Watertown, New York reported they sighted four

flying objects, with flashing lights, traveling in pairs and moving vertically and horizontally at 4 a.m. the same morning. One woman said she had seen an airplane circling the objects.

Two days later, on April 25, a huge glowing object approached the east coast of the United States on an east to west course, proceeded inland to a point above northwest Maryland, made a sharp turn to the right and followed a north-northeast course into Southeastern Canada, then made another turn to the right and was last seen heading toward the Atlantic Ocean. The object was seen by hundreds-of-thousands of people, and was photographed by several of the witnesses. Within an hour of the spectacular display, astronomers throughout the eastern U.S. proclaimed--without conducting an investigation--that the object was a giant meteor. The flight path of the object as described above was obtained from eyewitness accounts as the result of a three month investigation by NICAP/Seattle. The states of New York and Pennsylvania both reported UFO sightings before and after the flight of the larger object. A group of Junior High School students at Clarion, Pennsylvania said they saw a large object in the sky which stopped in flight and then took off at a great speed. Green and blue lights were seen on the UFO. At 7:30 p.m., another flying object was seen over Wyalusing, Pennsylvania. About the same time, Mrs. Gladys Stayer and Mrs. Keith Schroll were driving along Route 6 headed toward Roulette, Pennsylvania when they saw "a cone-shaped object" which was picked up by the car's headlights. Mrs. Stayer said that they were about three miles from Port Allegany at the time. The UFO seemed to have sparks coming out of its smaller end, and when her headlights struck it, "It took off up the valley" and vanished. Later, Mr. and Mrs. Clifford Bidwell saw a similar object in Port Allegany.

At 8:30 p.m., a cigar-shaped object with pulsating red lights at each end was sighted about five feet above a house at Nazareth, Pennsylvania. It appeared to be about 60 feet long and had three "legs" on the bottom. The surface of the UFO looked like green graft paper. It made no sound as it moved towards the Cherry Hill power station. A white disc-shaped object with a red glow around the edge and lights on the sides was sighted over White City, Pennsylvania at 9:15 p.m. A truck driver said he saw another object in the sky about 5 a.m. over Rochester, New York. William Shannon said he thought he was at first seeing an optical illusion, but then the object seemed to change from the appearance of a "wisp of cloud" to something more solid. It became darker gray, and disappeared into clouds. Philip W. Budane, chairman of the Broome County, New York Astronomical Society said he and two other members of the society saw six UFO's "in a kind of formation" over Chenango, New York at about 10:55 p.m. Mr. Budane described the sighting of the six objects as "very unusual. They came out of the southwest. They were bluish in color, glowed faintly and were very diffused-looking. You could see spaces between them. They were going fast--no lights, no vapor trail, no sound."

BROTHERS SNAP PHOTOS OF MICHIGAN UFO--Two Mount Clemens, Michigan teen-age brothers observed and photographed a disc-shaped flying object which they said hovered for 10 minutes behind their home, within a mile of Selfridge Air Force Base on January 9. Dan Jaroslaw, 17, and his brother, Grant, 15, had photographs to support their report of a disc-shaped flying object, slightly domed at the top with what appears to be a slim mast at the rear. On January 16, the nation's leading civilian expert on UFO's said the polaroid photos are "strikingly similar" to other reports of strange objects he has investigated. The statement was made by Dr. J.

Allen Hynek. He added that "analysis (of the Macomb photos) so far does not show any indication of an obvious hoax. To the best of my recollection even the 'antenna' shown on the back has been previously reported, as has the tail structure.".....Other UFO photographs have recently been declared "authentic." The famous Rex Heflin pictures, taken near Santa Ana, California on August 3, 1965--and classified "as a photographic hoax on the basis of extensive photo analysis" by the Air Force have been reclassified by the Air Force as "not...a hoax." Also, the photograph taken by 15-year-old Stephen Pratt at Mosborough, England on February 25, 1962--showing three UFO's--has been declared by photographic experts as being genuine and untouched.

FLYING OBJECTS REPORTED OVER SOUTHERN TEXAS--Strange objects have been sighted in the Gulf Coast skies recently. Four men reported seeing a UFO that looked "like a big old cigar" as it drifted over La Porte, Texas on October 30. "It was so darn big, it looked like it could have been 10 feet in diameter and 150 feet long," said Roy Pentecost, 57. He said the object flew upright, or perpendicular to the ground. "It looked like a big old cigar up there with tapered fins at the bottom," Pentecost said. "It seemed like it was drifting along, kind of easy like," at about 15,000 feet, he said. He estimated the object's speed at 100 MPH. The men sighted the object shortly before 9 AM and watched it for about 20 minutes, with all of them viewing it through the 50-power binoculars. Pentecost said he notified Ellington Air Force base of the UFO. After he telephoned in the report, Pentecost said, a jet fighter came into view and appeared to be following the object's path. Wharton County, Texas has had more than their share of sightings. After taking his girl friend home on a recent Friday night, 17-year-old Bryan Ritz (of El Campo) decided to take a short cut back to town, until he saw the UFO. "I was about midway home when I first saw the glow. It was bright red, then it started glowing a bright amber, and before I knew it the thing was hovering above the ground. I guess that's when it really scared me," Ritz concluded, "because I turned and got off that road as quick as I could. Mark De Friend, who has seen the objects for several months, operates a small dairy farm 17 miles northwest of El Campo. According to De Friend, the objects are frequenting the Gulf-coast because of the vast stretch of plains and rural population. "I've seen the craft so much, I guess I watch for them now. I saw them on December 28 and 29 right after dark. Both nights they came out of the west and headed toward Houston...It's come as low as 500 feet but it still has no sound. All you can see is rotating lights, and a bright glow," he concluded. Al Wittig, a Wharton cattle rancher has also seen a UFO. He first saw an object on a hunting trip in Artesian Wells, a town about 260 miles northwest of El Campo. His first impression was that it was a meteor. "It was falling through the air like a meteor," said Wittig, "and then it stopped dead still. I grabbed my binoculars, but when I looked up, the darn thing was so bright it burned my eyes." Wittig said it appeared right after dark. "It had a strong blue-white glow, and a bright red rotating light. You know, you always read about these things and laugh," he concluded, "but let me twll you one thing, you sure as heck won't catch me laughing anymore."

UFO REPORT BEING CHECKED BY CONDON--Dr. Edward Condon, head of the government-financed scientific study of UFO's said he received a letter telling him when and where a flying object would land on earth. "I'm going to answer the letter and try and find out what the basis is for the man's prediction," Condon said.

BUILDINGS ON THE MOON?--Our "Ranger 7" took 4,320 pictures of the moon in the summer of 1964. Some of the pictures showed two large white objects which had never been seen before. Our "Ranger 8" sent back 7,000 pictures They showed "Moon Domes" which Harvard University told about in its magazine "Sky and Telescope." It reported that there were now some 200 of these domes. Some of the domes had been seen by astronomers in France and reported as far back as in 1930. In order for these domes to be seen from earth scientists say they would have to be 750 in diameter. The strange fact is that these domes moved from one place to another. They were explained away as being big volcanoes. If the volcanoes on the moon move around from place to place they are a lot different than the ones we have on our earth.
