

UFOs kidnap and burn victims in terror spree

It was 15 hours later.

His parents had worried and sent local police looking for him.

Incredibly, a doctor found a small black wound on Juan's left index finger.

Another Rosario man Angel German Morassi said he was attacked by a UFO while he was plowing some land on a farm he worked 60 miles north near Santa Fe.

Angel, 37, said he looked up and saw "a big light" coming toward him over the field.

The mysterious light stopped

overhead and slowly began to descend.

"I thought it was going to land on my head," said Angel.

The terrified farmer began to run across the field, but tripped falling on his face.

As he turned his head to look back, he said the light "emitted a fiery color," and at the same time he felt a burning pain on his back.

Incredibly, doctors found four circular burns on Morassi's back and another wound on his right forearm.

"He seems to be perfectly well and shows no disturbances that might lead us to think he is fabricating or lying," said Judge Ernesto Giacomini who questioned the farmer.
