

Many of our members and readers by now have heard or read about the SBI's exclusive investigation and documentation on a sighting which invloved six police officers in the Upper Penninsula of Michigan. Included in this month's issue of our Report is the entire accounting of the incident, in manuscript form, that I have written for Saga UFO Report magazine. The only thing which is omitted are the photographs inwhich Jim & I took while there, since Saga has them in their possession at the time of this printing.

Certain UFOlogists have recently stated, "why have these two hot shots gone to Michigan on a simple sighting?" That which is not realized by these so-called UFOlogists, who never leave their desks, is that this encounter was by far not simple, rather it involved many factors previously noted during UFO cases. Such as: multiple witnesses whereby triangulation was used to determine the UFO size; the witnesses being credible professionally trained observers; high speed pursuit from police vehicles; sighting took place in location of Great Lakes area; UFO last seen flying towards or proxsimity of military defense complex. Besides these factors, the UFO was observed for a hours length and many details of the UFO's movements and description were brought to light. As any "normal researcher" can denote, this encounter was more than just a nocturnal light in the sky. Hundreds of interested individual, organizations and media persons yearned for data concerning the event. ONLY the SBI responded in order to receive the facts and document the case for themselves; A LESSON THAT SHOULD BE HEEDED BY ALL BIG MOUTHED UFOLOGISTS WHO PERSIST ON RESEARCHING BY USE OF TELEPHONES AND LETTERS, INSTEAD OF GETTING OF THEIR FAT BUTTS AND SPENDING A LITTLE OF THE MONEY THEY RECEIVE FROM PROFITING FROM THEIR PROPAGANDERIZING ON THE PHENOMENA.

Police Officer David Marlin, 26, and Mark Hager, 22, are two of the six law enforcement officers who viewed an unidentified flying object at 1 a.m. on March 12, 1980. Until this time, both officers were skeptical of UFO while protecting their community in the small town of Gladstone, Michigan. Now, due to their encounter, their lives have been disrupted and altered.

The story unfolds after an anonymous female telephoned the Michigan State Police and reported a UFO hovering in the vicinity of N.15 street. Unable to handle their present work load, the troopers called the Gladstone police department and dispatched the call to them. In turn, Marlin and Hagen responded to the location. There they witnessed an object with red and green lights, and a brilliant white glowing light on its front.

Rationalizing between one another, each attempted to determine what they were viewing. By process of elimination, they came to the conclusion they were not looking at an airplane, although it was much larger than one. They also concluded that the object was not a helicopter, since both officers stepped outside their patrol car and heard absolutely no noise.

After observing the strange object for approximately 8 minutes, as it made several right angle turns and abrupt ascending and descending maneuvers, the two trained and experienced observers decided to pursue the object in order to get a better look at it. As they pursued the UFO, they radioed for assistance from the Delta County Sheriff Department in Escanaba.

The two sheriff's deputies, Max Streicher and Dave Huchstep, responded to their two brother officers call for assistance. They traveled in and out of narrow roads and main highways to reach the location the Gladstone police officers reported chasing the object.

In doing so, they traveled nearly 26 miles at high speeds, and at times observed the UFO themselves. They reported to see the UFO glowing orange; light orange as it moved zig-zagging across the sky and becoming more intensified as it increased in speed.

In the mean time, Marlin and Hager were still busy pursuing the object at speeds in excess of 100 m.p.h. In vain they they raced after the UFO for 15 miles, but the UFO out maneuvered and out speed them at each instance.

Communicating with each other by way of their police radios, both the Sheriff's deputies and the two Gladstone police officers converged at Highway M-35 north of Gladstone, where all four officers viewed the object move erratically back and forth across the clear night skies at tremendous speeds. After approximately 10 more minutes, the UFO moved further away from them in a westerly direction. At this point, the officers watched the object hover momentarily and then make a 90 degree right angle turn to the west and depart in the direction of K.I. Sawyer Air Force Base.

More than one hour after the sighting, the sheriff's deputies returned to their office and notified the sheriff of the incident. The sheriff, Michael LeMire, interrogated the officers and then had the deputies file official reports on the event. The two Gladstone officers returned to their station house also, however, by this time reports from residents and people from surrounding areas were pouring in. Both officers never did find time to write their reports to Larry Ketton, city manager. Instead, each answered hundreds of telephone calls for almost eight hours from interested parties such as: radio stations, ABC, CBS & NBC television networks, UFO organizations from around the world, and from citizens all over the U.S.A.

Included in these calls, was a call from our organization, The SBI. Being a newly incorporated UFO body, with over 1600 members in

the U.S. alone and the fact that 50% of our investigating body is comprised of personnel of law enforcement background, made this case even more interesting to us. Pete Mazzola, 35 and a police officer in New York City for the past 12 years, and Jim Fallow, 31, a former New Jersey police officer who is now self employed, who are the SBI's two International Directors, telephoned Mr. Ketton for the full story. Mr. Ketton explained, "Hundreds of calls have come in inquiring about the sighting, however, no one has appeared here as yet to document the case."

With this in mind, Mazzola and Fallow attempted to contact Field Investigators in the Detroit area to respond to what is known as the "upper penninsula." Unable to get anyone to respond due to the short notice, Mazzola and Fallow wasted little time in boarding the first plane out of New York to Michigan. Between four and five hours later, they arrived in Escanaba. After making a few calls, they learned most of the officers involved were either sleeping or not on duty for any comments. This enabled the two to do a preliminary investigation into the character background of each officer involved.

They separated and began interviewing townspeople and neighbors, in both Escanaba and Gladstone, who knew the officers personally. Meeting back at their motel room at a nearby Terrace Motor Inn, each had uncovered similar responses. Each officer involved was highly experienced in their profession, reliable, credible, honest and very responsible type individuals who do not fancy to exaggerating facts.

On the following morning, Thursday, March 13th, Mazzola and Fallow went to the Delta County Sheriff's office. They were given permission to interview the sheriff, the under-sheriff and the deputies involved. With this they interviewed the sheriff, who has held office for the past three years, first. The following is a brief synopsis from the taped interview.

Q: Did you personally see and interview both deputy Streicher and Huchstep on the morning of March 12th in reference to their UFO sighting?

A: Yes, I did.

Q: Were they both sober...not intoxicated?

A: Absolutely.

Q: Do you believe the two officers' story?

A: Yes, I do.

Q: Have either one of your deputies reported such an incident before?

A: No.

Q: Did you perform an investigation to delete or eliminate the possibility the UFO observed was in fact a conventional type craft?

A: The SAC (Strategic Air Command) base at K.I. Sawyer at Marquette was checked and they reported that they did not have anything incoming or out-going and wouldn't have until 6 a.m. in the morning. The DNR (Department of Natural Resources), who has aircraft available to them, stated, "they didn't have any aircraft in the area." I know there weren't any commercial aircraft in the area from our Delta County airport.

Q: Do you know if K.I. Sawyer AFB had a visual confirmation of the UFO on their radar screens?

A: I don't know if there was or wasn't.

After about an hour of questioning the sheriff, official reports from the two deputies were brought into the office and generously given for the SBI files. Along with the reports came deputy Streicher and he too was interviewed. Here are some excerpts from the deputy's taped conversation.

Q: According to the report you filed to the sheriff and the statements made to us by you, are you telling us the truth?

A: Yes Sir, I am.

Q: Do you have any objection to the SBI analyzing the stress in your voice, through a process known as PSE (psychological stress evaluator) analyzation, to determine if you are lying about the sighting?

A: None whatsoever.

Now about noon, Mazzola and Fillow receiving a clearance to interview Gladstone officers Marlin and Hager from the acting-chief-of-police, began their interrogation. Both officers, who were interviewed separately and then later together, were asked what each felt about all the interests being placed on the sighting from hundreds of concerned people around the world? Officer Hager replied, "I thought there were hundreds of these sightings a day, but apparently not, but maybe because there were 6 police officers involved the credibility was better." When officer Marlin was questioned about the size of the object, he commented, "He was not sure what shape it was, but he was convinced it was a UFO." Trying to get Marlin to elaborate more on this statement, he was asked, "How do you know it was a UFO?" Marlin replied, "It was larger than an airplane or helicopter and when it made a turn we could see the side of it and tell it wasn't an airplane or helicopter. It was hard to tell what shape it was, I hate to say it was a flying saucer, it appeared to be round."

During the continuance of the interview, Marlin enlightened the two SBI International Directors by explaining their high speed pursuit. He said, "When we first saw the object it was flying over our patrol car, and when it began to head away, the period it took us to cover a quarter of a mile the UFO moved so fast it was almost out of sight. We were both amazed, not scared, and while we pursued the object, we decided there was no way that anybody was going to convince us it was an airplane or helicopter. We didn't care if they called us crazy or what, it definitely was not one of those."

Officer Hager's statements coincided with his partner's telling of the story and added, "I didn't believe in UFO before this, but I

do now." Both of the officer's statements and sketches of the object were nearly identical in every respect. Both also believe the UFO had a bright white light near the front and two red lights—on each side—and a green light towards the rear. Each claimed that the red and green lights oscillated. At the end of the three hour interview, officer Hager commented, "I didn't expect all the hoopla and we'll both be glad when all the phone calls stop, we've spent all day yesterday on them talking to people." From the taped interview we have selected just some of the more important questions asked both officers and present them here for your knowledge. We begin first with officer Marlin's interview.

Q: Tell us what you saw?

A: When we responded to the call on North 15th Street, we (partner and self) looked in a southerly direction and from the South we could see a very large bright white light. It was moving in a northerly direction--it was coming right at us. And just before it got to us, it started a left banking turn. At that point, we shut off our patrol car and we got outside. When it got just over us, it...it started its turn...we listened to see if we could hear any sounds and there was absolutely no sound. The temperature was 4 degrees, the sky was crystal clear and there was no sound coming from it whatsoever. In its turn, we could see this bright light. It wasn't a beaming light, it was more like a glowing light. On the top of it there was a red light and on the bottom of it there was a red light, and towards the rear of it there was a green light. These lights appeared to be flashing or oscillating. The UFO turned to the West and went about a mile to where we call "the bluff" (hill) in two or three seconds. We pursued the object West on Highway M-35 about 1-2 miles out of the city limits and watched it hover in the sky for 8 minutes. We called the Escanaba Delta County Sheriff's office for one of there units to respond

to the scene to confirm our observation. They watched it with us for several minutes and then left to try to get closer to it by traveling in a westerly direction. As we watched, the UFO zig-zag across the sky. In doing so, my partner and I could see the white light, then the red light, and then the green light which made us think the object was spinning clockwise.

Q: When this object passed over your police car, could you ascertain a shape?

A: The only thing I could see, and it was for only a brief instance,... I could see some metal between the two red lights. I couldn't see anything in the front or rear of it, but it appeared to be a shiny metal type. I don't know what the shape was at all, but it appeared round from the way it banked its turns. It was larger than an airplane, there was no way a helicopter is that size.

Q: By your estimation, how close would you say the object was to you?

A: It could have been anywhere between 3000 to 10,000 feet, I have no idea. But, I don't think it was lower than 3000 feet.

Q: When the UFO passed over the patrol car did your police radio still function properly...was there any static?

A: No trouble at all.

Q: When you responded on the call of the UFO did you have your red flashing roof lights on?

A: No we didn't, the sheriff's department did, but we didn't.

Q: What do you think you saw?

A: I really don't know. It's like nothing I've seen around here. I don't know what kind of sophisticated machinery or whatever our government has but...

Q: What made you say government?

A: Well, we contacted the K.I. Sawyer AFB and we get zero response from them.

The following transcription derives from officer Hager's interview.

Q: How did you feel while observing the UFO?

A: It gave me the chills at first.

Q: What do you think you saw?

A: I don't know.

Q: Do you think it could have been a conventional object?

A: I don't think it was.

Q: Do you think it was a weather ballon?

A: No way.

Q: Did you hear any sounds being emitted from this object?

A: Nothing.

Q: What shape did this object appear to be?

A: I couldn't make out a shape, all I could see were lights.

Q: Do we have your permission to analyze your voice for stress, with our PSE equipment, in order to determine the validity of your statements?

A: Yes.(both officers)

Q: Do either one of you read UFO literature?

A: No. (both)

Q: Do we have your permission to publish your names and story and our final determination of this investigation for all the world to learn?

A: Yes.(both)

Not nearly half way completed with their documentation, Mazzola and Fillow conducted still yet more interviews. This time the investigation took them to the Public Safety Department in Escanba where they questioned two other officers who observed the object. One officer said, "It was definitely a UFO", while the other protested, "It was a DNR helicopter." Although the two officers differed in their opinions, the interview was not a total loss. By permission of the superior officer in charge of the 75 man force, cadet(police trainee) Terry Pearson was questioned because his duty on the night of the

sighting was that of dispatcher and therefore, he overheard all the conversations of the officers on the police band radio. The questions and answers which follow are taken from the cadet's taped conversation.

Q: Were you on duty on March 12th between 12 midnight and 8 a.m. and was your duties for that night that of a dispatcher?

A: Yes.

Q: Did you hear all conversations being broadcasted between the sheriff deputies and the Gladstone officers in reference to the high speed pursuit and observations of the object?

A: Yes.

Q: From the entire incident transmitted over the police band radio, what stands out the most about the hour long conversation?

A: I heard the words "erratic" and "right angle turn" referring to the movement of the object. I also heard the statement, "All four of us can't be crazy" as they conversed with each other.

Q: What else can you remember of the conversations?

A: There was a comment that, "K.I. Sawyer AFB should have it on their radar."

Q: Do you agree with the officers statement?

A: Yea. Being the object was in that region which the base covers, the object should have been well within their range to pick it up on their screens.

Q: Has K.I. Sawyer always cooperated with your department in the past? What I mean is, do they let you know if it's a plane, helicopter, ballon, or if they have some sort of military exercise taking place?

A: Yea.

Q: Is this the first time that you know of that K.I. Sawyer did not know what the hell was going on?

A: Yes sir.

Having all the officers interviewed, Mazzola and Fallow returned to their motel room to compile the data they already possessed. Taking

When the questions turned to the UFO sighting, the air force man said, " Oh no you don't! I don't want to get mixed up in this." However, before his departure he did exclaim, "I've never known the radar to be off for more than a couple of minutes at most and that was only due to a malfunction that was immediately taken care of." Another response brought this statement from the air force man, "...maybe, sure it's a possibility it could have been a UFO, our radar always picks-up UFO on the screen but, it always turns out to be a satellite, meteor, another aircraft or something like that."

Not wishing to push their luck, Mazzola and Fillow departed. Their next stop, the Delta County Coast Guard. They quickly learned and confirmed the Coast Guard had neither an airplane, helicopter, or weather or research balloons aloft. The officer in charge was asked if a balloon could be the cause of all the ado. The officer responded by stating, "It's not a possibility, it's a reality. However, as to hovering, stopping in mid-air after moving at rapid speeds, and making right angle turns—absolutely not—balloons don't do these things, besides they don't have bright spotlights and multi-colored flashing lights."

Most of the documentation was quickly being accomplished; the air force angle, the weather facility angle, the witnesses angle—now all that was left was the helicopter theory. Therefore they proceeded to the Department of Natural Resources. Another quick and easy verification came almost immediately. A spokesman was quoted as saying, "No DNR helicopter was in the air or area at the time of the sighting. As a matter of fact, our next chopper was scheduled to be in the air at 6:30 that morning."

Again, collecting their tapes and reports they retreated to their motel room. The statements they received during this portion of the investigation were also reviewed with their PSE equipment. In their opinion, "everyone was telling the truth except the U.S. Air Force."

all the taped cassettes, they began to analyze the statements made for signs of deception. Mazzola, who is an expert in polygraph usage and lie-detection, observed the machine's LED digital readout display numeral after numeral. The machine basically operates under the principal of determining a persons normal voice pattern (from asking questions which will surely be the truth. ex.: Is today Monday?) of stating factual statements as compared to that of falsehoods. After a few hours, the conclusion was "all the officers interviewed were sincere in their statements, no stress which indicated deception was detected, and it is believed they are telling the truth."

Feeling satisfied this was indeed a case involving a UFO, Mazzola and Fillow set out to prove the officers were telling the truth. They now appeared at K.I. Sawyer AFB. It is important to remember here that this base is considered a SAC defense location. At the base they were informed by an officer (whom we shall call officer Jones for obvious reasons) who stated, "No aircraft were in or near the Gladstone area at the time of the UFO report and no aircraft was to be in the air until later that morning." When we asked officer Jones whether or not their radar screens picked-up a "blip" (UFO) and if he can confirm this, the diplomacy seen for a half ^{an} hour had changed to not ^{one} of hostility, rather one of negativity. Remember, the officers viewing the UFO last saw the object fly off in the direction of the AFB. Officer Jones replied to our question by stating, "I can't be sure if the radar was operational during this time, I'd have to check our log records." When we asked officer Jones if we could have a look at the log he spoke of, his answer was, "Our logs are government property and confidential. So, as you can realize they are not available for public inspection." Officer Jones then refused to answer any more questions. Mazzola and Fillow, preparing to leave the base, confronted a non-commissioned officer outside who was about to enter an air force vehicle. Approaching the man, the two began to converse with ^{the} air force man in general.

It seems that Officer Jones was either evading the issue or erroneously telling their side of the story. What we can deduce from what we already know from past experiences, the air force has strict control on aircraft flying over or in the immediate area of a top-security defense base. We know they would automatically respond to an unknown aircraft (UFO) by scrambling jets to the scene to investigate. We also know that meteors, satellites and airplanes do not make 90 degree right angle turns, hover, zig-zag or go straight up or down. So, once again it looked as though a cover-up or misinterruption of the facts was being perplexed by our military.

Before eating dinner, Mazzola and Fallow telephoned the Sheriff's and Gladstone departments to see if anyone else had come forward to report what they had seen that night. To their astonishment, 3 persons had reported it to one department and 7 to the other. Before long they interviewed these persons and 14 others who they encountered along their route. A total of 24 other witnesses, of which at least 16 had a similar account and sketches which had not been released to the media. The remaining 8 had either separate UFO encounters or were trying to get in on all the excitement and publicity.

Finally at dinner, Mazzola and Fallow agreed to contact Rick Rudden, a staff reporter for The Daily Press in Escanaba. Rick had covered the story from its origination and informed UPI (United Press International) to the facts. In order to show that the officers involved were expressing the truth, in order to show that more people were now coming forward and telling what they saw, and in order to explain to the media, who would surely inform the public, what the SBI had uncovered and documented an interview was in order. Rick and a photograher arrived later that evening. Informed of the facts of the case and to the SBI's re-enactment of the entire event with the officers involved, The Daily Press published the two hour interview on March 14th. The article emphasized to the neighboring populace to

in the event they wished to document what they may have seen that night or report a sighting in the future.

Returning home after two days of investigating and documenting, Mazzola and Fallow soon received many responses to their request from people all over the Michigan region. Besides this, they have learned that a similar UFO sighting occurred on March 17, 1978 in the same area of Escanaba nearly two years prior to the exact date of the recent sighting. Also of interest, a power blackout in nearby Bad Axe, Michigan occurred the night of Wednesday, March 12th, 14 hours after the sighting by the six officers.

A call from the SBI in New York to the Michigan based power company has received no official reply from any representative of the company. All that would be said was, "a powerful windstorm knocked over a major transformer and caused a power outage." Unknown to the power company, over 50 individuals from the area have reported seeing strange glowing green and yellow objects in the vicinity where the transformer "allegedly" toppled-over. UFO involvement? We don't know for sure and may never know, we can only hypothesize and call it coincidence.

In retrospect, the SBI was the first and thus far, only UFO organization to respond to the scene in order to determine the facts. In order to keep with our policy of quick response we will always try to get to the scene of a UFO encounter within 24 hours of the incident.

In conclusion, although a landing or abduction did not transpire in this case, although there were no UFO photographs or evidence, we feel the case as a whole is of great significance for several reasons. One, it involves not one but six police officers from three separate police departments who viewed the same object. Two, it is the second

such encounter within the last -7- months which involves a police officer within the Mid-West area. The last incident occurred on August 27, 1979 at 1:30 a.m. in Marshall County , Minnesota. (SEE: SAGA UFO REPORT, February 1980 issue) Three, the UFO (as in past encounters) is seen flying over or in close proximity of a top-secret military complex.

Are UFO monitoring our military bases? Are UFO making their appearances more readily available to our law enforcement agents? Is 1980 going to be a "flap" year for UFO in the Mid-West? Only time will tell and we shall all wait anxiously for the next major encounter that may shed some light on this 32 year old phenomena.



GLADSTONE — Two UFO investigators from New York left for home this morning after verifying the sighting of a UFO Wednesday and saying it is one of the most important to take place in the U. S. in many years.

Pete Mazzola and Jim Fillow, international directors of the Scientific Bureau of Investigation, registered in New York, were in the area for the last day and a half looking into the sighting by six area police officers.

The six officers — two from the Gladstone Public Safety Department, two from the Delta County Sheriff's Department and two from the Escanaba Public Safety Department — all reported seeing the object at about 1 a. m. Wednesday.

The officers from Gladstone, Mark Hager and Dave Marlin, viewed the UFO for more than 30 minutes near or on M-35 north of Gladstone. Both patrol cars from the sheriff's department and Gladstone reported chasing the object but lost sight of it as it flew toward the west.

It was described as having red, green and blue oscillating lights in addition to an extremely bright white light.

K. I Sawyer Air Force Base, the Coast Guard and the Department of Natural Resources all report that they did not have any aircraft in the area at the time.

When Mazzola isn't investigating UFO, he is a full-time New York City undercover police officer while Fillow was a New Jersey police officer and is now a computer technician.

The Scientific Bureau of investigation has some 2,000 members across the U. S. and half of those are police officers who act as investigators for the group.

The goals of the non-profit organization are to alert the public of the true facts concerning UFOs, protect the interests of the public officer involved in a sighting, and primarily, to expose the U. S. government concerning the suppressed evidence of UFOs that they contain, Mazzola said.

The group is concerned with police officers both because its two directors have police backgrounds and because "police officers are more apt to get involved with UFOs because they are out there, especially between midnight and eight when most of the public is asleep and when most UFO sightings take place," Mazzola said.

The director of the group decided to come to Delta County from New York instead of sending one of their member-investigators from Detroit because the case here was so unusual.

Mazzola said the two started for Escanaba "as soon as we heard about it in New York from UPI (news service)."

This pair came all the way to the U. P. because "this was a case of major importance involving several different police officers from three different agencies, which made the report very valid," he added.

They usually only cover reported landings of UFOs, but they covered this case because it "was unusual due to the fact that you had not one or two cops involved but you had four, five, six cops reporting the same object from different locations, there was too much credibility here to let it pass," Fillow said.

The two said the case in Gladstone is one of the best and most complete cases they have worked on, and they have worked on between 45 and 50 what they call valid UFO sightings.

The two investigate reports of UFOs in much the same way as they would investigate a crime.

"We try to build a case like a criminal investigation, and if we went to court with this evidence we would win. We build the evidence to substantiate the fact that something unknown was up there, we ask how that evidence was substantiated, we ask if all the possibilities were eliminated, we ask if misidentification was eliminated, we did all this," Fillow said.

The pair were able to talk to the police officers involved in the sighting because of cooperation from the Gladstone Public Safety Department and Delta County Sheriff's Department, and they were even able to study the actual police reports concerning the matter.

They talked to and made reports on 24 witnesses of the sighting, but "eight will be eliminated because it seems they just jumped on the bandwagon, but of the rest we're sure that they did see the object," Mazzola said.

The investigators talked to the officers separately to double check their stories, and each one checked out. They also, for the brief time they were in the area, checked the officers' background and standing in the community.

Each officer reported that before Wednesday morning, they were skeptical of the existence of UFOs, but that is no longer the case.

That's because now they "have been slapped in the face with reality, they believe in UFOs now," Fillow said.

Every officer told them that what they saw was not reflected lights but a material object. Quoting from the report of one officer, Fillow said, "It wasn't any aircraft that I ever saw before," the key word there is 'aircraft,' he did not say light or anything like that, he said 'aircraft.'"

After talking to the officers and other witnesses and even after using the officers' reports and taking a "dry run" of the early morning's events, the two concluded that what was seen that cold, clear morning near Gladstone was indeed a UFO.

"We have reached a conclusion, what has happened here is that without a doubt it was a UFO. The speeds were incredible, the maneuvers were typical for a UFO but were incredible to those who didn't see them before, the color changes were typical, everything was typical for a UFO," Fillow said.

Now that they have their findings, Mazzola said they "intend to make smoke, we are going to call a press conference when we land in New York, this has made world headlines and we want to make the public more aware of UFOs."

One important point brought up by the officers who witnessed the object was that "the colored lights were not standing still like they would on a plane, but according to the record the lights were revolving, at first they saw one color, then another color and then the next color, not all at the same time," he added.

One apparent discrepancy the New York investigators said they uncovered dealt with the use, or reported non-use, of radar at K. I. Sawyer Air Force Base near Marquette.

Fillow said they received reports that air force personnel at the U. P. base said they did not have any idea if a UFO was out there because their radar was turned off, an explanation he called "a crock."

He explained, "This is a major defense installation in the northern-midwestern U. S., and there's no way in hell they would turn off the radar."

Agreeing with his partner, Mazzola said the two are "convinced that the air force did in fact have their radar on, because it did not sound logical, they are just evading the issue."

They said that right here in the U. P. this issue concerning the radar is an example of the federal government trying to whitewash UFO sightings. But they added that they understand the air force's point of view.

"We understand the point of view of the air force base. UFOs aren't supposed to exist as far as the air force is concerned because of national security, panic to the public or whatever," Mazzola said.

Officials at the K. I. Sawyer Air Force Base said their radar operates on a 24 hour basis, so they say the radar was on at the time of the sighting.

A misunderstanding becomes apparent between the two investigators and the base because a base officer said their radar has just a 50-mile range, not anything that could cover the northern-midwest.

The base has weather radar in addition to tactical radar that is used for air traffic control.

Sgt. Jim Rosenberg of the base public affairs office said because the radar only has a range of 50 miles, a UFO sighted near Gladstone would be on the radar's fringes and there was a good chance if there was an object present, it would not be picked up by the base's radar.

The two were able to do such a substantial investigation because of the cooperation of the area police agencies.

They were able to receive this cooperation because Fillow and Mazzola, both having some involvement with police work, can identify with area police and break down barriers that may exist for others.

"Pete and I both have cop lingo, we understand them, cops usually don't open up to people but when they talk to a cop or a former cop, they open up, and that's exactly what happened here," Fillow said, adding "there was a tremendous rapport between the two of us and the local police."

The two said they were well received while in Delta County because "Many organizations, institutions and media have called in reference to this case from around the world, but we are the only ones who came here, that's a big difference," Mazzola said.

The Scientific Bureau of Investigation is only just a little over a year old and was formed by the two because they did not agree with another UFO investigative group they had been involved with.

While they and the other members of the group that are also policemen handle the investigative duties, other members of the organization who have the ability handle the scientific and technical aspects of UFO research.


They store all their information they gather in a computer in Houston and have laboratories in New York and New Jersey.

With them on their trip from New York to Delta County, the two brought thousands of dollars worth of equipment, which is just a small percentage of their equipment supply, Fillow said.

With this new equipment and technology, Mazzola said they have "been called the new breed of 'UFO-ologists' because we have new methods, innovations, techniques that have not been tried before."

When a reported U.F.O. leaves behind a visible record of it's being there this constitutes what is called in Ufology, "A Close Encounter of the Second Kind. (C.E. II)". The physical effects from a C.E. II can run the range of burned or depressed areas on the soil where the craft has allegedly landed to automobile stoppages due to the electro magnetic effect (E.M.E.) right up to the paralysis of humans and animals in the immediate vicinity of the craft. For years prior to 1968, U.F.O. Investigators and Researchers alike scrambled to every corner of the world, on reports of landings of U.F.O.s and their associated effects, hoping to grasp that one piece of the puzzle that might have been left behind by the U.F.O. In 1968, The Department of Physics of the United States Airforce Academy introduced a new textbook to their cadets in Colorado Springs entitled Introductory to Space Science Volume II.¹

In chapter #23 entitled 'Unidentified Flying Objects', U.F.O. researchers began to realize that they were on the right track for gathering information and data on C.E. II's. On page 456 subtitled 'After Effects', we begin to learn that the Air Force as far back as 1968 knew of after effects associated with U.F.O. landings. Some of the information is as follows: A) Burned areas or animals, B) Depressed or flatten areas, C) Dead or missing animals, D) Missing items; and perhaps the most important, E) Mentally disturbed people. What is meant by the term mentally disturbed people is not that mentally ill persons were reporting U.F.O.s, but rather that people, witnesses who have had C.E. II's have often been left visibly shook,

dazed and often incoherent some times for a matter of hours after the incident. A recent C.E. II took place on August 30,1979, in Warren, Minnesota. It involved the Police Officer named Val Johnson of the Marshal County Minnesota Police Department.

Amazing case

Officer Johnson was on routine patrol duty when on a lonely road a brilliantly lit object swept down on the Deputy Sheriff's car and left the vehicle damaged and the Officer unconscious in the front seat. Aside from being shocked and sustaining a mild case of Weilder's blindness, Johnsons car was damaged almost beyond belief. The fact that Johnson was unconscious for almost a half hour is of significant importance but the physical fact remains that his windshield was shattered along with the front left headlight and both his CB radio antenna and the police car radio antenna were both bent at 90 degree angles. The small dent on his patrol car hood was also evidence. Prior to the incident, Johnson had radio headquarters that he saw what he thought to be a small private plane approaching his patrol car and thought the plane was about to land on the roadway. Thats the last thing Johnson consciously remembers. Investigators at the sight immediately after the incident also noted that both Johnson wrist watch and the Police clock inside the car had mysteriously stopped for approximately 14 minutes possibly due to the Electro Magnetic Effect from this small "plane". Johnson was later quoted as having said "I was pretty down in the dumps the first couple of days afterward. I thought I was in mental difficulty. It's pretty hard for me to justify since I work with facts and logic but what happened to me isn't logical and it is a bit frightening, and I do believe I was buzzed verv closely by a U.F.O."

There are more to Close Encounters of the Second Kind than meets the eye. On March 10, 1979, the F.B.I. became officially involved in what has been called the "great cattle mystery". Since 1968 over eight thousand head of cattle and horses have been butchered with surgical precision over an estimated one million square miles across the United States stretching from Tennessee to Oregon. The F.B.I. joined forces with the New Mexico State Police in a effort to determine what was destroying the cattle and horses and to see if they could put an end to it. So far these are the facts that have been made available to me. On June 1979, Senator Harrison Schmitt (R.N.M.) an ex-Apollo 17 Astronaut and scientist held a conference with officials from seven states where the attacks have taken place in order to determine if in fact this was the work of a Satanic cult or as it has been reported for years, the work of U.F.O.s. The Justice Department authorized the F.B.I. Office in Albuquerque New Mexico, to become involved in the investigation on the basis that some of the mutilations were taken place on Indian lands. Many of the attacks have occurred at the Apache reservation in Delsey, New Mexico. The common denominator on nearly all the attacks have been these: 1) No tire tracks or foot marks or any other signs of human activity have been found near the mutilated carcasses, 2) Only the blood and certain organs of the animals (usually the reproductive organs) are removed, 3) Trace elements found on and in some of the carcasses have been collected and are currently under analyzation, 4) Buzzards and coyotees refuse to eat the mutilated animals even after they have been starved after a period of three days. Initially Government experts thought that they were dealing with some

sort of cult group or Satanic group because—the surgery involved taking parts of the cattle and horses, but that now seems theory to have dissolved. Because of the surgical precision and the apparent cauterization of the wounds, scientist now believe a type of laser surgery is involved in the mutilation of these animals. In one week alone Jacksonville, Mississippi had lost 14 head of cattle. In many locations tripod shape impressions on the ground have given rise to the speculation that these mutilations are the work of U.F.O.s. Some Apache Indians have actually witnessed U.F.O.s landing and taking their cattle aboard. Cooperation from the Apache Indian reservation has not been very good according to Government sources because the Indians consider U.F.O.s to be "big medicine". To aid in solving this phenomenon, District Attorney Elroy Martinez of Espanola, New Mexico, was recently granted a \$40,000 assistant grant from the United States Law Enforcement Assistance Administration. This money is to be used exclusively to help solve the mutilations that have been going on for over 10 years.

Not all C.E. II's are as dramatic as the happenings in the West and Midwestern States. On the night of November 2, 1971, Durel Johnson (Durel is not related to Officer Johnson) his wife Erma, and their 17 year old son Ronnie made history in the annals of the U.F.O. research. It was on that cold November night that Ronnie Johnson was just finishing his chores around their Delphos, Kansas farm house when he saw a U.F.O. land near their barn. Ronnie and his pet collie, Snowball watched in awe as the object descended breaking portions of a Chinese Elm Tree. The young Johnson tried to walk toward the object but found that he could not move. He notice his dog was also unable to move. The Johnsons who had 18 head of sheep in a corral near the barn told investigators that during the entire

landing episode none of the livestock moved so much as an inch. It was as though they were paralyzed. It is at this point that Erma Johnson came to the back door of their farm house to call Ronnie in for supper. She called her son three times and Ronnie swears he never heard her call. Erma called her husband Durel to find out why the boy wasn't responding to her calls, and they both set out in the direction of the barn to find their son.

Mr. Johnson later recalled that he told Mrs. Johnson to stay behind while he set out to look for Ronnie. As he walked to the small shed used to store feed, he noticed the U.F.O. not more than 50 feet from his barn. At this point Johnson could not move, it was as though he was frozen to the ground. Mrs. Johnson becoming anxious that her son and her husband were not responding to her calls, now set out to look for them. As Mrs. Johnson approached her husband, she too noticed the U.F.O. and by this time it was taking off with a tremendous luminescence and then it was gone. Mr. Johnson later reconstructed the events that immediately happened after the U.F.O. took off. "The first thing I noticed was that everything was silent. Dead silence....no crickets, no birds, nothing, there wasn't even a rustling of the wind in the trees, just complete silence. The next thing I can remember was fear for my sons safety. I could not see him because of this blindness that I had, it was like someone flashed a light bulb in my eyes and I had not become accustomed to the night yet. Mrs. Johnson who worked as a part time nurse recalls that it was she who finally found Ronnie and Snowball crumpled on the ground not far from where the U.F.O. had been. In near hysteria she shouted for her husband to call the police and to call the doctor. When the authorities arrived they found the family visibly shaken and Ronnie and Mr. Johnson quite disoriented. The elder Johnson by this

time had loaded a 12 ga. shotgun and was sitting on the couch as if in a trance and would not leave nor talk to anyone who was present. Mrs. Johnson took the police out to where the U.F.O. had been and it was then they became aware that the ground on which the U.F.O. had been was now glowing and several photographs were taken by the Police Department.² By this time the doctor had arrived and examined

Ronnie and determined that both he and Mr. Johnson were suffering from deep shock and prescribed sedatives for both. Mrs. Johnson had also been concerned about Snowball who by this time was walking around in a daze and bumping into objects in the house. The doctor examined the dog and determined that she was now blind. Snowball was blind for a period of three days. The Police who investigated this case also went on record as stating that the sheep near the landing sight were still immobile when they arrived on the scene. It was as though they had died and rigormortis had already set in. The following morning U.F.O. Investigators from the Center of U.F.O. Studies arrived on the scene to take soil samples³ and at this time the most bazaar incident occurred. While trying to dig up soil to be analyzed, researchers noted that while coming in contact with the soil, their fingers, and palms of their hands became numb. Mrs. Johnson also touched the soil and later recalled that she could not work for a period of six days because she could not take the pulses of her patients due to the numbness in her hands.

The soil in the circle left behind by the U.F.O. was dehydrated, not burned, just dehydrated. The ground was wet from rain the night before but the ring in their backyard was dried after the incident. Investigators noted that on seven consecutive nights after the U.F.O.

landing had taken place that the ring on the ground would glow bright enough where you could practically read a newspaper by it. Tree branches were in the close vicinity of the landing site were broken and burned. Later analysis done on the soil at the site and controlled samples indicated that something indeed had taken place on Johnson's farm. Seeds were planted in both the controlled sample and the site sample and watering conditions as well as lighting conditions were monitored to be nearly as exact as possible. After a period of 14 days the plants grew only on the controlled sample and not on the site sample. The soil for all intent and purposes had become sterilized.

For more than 15 years, U.F.O. landings have been cataloged by various U.F.O. Organizations. To date about 1,600 have been validated. For more information on Close Encounters of the Second Kind or Unidentified Flying Objects in general, write to :

Considering the fact Nostradamus' track record of predicting accurately will remain in effect, let us ponder the statement, "...like the great king of Angolmois, during the year 1999, seventh month, the great King of Terror will descend from the sky. 





After we had completed last month's feature article on remotely piloted vehicles (page 93), Lockheed Corporation's missiles and space subsidiary announced it had been awarded a \$100-million-plus contract by the U.S. Army to develop a reconnaissance RPV system that will "acquire and designate targets" for artillery and laser-guided missiles. Lockheed also released the accompanying photo of its prototype missile. The aircraft will carry both television camera and laser equipment to "illuminate" its targets. It will be fabricated largely of Kevlar; it will weigh 220 pounds and will have a 13-foot wingspan. It can be programmed to fly to a number of specific waypoints, then to loiter and search for targets, although programming can be overridden for direct manual control at any time.

An official "Salute Anthem" by Neves Gurgel, a composer and UFO hobbyist, will be played on some other occasion, a committee member said.

Some 350 Rio de Janeiro state police troopers and Federal Highway Patrol officers were mobilized in an "Operation UFO" to maintain order during the night-long vigil. Sale of alcoholic beverages was banned. Casimiro de Abreu police chief Heralmir Ramirez said proudly: "Everything worked out beautifully. There wasn't a single incident of violence."

When the appointed hour came there was a "profound silence that lasted for several seconds," Ramirez said in a telephone interview. Then somebody in the huge crowd shouted loud and clear, "Hey, where is the UFO? ... I want my money back." It was a joke, Ramirez said, because nobody really paid anything to be there.

But many people did pay for many things that business-minded Brazilians were selling there — hot dogs, small robots, signs reading "Welcome, peaceful friends from outer space." Luis Guttemberg, from the Rio suburb of Mage, did a brisk business by selling binoculars at \$25 apiece.

Barbosa, who called himself "the messenger of Jupiter," was not seen after the interplanetary dud. One reporter said he saw him being whisked away in a police jeep after some frustrated persons in the crowd started shouting "get Barbosa," but police would not confirm that.

UFO reports are keeping police agencies busy

ESCANABA — Still more calls were received today reporting the sighting of a UFO in the bayshore area after officers from three Delta County police agencies said they saw early this morning what appeared to be an unidentified flying object north of Gladstone.

At about 12:55 a. m. today officers from the Gladstone Public Safety Department received a call from an unidentified source reporting a UFO sighting.

After viewing the UFO, the Gladstone officers contacted the Delta County Sheriff's Department for assistance.

Two sheriff's deputies, David Huckstep and Max Streicher, joined Dave Mariin and Mark Hager on M-35 north of Gladstone, where the four reportedly observed the UFO for approximately eight minutes.

The UFO was described as having red, green and blue oscillating lights in addition to an extremely bright white light.

Gladstone Public Safety officer Dave Mariin said he was not sure what shape the object was, but he was convinced that it was a UFO.

"It was much larger than an airplane or helicopter and when it made a turn we could see the side of it and tell it wasn't an airplane or helicopter," Mariin said.

"It was hard to tell what shape it was, I hate to say it was a flying saucer, it appeared to be round," he added.

After approximately eight minutes of observing the UFO, the object began to move and the officers proceeded to follow it on M-35 north of Gladstone.

Mariin said when he first saw the object it was flying over his patrol car, and when it began to head away, "the period it took us to cover a quarter of a mile the UFO

moved so fast it was almost out of sight."

Both units reported observing and following the UFO for about 30 minutes. Reports say the object traveled at an extremely high speed and made very sharp turns and made abrupt ascending and descending maneuvers.

Two officers from the Escanaba Public Safety Department also reported seeing the object. One said he thought it was a UFO while the other said he thought it was a Department of Natural Resources helicopter.

The deputies and Gladstone police officers observed the object as it moved in a westerly direction until they lost sight of it.

Mariin said he and his partner, Hager, were both amazed, and while they were pursuing the object, they decided that "there is no way that anybody was going to convince us it was an airplane or helicopter, we didn't care if they called us crazy or what, it wasn't one of these," Mariin said.

Officials at K. I. Sawyer Air Force Base near Marquette was informed of the sighting and said no aircraft were in or near the Gladstone area at the time the UFO reports were made.

A spokesperson for the Gladstone Public Safety Department said the National UFO Reporting Center in Seattle, Wash., was informed of the sighting and asked to investigate.

Oddly enough, the last reported sighting of a UFO in the Escanaba area took place on March 17, 1978, almost two years before this latest sighting.

Since the reported sighting by the officers, all three departments have received several more reports today concerning the sighting of the UFO.

Greenland Has Rash Of UFO Sightings

GODTHAAB, Greenland (AP) — Since the first of the year, residents along Greenland's west coast have been reporting seeing bright objects in the sky.

Lt. Col. H.V. Jensen, acting commander in chief of Denmark's military forces in Greenland, said not a single observation of the unidentified flying objects had been made from planes or ships.

Meteorologist Leo Thorsager said he thought the many strange observations had to do with a lengthy and unusually strong depression, and with large temperature differences between various atmospheric layers.

The theories put forward by meteorologists have not done much to convince Greenlanders that they are just witnessing some unusual atmospheric phenomena.

The observations range from a twin flying object to an oval vehicle with lighted portholes. Teachers and students at a high school reported watching two objects scanning the sea, the fjords and the high school with strong searchlights.

More than 100 people, some of them with binoculars, watched a luminescent object hovering over another area, moving up and down and changing into the shape of a blue cigar as it disappeared at high speed.

UFO watchers kept busy

GLADSTONE — Officers who reported seeing an unidentified flying object early Wednesday north of here have been receiving hundreds of calls from as far away as Australia from various persons, media and UFO investigative agencies.

Gladstone police officer Mark Hager, one of the six area law enforcement officers who viewed the object, said he received calls just this morning from radio stations in Vermont, Louisiana, Boston and Chicago.

Officers also report receiving telephone calls since they viewed the UFO at about 1 a.m. Wednesday from media in Los Angeles, New York, Detroit, Washington, D.C., and, as Hager put it, "they've been coming in from all over."

Hager said he and his patrol partner at the time of the reported sighting, Dave Mariin, were both on the telephone for about eight hours Wednesday talking to media from across the U.S.

Hager said calls were also received from the media of the three major television networks - ABC, CBS and NBC - in addition to UFO Information Centers in downstate Grand Ledge, Seattle, Wash., and Chicago.

The report of the sighting was also on Wednesday's edition of the Paul Harvey News and Commentary Show on the ABC radio network.

Hager said he did not expect all the hoopla and he will be glad "when all the phone calls are done."

"I thought there were thousands of these sightings a day, but apparently

not, but maybe because there were six police officers involved the credibility was better," he added.

Hager also said information has been received that UFO investigators are expected to arrive in the area from New York and Seattle, Wash.

No other sightings of UFOs have been reported across the U.P. since Wednesday morning, and an Associated Press news release concerning the possible sighting of one downstate in Huron County Wednesday near Bad Axe has been proven inaccurate.

The radio station which released the news report, WLEW in Bad Axe, said there were no reports from the county sheriff's department concerning the sighting.

The news director of the radio station said that any lights spotted in the sky were probably the result of a power company working on a power outage in the area.

The sighting of the UFO took place Wednesday in Delta County when the two Gladstone police officers investigated a report of a UFO.

The UFO was described as having red, green and blue oscillating lights in addition to an extremely bright white light.

It reportedly moved at a very high rate of speed and made very sharp turns in addition to very abrupt ascending and descending maneuvers.

Both patrol units said they observed and followed the UFO for about 30 minutes before losing sight of it. The observation took place on M-35 north of Gladstone.

Two officers from the Escanaba Public Safety department also reported seeing the object. One said it was a UFO while the other said he thought it was a Department of Natural Resources helicopter.

K. I. Sawyer Air force Base near Marquette, the Coast Guard and the DNR all said they did not have any aircraft in the area at the time of the sighting.

Spangled Sky

8 In Nevada County See UFOs Of Many Colors

NEVADA CITY — Mysterious multicolored flying objects in the sky have been reported seen by eight persons who live on two different ridges northeast of Nevada City near the South Yuba River.

All eight persons described the UFO's as red and white lights, along with blue lights at times, that hovered, then moved quickly across the sky. They said the lights were from 1,000 to 2,000 feet above the ground.

The first sighting, Jan. 22, was reported by Richard and Lori Hewitt of North Bloomfield Road who said they viewed a circle of lights, red, white and blue. "in a horizontal pattern and definitely the bottom side of the object."

A Vietnam veteran, Hewitt said he's seen all kinds of aircraft, but that this flying object resembled none he could recognize. "The lights were at least 20 times brighter than any of the stars," he said.

Hewitt, who said he and his wife watched the UFO for five to seven minutes, said he heard "a jet-like sound, but very quiet. It could have been from the air the thing was pushing."

Officials at Beale Air Force Base said no unusual flight activity had originated at the base and could offer no explanation of what may have been seen in the skies over Nevada County.

The second sightings, Sunday night, were reported by six persons: two couples who live about a half mile from the Hewitts and two other persons from another ridgetop.

Michael Giacomini, who lives on Cement Hill, said he saw a white light which was followed by a pulsing red light. "They were both above me," he said. "One seemed to be on each side of the road." Then, he said, the two lights were joined by a blue light and they formed a triangle. "They did a spin at one point, and then the blue light disappeared," he added.


The red and white lights also were seen by Patrick Czarnowski, who described them as "brighter than light. They seemed to revolve around each other," he said. "They didn't seem to be propelled by anything or affected by gravity."

Across the canyon, Dave and Pam Butler and Ed and Pam Vaughn witnessed the same display. Butler said the two lights were moving west together, the white light stopped and the red one continued out of his sight to the west. A few minutes later, he said, the red light returned, joined the white light and they disappeared to the east.

Vaughn gave the same description and said, "I guess it could have been an airplane or helicopter but I doubt it. They were doing some really weird stuff."


Those who saw the aerial display said they were sure the objects were not ordinary aircraft.

"I've grown up believing that we're not the only people around; I'm convinced now," said Hewitt. "I'm a believer now," put in Giacomini.
