SBI seeks answer to riddle of UFOs

Staten Is. researcher inspired by encounter in Vietnam War

Pete Mazzola became committed to the investigation of UFOs when, on patrol in Vietnam, he saw artillery batteries from both the U.S. and communist forces fire on a disc-shaped UFO hovering silently near where his platoon was pinned down.

"I went to Vietnam in '65," Mazzola said in a telephone interview. "There were several times, while on patrol in the jungle, that I had time to look up at the stars. I saw more than a few unusual 'shooting stars' that maneuvered in a way no meteor could."

Sometime between 1966 and 1967 — he can't recall the exact day — Mazzola and his platoon, while on an extended patrol, found themselves pinned down in tall elephant grass. Then they saw something uncanny appear over the paddy fields and palm trees ahead of them.

"I couldn't believe what I saw," he said. "The other guys saw it too but afterwards were too shocked to talk much about it except to say, 'What the hell was that?'"

Mazzola was the Forward Observer for his platoon. His job was to call in the coordinates of enemy positions where U.S. Navy warships offshore could direct artillery fire. "We were bogged down a good 80 minutes," he said, "so I had the Navy battery fire a couple of rounds for effect, three or four minutes before the object appeared."

When the object did appear, the Navy guns kept firing. "From the whistling sound the shells made we could hear the direction they were coming from — the south," he said. "Then the object began to receive artillery rounds in the other direction, from the north" — from the Viet Cong.

"The shells never made the target," he said. "They all exploded short — we could see the black smoke puffs in the air." It was if the UFO was doing something to make the shells explode prematurely.

The craft continued to hover "silently, gracefully..." Mazzola said, with a tinge of remembered awe in his voice. After four or five minutes it "shot straight up in the air" and was gone.

Army clamps lid on sighting

Later, as a full-fledged UFO investigator, Mazzola tried to gather more

information about the encounter that started him on the road to UFOlogy. But "The Pentagon never acknowledged it," he said. "They clamped the lid on it."

However, recent government documents released under the Freedom of Information Act verified UFO sightings in Vietnam during the war. "Gen. George F. Brown authenticated it," he said.

After he came back to the United States, Mazzola worked as an investigator for the Aerial Phenomena Research Organization (APRO). He left APRO because he felt it and other UFO organizations seemed to be heading "on a never-ending path" of investigating UFO sightings without asking the right questions or developing the methods that would lead to a solution of the UFO enigma.

So Mazzola, together with a number of like-minded researchers from other UFO organizations, founded the Scientific Bureau of Investigation in 1979. The SBI, incorporated in Delaware, has its headquarters at Mazzola's Staten Island home. Mazzola is an SBI international director.

SBI is dedicated, not just to investigating UFO sightings, but to actually solving the UFO riddle, Mazzola said. To do that, SBI seeks the answer to three basic questions: "1. Where do UFOs originate? 2. What do they want? 3. Are they hostile or benevolent?"

According to Mazzola, SBI's investigations have arrived at no clear answers but several disturbing conclusions about these questions. But more of that later.

SBI's goal is furthered by a unique world-wide network of some 1500 members and field investigators, plus a panel of 128 expert consultants in fields of astronomy, physics, engineering, medicine, and others. The group maintains a telephone hotline for sightings and a "quick reaction team" to respond to a sighting anywhere in the United States within 48 hours.

Investigators are supported and encouraged with a system of promotions, compensation for expenses, cash awards, and availability of modern techniques to maintain a high level of membership loyalty and morale. Interestingly enough, some 42 percent of SBI's membership comes from the law-enforcement field.

SBI provides free analysis of UFO photographs and physical evidence. Queens UFOlogist Colman Von-Keviczky, director of ICUFON, is their

photographic analyst and a laboratory in New Jersey is used for analyzing physical traces of UFOs.

Unique among UFO groups, SBI provides reduced dues and subscription rates to senior citizens and students. Its newsletter, the SBI Report, publishes accounts of sightings throughout the world and articles by guest writers. The intent of the newsletter, Mazzola said, is to get "behind the scenes" of the UFO phenomenon.

Mazzola, reflecting SBI's policy of open-mindedness to all UFO theories, criticized the tendency of other UFO research groups to cling to their own "pet theories" to the exclusion of others and to bend the facts to fit those theories. At the same time, Mazzola stressed SBI is friendly toward other UFO organizations and maintains close working relationships with about 50 of them.

SBI's investigations "have been written up in every tabloid in the United States," Mazzola said. The group has also served as technical advisor for the TV show "That's Incredible."

The Indian Lake incident

Speaking of incredible, one of the most notable sightings Mazzola can remember from the hundreds he has investigated happened in November, 1978 at Indian Lake in upstate New York.

"Two New Yorkers were going on a hunting trip. Before they went they both had a premonition that they would see a UFO. They were making jokes about it, and passed it off as delusions of grandeur."

As they camped along Indian Lake that night, "they saw two Phantom jets armed with missiles pass over the lake at treetop level," Mazzola continued. "They thought it was unusual for a military jet to be operating over a recreation area, especially armed with missiles. The jets kept circling and the noise became excruciating. They circled in about a two mile radius," he said.

The two hunters remembered the area was close to Rome Air Force Base, and figured the jets were making training maneuvers. But when SBI investigators called the base later, Mazzola said, spokesmen said no jets had been out that night.

Finally, the noise of the jets died away and the two sportsmen began to settle down for the night. It was dark, and they had their lanterns out.

"Suddenly one portion of the tent lit up, like a huge flashlight was shining down on it. They heard no noise. Then the light went out." The hunters, more than a bit perturbed, finally went to bed.

The next day, Nov. 1, at about 5:30 p.m., as the two were cooking dinner, "A 300-foot-long, cigar shaped object appeared over the campsite, going west. It was silvery, and had a bright, blinding beam of light underneath it and a red light at the rear."

The two astonished hunters tried to

rationalize what they had seen. But before they had time to recover, "they saw a second similar object, this time 500 feet long, hovering within treetop level near the campsite. It appeared to be landing nearby."

By now the hunters had had enough. In a panic, they abandoned their campsite with all their gear, got into their car and took off down a logging road as fast as they could drive.

The logging road led to a ranger station, manned by a park ranger. Mazzola said this ranger, a veteran with a spotless record, signed an affidavit saying "he saw the UFO pursuing the auto down the road." The ranger called the state police.

Two state troopers, along with several local townspeople, responded to the call. They went with the two hunters to the campsite and found portions of the logging road inexplicably "torn up," Mazzola said. But the campsite, with all the equipment the hunters left behind, was undisturbed.

But the UFOs were still there. All witnesses reported that "three dish-shaped orange-colored objects appeared over a mountain. They moved erratically and seemed to descend into the lake" although no splashes were heard.

When the two hunters got home, they found their ordeal had just begun. They both began to exhibit symptoms of radiation poisoning — nausea, headaches, reddening of the skin — similar to what would be produced by microwaves, Mazzola said.

In addition, both "developed uncanny ESP abilities," Mazzola said. "Their pets began to react strangely to them." And both had "continuous recurring dreams" of their encounter. Both took a lie detector test which indicated they were telling the truth.

SBI's analysis revealed an inexplicable gap of 1½ hours between the time the hunters took off down the logging road and the time they were seen by the ranger with the UFO behind

them. The two were hypnotized by a professional hypnotist to try and recall the suppressed details of their encounter. And sure enough, a classic "abduction" case emerged.

Under hypnosis, the two recalled being taken into the craft and examined by alien beings. "One was examined while the other was caged in a glass-like structure," Mazzola said.

Mazzola said he is currently writing a book on the Indian Lake encounter, to be titled "The Indian Lake Incident." The sighting "encircles every aspect of the UFO phenomenon — responsible witnesses, military cover-up, abduction — you name it."

This sighting, incredible as it may seem, is only one among many that come in every day to Mazzola's desk. "Once a sighting is investigated, another pops up like kleenex tissues," Mazzola said. And they seem to have increased recently, as if UFOs "are becoming more brazen" and more willing to appear over high population centers.

One of the most recent incidents to cross Mazzola's desk includes a tape recorder sent from an SBI investigator from Australia which was burned and melted along the top. An Australian motorist had the recorder on the front seat of his car as a UFO hovered over him, shining an intense beam of light on him as in the movie "Close Encounters of the Third Kind," Mazzola said. And as in the hero of "Close Encounters," the Australian experienced a sunburn-like effect on the side of his face where he leaned out the window to look at the object.

SBI specialists tried to reproduce the same effect on a tape recorder using a microwave oven and other forms of radiation, but without success.

No firm answers yet

After all these investigations, what has SBI come up with in answering their three main questions?

As to the first question — where do they come from — Mazzola said, "We can't answer that until we rope one of these critters and interrogate them." But some conclusions have been arrived at by, of all people, the U.S. Air Force.

Mazzola quoted a textbook on space science used by Air Force cadets, recently declassified under the Freedom of Information Act. On Chapter 23 entitled UFOs, the manual concludes that, from the number of different craft sighted, their global scope and the 50,000-year history of UFO sightings, there could be "three or four groups of aliens, possibly at different stages of development" visiting our planet.

The question of what they want is still a mystery, Mazzola said. And as to whether they are friendly or hostile, he can only conclude that "There is good and bad throughout the universe."


On the one hand, the aliens seem to be "keeping watch over our planet. If we destroy ourselves, we may destroy other planes of existence. They may be trying to prevent that from happening."

On the other hand, humans have been harmed by UFOs, as in the Cash-Landrum close encounter in Texas and in reports of hunters being killed by UFOs in Brazil. Other people have reportedly been abducted against their will causing extreme terror, although not physically harmed. "How can we say they are friendly when these things happen?" Mazzola asked.

Mazzola is certain of one thing — the answers to SBI's questions will not be answered until the fragmented UFO groups get together and force the government to release the data on UFOs known to be in the hands of the military and intelligence agencies. Mazzola said a major conference in Toronto of the Mutual UFO Network (MUFON) scheduled for this July 2-3 will serve as an opportunity to bring UFO groups together so they can focus on solving the UFO puzzle instead of competing with each other.

Close encounters are now of the spooky kind

TALENTED young director Steven Spielberg, who stunned moviegoers with Close Encounters Of The Third Kind, has just finished making a movie called Poltergeist which is being hailed as the ultimate ghost story.

Spielberg has thoroughly researched the subject, speaking with dozens of people all over the world who claim to have had experiences with poltergeists.

And the stories they told him convinced him such bizarre phe-

nomena really happen. Says Spielberg, who spent \$15 million on the movie: "Time after time people told me what they'd experienced in incredible detail.

"These weren't the kind of people that you'd say, 'Hey, I think this guy's making this up.' Some of them were doctors and respectable businessman.

"I went in a skeptic and came out a believer."

Spielberg has also recently completed another sci-fi movie,

ET: The Extraterrestrial And His Adventures On Earth, about a visitor from outer space.

The director says: "There's very little doubt in my own mind that all of these things in my movies do exist — maybe not in the exact form of shape we've chosen to show, but in some form scientists can't explain.

"I'm convinced that much of what we're saying is true and probably has happened somewhere on earth."

The reasons for writing are two-fold: one, my documentary series will be sold to American & Canadian TV & should be released in January of 1983 on various networks. The pilot episode of "FORCES" will be a knockout; we are in touch with all the big researchers. It is initially a 13 episode series, however, I think it is likely to run for

Shepparton UFO

Pentagon in secret probe of time warps

THE Pentagon has launched a secret investigation into a concept straight out of the old Buck Rogers comic books — time warps.

In science-fiction, a time warp is a hole in space. People and objects which pass through one enter a time zone in the past or future.

But as part of a \$6 million investigation of psychic warfare, time warps apparently are being viewed by the Joint Chiefs of Staff as a possible defense against nuclear attack.

"Some scientists have suggested that it would be very advantageous if the United States could throw a time warp over the area of the North Pole," says Dr. Gordon Myers, a defense analyst who works on contracts for the Pentagon.

"We know that in the case of a nuclear attack, the Soviets would send most of their missiles

aimed at the United States via the polar route. That's the fastest way for them to get here.

"If we had a time warp in place, the missiles would enter it, like a sort of black hole in outer space.

"Perhaps it could be arranged for them to explode in a remote period before there was any life on earth."

The scheme is being kept under wraps because of the incredible military potential and because some government leaders fear the public would get furious about financing research into comic-book concepts.

"We don't want any publicity on our research into futuristic projects," says a Pentagon official who did not want to be named.

"Not only does it alert the Soviets, but it gets the taxpayers very upset."

A bright light UFO IS SIGHTED

on a "AGE" (Aust) 3/22/82; Cr.: VanAndel dark night

Police searches near Greensborough last night failed to find a craft reported variously as a crashed aeroplane and — unidentified flying object.

Air Traffic Control at Tullamarine confirmed the sightings, of a bright green object with a yellow tail over the north-east of Melbourne.

A control spokesman said it was Jupiter. Sightings of the planet could be ascribed to the relatively low level of smog in Melbourne and the warm weather.

He said UFO sightings increased markedly on warm nights because there were more people outside gazing idly into the sky.

An Unidentified Flying Object was seen over Beac early Monday morning.

Milk bar owner, Mr Frank Bowen, said he and his daughter, Catherine, were up at 4.40 am and spotted an object hovering over the nearby hill.

Mr Bowen said it was round, bright, sparkly with glittering lights and appeared to have a dome on top.

He and his daughter watched it for about a quarter of an hour before going back to bed.

He said during that time, the UFO ascended further into the sky and was a most unusual sight.

Mr Bowen usually gets out of bed early to open the doors of his shop to allow the cool air in.

"STAR" (Melbourne, Australia); 1/03/82 Cr.: Thomas Van Andel

An Echuca woman on Monday morning reported sighting an unidentified flying object.

She saw it about 5.35 a.m. above the Hickory factory in Cornelia Creek Rd.

It was, she said, a huge red ball with a long, pointed and flickering tail.

The object, which was the first UFO the woman had seen, sped off — "like greased lightning" — disappearing in an easterly direction.

Space invaders buzzing Spain

MADRID (UPI) — More than 100 "Unidentified Flying Objects," including one the size of an oil tanker, were spotted in Spanish airspace in 1981, a UFO watcher says.

Juan Benitez, a journalist and UFO enthusiast from Bilbao, said the 141 sightings represented a slight decrease compared to the previous year.

Benitez said the captain of an Iberia jetliner reported he saw and received radar signals from "an enormous metal object as big as an oil tanker" off Spain's Atlantic coast last August. It measured 100 metres compared with an annual average increase of 0.12 centimetres.



Tammy Utt, 17 years old, is recently employed as a check-out cashier at the Super Value supermarket. The employment is only temporary as she continues her training in a Bell & Howell computer course. Yet, her temporary job did serve a purpose—she observed what she believes was an UFO after ending her tour at the 24-hour store.

Residing with her parents, James & Beverly Utt, just west of Escanaba in the rural district of Riverland, she got into her auto and headed for her home at about 11:30 p.m. It was a beautifully clear night, filled with stars and 3/4 moon, to drive the nearly 30 minutes to reach her house.

The following account of the incident is told to us by KATHERINE LE DUC, Chief Investigator for SBI in Escanaba, who interviewed six witnesses (3 for this case & 3 for other related encounters), investigated the site area & then documented the entire case:

Tammy traveled west for about 1/5 of a mile on County Road (CR) 414, after leaving work, making a left turn onto CR-533. After nearly 3/16 of a mile she saw two strange lights hovering just above the trees to her right. As she made a right turn back onto CR-414 Tammy said, "I looked up at the lights and they looked like bright headlights in the sky. They were stationary until I approached in their direction & then they "backed up." As I headed west again the two lights

followed me for about a mile or so. At about this point the road curves to the right, so I slowed down prior to it & I could, for the first time, see the object through my driver's side window."

Tammy further stated, "I could make out the shape of the object. It was flat on top with the sides of it sloping outward & had a rim around the bottom portion with tiny red windows all around it. I say red because a reddish glow was coming from inside the thing which could be seen through the windows."


Being frightened, & justifiably so, she refused to follow the curved road to the right since this would have placed the object to the rear of her, making it unobservable. Instead, she stopped her auto on the dark & lonely road & just watched in awe as the object also stopped.

"Seeing this, I backed up about 20 feet & stopped. I rolled down my window & shut off the radio to listen to any sounds, if any. I heard nothing & decided to turn off my headlights to maybe get a better view of this object which reminded me of a "straw hat," but when I did the object descended rapidly towards the ground. It appeared the curious looking object was trying to hide from me behind the trees. However, I still could see the bright white lights shining through them, so I definitely knew it was still there," said Tammy.


"Not a sole around, I decided to back up once again, this time about 200 feet, in order see it better. At this time the object ascended back up over the trees & hovered. Determined to see it better I backed up about another 1/8 of a mile, right in front

of Sodergren's General Store where CR-414 meets CR-537. I could now see the object, which also backed up, as I looked directly down CR-537. It was sitting on the road & its bright lights went out, I could see all the windows & little white lights on the bottom of each. I also saw a reflection from a blinking light, but could not see where it was coming from," Tammy further told Le Duc.

Tammy continued with, "I noticed the object was wider than the road itself (24') & there was absolutely no noise being emitted. Right about now my curious behavior changed to sheer panic! So, I raced for home about a mile away off of CR-13. The porch light was on & this made me happy since I didn't have to wake my folks to tell them what happened. I nearly tore the door off its hinges as I ran inside."

Katherine LeDuc began her tedious task of investigating further. She spoke to Roger Good, undersheriff for Delta County Sheriff's Dept., and found a 7-page report on the incident. (The SBI was alerted to the case by our law enforcement friends & is use to the great police work & report writing in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.)

Katherine then went to the encounter location & talked to Mr. & Mrs. Haga, who own the house in front of where the object landed on CR-537, & found they had heard & seen nothing. She also visited the exact site where the landing was to have occurred & noted a depression 54" wide, 112" long & about 10-24" in depth.

The following inquiries were made, with the following responses:

K.I. Sawyer Air Force Base—claims no helicopters in the air & nothing picked up on their SAC radar equipment. Dept. of Natural Resources—claims their helicopter was not in use during this time. Escanaba, Gladstone & Marquette public officials—claim no knowledge of the incident.

Katherine also found two other witnesses: one, Jamie Robinette who reported bright white lights near Sodergren's store between 11:30 & 11:45 p.m. and two, Bonnie Lee who reported a bright object with white lights that turned red at about the same time.

LeDuc really investigated well and found three other people who all observed a similar type UFO within a 5-day span of the Utt case. Gary DuBord sighted the UFO on February 9th at 1:45 p.m.; Ricky Mercier Powers reported the UFO on February 12th at 6:55 p.m.; & Todd Poquette saw it on February 13th at 5:45 p.m.

Tammy Utt is an outgoing, friendly, level-headed,


normal & healthy female who is very mature for her age. Besides our own investigator, Katherine LeDuc, also on hand were Dr. Kenneth Schellhase, his assistant known only as Mary, & Dr. J. Allen Hynek (all from the Center for UFO Studies—CUFOS.) & I'm positive they would agree in my conclusion that Tammy Utt is not a person to tell lies, seek recognition or publicity, suffer from delusions of grandeur, play practical jokes, or one who

alters their story each time it is told. I personally performed a Voice Stress Analysis from tape recordings sent the SBI and conclude she believes she is telling the truth & that the encounter truly occurred as she stated. In light of the facts presented in this case the SBI feels the Utt case should be labeled a "genuine unknown."

Numerous UFO sightings have been brought to our attention from Escanaba, Michigan & we are sure others will follow in the future.

The Hoaxing Contactee by Ken Behrendt

Since the mid-seventies the reader of the UFO literature may have noticed that there has been a steady decline in the number of UFO books that appear each year. In fact, the situation has deteriorated to the point where soon one may no longer be able to obtain inexpensive paperbacks that deal with the subject & will be forced to purchase only trade sized softcover & hardcover books. If current trends continue, then eventually the literature of ufology will consist only of privately printed limited edition books with sky high price tags.

As one writer who has had much difficulty getting my material into print, I have communicated with many publishers who have told me point blank why the above situation is now taking place in the UFO literature. As one can imagine the current state of our economy & the ever increasing costs associated with publication have much to do with the matter. For example, about ten years ago a hardcover book needed to sell only two or three thousand copies for the publisher to break even on his investment; today the figure has risen to between six & seven thousand copies to recover costs. Also publishers are quick to point out that general interest in the subject of UFOs has been dwindling due to the absence of large scale sightings in the U.S. & the lack of progress in the subject. To put it bluntly, the subject is getting a bit boring to the public and with this comes the reader apathy that has caused a contraction in the volume of literature produced on UFOs.

One category of the UFO literature has, however, managed to maintain its sales potential & is slowly but

surely accounting for a larger portion of the published UFO literature...I refer, of course, to the contactee books that have had a following since the early 1950's.

In the future these books will be taking up much of the limited space available writers & researchers on the subject of ufology & this is indeed a shame for the vast majority of these books are the sole product of the contactee's fantasies & add ab-

solutely nothing to mankind's understanding of the budding science of ufology. Their very existence serves as a crippling handicap that retards real progress in the field.

In discussing the success of UFO books with fellow ufologists, the question of the success of contactee books has occasionally arisen & I have found that their success is generally written off to the gullibility & uncritical acceptance of the general reader. I, however, do not agree with this conclusion...I feel these books thrive because we, the so called "serious" ufologists, have failed to provide the general reader with concrete answers to the enigma of UFOs. So great is the general readers' thirst for accurate knowledge on the subject that even the ultimately meaningless contactee literature is eagerly embraced to satisfy this thirst. It seems that in the absence of fact, many people will be satisfied with fantasy...& it's a fantasy that occupies an ever greater portion of the dwindling ufological page space.

One way to counter the above tendency is to develop criteria that will enable UFO writers & research-

ers to steer clear of the cases that eventually degenerate into the contactee type of case. Since most hoaxing contactees rarely tend to depend on the writing abilities of others... notably the principal investigators of their case. If the investigator can be made more aware of the type on contactee cases that are hoaxes, then less of such material will see the light of day in print. Readers, too, can help to stem the rising tide of contactee literature by avoiding writers & publishers who have a history of producing such books. Once the financial funding for such books dries up, they will quickly leave the UFO scene & we may expect a substantial rise in the quality of UFO literature as more scholarly & scientific works come in to fill the void.

At this point it seems appropriate to mention that this writer does not deny the reality of all CE-4 cases that would be too arbitrary & simplistic an attitude to adopt. Without a doubt, some of these cases are genuine & when that is the case it is most obvious from the network of independent corroborative evidence that is presented. But these kinds of contactee cases are the exception in the literature and the writer/investigator as well as the reader must be ever vigilant or he may wind up promoting or accepting fantasy instead of fact.

As a service to future investigators of potential contactee cases, I have prepared below a brief a brief psychological/scenario profile of what I believe is a typical hoaxing contactee & his/her actions. This profile should be thought of as a composite & is not intended to refer to any particular

hoaxing contactee. It should be viewed as a set of warning signals which, when observed, should alert investigators & readers to the high probability that they are becoming involved with a work of science fiction rather than science fact:

BACKGROUND

Hoaxing contactees tend to be undereducated, often not having graduated from high school. Because of this handicap they inevitably develop feelings of inadequacy & in their youth may be drawn into movements that make them feel special & superior. Often this takes the form of involvement with various religious groups or cults.

After a while with the group or cult, the potential contactee comes to realize that he & his fellow members are merely being used for the status or money they can provide the group's leaders with. The hoaxer's initial feelings of superiority fade & he is ready to try something else to boost his sagging ego.

The potential hoaxer may then pursue several various hobbies or group activities, but always it is the same story...only the leaders in the field or group get the big ego trips...the followers are the losers.

At this point, the potential hoaxer (who may be totally uninterested in ufo-logy at this point) is searching for some activity which with a minimum of effort & investment on his part can instantly confer leadership status on him. Often, if the hoaxer was involved with aprior religious group, he may have been secretly jealous of the status possessed by such figures as Moses, the various prophets, or Jesus. He

is impressed that their actions & sayings (of a moralistic nature) are still kept alive in religious literature & revered. He wishes he & his actions were important enough to make a difference in the lives of others.

TRIGGERING EVENT

Suddenly one day there is a rash of UFO sightings in the potential contactee's local area...perhaps he himself is lucky enough to catch a glimpse of the elusive UFOs. These events have an immediate & potent effect on the hoaxer. He realizes suddenly that UFOs represent the ultimate reality of the universe. He rushes out & reads the literature of the field...he also reads many contactee books & becomes familiar with the accepted terminology & scenarios of the subject.

He realizes that his contact with aliens would be of tremendous importance to humanity & would confer great status on himself...just like the prophets of old, he could act as an intermediary between the technological goods & inferior for mankind! He, too, will gain the status he desperately needs to make his life have some meaning.

SUBSEQUENT ACTIONS

The potential hoaxer may now begin driving around late at night hoping that he is to be suddenly, telepathically forced to stop so he can be hustled aboard a landed UFO to begin his career as an intermediary. Unfortunately, this just doesn't happen & all the frustrated individual is left with is the rich fantasies he's concocted as to how such an encounter might have proceeded.

This frustration proves too much for the future hoaxing contactee to bear & on one of his nightly drives he leaves his car & quietly makes his way across the dark

terrain to a point several miles from his vehicle. Hours later he comes upon a passing car or a lonely house & excitedly claims he was just released by a UFO. The police are summoned & the "witness" obtains the "official verification" he needs for his story. At the very least, the abduction/contact winds up on the local police blotter which is available to the public, reporters & UFO investigators. No matter how unbelievable the witness's story, the fact that many others have reported sighting UFOs lends the hoaxer's tale a certain amount of credibility.

At this point the hoaxing contactee sits back & waits the arrival of reporters & UFO organization investigators...his most secret desires are soon to be realized.

THE INVESTIGATION

If after a week from a bogus experience the hoaxing contactee does not get discovered by investigators, he will send every UFO organization he can obtain an address for a letter that shortly states his experience. Investigators then flock to his residence & each hears the tale & visits the abduction/contact site. The witness mentally keeps track of the personages he meets & is most helpful with those that seem to believe his fantasy & seem most likely to be able to get it into print. As investigators who see the weakness of the hoaxer's case slowly drop out, only a single persistent one is left... he becomes the "principal" investigator & may share a special relationship with the "witness" that can stretch over several years or until one of them is convinced the whole story has been as accurately as possible.

THE EVIDENCE

The hoaxing contactee can often provide massive amounts of photographic evidence to bolster the reality of his experiences...these are obtained by tossing up small models of UFOs & photographing them against the sky with a simple camera. Landed UFOs are never shown because they are too difficult to fake & a simple camera does not require any focusing during the few seconds the model is airborne.

The fuzzy details of the hoaxer's experience can then be sharpened up through the use of the much over-rated regression hypnosis. After a quick visit to the local library the witness learns to imitate the state of hypnosis well enough to fool even an experienced hypnotist. Then in a slow, halting voice the now full-fledged contactee delivers a highly detailed account of his abduction/contact complete with descriptions of the aliens, the interior of their craft, & a tantalizing pseudo-scientific description of its means of propulsion. Also since the tape recorders are spinning this is a good time to deliver a message from the space people to humanity. Rather than something useful like a cure for cancer or a way of turning water into gasoline, the message delivered will deal with moral issues & would have us believe all of earth's woes are due to the imperfect character of its inhabitants whereas the witness was selected for the privilege of contact due to his superior moral qualities.

On subsequent contacts the witness may obtain further "proof" of his experience in the form of various artifacts such as pieces of metal which may be inscribed with alien

letters or broken bits of crystal used in the UFOs propulsion.

THE CONCLUSION

Most hoaxing contactees do not like to end their cases since they may need additional material for future books & to keep the show going they may maintain contact with the aliens through additional & random personal meetings, trance like states where they are possessed by aliens, or through messages delivered via automatic writings.

A clear indication that a contactee case is a hoax is given by the uncanny way in which critical observations that can confirm or deny his experiences are usually made only by the witness himself; this is because cohorts who might later recant their supportive testimony are too risky to have around. The hoaxer prefers to work alone, not only for the sake of security, but to also guarantee that no one else will be in a position to steal the hoaxer's limelight...or worse yet black mail him for the fraud he has committed.

As the case progresses, arrangements may finally be made to have the witness undergo a polygraph test. This will be resited at all costs, but if forced upon the hoaxer with the consequent negative results, will be written off as merely "inconclusive" due to the nervous condition of the contactee or the bizarre neurological changes that have taken place in him since his medical examination by the strange instruments of the aliens.

The successful hoaxing contactee finally makes it to that golden day when his tale appears in print & is permanently enshrined in the literature of ufology. He is a special, superior person

who has beaten the odds to get his message across to humanity. He is now one with Moses, Plato, Jesus, Mohammed and all the other greats of history...his careful efforts have delivered an ego trip that will keep him flying for the rest of his life.

The hoaxing contactee is finally a winner & ufology is the final loser.

Giant hole in ice baffles experts





UFO art at museum

There will be a UFO art show at the Queens Museum from July 31 to October 31, at 246 W. 16th St. Over the decades since World War II unidentified flying objects—UFOs—have taken their place in our collective image bank. According to polls on the subject, the idea of UFOs is familiar to over 95% of the population. Whatever one thinks about the physical reality of these objects—and nearly 60% of the population believe they are physically real—we all know what they are supposed to look like, how they are supposed to behave.

UFOs are a staple of television, popular films and fiction, but they have also become a new and potent image in the iconography of the visual arts. And so this exhibition—a show of art based on UFOs as iconography, as a ubiquitous phenomenon that has influenced many contemporary artists.

The exhibition will include paintings, sculptures, photographs and mixed-media works selected from two related categories. In the first, the works all deal directly and literally with the UFO as iconographic object, such as H.C. Westerman's "UFO Landing in Africa," Jean Highstein's "Flying Saucer," and Chris Van Allsburg's "Incident at the Observatory."

The second, and larger category will consist of more abstract works which have been subtly, or sometimes overtly, influenced by the UFO phenomenon. Its pervasive ambience alone has been sufficient to color the work of a number of painters and sculptors. Many other artists admit to an intense interest in the subject, of claim to have had a UFO sighting or experience of some sort. In more than a few instances the resulting art works have been deeply affected.

Since 1975 I have been investigating the UFO phenomenon, along with a group of astronomers, psychologists, medical professionals, and otherscientists and laymen. In that

time I have dealt with about a half-dozen artists who have apparently undergone actual UFO abduction experiences, the details of which have come to light through the use of regressive hypnosis. Some of these artists are well known, and all desire anonymity. The work of several will be included in this exhibition.

And so this second category will consist of a) works obviously influenced by the pervasive UFO image world; b) works by artists affected by their UFO interest and/or personal sightings; and c) UFO—influenced works by artists who have had profound UFO encounters. The category to which an artist belongs will in no way be made public; the exhibition is a visual event only, and no biographical information on this issue will be made known.

Examples of artists who could be included in this second and larger part of the show are Howardena Pindell, Steve Keister, Tyrone Mitchell, Pat Pasch, Larry Fink, Bill Jensen, Carol Diehl, Vincent Mariani, Robert Cullen, Toby Buonaguiro and Budd Hopkins, among others.

As a subsidiary feature of the exhibition, a separate area may be devoted to documenting the UFO phenomenon, and thereby demonstrating the interaction of art and social context. It would include UFO photographs and historical material, as well as unattributed quotes from artist—participants in the show—excerpts from hypnotic sessions, descriptions of UFOs they sighted, and so forth. A series of panel discussions, lectures and films on the subject is being planned for presentation over the three month run of the show.

Considered any way one wishes, contemporary life has been enriched and expanded by the UFO phenomenon. Whether UFOs are myth or reality, religion or science, they have undeniably widened the framework of our speculations, our curiosity, and our shared cultural image world. This exhibition, "The UFO Show," will be a physically beautiful testimonial to one of our central mysteries.


