How dare NOVA, America's award-winning documentary series, present a UFO program on the Public Broadcasting System (PBS) that diverts from the true facts of the phenomenon? How dare NOVA call serious-minded researchers, as well as witnesses of UFOs, religious fanatics, cultists, or outright hoaxers? How dare NOVA try to pull the wool over the America public's eyes and not expect any rebuttal from those of us who have dedicated our spare time to inform the public for the past 35 years on the reality of the enigma on a world-wide scale and the role our government plays in suppressing the hard core facts on the existence of these objects from us?

Excerpts from a press release prior to the airing of the program are as follows:

"Are they Watching?

"The Air Force says the reports are groundless. The CIA says they're not responsible. The sightings, however, continue unabated. Now NOVA presents television's first rigorous, scientific investigation into the fact, fiction, and hoax of unidentified flying objects, in 'The Case of the UFOs,' airing on Tuesday, October 12, 8:00 p.m., on PBS.

"UFO sightings are often reported in sensationalist newspapers. NOVA, however, introduces serious investigators who are carefully sifting, researching, and interpreting UFO reports, because they feel there is more to UFOs than fantasy.

"NOVA takes a penetrating look at several famous UFO reports. Were Apollo astronauts shadowed by mysterious spacecraft on their way to the moon? NOVA shows a NASA film which led to this report, and interviews the astronaut involved, Pete Conrad.

"NOVA also investigates the UFOs allegedly sighted from an airplane over New Zealand on New Year's Eve 1978, which were filmed by a BBC camera crew. NOVA presents the film along with the sound recording made by the crew during their harrowing experience. NOVA retraces the airplane's flight path with the original pilot, searching for an explanation.

"Was Travis Walton, an Arizona lumberjack, abducted by aliens, and taken into their spaceships? He passed a lie detector test on his story, which was reported coast-to-coast by a national newspaper. NOVA interviews Walton, and also reveals little-known facts about the lie test and the newspaper's involvement.

"What about Police Deputy Val Johnson, whose cruiser reportedly was damaged in an encounter with a brilliant ball of light? NOVA reports on a fascinating, though controversial, theory which connects this UFO report and many others with powerful forces inside the earth. Some scientists believe this theory can also

account for reports of extraordinary religious apparitions.

"The U.S. military closed its official investigation of UFOs 13 years ago but NOVA proves that serious study of these mysterious phenomena is very much alive, and may just be on the verge of significant discoveries."

PBS ignores own publicity

In my opinion, if the program were produced within the guidelines of NOVA's own press release the public may have had the opportunity to distinguish from the pros and cons of UFO reports, instead of the one-sided "UFOs do not exist and anyone who sees one is either a lunatic, liar, or mistaken" type attitude that was projected.

NOVA is produced for PBS-TV by WGBH (John Groom, producer) in Boston and apparently contracted Kendrick Frazier as a consultant for the program. Mr. Frazier, by coincidence, is editor of "The Skeptical Inquirer, The Zetetic" published by the Committee for the Scientific Claims of the Paranormal, a well-known group of UFO skeptics comprised of many of the participants of the program — coincidence again we are made to assume. Producer John Groom and executive-producer John Mansfield have already been contacted by MUFON (Mutual UFO Network), CUFOS (Center for UFO Studies) and SBI (Scientific Bureau of Investigation) by both telephone and letter to express our disgust and contempt with the program which appeared to be a "debunking tactic" and misinformation to the general public — possibly even a fraud since the program is labeled a "scientific expose."

Let's explore the program further. First, NOVA's press release makes absolutely no mention of the participants of the program. This was a diversion to distract attention to its biased contributors whereby UFO groups may have banned together to block the airing of the program to the public, or at least demand equal time.

Editing supports debunkers

Second, Dr. J. Allen Hynek (CUFOS director) was literally ousted

from the program and never mentioned once during the hour-long show. Then, may I ask, what happened to four reels of film that were made of him and about major UFO investigations documented by CUFOS?

Third, both Dr. Bruce S. Maccabee and Alan Hendry were participants of the program and, yet, many of their contributions were purposely edited in such a fashion to appear as though they agreed with the five remaining debunking speakers: James E. Oberg, Philip J. Klass, Michael A. Persinger, Ph.D., Dr. Brian Brady and W. "Bill" Ireland. Why?

Fourth, John Schuessler (deputy-director of MUFON) was filmed for the program in regards to the well-documented Cash/Landrum case that occurred in Texas on December 29, 1980. Why was Schuessler ousted from the program and not a mention made in reference to this (possible military involvement) case?

Fifth, why is it that neither MUFON, SBI, or many other credible and reliable UFO organizations around the world were made aware of this proposed UFO program or asked for their consultantship? Is it the fact that MUFON has too many powerful scientific and medical consultants in their membership that could openly dispute NOVA's team of debunkers' claims with hard-core facts? Is it the fact that the SBI has too many trained law enforcement officers within its membership that have sighted UFOs and can be considered professional observers? Of course, it stands to reason, UFO groups in Canada and overseas were not consulted since NOVA did not wish to imply that the UFO phenomenon is a world-wide enigma that has existed for the past 35 years.

Cases not explained

Finally, Deputy Val Johnson's case was not fully explained to the public. No mention of the fact that whatever struck his police cruiser caused an implosion of glass rather than an explosion; no mention was made of the three areas of his windshield that formed a triangular pattern; no mention was made that the antenna on the auto was bent forward rather than backwards (as would occur when an

UFOs in New York State pt. 1

In last week's issue of the UFO Supplement I reported on the recent UFO sighting over New York City on August 24. By no means is UFO activity a newcomer to New York residents. This week's article, hopefully, shall enhance the UFO enthusiasts' knowledge of UFO events in New York State — only the tip of the iceberg — which have been investigated and documented by the SBI (Scientific Bureau of Investigation).

On November 12, 1981 an unidentified flying object was sighted by at least a dozen witnesses according to SBI Chief Investigator in upstate New York David Waters. Waters explains, "The UFO was first sighted near the Warren County Airport and later spotted in areas of Saratoga County. Witnesses alleged to have sighted a series of bright white objects with a greenish tint moving erratically in the sky." Waters further stated, "The UFO was at a low altitude, moving slowly and hovering at times. All of the witnesses interviewed claimed that the entire surrounding area was absolutely dead quiet."

A strange coincidence

"Speculating further," said Waters, "it is strangely coincidental that at about the same time as the sighting phone service went out in the Saratoga area from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m." Waters telephoned the headquarters of the SBI in Staten Island and found to his amazement that numerous other UFO activity of a similar UFO occurred in Vermont, New Jersey, Ohio and Pennsylvania in addition to the New York State sighting.

It seems that on that clear, cold Thursday night in November, at about 6:45 p.m. (EST), a triangular arrangement of four UFOs was observed by Larry Figueras, 39, his daughter Christina, 14, and their neighbor Bernard O'Connell, 67. Cooborating the sighting further, the object was also viewed some distance away by Jenny Wiley.

Larry had just lost telephone service a few moments before going next door to use their neighbor's, thinking the trouble was with his phone alone. Proceeding next door with his daughter they observed the eerie lights traveling from the north slowly to the south. The nocturnal lights were arranged with three of the four objects evenly spaced in the front and the remaining one in the rear. Larry tried to notice if the lights were connected by some sort of solid body but could not determine if any existed. As they watched in awe, the UFOs stopped abruptly, hovered motionless, and pivoted so that the front row was on the bottom and the rear object was on top.

As the two Figueras continued to watch the objects from outside their rural home in Saratoga, surrounded by high power transmission towers, they saw the objects "merge" with the center object in the front row — it was now one large bright white object! Yet, the rear object did not merge with these objects rather it moved swiftly to the left side of the larger object. At this point the two objects began to flash brilliantly from left to right, first at a slow pace when rapidly for a few seconds. When the flashing ceased it seemed the aerial show had just begun. The objects erratically maneuvered in the sky, moving up and down, back and forth, and ascending and descending slowly and at great speeds. Finally, after 20 minutes of viewing this spectacle, the objects appeared to come close to the ground behind two old silos and then rapidly ascend straight up and out of sight.

Objects made no sound

During the time of the sighting the witnesses agree they heard no sounds of any kind and smelled nothing unusual. None of the witnesses were injured due to the sighting and none suffered an after effect of any kind. However, two points must be stated for the record. One, the Figueras' family dog, at one point during the sighting, broke from its leash and ran back into the house barking. Two, a circular glowing patch on the ground was observed where the objects descended behind the silos before departing to places unknown.

Waters investigated the Figueras and the sighting diligently and found the following to be true. The night was dry, clear and cold, reaching a low of 25 degrees. Sunset was at 4:33 p.m. and the moon rose at 5:37 p.m. There were many stars visible that evening, however, Venus was out of the southwest at about 20 degrees and set at 6:49 p.m. The Figuera family are a very religious family, belonging to the Assembly of God Church in Saratoga. They all appear to be honest and straight forward when questioned about the sighting and share a common interest in wanting to know what they saw.

Waters searched for more witnesses and came in touch with Paul Bartholomew, an independent UFO researcher in the area. Waters came to learn that on the same night as the Figueras' sighting a triangular arrangement of lights was seen by William Barrett at about 6:40 p.m. Barrett, in turn, called his wife and a friend, Roger Mamman, also of Glen Falls to tell them what he had seen. Thus, two more witnesses confirmed the report of this strange event. At about 6:30 p.m. Francis Baker, of Hampton, also reported observing a triangular-type object for nearly half an hour. Similarly, Paula Henderes, of Saratoga, spotted the same object at

around 7:15 p.m. and, coincidentally, sketched the same type of formation of objects as Figuera.

Phone service interrupted

Dave Waters is an experienced UFO investigator and for this reason the SBI takes all his documented reports seriously. Waters, in his concluding report to us, notes several coincidences that make it of noteworthy value to report here. For example, the telephone company in Saratoga experienced a three hour interruption in phone service to call customers bearing either a 584 or 587 in the first three digits of their phone number. A spokesman for the phone company, Carmine Angelotti, was contacted and stated, "The failure is a result of an interfacing mechanism burn-up. It isn't anything peculiar, it has happened before." Waters investigation, through telephone company records, clearly indicate that never before in the New York Telephone's history has two complete exchanges been knocked out simultaneously; partial, localized loss of service due to storms, accidents, etc. have occurred but never such a complete shut down.

Waters further learned from the Volunteer Fire Departments in the area that during the time of the sighting, also the loss of phone service, they experienced interference with their radio reception, basically they had problems receiving or transmitting calls — electromagnetic (EM) effect?

Waters also learned that sporadic power failures occurred in the village of Ft. Edward and the town of Wilton. However, when Waters called Al Jennings, a spokesman for the Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation, he could not obtain any further data since he was politely informed, "No comment!"

Interesting to note is the fact the following day, Friday the 13th, residents of upstate New York noticed a lot of air traffic which is highly unusual in this area. Still yet, on December 14 of the same year an earthquake transpired over the area where the UFOs were sighted. Coincidentally, the epicenter of the quake was close to where the Figueras reside. This was the first quake to ever be reported on this particular fault and the first quake to be felt in the area in several decades.

Dave Waters conclusions of the New York incident are as follows: "There was one or more objects that traveled from the north, southward, to Saratoga and vicinity areas. It was seen by several separate groups of witnesses, whose testimony are very similar. I could not find any evidence of a landing or touchdown at the Figueras' site location. There was not visible signs in the calve to knee-high grass. A check for radiation probed negative beyond normal background

object struck the auto head on). In the case of Travis Walton, NOVA prevailed in making him appear as a total lying hoaxer. Absolutely no answer was given in respect to where Walton's body would have disappeared to for five days after, allegedly, being struck by a ball of electrical plasma and developing amnesia as suggested by Dr. Persinger. As to the New Zealand pilot who observed a UFO while transporting a BBC camera crew, since the pilot did not once alter his opinion of his professional observation, the incident was rudely explained away as reflections from fishing boat lights, temperature inversions, refraction of light emitted from a city 80 miles away, and even the planet Venus.

To back up NOVA's team of debunkers, radar technicians monitoring the aircraft at the time conveniently forgot to remember who told the pilot that there were six UFOs approaching the plane. How come the public was not able to listen to the taped conversation from the pilot and radar technician of that night? However, the public was able to listen to Apollo moon mission tapes between Houston Control and astronaut Pete Conrad. Why was Pete Conrad the only astronaut interviewed for the program? Why didn't they use Gordon Cooper as a participant? Perhaps NASA was afraid Cooper would tell the public he's observed UFOs a number of times while in space as would other astronauts than Conrad.

To top it all off, NOVA led the public to believe that the Air Force and our government has not investigated or documented another UFO incident since its termination of Project Bluebook (22 years investigation of UFOs by the USAF). Naturally, this is a total lie and can be proven by recently obtained documents under the Freedom of Information Act from American intelligence-gathering agencies. By the same token, these documents were never even mentioned on the program. Why? Equally confusing was the program's conclusion whereby a segment from a fantastic color movie film depicting a UFO traveling at a tremendous speed was shown to the watching public. However, not a hint of the date, year, time, location or photographer of film were given. Why?

Major UFO figures ignored

There are numerous other questions that come to mind immediately while viewing the NOVA program. Why wasn't Ted Philips (physical trace expert) consulted? Why wasn't Leonard Stringfield (crash/retrieval expert) consulted? Why weren't excellent investigators, who have authored several books on the subject, consulted such as Raymond Fowler, William Moore, or Budd Hopkins? Why weren't UFO hypnosis experts Drs. James Harder or Leo Sprinkle asked for their participation? Why

wasn't the SBI asked to be a participant in order to show and demonstrate the effectiveness of the Voice Stress Analyzer?

The late Dr. James E. McDonald once said, "... UFOs are a problem that has been lost from sight, swept under the rug, ignored, and now needs to be very rapidly brought out into the open as a problem demanding a very serious and very high-caliber scientific attention." One time General Stamford (then Director of Intelligence) stated, "Credible people are observing relatively incredible objects." I guess statements such as these, and scores of others, don't mean a hill of beans.

The entire scope of the NOVA program was to ridicule the witnesses and researchers of the phenomenon, to minimize the importance of the subject, and to either dismiss, disregard or totally ignore 35 years of hard core facts on the enigma. No, neither the SBI or any other UFO group wants a formal apology from WGBH or its sponsors. What we want is equal time which should be allotted to us in order to make the viewing public fully aware of the entire scope of the phenomenon, thereby letting them decide for themselves.

The SBI, MUFON, CUFOS and all other UFO groups too numerous to mention, wish the readers of News World's UFO Supplement to voice your opinion on the NOVA program for two reasons: one, as an enthusiast of UFOlogy it is your duty and two, if you don't voice an opinion surely this sort of thing will continue.

Please contact the general manager of your PBS-TV outlet and bluntly state your dissatisfaction with the October 12th program. Pass this information on to other persons interested in ufology and have them do the same. Write a formal letter of complaint and ask that UFO organizations be given the right to express the truth of the matter immediately.

Address your complaints to: Mr. John Mansfield, executive producer for NOVA, WGBH Educational Foundation, 125 Western Avenue, Boston, Massachusetts 02134. Make sure you mention the name of the program, the date you viewed it and the PBS station that aired it.

Now is the time to put up or shut up! The public has always wanted cooperation between UFO groups and now it exists. We all ask you to aid us in this suppression of real UFO evidence from the American public.

UFO cause eyed in upstate N.Y. telephone cutoff

Phones quit as huge UFO hovers

The following is a statement which was broadcast over WWSC-radio, in Glen Falls, New York on Friday November 13, 1981: "A number of persons from throughout the Glen Falls-Queensbury area reported sighting an unusual object in the sky last night. A spokesman from Warren County Airport told us he had received calls from several individuals claiming to have seen a large triangular shaped object with lights . . . and as big — if not bigger — than the Good Year blimp. An airport official said the object wasn't anything from the airport and he wasn't sure what it might have been. Most of the persons sighting the object said it moved very slowly, approximately 1,000 feet above the ground, having orange, yellow and white lights and made no noise."

May have disrupted phones

Chief Investigator for the SBI (Scientific Bureau of Investigation) in New York David Waters claims that his investigation leads him to believe the UFO observed by numerous people may have caused the interruption of telephone service for three hours and sporadic power failures in the area. Waters states that it is not unheard of to have power and phone failures in areas where UFOs are sighted."

Thanks to Waters and independent researcher Paul Bartholomew, through a cooperative feedback procedure, we are able to clearly define the events of November 12, 1981 to our readers. This type of cooperation should be a model for all other UFO researchers to follow, indicating that harmony, respect and an exchange of information can be achieved in the field of ufology.

The first person to report the sighting to station WWSC was Mr. Bartholomew's brother Robert, who was taking phone calls from witnesses and relaying the messages to his brother for further investigation. And although the sighting primarily transpired in Glen Falls, it is by no means confined to this area or time (around 6:40 p.m.) EST). UFO reports were also received from Saratoga

Spring, Hampton, Granville, Whitehall, Richford and several other states.

One witness, William Barrett of Glen Falls, stated, "I looked out the window about 6:40 p.m. and this thing came out of the eastern sky . . . coming from the east for a period of time and then turned due south. It had several lights . . . white lights . . . shaped like a triangle with its sides not quite as long as its base. The object was relatively low flying and some of the seven lights on it were flashing while others remained stationary. But what got me is it was damn big."

The interview continued with Mr. Bartholomew asking question after question in reference to the sighting. Barrett further commented, "The object wasn't making any audible noise . . . not like a jet, private aircraft, or helicopter. This thing was noiseless!" During the sighting, Barrett had time to call his neighbor next door. Hence, Mr. and Mrs. Roger Hamman viewed the strange object as well.

Wide as a football field

Mr. Hamman claims, "I ran out on my lawn with my wife and there was this object in the sky . . . large, very large . . . triangular-shaped. the best way to describe it would be to relate it to ducks flying in formation. I heard absolutely no noise being emitted from this object and observed several lights around its edges. To relate just how large this thing was I'll say that it appeared to be as wide as a football field . . . low to the ground. I don't know whether or not I believe in UFOs, all I know is that I saw this thing, my wife saw it and my neighbor saw it and I have no idea what it was."

Next came Mr. Francis Baker of Hampton, who also reported the object. Baker states, "The object was triangular in shape, like a hang-glider . . . since it was noiseless . . . and tremendous in size. My wife also observed the object with me sometime between 6 and 7 p.m. for approximately half an hour. The object was circling toward the east." The Baker's were on their way to a Grand Union supermarket and when they arrived Mrs. Baker pointed the object out to a woman outside the

store and she observed the object too.

At about 7:15 p.m. Paula Henderes of Saratoga Springs claimed she saw the object along with two friends. "I only saw the lights . . . it was really clear. It was scary watching it for about five minutes . . . you know, the phones were out, lights were going out all over the place . . . truly scary!"

Of course, more sighting reports were received (see UFO Supplement, September 4th and 11th issues) throughout the day. Dave Waters called numerous city and government agencies in order to determine if the object was conventional in nature — explainable. In an article appearing in the Schenectady Gazette (November 1981), staff reporter Michael Sorenson interviewed New York Telephone spokesman Carmine Angelotti in reference to Waters' allegation that UFOs caused the phone interruption over the area. Angelotti, naturally being the district staff manager of public relations, claimed the malfunction was possibly due to a minicomputer failure. However, Angelotti gracefully stated, "I found Waters' telephone call to me refreshing, a delight to think that UFOs could have been the cause of the problem. Our technicians thought the call was very interesting when I told them about it." Angelotti went to a lot of trouble for someone who was near positive a computer failure caused the malfunction of telephone service. He called AT&T to see if any studies had been done in the Bell system about UFOs and their effect on phone service. "They have never been asked that question before," he said.

Needless to say, the phone company's position was that there was a mechanical malfunction, and UFOs had no connection to the phone disorders of that evening. "It's a rare occurrence that computers go down. The switching system is the most complex system on this planet. However, this is not to say Mr. Waters is not correct," Angelotti concluded.

Mohawk Valley a UFO hotbed

Waters said he could not prove cause and effect of a UFO sighting with phone disorder. Yet, Waters commented, "This is not the first sighting of a UFO in this area of New York. UFOs are often reported along earthquake fault lines, and a fault line exists from Lake Champlain south to Schenectady and continues on to Manhattan." Waters added, "Not many people know this, but the Mohawk Valley is a hotbed for UFO activity. The activity not only includes UFOs, but a Loch Ness type creature in Lake Champlain, and a similar type creature also seen north of the Scandaga Reservoir." Little did Waters know when he made this statement that on December 14, one month after the sightings, Saratoga Springs would be gently rocked by an earthquake. It was shallow but could be felt and read 2.2 on the Richter scale.

According to Walter Mitronovas, a spokesman for the U.S. Geological Survey in Albany, there hasn't been a

detectable earthquake in that area for about 31 years. Coincidentally, a man by the name of Figueras (the same last name of a witness who reported sighting four UFOs near his home in Saratoga and is not related in any way; see last week's UFO Supplement) actually predicted the quake four weeks prior to its occurrence but no one took him seriously.

As a final comment by this writer in reference to these sightings and the others that will surely follow, perhaps ufologists and UFO enthusiasts will come to realize just how important it is for everyone researching this phenomenon — independently or through an organization — to have a "standardized" procedure and vocabulary for investigating and documenting. For example, Paul Bartholomew's independent research is very good but could be altered to excellent if the proper training were given him. How many independent researchers are there in the USA who know what they are doing but are improperly trained? How many do not know what procedures to follow, what methods to utilize, or have either a basic UFO vocabulary of their own?

I found Bartholomew's reports fully detailed with a word-by-word description of what each witness observed during the sighting. Yet, independent researchers have their own way of doing things and because of this much is lost in the documentation of the case. Bartholomew's reports, like so many other independent researchers, failed to include essential data in the body of the reports — ages of some of the witnesses, education, religion, race, color, creed, physiological and psychological effects during and after the encounter, interest in UFOlogy, psychic abilities (if any), texture of the object, odors, weather astronomical statistics for that day, background verification of military installations, airports, nuclear or atomic facilities, bodies of water and high power transmission lines in or around the area of the sighting, illnesses or injuries during or after the sighting, physical evidences (if any) and their analysis reports, and camera data if a photograph was taken during the sighting.


These are only a mere handful of inquires to explore when dealing with UFO witnesses. The UFO phenomenon is so complex that a proper scientific study cannot be accomplished unless we (UFOlogists) all research the enigma using the same guidelines for documentation of a case. Until such a time, we will never gain much progression in obtaining the answers we all crave.

Chief Investigator for the SBI (Scientific Bureau of Investigation) in New York David Waters claims that his investigation leads him to believe the UFO observed by numerous people may have caused the interruption of telephone service for three hours and sporadic power failures in the area.

By the same token, Paul Bartholomew should be commended for his valuable dedication and persistence in persuing this 35-year mystery all by himself. Without his assistance the SBI may not have learned of the many other cases involved in this sighting. Similarly, Dave Waters deserves the Medal of Honor for his courageous and determined outspokenness in dealing with local, city and governmental agencies during these New York sightings.

UFO - Over Argentina

December 10, 1981: Juan C. Meneses claims that he was tele-transported 100 kilometers from Route 5, near the city of San Luis del Palmar in Corrientes Province.

Meneses said he was in his truck when he was blinded by a "very strong light." When the light struck him, he lost consciousness and awoke to find himself and his truck near the city of Beron de Astrada, 100 kilometers away.

He was then admitted to Caa-Cati hospital with a nervous breakdown. Six days later he was released but he continued to suffer recurring nightmares of the encounter.

"The light was very white as well as bright and engulfed the entire truck," he recalled. He further stated, "I was semi-conscious and could see everything floating. The bad part came later when I realized I was in a metal-type room. I was floating upside down, as though I was suspended in mid-air and I could see a very thin being, about a meter high. He reminded me of a Christmas tree since he was of a greenish-grey coloring," Meneses continued.

"The being did not talk," said Meneses, "but I could hear its questions mentally. Its forehead was wrinkled, its arms so long they almost touch its feet. My body felt very heavy and at one point, I began to walk about one block's distance to my truck, started my vehicle and drove down the road. About then I realized I was far away from where I had remembered being before. When I reached the town I went to the police."

Meneses also stated, "at the police station an officer notified another city and they came to pick me up and take me to the hospital. I am now truly scared."

This interview was performed at Meneses' home in the presence of his wife & Dr. Alberto Vidal (M.D.) in order to keep him calm during the documentation. After his encounter with the UFO, the town of Ciudad Paz where he resides was visited by a UFO that flew low over the province. Needless to say,

the townspeople were very frightened. This scared, panic feeling lasted over 48 hours because most residents felt they too were going to be abducted like Meneses. This experience has a solid man of excellent reputation and transformed him into a person who is afraid of the dark & does not wish to be alone.

Dr. Vidal stated, "I know this man for years & he is not one who fantasizing. I was impressed to see a grown man crying non-stop whenever we spoke of the incident."

Dr. Vidal further commented, "I really never saw a person in that bad of shape with much distress and fear. He must have had a horrendous experience."

Mr. Meneses is now fairly back to normal with the exception of a red mark on the top of his eyes. However, he is still taking tranquilizer for his tension and fear. As soon as he is fully recovered a psychoanalysis is planned.

A week after the Meneses encounter, in a town called Berqui, Mr. Sixto Barrios reported that an object lit up a room of his house with blue light and his dog barked all that night. The next morning a circular burn mark was found on his farm and four depression marks. As of today nothing grows in that area.

An airline pilot who saw the light from his home said it was like that of a Saturn rocket launch—but in the reverse direction.

Strange light on the horizon

There has been another UFO sighting in the Ashburton district.

A farmer, Mr Jack Howden and his son, Stewart, were outside the old Westerfield homestead 20 kilometres from Ashburton at 4.30 a.m. getting sheep ready for the transporters, when their attention was taken by a bright object in the sky on the north-east horizon.

They took a fix on the object by lining it up with a tree, and this proved it was a moving object, hovering rather than moving at speed.

Mr Howden and his son watched the mysterious object for over an hour, and they say it was still visible in daylight at 6.30 a.m.

Because of this, Mr Howden is convinced the object was not the reflection of lights from a ship off the coast.

"It was definitely moving on the horizon. It was a long way off and we didn't see windows or little green men looking out," he said.

"It was like a very bright star, but of course it wasn't. Stars don't move," Mr Howden said.

He says he has always had an open mind about UFOs and doesn't believe we are the only intelligent beings in the galaxy.

On January 26, Mrs Lillian Cockburn of Tucker Street west saw a bright moving light in the sky towards the east at 3.15 a.m., and the object was also reported from Christchurch.

Police report UFO over Seneca fields

TIFFIN (AP) — Two Seneca County deputy sheriffs say they saw an unidentified flying object soaring above the cornfields near Tiffin early yesterday.

The object, according to Seneca County Sheriff Weldin Neff, appeared to be a bright, white ball of light that was just above cloud level, but appeared to be at an altitude below two small airplanes seen in the sky at the same time.

Neff said he was contacted just after 2 a.m. by Cpl. Jim Wood and Deputy Michael Hall. They told him they saw the light moving south at moderate speed. They said they watched the object for about two minutes before it vanished.

The sheriff and another deputy sheriff went to the scene, on a Pleasant Township road near Fort Seneca, about five miles north of Tiffin. But Neff and the third deputy sheriff did not see the object.

Neff said he had received three reports of UFO sightings by the public earlier in the week. Those differed from the report filed by the deputy sheriffs because the citizens said the ball of light they saw was colored.

"The explanation? I really don't know. There are a lot of unexplained things in the world for which there is no definition," Neff said. "I haven't really come to any conclusion."

The Federal Aviation Administration's regional air traffic control center in Oberlin and the UFO Reporting Center in Seattle said they had received no similar reports.

"It's been quiet — unusually quiet," said Robert Gribble, director of the UFO center, a private research group.

Pilot Beams Thoughts to UFO

In a stunning UFO encounter, a veteran jetliner pilot actually communicated mentally with an incredibly brilliant object that kept pace off the wing tip of his Boeing 727 for more than an hour.

The pilot beamed his thoughts, asking for a sign indicating if there was intelligent life in the UFO. The object then grew phenomenally brighter and moved much closer.


On the Boeing, some 150 awestruck passengers alerted by the pilot observed the UFO.

"It was beautiful. I never thought such brilliant light existed in the universe. I felt like crying — not out of fear but out of happiness," declared passenger Cilezia del Rosso, 29.

The remarkable object was also seen by two other jetliner captains and was tracked for a time on radar.

Flight 169 of Brazil's VASP Airlines was en route from Fortaleza to Rio de Janeiro when the unforgettable encounter occurred. It was 3:12 a.m. February 8.

"I observed a bright light coming in our direction. Its brilliance was like a giant flare sending off different colored rays, from red to orange but predominantly blue and white," pilot Gerson Britto told *The ENQUIRER*. He radioed for information and was told there was nothing on radar anywhere near his jet.




Minutes later, the captains of two jetliners elsewhere radioed that they, too, had seen the object.

Britto, recalling books he'd read about telepathic communication, beamed thought messages to the UFO.

"I directed all of my attention on the brilliant light," he said. "I sent a message that I was available for any kind of contact."

"The response came. The UFO suddenly increased its brilliance by at least five times. It became so bright that it seemed like a giant fluorescent light was shining on our entire jet."

"At the same moment, the UFO came closer — from 40

miles to within eight miles. Radar at that moment radioed that it was picking up the object at a distance of eight miles."

The object kept pace eight miles off the plane's left wing tip, and Britto got on the loud speaker to awaken his sleeping passengers and tell them to have a look.

"Everybody moved to the

incredible intensity of light on the left side of the plane. It was like God was on that side," said passenger Elaine Belashi.

Banker Jaime Rodrigues added, "It was the most beautiful thing I've ever seen in my life."

Copilot Antonio Santana said, "The UFO responded with a light show no firework celebration could ever match. I'd never seen anything like it before. It was beautiful."

The object was disk shaped, according to another nearby pilot, Mario Pravato.

"It had a bluish-white brilliance. What I saw had nothing to do with any physical phenomenon existing on Earth."

The object remained in view for an hour and 25 minutes.

The Brazilian Air Force, which was reported to have scrambled jets to intercept the UFO, declined any comment on the encounter.

Build Your Own UFO Detector

There are basically three ways in which you can have a UFO experience. You may have it indirectly by reading about the sightings of others. You may be fortunate enough to be in the right place at the right time to directly view your own UFO. Or, you may directly view your UFO after having been alerted to its presence by a UFO detector.

Obviously, a UFO detector which is reliable & sensitive can be a great aid to the would-be UFO watcher. It can alert the watcher at any time during the day or night, under any weather conditions, and, most important, when the owner is not normally observing the skies around his home.

Unfortunately, the UFO detectors presently available to ufologists are neither reliable nor sensitive. For, unless you can afford several tens of thousands of dollars for a portable radar unit or a laboratory quality geomagnetometer, you will inevitably wind up with a small device that is designed to detect any gross changes that might occur in the local geomagnetic fields surrounding the instrument due to the presence of any magnetic fields emanating from the propulsion systems of nearby UFOs. These devices usually contain a regular compass needle whose point rests inside a metal ring. The mode of operation is simple: when the portion of a UFO's magnetic field near the detector is stronger than the local geomagnetic field (the earth's magnetic field is about 3/4 of a gauss and a gauss is a unit used to measure the strength of magnetic fields), the needle

will be deflected until it makes contact with the metal ring. At this point electrical current can flow from batteries through the compass needle & metal ring to sound a bell or buzzer. This simple detection system has its origins in several UFO sightings that occurred during the '50's in which campers' & pilots' compasses behaved erratically when UFOs were very close.

The problem, however, with these simple magnetic UFO detectors which makes them virtually useless for average detection purposes is that they require the local presence of a UFO's magnetic field that is stronger than the earth's magnetic field near the detector. Since magnetic fields rapidly drop off in intensity for even short distances from their sources, these magnetic detectors generally do not work.

For example, the formula for the intensity of the magnetic field of a current carrying loop or coil of wire that is a certain distance from the loop's center or core & in the plane of the loop is approximately given by:

$$H_p = \frac{H_c R^3}{2 D^3}$$

where H_p is the magnetic field intensity in gauss measured in the plane of the loop or coil, H_c is the magnetic field intensity in gauss at the loop's core or center, R is the radius of the loop & D is the distance from the loop's core or center to the point in the loop's plane where H_p is measured. R & D can be in any units of length as long as they are the same units. The

current carrying loop & its magnetic field are shown in figure #1. (see: opposite pg.)

Now, by rearranging equation #1 & letting the magnetic loop or coil inside the UFO have an arbitrary radius, R , equal to 1 foot & a core magnetic field intensity, H_c , of 1000 gauss, we can determine the maximum distance, D , at which the magnetic field of the loop exceeds the strength of the earth's local geomagnetic field (for this purpose, let H_p equal 1 gauss which would certainly deflect the compass needle of the magnetic UFO detector). Thus:

$$D = \sqrt[3]{\frac{H_c R^3}{2 H_p}}$$

$$D = \sqrt[3]{\frac{(1000 \text{ gauss})(1 \text{ ft})^3}{2 (1 \text{ gauss})}}$$

$$D = 7.937 \text{ feet}$$

according to equation #4, our magnetic UFO detector would be activated by the UFO's magnetic loop or coil if it is within a distance of 7.937 ft. from the detector! (NOTE: for your own calculations, a scientific pocket calculator will give you the cube roots required by equation #2.)

At this point, the reader may protest that a UFO's propulsion system would probably use far more than a single coil & this would increase the distance at which the magnetic UFO detector would be activated. Although this is true, the increased detection range is not as great as one might suppose.

For example, let us assume that a given UFO has a total of four dozen (48) of the previously defined coils which are arranged (perhaps inside the flat ring of a

"saturn" shaped craft) so all of their core fields, H_c , point in the same direction & lie in a plane which also happens to contain our magnetic UFO detector. Since we now have forty-eight coils affecting our UFO detector we must now calculate the distance, D , at which the magnetic field strength, H_p , due to a single one of the craft's coils will be 1/48 of a gauss or 0.020833 gauss. This will then be the maximum distance at which all 48 of the craft's current carrying loops or coils produce the local H_p of one gauss necessary to activate our magnetic UFO detector. In this case all of the 48 coil's magnetic fields combine to produce the single magnetic field near our detector. The calculation is:

$$D = \sqrt[3]{\frac{(1000 \text{ gauss})(1 \text{ ft})}{2 (0.020833 \text{ gauss})}}$$

$$D = 28.845 \text{ feet}$$

Thus, increasing the number of coils in our hypothetical UFO by a factor of 48 only increased the effective detection range of our magnetic UFO detector from 7.937 to 28.845 feet!

Of course, one can argue that if the core magnetic field strength of each of the coils is boosted into the tens of thousands of gauss & there are hundreds of coils inside the UFO's hull, then the detector would be activated at a distance of hundreds of feet from the UFO. However, an extraterrestrial craft meeting these criteria would have to be exceptionally large & such mothership sized vehicles would rarely come down close enough to the earth's surface to activate a ufologist's magnetic UFO detector of average design. So once again, we can only conclude that these types of detectors are almost useless.

To detect a typical UFO with them, the craft would have to be hovering right outside the house of the detector's owner!

Because of the above severe performance limits put on inexpensive magnetic UFO detectors by the nature of magnetic fields, this writer is now suggesting that it is time to abandon the use of magnetic UFO detectors in favor of an entirely new system of detection. This new system of UFO detection will be detailed later in this article & will be seen to be:

- *able to detect ALL types of UFOs at distances normally achieved only with radar.
- *sensitive only to the presence of UFO propulsion systems.
- *rugged, portable & functional in any position.
- *virtually maintenance free.
- *inexpensive to construct from readily available equipment and parts.


This new method of UFO detection will possess NONE of the severe drawbacks of magnetic UFO detection, but does possess the ability to detect ALL types of UFOs (and ONLY UFOs!). at dist-

ances that would normally be achieved only with radar units. Plans will shortly be given whereby you, the reader, can construct your own UFO detector which will be both highly reliable and sensitive...and, most important, will cost less than \$25.00 per detector!

We can begin by pointing out that the UFO detector to be presented does not work by attempting to detect the feeble local magnetic fields produced by some UFOs, rather this detector has the unique ability to detect the anti-mass fields that are produced by the propulsion systems of ALL UFOs.

For those readers who are unfamiliar with the anti-mass field concept & its application in UFO propulsion, we should briefly define it here & summarize some of its effects which then allow an inexpensive device to be constructed to detect it. In a previous issue of this magazine (see: this writer's article in THE SBI REPORT, April/May, 1982, Vol.4, #2, pg.5) it was proposed that all UFOs contain a device called an "anti-mass field generator." This device was

seen to be crucial to the aerial performance capabilities of UFOs because it produced a new (and presently unknown to earthly science) field effect called "anti-mass field." This new type of field has the remarkable ability to absorb or store the mass energies of the physical structures the field penetrates & to store these mass energies as field energy in the anti-mass field itself. Once the anti-mass field of a UFO is generated, it quickly neutralizes the mass & weight of the craft & its crew. When this happens a UFO can travel at enormous velocities through a planet's atmosphere maneuver very erratically while being immune to the destructive effects of inertial forces, & in space, travel at tens, hundreds & even thousands of times the velocity of light while operating beyond the limitation of Relativity Theory.

It was also noted in the previous article that the anti-mass field stored only mass energy & not kinetic energy. That is, as moving objects lose mass in an anti-mass field, they must speed up in order to conserve their kinetic energy. Any air molecules in an anti-mass field will have the orbital velocities of their negatively charged electrons greatly increased as they lose mass. These electrons will then produce magnetic fields that can interact with each other so as to eject the electrons from the air molecules. This produces a region of ionized air. If a strong local magnetic field is also present along with the anti-mass field, then the air molecules will become so highly ionized (because their electrons' magnetic fields interact with the external magnetic field) that a rich, ambient temp-

erature plasma will be quickly formed.


The above process neatly explains how a UFO's propulsion system can stall an automobile's engine. The combination of the UFO's local anti-mass field (near the car) & the magnetic field of the car's ignition coil causes the air molecules near the coil's terminals to become highly ionized. This ionized air then short circuits or grounds out the high voltage side of the ignition system. High voltage current fails to reach the spark plugs & the engine stops running.

Since there have been cases where a car's engine stalled while a hovering UFO was tens or hundreds of feet from the car, we see that a UFO's anti-mass field can extend for some distances from the alien craft & produce significant amounts of ionized air in the weak magnetic field (a few tens of gauss at most) that surrounds the outer plastic case of an automotive ignition coil. It is this secondary or "EM" effect which can be used to indicate the presence of a UFO! All that will be needed to build a detector using this effect is a source of a magnetic field & a device that indicates the presence of current carrying ionized air. To make our novel UFO detector have great sensitivity & range, we can provide a very strong magnetic field that will induce ionization of air molecules when the anti-mass field present is very weak due to a distant UFO & we can also provide a circuit that can detect amounts of ionized air that are far, far less than would be needed to stall an auto engine. Once such a system is provided, it should be possible to detect

the average UFO at a distance of several miles (it is felt that the device to be described will detect an alien craft at a maximum of from 2-5 miles depending on the size of the craft & the intensity of the anti-mass field it generates).

To build your own UFO detector that will function as described above you will need a small, but powerful, magnet & an ionization type home smoke detector (note that the photoelectric type smoke detectors CANNOT be used to build this UFO detector). These ionization type smoke detectors function because they contain a small quantity of radioactive isotope (usually 1 or 2 microcuries of americium 241) whose radiation can ionize any smoke gases that enter the unit. Once this happens, the ionized gases can cause a weak electric current to flow between two metal plates & this current flow then activates a circuit that sounds a loud alarm. The basic idea is that the alarm will wake a sleeping person in the event of a nighttime house fire & allow them to escape before a major conflagration develops. (Surprisingly, most people killed in fires are not burned to death, but rather poisoned by the inhalation of the toxic gases the fire generates...so you just might want to consider purchasing several detectors to be used as smoke alarms).

Your UFO detector is now made by dismantling the ionization chamber of the smoke detector & removing & discarding the capsule that contains the radioactive isotope. Once this is done, the powerful magnet is cemented into the ionization chamber so that it does not short circuit the metal

plates yet fills the chamber with a magnetic field which can ionize air molecules should there be a UFO's weak local anti-mass field suddenly penetrate the detector. When this work is done, you will have a reliable UFO detector that is highly sensitive ONLY to UFOs (note: the device will no longer detect smoke) and will be operable for over a year on the battery it contains.

Your detector may be left in your home or carried in your car. If you have a local UFO club, you might construct several of these units & place them in members' homes to form a grid-like pattern that completely monitors the UFO activity in an area that is tens or hundreds of square miles in area (for example, assuming a detection range of 2-3 miles, you could easily monitor all UFO activity in an area of about 144 square miles using only 9 of these novel detectors for a cost of only \$225.00.

Model #SA76RC smoke detector (it is manufactured by Pittway Corp. & is available in most major retail outlets for a cost of under \$20.00) and shows the location of the isotope capsule that must be removed & discarded. The magnet glued in its place is ring shaped & made of ferrite based ceramic with an average field strength of hundreds of gauss (you may order this ring magnet from EDMUND SCIENTIFIC, 101 E. Gloucester Pike, Barrington, New Jersey 08007--Catalog #K-31570 at a cost of \$6.45 postpaid or use a more powerful disc-shaped magnet: catalog #K 30962 at \$37.10 postpaid). It is important to firmly glue the magnet over the center hole of the internal electrode plate (after the isotope capsule is removed) so it does not touch the outer vented cover electrode. Use care in handling the isotope capsule & limit your exposure to its radiation by removing it quickly. Dispose of it immediately without opening it & wash your hands thoroughly to prevent the possibility of contamination unlikely as this is with the sealed capsule. If you follow the instructions given, you will have a finished UFO detector that just could make the difference in you seeing your next UFO.

Here are some of the features your detector will have if you use the "First Alert" model suggested:

- *be powered by an inexpensive 9 volt carbon zinc battery for over one year;
- *flash an LED indicator light once a minute to show the battery is connected & delivering power;
- *have a built in test button to test the entire unit;
- *sound a trouble signal that beeps for 30 days(new battery)






Figure-2 - Various Internal Views of the "First Alert" Model SA76RC Home Smoke Detector




