## STRANGE OBJECT LEAVES FILMY DEPOSIT ON GOFF FARM (by John de Haes)

Chadron, Nebraska---November 16, 1961---  
A weird unidentified flying object streaked across the skies above the Theodore Goff farm last Wednesday afternoon and left behind it a mysterious substance that defies explanation. The strange, seemingly metallic substance, came off the flying object in thin fibers and settled to earth, draping itself like a finely-knit shroud over Goff's fields, trees, machinery and power lines. The Goff farm is located eight miles south and about one mile west of Chadron on the Deadhorse Creek Road. "It was about 3 o'clock last Wednesday afternoon," Goff related, "and I had been working in my shed. I came outside and happened to look up and see this strange ball flying through the air. It was kind of rough," Goff went on, "and seemed to be rolling as it sped through the air. It was going faster than any airplane I ever saw and it just disappeared from sight when it

got out of the sunlight. It made absolutely no noise. Big chunks of it broke off," he said, "and these fibers began settling down on everything." Goff described the object as being "about as big around as a tractor tire, four feet in diameter or so and it came out of the southwest going northeast." He said, "At first I thought it was an airplane, but when I really looked, I just didn't know what to think. I thought maybe it was a balloon, but there wasn't a bit of wind that day and it was really moving."

"It's hard to say how high up it was, maybe a thousand feet or more, but I just don't know. It didn't scare me," Goff said, "I always figured if something is going to happen, it's going to happen. But it did give me a funny feeling."

The strange fibers are almost gone now as the wind and recent snows have carried most of them away. A few strands still remain, clinging on some tires Goff has stacked on an old threshing machine and he has covered the tires with canvass in hopes of preserving the fibres. The fibers, as all investigators report, cannot be seen with the naked eye except when they are in direct sunlight. Then, and only then, can you see them glistening ghostlike in the sun. They can be felt on the skin like spider webs, but they are much smaller in diameter than a spider web. A human hair seems like a rope compared to the fibers. "I didn't really notice the fibers too much that day," Goff said, "but the next morning my fields and trees just glowed with the stuff when the sun hit them. You can pick one up, but you can't really tell if you have one unless the sun shines and hits it just right," Goff stated. "It's the strangest stuff I ever saw."

Attempts to break the weird strings are to no avail. They seemingly cannot be

broken apart, but when a hot cigarette was applied to one of the strings, it did break. The string did not, however, burst into flame or seem to burn. All attempts to pick up one of the fibers also met with frustration.

"They're so fine you just can't tell when you've got one", Goff said. "You can feel it, but you can't see it. After I saw the stuff all over my fields the next morning," Goff went on, "I thought maybe it was some thing the Weather Bureau was sending up so I called them at the Chadron Airport." The staff at the airport did not know what the substance was, however, and had no idea as to what the object might have been.

Officials at the airport notified local authorities who in turn contacted officials at Ellsworth Air Force Base in Rapid City. Authorities at the Air Base had no explanation whatsoever for the weird phenomenon, but did indicate that an Air Force investigating team would be sent out from Washington, D.C.

The team, officials said, was scheduled to arrive the first part of this week, but as of today, still no word has been received from them. Dr. Lyle Andrews of the Science Department at Chadron State College said Tuesday that the fibers might well be part of a military radar-jamming experiment. According to Dr. Andrews, small fibers are dropped from planes in the stratosphere and settle to earth. The fibers are so numerous that they are picked up by radar and leave a confusing pattern on the screen.

"I don't understand the ball that Mr. Goff says he saw, however," Dr. Andrews concluded. "That has me puzzled."

A former Air Force serviceman said today however, that he did not think the fibers at the Goff farm were of this type. The fibers used in these experiments are about a sixteenth of an inch in diameter, and these fibers at the Goff farm are much smaller, he said.

No other reports have been received concerning the sighting of the strange ball, but Helen Hawthorne, a rural school teacher about six miles northwest of the Goff farm reported she saw some of the fibers in trees near the school.

Road equipment operators on the Dead Horse Road about five miles south of the farm also saw the fibers hanging on their

equipment and from the power lines, although they did not sight the flying ball. Today, the mystery of the strange object and its silvery remains is still unsolved and may well never be. 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#### SONIC BOOMS ROCK L.A., BREAK GLASS

Los Angeles, Calif., Dec. 2, 1961---

Three thunderous sonic booms rocked Los Angeles at 2:25 p.m. Friday arousing wide-spread alarm.

Reports of shattered windows flooded in to authorities a few minutes later, many in the Wilshire Boulevard shopping areas.

Thousands of calls from residents "some of them hysterical", jammed all incoming lines to police and fire department switchboards throughout the city and some areas of the county.

Downtown Los Angeles buildings, including City Hall and the Police Administration Building shook as the booms, apparently centered in the southwest, rolled across the basin to the foothills.

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#### SPACE CREATURES MAY EXIST

London (AP) Space travellers reaching the moon and other planets may find living organisms that have been lying dormant for millions of years, says a British medical scientist.

Frozen by the tremendous cold, they could be brought back to earth, thawed and returned to life, writes Dr. Audrey Smith of the National.

Reviewing current techniques of cooling men and animals to temperatures around the freezing point, she wrote:

"We now have to distinguish between clinical death and biological death." Clinical death means that animals can now be frozen so that their heart beats, circulation and brain activity stop. But they can be thawed out and brought back to life unharmed. The time limit so far is about 2 hours. In support of her theory, Dr. Smith made these points:

Many animal tissues can be frozen into indefinite suspended life after treatment with glycerol or other substances. Glycerol is produced internally by some insects and enables them to survive temperatures of 80 degrees below zero. There are insects and shellfish that can survive repeated freezing and thawing.

Scientists discovered recently that the larvae of an African insect survives complete drying out and then revives again when moisture is present. In its dried-out state it can stand immersion in liquid nitrogen at minus 300 degrees or five minutes exposure to temperatures of minus 400 degrees.

On some planets, said Dr. Smith, extremes of temperature and drought may have developed over millions of years. Living creatures could, during this time, have evolved ways of surviving these extreme conditions in a state of suspended animation.

In more favorable surroundings, with higher temperatures and with moisture present, as on earth, they would come to life again, she said. (The Vancouver Province, October 10, 1961, Credit Gene Duplantier, SAUCERS, SPACE AND SCIENCE, 125 Woodycrest Ave., Toronto, Canada.)

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#### REPORT 2 METEORITES HOLD TRACE OF LIFE

London, Nov. 18 (AP)--Two New York scientists said today they have found evidence of traces of living things in meteorites reaching the earth from outer space.

Dr. George Claus of New York University and Prof. Bartholomew Nagy of Fordham University reported in the scientific magazine NATURE that they found in certain meteorites organized elements resembling in structure the fossilized remains of microscopic forms of life.

Of five types of "organized structure" which they describe, four are said to be similar to known earth species but not identical.

#### OTHER DISCOVERIES

They resemble small single-celled animals -- dino-flagellates or chrysoomonads -- which live only in sea or lake water. The fifth is unlike any known terrestrial organism.

This evidence will do much to strengthen the implication of other discoveries in the last two years.

The two scientists examined samples from two meteorites. These were the Orgueil meteorite, which fell in southern France in 1864, and the Ivuna meteorite, which fell in an arid region of Central Africa in 1938.

They said it is most likely that the structure they have seen are the fossilized remains of living micro-organisms "indigenous to the meteorites."

No single piece of evidence of this kind can be considered conclusive proof of the existence of life outside the earth. But now that the prospect of interesting discoveries seems to have brightened, it is certain that analysis of meteorites will accelerate. 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### DID A SCOUT SHIP TOUCH DOWN ON THE ISLE OF WIGHT?

Perhaps the fact that it is an island may explain why the Isle of Wight has a UFO sighting once every few months or so, particularly off the southern coast. But certainly there have been an increased number of sightings lately for some mysterious reason or another. So much so, in fact, that a news commentary on the Southern TV concluded with the comment: "So if there are such things as flying saucers, it would appear they are watching the Isle of Wight. I wonder why?"

Even so it is regrettable that one of the most exciting local reports so far has been neglected by the national dailies.

Living so close to hand, it was natural for me to seek an interview with the two witnesses who claimed this unusual sighting. There are, of course, other interesting aspects of the case, but for the sake of brevity we must keep to the salient facts. From the outset I found Mrs. Smith and her daughter, Mrs. Taylor, of Ryde, charming and extremely helpful people. At our first, and at a subsequent meeting to make a tape recording, both these ladies gave me a

strong impression of sincerity and complete honesty.

Fortunately, Mrs. Taylor proved to be an excellent artist and she has been able to record a good impression of the vehicle she saw.

Several people in the vicinity of Ryde had seen UFOs, but it was a Commander Mole, of Feaview, who was interviewed on the Southern Television. As a result of this Mrs. Smith telephoned Commander Mole to tell him she was glad someone else had seen an object, for it confirmed her own experience.

Commander Mole was very impressed by Mrs. Smith's description and suggested she tell someone in authority about it. Fearing ridicule, Mrs. Smith, however, did not contact anyone and it was Commander Mole who informed the press for her. Otherwise it seems likely that once more a valuable piece of evidence would have gone unrecorded.

On the night of July 3 Mrs. Smith visited her daughter and at approximately 12:15 a.m. they went up to the roof above Mrs. Taylor's flat to bring in some baby linen off the line. Being interested in ships (Mrs. Taylor's husband is a sailor), they had automatically glanced out to sea from the excellent viewpoint the flat roof offers.

Mrs. Smith had spotted the lights of what she took at first glance to be a ship some distance away and at eye level, but her daughter pointed out that the lights could hardly be those of a ship for they were in the air.

The two women watched fascinated for a few moments. Then they could make out five distinct lights in a row. Slowly the lights seemed to get nearer. Then they could make out yet another light above the five. Still the lights got nearer, until the object which was emitting them itself became visible. Mrs. Smith had said to her daughter: "Whatever is it? It looks like a hovercraft." Up till then the UFO had been steady at eye level, presenting a side elevation. Then it had tilted, revealing something of its plan form. The likeness to a hovercraft, which Mrs. Smith had seen several times, is quite understandable, except that this one was completely silent.

Still the UFO came closer until Mrs. Taylor backed down the stairs with apprehension. "We thought it was coming straight for us," she said. She also described it later as being like a hovercraft (circular

in shape) with five porthole lights which emitted rays of orange-coloured light. There was an orange-coloured diffused light on the top and the whole base appeared to glow with an orange light, which was reflected by the trees only (in the writer's estimation) some sixty feet below.

Suddenly the UFO darted off and upward in the direction from which it had come. The press had quoted Mrs. Smith as saying "faster than any jet". In fact, the speed made her feel a bit dizzy. One moment the vehicle was there, the next instant it was rapidly fading away in the distance "like a shooting star."

After this dramatic departure, during which there was still no sound, a glowing ring of light was seen to occupy the area where the UFO had been. Mrs. Smith described it as looking like a smoke ring which gradually spread out rising into the air as it did so. Having persisted for some five minutes or so, it had finally dispersed into a glow of light.

Neither of the witnesses had studied the subject of flying saucers and neither had seen photographs of George Adamski's scout ship.

The writer took great care not to help them in any way, yet the presence of an independent witness Mrs. Taylor did a sketch of the UFO and it was exactly like a scout ship. Later when I produced the photographs of the Darbshire and Adamski scout ship, they unhesitatingly and easily identified it, saying it looked more like the Darbshire photographs before it tilted, then, when it tilted, it looked exactly like the Adamski scout ship photograph.

I am able to add that I and others are satisfied that these ladies unquestionably observed a scout ship at fairly close range less than a quarter of a mile away from where they were.

That same evening, several miles away and a little earlier, a friend of mine saw bright lights in a remote field, which were preceded by a strange and very local whirlwind. (Credit British FLYING SAUCER REVIEW, November-December 1961.)

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THE CASE OF MAJOR MAYER

Major William E. Mayer, a brilliant neuro-psychiatrist, was a member of the task force responsible for the rehabilitation of American GI's brainwashed in Korea by the Chinese

Reds.

He could be a central figure in the upcoming investigation of "military muzzling" by a subcommittee of the Senate Armed Services Committee. By a 15-to-1 vote, the Committee agreed to probe changes that anti-Communist military men were under tight leash by Pentagon civilians.

The special subcommittee will be chaired by Mississippi's Senator John Stennis.

Some time ago, the Army doctor made an address before the Freedoms Foundation on the subject of Communist brainwashing. Rebroadcast by Radio Station WKRC in Cincinnati, it was described by a local newspaper as a "scholarly, thoroughly responsible account of the brainwashing of American prisoners in the Korean War by these Chinese Communist captors."

Mayer discussed the techniques utilized by the Reds that turned one-third of our Korean War prisoners into collaborators and one-tenth into informers on their fellow prisoners.

Many Cincinnati residents looked forward to hearing Mayer again. He accepted invitations to speak this fall at two local colleges - Xavier University and Our Lady of Cincinnati College.

Some time later, however, Major Mayer notified the colleges that he could not speak this fall. This was interpreted as another case of Pentagon censorship and local reaction was sharp. Declared the Cincinnati ENQUIRER:

"Anyone who heard or saw Major Mayer knows that he is no wild-eyed fanatic, no crank, no crackpot. He is instead a solemn, thoroughly-informed, articulate young physician whose splendid talents led to his appointment as chief neuropsychiatrist in the Army task force..."

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#### 5000 FRANCS

A French worker in a factory succumbed to the urging of his fellow worker to go along with him to a meeting of the Communist Party, to which his fellow worker belonged.

After listening to all the fine things in store for the workers, should they succeed in gaining control of the French Government, the worker decided that this was for him, and he joined the Communist Party.

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Ten thousand years ago, so the story goes, a great civilization called Atlantis disappeared under the sea. Tall tale or fact? Historians have been unable to agree. Now a German explorer, Jurgen Spanuth, claims to have discovered a lost city that was part of the country of Atlantis.

#### UNDERSEA EXPLORER REPORTS

#### "I'VE FOUND THE LOST CITY!"

Eight divers walking on the bottom of the North Sea off the German coast believe they have cracked a riddle 32 centuries old. They also claim they have found Atlantis, the fabled Lost Continent that vanished 10,000 years ago.

Atlantis, they say, stretches from a point 28 miles off the coast of western Germany to just off the southern tip of Florida.

The underwater searchers have found outlines of buildings covered by centuries of drifting sands at the bottom of the sea.

They are expecting to uncover more of the fabulous land of the men who went to their doom in the great flood that the Bible calls the Deluge.

Ten thousand years after the warrior-builders of old rode chariots in the golden streets past pink palaces, modern men in rubber suits are walking those streets again.

The man behind the discovery of the Lost Continent is 60-year-old Rev. Jurgen Spanuth, a Lutheran minister. He lives in Ost Borede-lum, in West Germany.

Rev. Spanuth had been delving into the riddle of Atlantis for a quarter of a century when, 12 years ago, the lightning struck.

Researchers from the Oriental Institute of the University of Chicago discovered some carved writing on an ancient temple in Greece. The markings were the work of King Rameses

the Third, who lived 12 centuries before Christ.

Translated in part, the riddle read: In front of the King's castle toward the open sea lies a rock, rising from the sea, looking as if it had been cut by a knife. The rock consists of red, black and white stones and there is copper on the island. The castle of Atlantis lies in the delta of the three big rivers.

The Rev. Spanuth spotted three clues.

Out in the North Sea, near the German island of Helgoland, 28 miles west of the German mainland, a huge rock stuck out of the water.

The surface of the rock looked as if it had been cut by a knife.

The rock was red and black and white.

The rock was in the delta of three big rivers - the Eider, the Elbe and the Weser.

The rock was the only one of its kind in the world that fitted the description carved on the temple more than 3,000 years ago.

The German minister-explorer set out in rough seas for the red, black and white rock in the summer of 1952.

He took with him a diver, a public stenographer and an underwater telephone.

On the third day, the diver, under only 30 ft. of water, telephoned: "I see a wall!"

He traced the wall for almost half a mile.

Then the minister's money ran out and the expedition was called off.

"I shall go out there again," he announced.

"I have, beyond doubt, found the Lost City and Continent of Atlantis."

Some historians doubt that the Lost Continent existed. They brand it a tall tale.

Pastor Spanuth, tackling the mystery, delved into the fiction and the known facts about the fabled continent.

Eventually came the discovery of the Grecian tablet 12 years ago and Pastor Spanuth got busy.

After his first exploration off the coast of western Germany he got backing for the exploration from the German government. They lent the minister a ship and eight divers.

The divers worked secretly for weeks under the North Sea. They found fortifications. They found a dozen stone flags from a small courtyard. They found carved writings on the flags and fortifications. Scholars are still working on the translations of these writings.

But this much is already known: The story of Atlantis, a great civilization that disappeared under the sea, is true.

King Rameses records unearthed by Chicago researchers have proved strikingly accurate.

The castle of the King of Atlantis was standing less than 30 miles west of what is now Germany, when Rameses wrote of it, 12 centuries before Christ.

The King of Atlantis, Spanuth's discoveries reveal, once ruled over what is now Scandinavia and northern Germany as well as over Atlantis.

The inhabitants of Atlantis were Scandinavians.

The scientific world now awaits the next exploration of Pastor Spanuth down under the bleak North Sea.

He may reveal further secrets of the riddle of the centuries - the riddle that has, he claims, revealed that the Lost Continent of Atlantis was not a fable, but the truth. (Credit Paul Hammer, Chicago, Illinois.)

Why don't we test some bombs? What on, under or above the earth is it that prevents the President from giving the brief order for which his soldiers and technicians have so long been waiting? Maybe there was an argument (though NR did not think so) for our holding off to exert moral pressure on the enemy to do likewise. But he's gone ahead with one bang after another. Everybody knows that his nuclear power has leapt ahead through his crash series. Everybody knows that we are falling---relatively at least---behind, that we cannot develop the devices our security requires without tests. So what are we waiting for? For a "new moratorium" that will last, like the last one, until the exact moment when the enemy wants to break it? Until his weapons development has reached a point where he will be able to say: surrender or die?
