

RECENT SIGHTINGS

SEPTEMBER ISSUE

16 May 1966. Ft. Meyers. Two objects, red in color and "about the size of a bead", were reported high in the sky above Winkler Rd. at 9:10 Monday night. Fritz R. Wilke, 28, 2405 Kennesaw Ave. a utility man in the packing house of Zipper Farms, reported the sightings to the News-Press. Wilke reported he was knockknocking at the door of a friend, Manuel Rodriguez on Winkler Rd. when he looked up and saw the first object in the clear sky. "At first I saw only one," Wilke said. "It was right overhead and very high up, judging by its size. It began to trace a circle in the sky. About half-way round the circle another object appeared. Following the path of the first. Wilke said he called Manuel and Eugene Rodriguez, and brothers Herman and Miguel, all came outside and watched the objects for approx. 10 minutes. Wilke reported that the first object changed suddenly from red to green, then to a bluish-green, then to a bright gold." Wilke said, "and it seemed closer." When the second object appeared, the first switched to a red color again. The second remained red through out." At 9:20 PM the whattamacallits did fade out of sight. _____

Gainesville - 24 May 1966.

The unidentified flying object that passed over Gainesville early Monday morning was seen by Phil Cantner and a friend as they got out of their car sometime between 12 and 12:15 AM. He had it in sight five minutes and described it as round with a ring of about 10 evenly spaced steady red lights. There was a pulsating white light in the center, he said, and estimated the white light was a diameter's length above the object but with no visible connection to the object. ... Around midnight the Gainesville Police Dept. received a call from a person who described the object as having a ring of lights, red, with a white light in the center, like the report from Cantner. They also received reports from the Campus P.D. Two University of Fla. policemen reported seeing a "shining object with an outer ring of red lights with a white flashing light in the middle" hovering over Florida Field. Campus Police Chief said Officer Lewis Lindsay sighted the object at 12:06 AM and that another night patrolman, Lt. R. Martin, saw "the same object" shortly after Lindsay reported it..... According to the witnesses, the object was noiseless and was flying in a northeasterly direction... It appeared to be round but its size could not be estimated by any of the witnesses... Cantner estimated the speed at 30 MPH and the altitude at 1,000 to 3,000 ft. He figured the diameter at between 30 and 100 ft. _____

28 May - Orlando. An unidentified flying object was reported over Lake Conway early Saturday AM by a group of teen-age girls at a slumber party. It was reported over the middle of the lake at 4AM and the object appeared to change colors and would stop and then move again. The Reporter: Miss Diane Foote, 1420 Bell Vista. _____

24 June 1966 - Palm City. Friday about 11 PM, Ed Menninger, Jr., saw something in the sky toward Palm City and described it so " It looked like an inverted pale orange ice cream cone... and I first saw it while driving on Palm Beach Rd... and as I approached Palm City, it went out of sight ... then loomed back going westward then it disappeared again." June 26 1966 - Lambertville, N.J. IIOUFO member, Alberto Juliano 133 Brunswick Ave. Lambertville, New Jersey, reported to East Coast H.Q. 6464 34th. Ave. No., St. Petersburg, Fla., a sighting that took place at 11:30 PM on above date. He reports, "I saw 2 "stars" separate, and one descended in the typical falling leaf pattern." "It stopped, in mid air, for fully five minutes, then, at tremendous speed it shot straight up and disappeared." The object was the size of a "very distant star", and was bright white in color.

Cocoa Beach - Fla. A resident of this space-age community sabotaged the world's first welcome station for occupants of Unidentified flying Objects Monday night. Mayor Bob Murkshe says he has a "pretty good idea" who is the scoundrel who removed a sign from the city's hospitality haven for little green men. The sign, which the villian tore down and threw into the bushes, proclaims a small spot at Fisher Park here to be the "OFFICIAL UFO WELCOME STATION, COACO BEACH, FLA." July 3 - 1966 - Brooksville. An object was first spotted low in the N W as a tiny speck of light, star-like, and stationary. Then it suddenly became very much brighter and changed colors from white to orange-yellow to red. Then the object made several side-slipping motions - zip- to the south - moved slowly again until - zip- another burst of tremendous speed again to the south. The object then gradually disappeared in the S W, and was last seen as a blinking red light, that if one had NOT watched its' previous progress, one would think it a plane and would never give it another thought. July 11, 1966 - Sanibel Island, Fla. Mr. Mark Brown, of Orlando, Florida, was vacationing with his family at this summer resort, and happened to be walking on the beach with his Mother and his brother and his wife. The time was aprox. 7:20 PM, and they saw, southwest in the sky, "a bright, orange light or object." "It was too bright to see any outline of the object." July 15 - 1966. AIR FORCE TO HIRE TEAMS FOR STUDY OF 'SAUCERS'.
 Washington (AP) The Air Force intends to contract with a few selected universities to provide scientific teams to investigate promptly and in depth certain sightings of unidentified flying objects. The Air Force said yesterday that no schools have yet been chosen and the number to be used is still indefinite. A scientific advisory board recommended last March that course of action be followed by the Air Force which has pledged to strengthen probes of reports it receives on UFO's. The board suggested that each university team should include at least include one psychologist, preferably one interested in clinical psychology, and at least one physical scientist, probably an astronomer or geophysicist familiar with atmospheric physics.

8 July - St. Petersburg. A glistening silvery object with neither visible wings, windows or contrail, soundlessly sped through the skies of St. Pete. According to two young boys who saw it, the object flew "faster than any airplane." It came from the North and disappeared in the clouds to the west.... 19 July 1966. Astronauts in Gemini X, on their first orbit, reported seeing two bright objects. Newspapers in New York, on page 26, of the New York Times, reported this and other information pertaining to the flight. BUT, when others went to their favorite newsstands only to find that the first article had been deleted, and an entire new make-up was used for page 26. Wednesday, July 27, 1966 - Chattanooga, Tenn. "In the late afternoon, as we drove southward between Chattanooga and the Georgia north border, I spotted a dark, disc-shaped object with a knob on the top and bottom, wobbling as it rose vertically in the west. It stopped and hovered briefly, then started moving south with an up and down oscillating motion. Then it smothered out and passed behind some trees. It was in view for about 15 seconds. I couldn't say for sure that it was a disc. It may have been a cigar, or if it was a disc, it was seen from an edge view." St. Petersburg, Fla. July 29, 1966. Two boys walking on 1st. Ave. North, reported seeing an orange-red disc-shaped object about 300 ft. altitude, going east to west. The time was approx. 10:30 PM.

Brooksville, Florida. July 29, 1966; Reports from IIOUFO member Wallace McNeil, of New Port Richey, "One extremely bright, white light, seen directly over power lines in back of his house. The object remained stationary, then another object, same description, joined first object, then the two of them flew off together. At this same date, two orange-red disc-shaped objects were reported, seen one at a time, going straight down, in the vicinity of the John Reeves' contact case, in Brooksville. SOURCE: EAST COAST H.Q. July 29, 1966 - New Jersey. Carl Direspena of 62 Parkside Avenue, New Market, a schoolboy, reported he sighted an object which hovered and then moved in a circular motion for about a period of 5 minutes. Carl asserted that there were green and red pulsating lights at either side of the object. He managed to take a poloroid snap of this object. The well-known saucer photo expert Augie Roberts, is attempting to secure this picture for analysis as he wishes to determine whether or not Carl took a photo of a plane with its' landing light on. There is an Air Force base near where Carl lives. Mrs. Kostiuk, of New Market, reported this sighting to Mr. Robinson and also stated that a UFO had been seen the next night at Dunnellen in the White Plains region. More information is being sought. Mrs. Kostiuk asserted that there are high tension wires which lead from New Market to Dunnellen in this area. She has conjectured that these high power lines may have been the source of attraction in this area for these UFO. We can however, remember the object, it was asserted, hovered above the power lines during May and June near Lakehurst. This circular object is described AS ABOUT 50 FT. IN DIAMETER AND was asserted to have been sighted about the time of that power failure. July 31, 1966 - Erie, Penn. The Air Force is investigating reports near Edyng Saucer and a creature for Outer Space which was sighted near there. Betty Jean Klen, 16, of Jamestown, New York, Douglas Tibbetts, 18, of Greenhurst, N.Y., Mrs. Anita Hailsey, 22, of Jamestown and Gerald Lavelle all reported sighting an object that came down in the area of the Preque Isle Peninsula, on Sunday, July 31. While Tibbetts went with the police to investigate the object which descended Miss Klem asserted that she, Mrs. Hailsey, and the latter's two children, saw a formless creature appear from the bushes and approach to within 5 feet of the automobile they were sitting in. She said the object had a head and shoulders, was about 6 ft. tall, but she saw no legs. Miss Klem, being frightened, began blowing the horn to summon the police, the creature disappeared without a trace. However, it would seem that officials are checking strange markings, in the form of a claw found in the sand nearby where the object was seen. (Many versions of this same story have come in to us. Researchers said the two triangular impressions in the sand were described as: 18 inches deep and 6 to 8 inches wide. Photographs were taken of them and also plaster casts. July 31, 1966 - New Jersey. New Jersey residents of Midland Park, Waldwick and Ridgewood, reported seeing a bright red object overhead. Aug. 1st. - New Jersey Bergen County residents reported sighting a bright object overhead between the hours of 3 and 5 AM. G.E. Townsend of 63 Oakhill Road, Midland Park, who watched the object through binoculars, said that it moved slowly from the east above his house, toward the Waldwick area. The object, he said, was like a big, pinkish, red ball which did not make a noise. Waldwick patrolman, Jay Stafford also reported seeing the object. He described it as a bright, red, round ball which remained motionless in the sky for 5 to 10 minutes before it disappeared. 3 August - 1966 - New Jersey. For 2 nights in a row, residents of the West Bergen and Passaic Area have reported sighting a white object over Paterson. The object is described as nine times as large as a star. Also, on August 7, 1966 local papers in the Passaic County Area report that residents of the Hawthorne, Wayne and Ringwood sections are reporting a red object which streaks through their skies. Some have reported, however, that the object hovered above them for close to an hour. Or a half hour. This area is close to the well-known Wanage region. This section contains the Wanage Reservoir which was the area of some well publicized sightings in January. SOURCE: ON FILE AT EAST COAST H.Q. Sandusky, Ohio - August 3-1966. Three red and green flashing lights branded by sheriff's department deputies and police as unidentified flying objects, hovered over the Sandusky area. The sightings reported near the Soldiers Home on US 250 at Ohio 13, deputies said. The objects, also seen by Perkins Township police, hovered over the area for about 40 minutes and then took off like a jet. And at Milan, 10 miles south of here, police reported RADAR on their cruiser registered 95 - 100 mph readings at times when NO cars were moving in the area. Also, at NILES residents witnessed what they described as "flying saucers" early today in the eastern heavens. The sightings occurred about 5 this morning. One NILES woman said she viewed the spectacle for nearly an hour before the objects disappeared about daylight.The objects were reported "quite clear, blinking, and 2 of them were bright and silvery and quite large. The third, in a formation of three was considerably smaller and had flashing lights of blue, red and orange. In another section above the eastern horizon, four or five others were also seen, but they were not so clearly defined as the other formation. (Quotes from the reporter who sent in the clippings, Audrey Reynolds, Box 57, W. Farmington, Ohio. "Before midnight, the near time of these clippings, a party sighted 3 saucers --- hovering about "hood level" of a car at Bristolville. A red light coming from the top which was taken to be a fire and was why this party stopped and spotted them in the first place. When she made a right turn to go back to State Route 45, the saucers took off in the same direction --- a green light coming from the top and disappeared almost instantly.
