EDITORIAL

They knew each other as Gus, Ed and Roger. And they shared one real love that bound them together as a team- they live to fly. For Air Force Lt. Col. Virgil Grissom, the first Apollo mission would have been his third trip into space, a distinction no man today can claim. For Air Force Lt. Col. Edward H. White II, it was a flight that commanded his eagerness as much as his first when he slipped outside Gemini 4 for a breath-taking 21 minute walk in Space -- America's first. For Navy Cndr. Roger B. Chaffee, it would have been the fulfillment of a dream, a dream to fly in space. He was a rookie getting his first opportunity to travel in that weightless void.

The three died together -- suddenly and apparently without warning, when the flash fire erupted inside the Apollo spaceship they were to take on a voyage of up to 14 days in orbit around the Earth.



Some called Gus Grissom a hard-luck astronaut. As one of the famed original seven Mercury spacemen, he became the second American to fly in space. Taking a 15 minute sub-orbital flight July 21, 1961 he had to swim for his life when his tiny spaceship, Liberty Bell 7 blew its hatch and sank. The Apollo 1 spacecraft has been beset by problems throughout its development. At a symposium in Houston last month, Dr. Joseph Shea, Apollo program manager at the Manned Spacecraft Center, said Apollo 1's life-supporting system had logged - "something over 200 individual failures" during its qualification program. Even during final phases of Apollo 1's checkout and testing, hundreds of changes and modifications were being made every month. Early last year, officials said they hoped to launch the spaceship before the end of 1966. Blastoff dates were set for Nov. and Dec.

A series of problems, mostly involving the environmental control system, delayed the launch until Jan. Several weeks later, in early Dec. tests in a vacuum chamber were postponed for two weeks because of another leak, forcing the launch date to be delayed until Feb. 21. It is to be hoped that the tragic loss of these brave Americans will not deter us from future spaceflights. As I believe that it would be their own wish to see our space program go forward. It is a paradox that sometimes Death shows us the way to Life. Death, even quite unexpected and tragic death, can be beneficial to the extent that the very act itself provides the learning that will be needed in future explorations into the Unknown. These pilots, themselves, had no qualms as to the dangers that they faced, yet they faced them with a supreme confidence that their efforts would pave the way for others.

I have no doubt that what they sought, now they have found. I feel that their spirits will soar right along with the next team to man the Apollo craft. Into the unlimited void, that some call Space - and others call Infinity. God Bless them.

Columbus, Indiana - Jan. 4, 1967 Jimmy E. Mobeley, 26, became a UFO "believer" yesterday afternoon when an Unidentified Flying Object buzzed his car as he was driving home from work. Mobeley told police he was just south of Taylorville in Bartholomew County when he spotted the object, which he said was about 25 ft. long and 12 ft. wide, traveling at 50 to 60 miles an hour. As the 'football' shaped object passed over his car, he said the lights dimmed and the motor missed. He said another man and a woman in a second car stopped to observe the object with him. He described it as having "two green, glowing spots on the right side," and "three red lights flashing in sequence on the underside." Mobeley said the object made a humming noise like an electric transformer. He also said it came within a block of where they were standing and he could see a porthole in the side of the object. He said it changed speed and color as they watched it and was headed toward the Northeast.....

Martins Creek, Pa. - Jan. 10, 1967 A UFO was reported sighted North west of Martins Creek -- Reported by Leonard Sabatine, Jr. owner of Sabatine Radio and Electric Service, Sandt's Eddy... While parking a truck in the barn at his residence, three miles northwest of Martins Creek on Little Creek Road, Sabatine said a "strange, squealing sound" caught his attention. Looking up, he said he was blinded by two large dome-shaped lights hovering over the treetops several hundred feet from where he stood. He said the lights dimmed and went out, replaced by a vertical beam that moved across the ground beneath. When that light went out, the "headlights" went back on and moved straight up into the sky until they disappeared, he said.....
"It wasn't the lights that scared me," Sabatine said, "... but that sound, I've never heard anything like it before." The sound was continuous, but varied in pitch from a high squeal to a lower hum.".....

Seattle, Wash. - Jan. 10, 1967 Mysterious lights - resembling a flare - were sighted in the sky above the west side of Queen Anne Hill Monday. Puzzled observers began calling the police and fire departments in the afternoon to report the lights. One man told THE POST-INTELLIGENCER he saw a reddish glow, trailing smoke. The fiery object abruptly vanished, he said, leaving just the streak of smoke in the air. Employees of the Space Needle also reported the lights Monday night... Herndon, Florida - Jan. 11, 1967 Mrs. Helen M. Beilfuss - 333 Knowles Avenue, Winter Park, saw what she described as a "transparent or translucent" and seemingly "weightless" aircraft hovering almost motionlessly over the Herndon Airport.. She said the craft attracted her attention because it seemed to be standing still ... without any weight. The only motion she noticed was a slight tipping of the left side. Detroit, Mich. - Jan. 12, 1967 Another report of UFO'S over Michigan came Thursday, this time at Detroit - and once again with the photographs.. Mark Osterman, 31, a dealer sales representative for Cities Service Oil Co. said he saw the object Jan. 3 - while photographing a service station on Detroit's west side. He produced a small, color photo showing two light yellow oblong objects in the sky above the station. The objects appear to be ringed by halos of light... Osterman said the objects were in view for about two minutes then departed at "unbelievable" speed. "I've never seen anything move so fast," he said. Osterman said he was a flight engineer and gunner for the Air Force during the Korean War. The objects had shiny surfaces reflecting the sun and left before he had time to take a second picture. "They were in perfect formation. They made their stop at the same time-- almost as if they were joined....."

Stroudsburg, Pa. - Jan. 14, 1967 "Stroudsburg man reports seeing "Big Butterfly" in sky.." Vernon Heller, 41, of 41 Stofflet St. reported that he saw what he described as a "Big Butterfly" floating across the cloudless sky near his home Thursday night. Heller termed it an unidentified flying object which made no noise..... He said it was definitely not an airplane.. "And I don't think it was a flying saucer either... but it sure was eerie looking!" .. "My daughter (Mrs. Doris Staples) spotted it first when she went out on the porch," he said. "It was silver and gold and red in the back. It looked like a big butterfly. It floated in a north-east direction over the Main Street section... We watched it for 10 minutes until it disappeared... Stratford, Conn. - Jan. 14, 1967 Mrs. Bonnie Verrilli at 6:30 PM saw a red, domed object in the SW - hovering. It slowly descended looking like a small red star - another object joined it. One blinked out and the other one traveled to the East. Also -- Mr. and Mrs. Panuczak picked up the object which had turned white and slowly stopped and started -- as it traveled across the sky. Pittsburg, Kansas - Jan. 14, 1967 (UPI) Friday the 13th made a lot of people believers in southeast Kansas and southwest Missouri.... "We'd better not tell the day shift, they wouldn't believe us," said Mrs. Lora Miller, night dispatcher at the Cherokee County Sheriffs' office in Columbus, Kan..." "I wouldn't have believed it either if I hadn't seen it with my own eyes," radioed a Crawford County officer at Pittsburg. The unbelievable was an unidentified flying object that had law enforcement officers from three counties reporting sightings in the early morning hours... But Lt. Charles Hickman of the Joplin, Mo. police department saw something. "The Pittsburg (Kan) police called us about 4 AM and said "something unidentified in the sky" was heading our way and to get out and look for it. I was one of six officers who went to the eastern edge of Joplin... We all saw it. It was a large white light, travelling at a slow rate of speed.. something was reflecting off it." Hickman said it was about 1000 ft. overhead and he "was pretty close to it", within a mile..... Orlando Florida - Jan. 15, 1967 (Following reports from SCOOP REPORTER - Randy Vincent - 6519 Stockbridge Ave. - Orlando -- they are still incomplete as yet - full details later) A physicist working for Martin Co. and his wife saw a bright yellow oval object over Lake Conway for about 30 minutes around Jan. 15. (I am still investigating this case- will send full details later- R.V.) -- there were many other local cases I am trying to verify-- The following reports came in from Kentucky.. Jan. 15 - High school boy sees two erratically moving lights-- many other calls received to report UFO'S -- Jan. 16 - Man sees large luminous green sphere.. It hovered, moved then vanished... Jan. 18 - Several people report inverted saucer -- flying low with converging cone of light below... Jan. 24th. at 6:53 PM a boy and I spotted a bright white light in the SW sky. It was moving from right to left on a SW course at high speed without any sound - then disappeared.... (this last report was from Orlando)

Seattle, Wash. - Jan. 16, 1967 A white light over the south part of the city was reported last night by scores of persons. Some thought it was a falling airplane. An air-control official at Seattle-Tacoma Airport said the light was seen at 10 PM by persons at both airports here and a United Air Lines crew. It appeared to be a flare in the North Beacon Hill area... CREDIT: ROD DYKE -address given. Brooksville, Florida - Jan. 16, 1967 Mrs. Eula Lewis- SCOOP report Co-ordinator - Box 380, Rt. 4 - reported that a tear-drop shaped object was seen to hover over a parked car on Hayes Road in the vicinity of the recent 'landing' area.. It was described as: "One half was green- the other half red-- about the size of a volleyball.." Upon discovering the strange object hovering over their car- the ones involved, suddenly saw it just "vanish" before their eyes....

Mrs. Lewis also received another report from Masaryktown, Fla. of a "golden colored object that would swing like a pendulum as it hovered over a residence.. The Sheriff was notified, also other UFO reports in the same area on the same night..

St. Petersburg, Florida - Jan. 17, 1967 Many reports were received of an object described as "bright orange which then turned to red -- a smaller object seemed to be following the main one, then the small one "suddenly went out" and the main orange-red colored object shot straight up - sparks came from it- and it just "went out". Also-- reports on the same night came in from Clearwater and New Port Richey. The time was approx. 8:10 PM when first seen.. One of the observers was a man just discharged from the Air Force - name on file -- but- withheld for obvious reasons!

Irish Valley - Pa. Jan. 18, 1967 Mrs. J. Krebs was looking out of her window at 5:45 PM on Wednesday evening when she saw a bright thing just over the mountain which was hovering.. Thru binoculars the object was aluminum colored and had antennae sticking out of its side also it pulsed with a pink light. Mission Peak, Cal. - Jan. 18, 1967 Wouldn't it be awful to have the knowledge to navigate and pilot what we call a UFO from some unknown galaxie, all the way to Mission Peak, then be unable to find the Niles District? Far-fetched? Yes, but the people who were giving directions yesterday about 5:35 PM on Mission Blvd. across from the old Bar X Ranch.. Hopefully, those giving the directions know what they are doing, as yet only some of them have reported the incident. Freemont police and the News Register had several phone calls early last night -- Flying Saucers in the foothills -- UFO'S northbound over Over Mission Blvd. Wierd lights in the sky.. Len Joseph, 20, has always been leery when it comes to tales of visitors from space. Now he's not so sure. His account of what happened on Mission Blvd. shortly after dark, is the most detailed record of the local 'sighting'.. Joseph, who was returning home from classes at Foothill College, said he saw several cars stopped, people standing on the road giving directions. "I didn't give it a second thought," Joseph said. "People do this all the time. Then I saw other people farther down the road, and they were out of their cars, either pointing or looking to the sky.. "I looked out of my car window," he said, "and saw what resembled the Star or Bethlehem - an extremely bright nucleus with wands of light being cast from it." He also saw a commercial airliner in the sky.. Using the plane for a reference point, he decided the 'object' was higher, farther away and moving faster than the airplane." ----- (another clipping) -- Apparently flying saucers are forsaking Freemonts Mission Peak in favor of other, nearby areas... At least that's the conclusion of Doc Hall, professional climber and UFO researcher who investigated the peak yesterday for traces of saucer landing. However, Doc did report sighting two more UFO'S while on his trek.. Hall's project was prompted by last weeks reported sighting of a strange airborne craft the "shined like the Star of Bethlehem"..... Doc said: "We (he, his wife Mickey and an observer friend) spotted two ships about 2 o'clock Sunday. One looked like an inverted bowl on top of a halo. It hung in the air for maybe half an hour, then disappeared due west. The other one was smaller. It was below the bigger one. In a short time we just couldn't see it any more." --- From the position of the two sightings he claimed, Doc thinks that "there ships are coming from and landing in the Pleasanton Ridge area which is even less inhabited than our own Mission Peak." ----- CREDIT: FLYING SAUCER INFORMATION - Box 444 - Belmont, Cal.

Stratford, Conn. Jan. 21, 1967 While walking my dog, at 6:42 PM I spotted a small white object about the size of a star traveling SE. It slowly turned and headed SW until it was obscured by trees. It was circular in appearance.. I called a Mrs. Irene Tkacs - who picked up the object still traveling SE. It slowly crossed the sky, then stopped, reversed and headed NW and traveled about 6 inches in the sky. It stopped again and headed SE again. It turned colors from white to red several times and zig-zagged up and down and side to side across the sky still heading SE. The object appeared circular and it also made a few small circles as it slowly left her sight in the distance. The object was viewed at 7:27 PM/ No sound was heard.... Cairo, Ill. - Jan. 21, 1967 2 Nights of "SAUCERS" along the Mississippi... Police watching from levees on both sides of the river between Cairo and Charleston, Mo. said they saw what they described as a flying saucer for 15 minutes last night. Some residents of Poplar Bluff, Mo. 80 miles west of Cairo, reported spotting unidentified flying objects on the previous night.. Authorities said all descriptions were identical.. Cairo policeman Gene Smith and Carl Jones said they saw the object, described as having red and white lights, Thursday night. They were among a group of officers who watched the phenomenon again last night. Smith said the Cairo and Charleston police maintained radio contact across the river last night as they watched the object. All said it turned greenish when it changed altitudes at high speeds. Granite City, Mo. - Jan. 30, 1967 - A handful of Granite City police officers and two Madison County sheriff deputies stood spellbound in that city's Nameoki Valley Shopping Center for more than one hour tracking 'something' in the dark early morning sky during the weekend. It was the first official report of UFO'S in the St. Louis area this year. Groups of residents have been reporting 21 sightings since 1950. The only other sighting recorded in the month of Jan. occurred on Jan. 1, 1958, when "hundreds of residents" in Afton, Ferguson and Granite city saw a bright object. They called it a "vivid light" that blinked from red to blue to red. It was spotted later that evening over Springfield, Ill. Officers in the latest sighting reported the same general description. Believers may wonder why the Flying Saucer waited nearly a decade to return. There seems to be a pattern to the sightings here.... What did the police see in Granite City? "I don't know," said Patrolman Everett Kelley, "but it has made a believer out of me." Patrolman Ralph Parmley first spotted it at about 3 AM Saturday hanging over the north-northwest sky. "It changed from red to blue-it was a ball of light." He said it had some kind of dome with something on the bottom that looked "like a coffee cup." Officers Harris, Astorian, Wright, Yound and LeMaster gazed through binoculars..... There were other reports from the Missouri side - from Lemay, Meecham Park and Sulpher Springs road area about 7 PM Friday..... CREDIT: Andrew A. SCIENCE CORNER

"Can 'alien' life be artificially produced?"

MYSTERY MEN FLASH GOVERNMENT CREDENTIALS

New York (NANA) - Mysterious men dressed in Air Force uniforms or bearing impressive credentials from government agencies have been "silencing" UFO witnesses, according to Col. George P. Freeman - Pentagon spokesman for Project Bluebook. "We have checked a number of these cases," Freeman said in an interview this week, "and these men are not connected with the Air Force in any way."

He cited one recent case in which the police officers and other witnesses in Wanaque, N.J. were allegedly told and collected together by a man wearing an Air Force uniform. They were told that they "hadn't seen anything" and that they shouldn't discuss the incident. We checked with the local AFB," Freeman declared, "and discovered that no one connected with the Air Force had visited Wanaque on the date in question. Whoever it was, he wasn't from the Air Force." -- Another mystery man, this one bearing the credentials from the North American Air Defense (NORAD) turned up at the home of Rex Heflin, a man who had taken a series of UFO pictures in California in 1965, and demanded the originals. Later, NORAD denied having anything to do with the incident... Heflin's photos have never been returned and the Air Force has never been able to determine the identity of the man who took them... Similar mystery men, according to other sources, have turned up and confronted UFO witnesses in the states of Washington, Texas, Connecticut, and on Long Island, N.Y. In Feb. 1960 - Joe Perry, a restaurant owner in Grand Blanc, Mich. took a series of UFO pictures and was soon visited by two men posing as FBI agents. They seized a photo of a dome-shaped object with a green tail.... More recently, a man claiming to represent "a government agency so secret that he couldn't give its name" appeared in a school in Norwalk, Conn. and grilled two 12 year old boys for two hours about the disc-shaped object which they said had pursued them at ground level in April, 1966. "We haven't been able to find out anything about these men," Freeman admitted. "By posing as Air Force officers and government agents they are committing a federal offense. We sure would like to catch one." .. Freeman also commented on the numerous reports of sightings of low-flying unmarked planes over areas where UFOs had recently been seen. "That's a federal offense, too." All Air Force planes are clearly marked. We don't know anything about these unmarked planes. We'd like to catch one of them, too." Many witnesses swore that they saw several Air Force helicopters maneuvering over Wanaque Reservoir following a UFO sighting last Oct. Freeman said that a careful check had been made and that no formation of helicopters had been in that area at that time. "Besides, he continued, "most AFB have only one or two helicopters for rescue work. I just don't know where a whole formation of them could have come from."

Additional information that arrived after this article was started tells of UFO photographs taken at Newport, Rhode Island on Jan. 3, of an Oct. 4th, 1966 "landing" reported from East Connersville, Ind.-- pilot chases of UFOS over Missouri, California, Peru and elsewhere.

Other sightings and or radar trackings were reported from Offutt AFB (Nebraska), from Ream Field (Cal.) Kansas City Radar Station (Kan.) and Kirksville AFB (Missouri). Automobile chases have been reported from over a dozen states in recent months, as low-level UFO flights have been reported near highways, etc.. Dozens of detailed sightings have been reported by local police and State patrolmen across the nation... DELL magazine and LOOK magazine each published special UFO editions in Feb. and included not only black and white and color photos of the "unknowns", but also covered many of the "unexplained" of the UFO cases in Air Force Files..

Most "radar" trackings of UFOS are classified and servicemen of our Armed Forces are forbidden to reveal their UFO experiences to the public under Air Force regulation 200-2, Joint Army-Naval- Air Force Policies 146-B and CIRVIS reports. These policies keep military UFO sightings from the public and are backed by fines, prison terms, and court martials. Many civilian airlines have also forbidden their pilots to report their UFO encounters, because their sightings involve them with hours of questioning and are bad for passenger business..

The traditional AF denials of UFO existence came with an AP story on Feb. 14, 1967, which stated that though the UFO observations were on the increase again, that UFOS were "no security threat". This report failed to explain why AF pilots have fired at UFOS on a number of occasions, why the CIA had censored UFO reports from the Air Force, or why after 20 years of UFO activity, the US Government has approved 600,000 dollars to the U. of Colorado to conduct a scientific investigation of these aerial phenomena over the next two years..

Dr. J. Allen Hynek, head of the astronomy department at Northwestern U. and chief scientific consultant on UFOS to the AF recently has called for a scientific investigation. Hynek stated also that the Air Force had never conducted a scientific investigation -- and further more advised U Thant of the United Nations of the global scope of the UFO problem. Over 11,000 UFO sightings were reported to the Air Force in 1966 alone, the largest number second only to 1952, which produced over 15,000 sightings. The Air Force, it is estimated, receives only around 10% of the total sightings reported in the U.S.A., because of the loss of respect that it suffered with its ridiculous explanations of many UFO reports and thus the University of Colorado now has the "Tiger by the Tail". WHAT the U. of Colorado does with the problem remains to be seen. In the meantime, the UFO flurry continues with recent sightings from Pennsylvania, Ohio, North Carolina, Michigan and Florida.....





THE MYTH OF PSYCHOGEOCENTRICITY

The concept that Earth was the center of the Universe dominated scientific thought for centuries. No intelligent being would that this concept was true in the light of present day knowledge.

But this idea remains throughly ingrained in our society today in another form. This is the common belief, subscribed to even by some reputable men of science, that not Earth, but its dominant life form, man, is the center of the Universe.

The serious ufologist, with luck and effort, will be most likely be the one to confirm or deny this theory. Psychologically opposite of Coral Lorenzens theorizing in "The Great Flying Saucer Hoax", the idea that extraterrestrials' life forms must be totally non-humanoid does not represent an ego-orientated attempt at belittling all forms not identical to itself, it represents sound, intelligent thought..

Obviously the multitude of ramifications entailed here are too numerous to go into in detail. But, briefly, it must be recognized that life is a product of its planetary environment, not the opposite as is prone to be purported by the so-called "experts", or Air Force mouthpieces. Their logic is the syllogistic logic of the medieval using intelligence to negate intelligence. The odds against alien life looking physically like us is astronomical. Scientists have computed that there are over a billion possible planets capable of supporting life as we know it. But, this represents a general classification only and makes no statements as to mass orbital distance, quantitative atmospheric conditions, or temporal differential. ANY of these factors could produce a life form alien to us as Terrans, if not to the objective concept of humanoid life.

In 20 years of ufological research, I have come across only one UFO case that could be a NON-humainoid form. This was the FLATLANDS Case of 1952. Now, 15 years later, sloppy researchers are even trying to say that this fits into the category of the "little men" story.

For years, the serious researcher did not deny the possibility that UFO crews could be humanoid, but did not need to take such humanoid reports as were available, seriously. Quacks and publicity seekers abounded with their ridiculous little men or benevolent "pretty people" garbage. They still abound. Only today, conditions in Ufology are vastly different. Today, any ufologist may, in the course of his normal operations, face these crews. This idea, fantastic ten years ago, is highly possible today. The ufologist, who goes into it with the idea that he will be facing 'benevolent' humans, is in for trouble. The psychological evidence against the humanoid form is so great as to be beyond the scope of this article. The interested reader may read, among many others, "Life on other Worlds", Spencer, which is an excellent beginning for the field, if overly technical for the layman. There is only one thing which we may know definitely about the UFO crews-- at this stage -- They possess intelligence and it is vastly superior to OUR own or they would NOT be here!
