The next letter, by happy co-incidence, is from none other than Shirley Fickett, who is a member of Hayden Hewes' International UFO Bureau in Oklahoma. She writes:

"In fear of seeing that dreaded 'X' after my name on the envelope, I thought I better share this bit of info with your readers.....I have it from good authority that Chester, Illinois, was indeed burned to the ground, then miraculously reconstructed, as stated in 'Official UFO' Magazine. It was not, however, done by a group of UFOs. Someone in the know reported to me that they were in Chester at the time of the holocaust, and being on the streets, observed Elvis' clone 'streaking' through the streets with a

torch in hand - setting fire to everything in sight as he sprinted about.

"There could be a grave possibility that during this encounter, the clone burned along with the city; and since it was of flesh, it was not re-constructed along with the more solid molecular structure of the buildings.

"I am a former buyer and reader of 'Official UFO'".

Richard Heiden writes:

"I agree with you 100% that adults should be able to choose whatever religion they want.....However, you miss the whole point of the problem with cults like the Moonies and the so-called UFO Education Center. It is that many (maybe even practically all) of their followers join only after losing their free will, so they are not capable of deciding what it is that they do want.....

"Besides giving UFOs bad publicity (which we seem to agree on), and the religious cult aspect (on which we don't), I think there is another problem with outfits like the UFO Education Center. Many UFO witnesses who consider it their civic duty to report it to someone, do so to the UFO Education Center. Even police and sheriff's departments have done this in the past, at least until my article exposing the group came out in a statewide law enforcement journal last winter. At least in Wisconsin, anyway, the UFO Education Center is a highly visible group, though they've been lying low lately.....

"In a field where the vast majority of sightings are not reported at all (to judge by the polls taken), it is probably too much to expect that witnesses would also report to some responsible UFO group. Thus these sightings are, for all practical purposes, lost to ufology. I do not know if the UFO Education Center cooperates with groups like APRO, CUFOS, and MUFON, but I would be very surprised if it does. I think the two camps would not have anything to do with each other, because of their fundamental differences.

"Also, there is incredibly poor investigation by the crackpot contactee groups. Even a Milwaukee 'Journal' reporter noticed that the UFO Education Center tries to fit every case into the Adamski framework, and to explain to witnesses that they saw a Venusian scout craft or whatever. And of course the abduction and hostility cases they immediately write off as hoaxes or mistakes, because they 'know' the 'benevolent Space Brothers' would not do things like that. When they investigated (and I use the word loosely) a case near Fond du Lac, Wisconsin, involving a pair of green-colored occupants, they told the witnesses that the 'Space Brothers' are just like us, so the green appearance must be due to their clothing, or light from the UFO or something. (Since the UFO was multi-colored, they could use this to explain their color, regardless of what color they were.).....

"Now to comment on a couple of things in 'Saucer Spud': Is non-subscriber Timothy Greed Beckley the same individual as Timothy Green Beckley? If so, did he change his name, or is a 'typographical error' involved here?

"You reported on a 'serious and interesting experiment' in ESP you heard about from Alan Abel. If this is the same Alan Abel I'm thinking of, I can't imagine how anything connected with him would be serious. Probably his most famous hoax (one of many) was his 'Society for Indecency to Naked Animals' (SINA), a campaign to put diapers on all the nude animals. He also invented 'Mrs. Yetta Bronstein', whom he ran for president in 1964 and 1968.....Abel also did a movie called 'Is There Sex After Death?' It was in this capacity that I saw him once about six years ago on 'Merv Griffin' or one of those shows.....Abel also conducted a poll for the 'National Enquirer', in which he asked people if the colors of the U.S. flag should be changed to blue, white, and red.....Only one person out of 50 told Abel that the flag colors would not really be changed, but I think the others were just humoring him, and having fun of their own in disagreeing with the idea."

We still disagree about the danger of cults, though there's no doubt that their UFO "research" methods are hopeless, and hurt ufology. But if people need to be "deprogrammed" from the UFO Education Center, why not from the Roman Catholic or any other "legitimate" church, whose grip on its followers might be just as strong and illogical? - As for Beckley, we just can't seem to ever type his middle name correctly, somehow. - Abel is indeed a professional hoaxter (and a great guy!), but his friend Gene Buck in California seems serious about his interplanetary ESP experiment, and deserves the benefit of the doubt. - We thank Richard Heiden for his most interesting missive. - Editor.

Dear Mr. Moseley--

"Uncle Lou's" criticism of ufology is well taken; but his lament is crocodilic, not scientific. If he really wants to see "one solid scientific study" performed on UFOs, let him beg, borrow or steal a copy of Wilhelm Reich's Contact With Space, the last book Reich published before he died in a federal prison.
