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## MISC. RAVINGS

THIS YEAR'S FART-FEAST (FORTFEST?) was held in Washington, D.C. on August 5th, and was attended by your "More Saucer Tit" editor plus about fifty of the Faithful. All of the seven or so presentations showed a quality of scholarship sadly lacking in most UFO conventions, and the organizers should be congratulated for this! To us, the most interesting talk (though we heard the same stuff last year) was a run-down of anomalies which, taken together, strongly tend to show that civilized Man has been around for many thousands of years - perhaps millions - rather than the relatively short period of time generally believed by orthodox science.

The "feature presentation" of the day was the first public showing of the complete New Zealand saucer film (circa Jan. 1st, 1979), which has been studied in painstaking detail by Dr. Bruce Maccabee, a pro-UFO Navy physicist. The movie is supported by simultaneous radar observations and other evidence. The film runs for several minutes, but the UFOs dance around so erratically that little can be deduced by an amateur observer such as your editor.

Following the film was a panel discussion, consisting of Maccabee plus ex-NICRAPer Richard Hall & arch-skeptics Bob Sheaffer and Phil Klass. Hall defended the film, whereas Sheaffer believed it merely showed brightly-lit fishing boats, and Klass insisted vigorously on false radar returns as an explanation. Again, the happy amateur was lost in the complex technical arguments between these men!

Two disappointments marred the day: Bob Jones of Vestigia failed to show up, and a trained dolphin intended to photograph the Loch Ness Monster was reported to have died suddenly. (No connection between these two events.)

Following the presentation, a secluded dinner was attended in a Washington restaurant by Dr. Bill McIntyre, Klass, Sheaffer, and your editor. Having decided the fate of the UFO Field for the next hundred years or so, we dispersed thereafter.....


Actually, it should have been called "The Wrong Field Story", as the title episode allegedly took place at Columbus Air Force Base, Ohio! - Editor.

had to feel totally lost at the proceedings. The presentations were difficult enough to follow for someone who had at least an idea of what was being discussed.

"I felt that the presentations on the Kentucky abduction case and the Ohio Valley monster sightings were fairly well done, but I enjoyed most talking with you, Bob, Rick, and several others that were in attendance. I assume that it will be quite awhile before the Cincinnati chapter of OUFOL sponsors another convention!

"Your newsletter continues to be both informative and entertaining... I can't believe, though, some of the bizarre letters and wild accusations that come across the Editor's desk! Zechel, Klass, 'Concerned Ufologist', Hendry, Oberg - Who do these people think they are, anyway! "Among the topics that should be considered is the selection of a new and more professional class of speakers. I do not wish to denigrate the knowledge and ability of the folks who have given talks at the past few conventions, but few of these people are public speakers, and few of them take the time to really prepare a presentation that will appeal to an audience only slightly familiar with the ramifications of the subject. Moreover, it is important to attract speakers from all realms of thought in the field, as long as the speakers have serious credentials to lecture on UFOs....

"In New York next summer, we will have the opportunity to attract a wide range of national media attention - and we should see to it that this attention affords us a proper forum to publicize our work to the public at large. The convention itself may actually be only a small part of the audience we can reach.

"Think about it. I hope that there will be some response from your readership on these issues. Let's not botch up this chance - it may be the last chance we have!"

None other than TODD ZECHEL writes the following:

"I'm amazed - even stunned - to see my name being taken in vain so often throughout your 'newsletter'. I'm even more concerned over the fact my personality has become a bigger issue than UFOs and my research thereof. Therefore, as I told you over the phone, I have decided to withdraw from

active participation in organized Ufology, and will from this point on conduct my work as quietly and with as much dignity as possible.

"Accordingly, I have tendered my resignation as Director of CAUS and as Director of Research for GSW. Whatever role I play in these organizations in the future will be as a private individual contributing funds, information, and other forms of support to worthy projects.

"None of my actions are related to efforts by Philip J. Klass to defame, obstruct, and otherwise injure me.....I shall deal with Klass in the manner that is necessary, otherwise known as quid pro quo....

"I do not generally feel bitter about Ufology or Ufologists. Whatever else one could say about most Ufologists, he could never say they are not interesting people. I have met some very intelligent, dedicated, and fascinating people who happen to be Ufologists. I must say, however, that all of the people - men and women - that I have respect and affection for, believe there is some basic reality to UFOs, whether they believe UFOs are physical craft from another planet or some other explanation such as ultra-terrestrial or variations thereof.

"As for the so-called skeptics, I have found them to be boring, chauvinistic and often offensive. It is not curious at all to me that they are nearly unanimous in their support of big government, big business, the military-industrial complex, unlimited proliferation of nuclear power, the spread of technology without regard for human safety, the nuclear weapons build-up, and a host of other political issues, all of which place the skeptics in the category of being right-wing fanatics. That these fanatics employ ad hominem arguments and character assassinations to debunk UFOs and discredit Ufologists is not surprising at all. In fact, given their limited thinking abilities, it is the only course of action available to them. I am only surprised and amazed by their lack of integrity, and their willingness to cause grave harm to innocent people in order to further their cause. But I suppose in light of the history of Fascists, and the incredibly evil acts they've committed, I should not be surprised at all.

"Unlike Nixon, I don't expect my resignations will protect me from further abuse. No, you will still have Todd Zechel to kick around - and I'm sure you will avail yourself of every opportunity. I merely want to ensure that when I'm being kicked, deservedly or not, that innocent people aren't harmed by the blows...."

"I must be a very insignificant member of CAUS. Even though I've received two recent letters from Philip J. Klass, he seems not to have thought me to be important enough to get a copy of his TZ-5 paper on Zechel and CAUS, cited in your newsletter a month ago.

"Klass writes in his July 7th letter to me: 'If NSA really is a civilian intelligence agency, as you have so brilliantly and eloquently demonstrated, then clearly NSA is parading under false colors when its letters carry the Defense Dept. seal.' Of course, Klass makes up an imaginary quote for me, as usual. I can speak for myself, Phil, thank you!

"In his latest letter, Klass says he's 'anxious to resolve once and for all the issue of whether the National Security Agency really is a civilian intelligence agency, as you and Todd Zechel have so loudly proclaimed, or whether it really is a component of the Defense Department...' Again, the phony quote. Klass, conveniently, fails to see that the two points are not contradictory, as he well knows from my letter of Sept. 25, 1978. It is analogous to the question, 'Does a person die when murdered? Or does he/she become dead?'

Klass must be an unbridled right-wing militarist, since he keeps insisting the military controls DOD. But maybe he's right. Maybe we do live in a military dictatorship.

"Klass' postscript in his letter (printed in your May 30 issue), which concedes Zechel did work for the Army Security Agency (ASA), is amusing in light of Klass' earlier papers - which he must want to forget. In TZ-2, Klass reprinted whole pages from the book published by his top 'authority' on NSA, Victor Marchetti, to prove his silly points.

"Unfortunately for Klass, his expert Marchetti, who once worked for ASA just like Zechel, now publicly calls himself a former 'NSA officer.' Just like Zechel!

"Poor Phil. He has lost once again. And on his own selected battleground - or I should say playground.
