TERRIBLE ATTACK BY THE S.B.I.

Anyhow, one of our agents has sent us the May 1980 issue of "The SBI Report", which contains the above-mentioned Terrible Attack. You see, Pete has joined the Wilhelm Conspiracy mentioned in "Saucer Fear". From Confidential Sources we have now obtained complete details about the "secret" organizational meeting of the so-called "Coalition of Concerned Ufologists". This conspiratorial group will meet at 8:45 a.m. on August 23rd in Room 317 of the Student Center of Kent State University, Ohio. Ring-leader Charles Wilhelm will be joined by, among others, non-subscriber Bill Spaulding of GSW, who supposedly represents a total of 500 scientific and non-scientific members. Bill will be flying in all the way

"Miss UFO" is holding one of George Rackus's alien heads. Sorry that we can't reproduce the photo here.....A number of our loyal non-subscribers have been asking us how they can obtain tapes of the various speeches at our convention. So far, we have received only one reply, which is printed on the last page of this issue....

Author and lecturer Art Ford of New York City, who was to have been a speaker at our recent National UFO Conference, tells us that he is Retiring from UFO Research. Therein he shows that there just ain't any sound evidence of visitations to Earth by ancient aliens, as claimed by Von Daniken in 'Chariots of the Gods'. I also must stand forth, and with equal zeal demand credit for any incompetency connected with the operation....

"There was no lack of publicity on our part. I personally contacted every TV and radio station, AM and FM, and every newspaper, metropolitan and suburban, with releases about your convention. And there were 500 posters printed and distributed around Dayton, Fairfield, Cincinnati, and Covington (Ohio), not to mention California, Michigan, South Dakota, Texas, Florida, and Ontario, Canada. "....Regarding Earl Jones' 'confession' that he was responsible for running the ill-fated '79 con., and not Charlie Wilhelm:As you will recall, Charlie (a Permanent Organizing Committee member at the time) failed to show up for the P.O.C. meeting before the con., even though I personally made sure (and I suppose you did also) that he was informed of the time and place. Also, once you finally got in touch with him later that evening, he told you not to worry, that he had an agenda all planned and ready to go for the 'closed' delegate meeting. And, as we all know too well, he showed up late for that meeting, with no agenda whatsoever, effectively throwing us off guard and making the NUFOC look like an organization composed chiefly of twits!...."

Charlie W. is a twit! - Editor.

We have received an interesting assortment of anonymous postcards, very likely from "Dr." Bill McIntyre. We quote them in part, below:

However, if he quoted accurately from your press release for the 1980 conference, it is hard to imagine how you can characterize its inaccuracies as 'inadvertent mis-statements'...."

DENIS COREY writes:

"....It would appear that fellow Ohioan Charles Wilhelm has been hanging around the fuel nozzles again (fumes, you know). What does the Post Office have to do with UFO conventions?....

"The Social Page (P. 4) of 'Saucer Fear' was a nice touch. 'Space hardware found on a farm near Grovers Mill, New Jersey,' eh? What a clue, indeed! Obviously of Martian manufacture! Remarkably untarnished with age!...."

Tom Benson claims it's real "space junk" of some sort. - Editor.

ORES WILSON writes:

"....Charles Wilhelm is causing a lot of trouble, but that won't stop the Space People from landing on Earth when they are ready to, and this will happen in 1982, it is said.

"Oshkosh, Wisconsin, is far more suitable than New York City for a UFO convention. Prices should be lower there. New York is too hectic, and Oshkosh is a central U.S. location...."

STEVE BARNETT writes:

"....My regards to the guy from OUF00L. We should all be driven from the field occasionally until we are fit only to graze.
"Bless you, Oh subtle landlord...."

WILLIAM RETOFF hits us with the following Deep Thought:

"....What would happen if all the people in Ufology who were silenced got to say what they wanted?...."

Finally, MICHAEL COHEN lets go with the following:

"In response to the recent controversy about Phil Klass and his ability as a technical writer, I would like to present evidence that he and his magazine, 'Aviation Week & Space Technology', live in constant fantasy worlds. From 1965 until 1975 he and the other editors and writers of this magazine claimed that 'air superiority' was winning the war in southeast Asia. Hundreds of articles were published praising the aviation equipment used in this conflict which cost the lives of thousands of U.S. airmen and the taxpayers tens of billions of dollars. The American public and the military establishment believed these articles because Mr. Klass and 'Aviation Week' were supposed to be 'experts' in the field of military aviation. Mr. Klass personally wrote many of these articles, praising the electronic and other systems used in the 10,000 U.S. aircraft lost in that war.

"'Aviation Week' admitted that the war was lost in 1975, when 1,000 U.S. aircraft were captured on the ground by the Communists. As far as I know, Mr. Klass never acknowledged in print that the United States lost the war or that all that electronic equipment which he praised for so many years was really useless junk. Perhaps he believed his own misstatements, and he might still believe today that we won that war. Unfortunately, thousands of U.S. pilots died believing in his misstatements.

"In the July 15th issue of 'Saucer Fear', Klass boasted about his ability as a 'technical journalist' by quoting an article in 'Time' which begins: 'When a modern bomber strikes into hostile air, it will carry few guns or defensive rockets - perhaps none. In "Aviation Week", Philip J. Klass tells a small part of the large, top-secret story of electronic countermeasures....' The hundreds of B-52 pilots and crew members who died attacking Hanoi in 1972 learned the hard way that Mr. Klass was handing them a snow job.

"Mr. Klass has to resort to using slander and irrational arguments attacking the existence of UFOs because his ability as a 'technical writer' during the Vietnam War shows that he is living in a fantasy world. Such a person naturally attacks anybody who disagrees with his views as being insane, suffering from hallucinations, or 'misinterpreting the facts'. In his fantasy, Klass believes that he is not only a capable technical journalist, but also a capable psychiatrist. On Page 338 of 'UFOs Explained', he tried to explain how four rational Army helicopter pilots did not see a real UFO: 'One could not exclude the possibility that the helicopter crew, like the Zond-4 observers and so many other UFO observers, were unwitting victims of spurious details supplied by their eyes....' Thus, Mr. Klass wants us to believe that the 15 million Americans who have seen UFOs are suffering from a form of mental illness.
