But afterwards, at a dinner with about a dozen of the faithful, your editor playfully bent a very ordinary spoon under the table when no one was looking - and succeeded in convincing almost everyone at the table that he had Geller-like powers. Which only means that the "will to believe" is very strong in many people. As for Randi, he had told us that he would be attending the Geller performance, but he failed to show up. All very weird, we must say!....

Every now & then we get Bored enough to leaf through some of the UFO literature that drifts into our Headquarters; and in doing so recently, we were surprised to find part of our editorial from "Saucer Stool" (April 10, 1980) reprinted in "UFO Bulletin Board" in the Summer issue of Ray Palmer's "Search" Magazine. We're glad the people at "Search" found it interesting enough to reprint, but the implication is that we are looking for members/subscribers/ or whatever - whereas we're not. We keep our mailing list down to a bare minimum of Truly Deserving non-subscribers such as yourself. (We presume that you are a non-subscriber, as otherwise you probably would not be reading these immortal words.)....

JOHN KEEL is having mysterious troubles with his telephone again. One day when we called, a robot told us it was out of order. The next day, Keel's voice on tape said: "If you wish to interview John Keel, send a check for one hundred dollars to Box 351, Murray Hill Station, New York, N.Y." Finally, we reached ole John in person, and he explained both these oddities. It seems (or so he claims) that someone cut his, and only his, phone line - out of thousands of wires in the same box! As for the \$100 bit, this is to fend off excessive interviews. Some organization of disc jockeys printed his home phone number in their bulletin, and he receives dozens of calls for minor radio interviews, thus interrupting his tranquility....

The October 1980 issue of "Fate" Magazine contains an interesting article which we had overlooked till now. Entitled "Alias Carlos Allende", it finally gets to the bottom of the controversy surrounding the mysterious man who allegedly witnessed the "Philadelphia Experiment" in 1943. The gist of it all is that Carl Allen, alias Carlos Allende, is an eccentric wanderer and bullshit artist whose family still live in New Kensington, Pa. The author of the article, named Robert Goerman, interviewed Allende's father, who is still alive, and obtained a mountain of documents showing that Carl not only "annotated" Morris K. Jessup's book "The Case for the UFO" (using three names and three supposedly different handwritings), but also has the habit of annotating just about anything he can get his hands on!

Of course, long-time readers of our newsletter know that the original expose of Allende appeared in the Sept. 10th, 1977 issue of "Saucer Stews", which was published shortly after your editor met the mysterious wanderer in Clarksburg, West Virginia, together with former UFO personality Gray Barker. Our impressions of Allende as published in 1977, though not backed up by the documents and family interviews that Goerman obtained, nevertheless are almost identical. For example, Goerman states that Allende claims that his confusing annotations make him co-author of "The Case for the UFO", which is the same claim he made in a Clarksburg newspaper interview - which we reproduced in the above-mentioned issue of "Saucer Stews".

We would welcome comments on the above from non-subscribers Charles Berlitz and Bill Moore, co-authors of the best-selling book called "The Philadelphia Experiment"....

The October 1980 issue of "Fate" also contains another interesting article, called "Solving the Mystery of Nazca". This is another subject your

editor knows a good deal about, having dug personally on the famed geometric lines in Nazca, Peru many years ago, and also having written an article for "Fate" on the subject during that era.

It is quite true, as the author of the present article points out, that the "landing field" explanation for the lines is absurd and unnecessary - Eric Von Daniken to the contrary. Furthermore, it is not a fact that the lines can be seen only from the air. (Otherwise, how could we have dug on them??) Likely, these lines had an astronomical significance to the primitive people who constructed them - roughly in the first 500 years A.D. These ancient people are now known, to a degree, from the designs on their pottery, which in some cases match the designs laid out on the Nazca desert. A mystery? Perhaps; but alas, it isn't related to UFOs.....
