Bigfoot hunter JOAN JEFFERS, turning now to a different subject, writes:

"In response to David Schroth's remarks on hypnosis: Indeed we should be skeptical of material obtained through hypnosis, since no test has been devised to prove the existence of the hypnotic state. "The Wisconsin Dept. of Revenue is giving me a hassle over allowing tax deductions for expenses on behalf of non-profit UFO research organizations - investigations, phone calls, postage, clipping service, etc. The IRS accepts these deductions, and the state is supposed to do so also; but the state claims they are personal expenses. Even though the IRS accepted my amended returns where these expenses were the only ones listed, the state says they must have just slipped by. As far as the state is concerned, it doesn't count unless the IRS audited the returns, in which case they would accept the deductions too.

"Is there anybody among your vast circulation, anywhere in the country, who has an audited IRS return in which he claimed similar deductions (not necessarily all of them, however), who is willing to share with me the details of the deductions, in order to demonstrate to the Wisconsin Dept. of Revenue that such deductions are in fact allowed by the IRS? The Dept. might require a copy of the actual return, but that could probably be sent directly to them, without my seeing it, so nobody would have to worry on that score. I know the federal and state tax forms clearly state that such expenses are deductible, but my appeal was already rejected....

"If I went on the basis of logic and common sense, I would have every reason to be optimistic; but so far optimism hasn't done any good - nor do logic and common sense when it comes to the Wisconsin Dept. of Revenue and its appeals bureau. \$200 in refunds are at stake, plus any future deductions, not to mention those of other ufologists in Wisconsin."

Much Space here to complain about only \$200 in deductions; but we happen to have extra Space in this issue. Our advice: Don't fight the (SHUDDER, GASP!) Feds! They'll get even, somehow! - Editor.

Rumors of Death of Moseley Persist

Rumors are rampant that UFO writer and researcher James W. Moseley died in a mysterious car accident several years ago. Citing irrefutable evidence, a spokesperson close to the situation told reporters that the man currently claiming to be Moseley was in reality Richard H. Hall, former executive of NICAP.

Hall, it will be remembered, was a frequent critic of the Moseley-led independent UFO researchers movement that was a major force in the field during the mid to late 1960s. It is thought that he was selected to take Moseley's place because he would be the person least suspect as an imposter.

"The evidence is absolutely certain," the spokesperson remarked at a recent background session with journalists. "Nobody has seen Hall and Moseley together in years. It's like Superman and Clark Kent; when one of them is present, the other's always somewhere else.

"As for Hall, his place in society has been taken over by John A. Keel."

The evidence of Moseley's death may be found in a number of strategic places, sources say. The best-selling record album *Strangers From Space* that Moseley allegedly recorded with Long John Nebel years ago contains the most telling proof of all. When played backwards, one can hear the distinctive voice of Gray Barker announcing, "I buried Jim."

Moseley's unheralded departure was also noted in various messages received through automatic writing through the years. It is said that on a trip in 1974 to Valley Forge, Pennsylvania to attend a session of the National UFO Conference, Moseley's car was forced off the road by a black Cadillac Fleetwood limousine. The strange vehicle had blacked-out windows, and an especially foul-smelling exhaust. Witnesses to the alleged accident described the odor as resembling that of burnt sulphur.

According to one account, Moseley's car went over an embankment, and the vehicle burst into flames. Strange lights in the sky were seen around this time. When investigators reached the scene of the mishap, the car was found little the worse for wear, except for the prevailing smell that resembled that of the exhaust of the mysterious Cadillac. No one was found inside the vehicle, but a large glowing object was sighted just above the trees.

Someone pledged to secrecy after the investigation later said he heard a voice in the sky that was not unlike Moseley's. The voice cried out, "The sun doesn't look right. I can't tell which way is west... hail NICAP..."
