HOW CAN BUDD HOPKINS SELL US THE BROOKLYN BRIDGE
WHEN HE DOESN'T EVEN KNOW WHERE IT IS???

We were going to taper off on the infamous Linda Napolitano UFO abduction case until we received the astonishing March/April 1993 issue of the "International UFO Reporter" (IUR), organ of the J. Allen Hynek Center for UFO Studies (CUFOS), with Jerome Clark (sadly!) as its editor. Let us start right off by observing that the late Dr. Hynek, whom we knew and liked, must be spinning in his grave these days, if he has any inkling of what Clark and associates are doing to the scientific integrity of the organization he founded!

First, we are annoyed that Hopkins & associates persist in calling the central figure in this fiasco Linda Cortile, when her real name, Napolitano, has already been published widely since it first appeared in "Saucer Smear". And the name of the United Nations dignitary allegedly in the Linda case is still kept secret by Hopkins and his followers, when we all know it is Javier Perez de Cuellar, former Secretary General of the U.N.

Secondly, as the title of this article implies, scientific researcher Budd Hopkins doesn't seem to know much about the location of New York City's Brooklyn Bridge - near which this alleged UFO abduction took place. Hopkins has apparently lived in that part of the City much of his life, as has Linda; and yet, on the very cover of IUR, there appears a photograph of the Bridge, taken by Hopkins, with the caption: "Stereo view of the Brooklyn Bridge from approximate location of 'Dan's' car at the time of the abduction". (This location is in Manhattan.) The caption continues: "The New Jersey side is across the river on the left, and Manhattan is out of sight to the right."

Yes, Manhattan is out of sight, behind the camera; but unfortunately for Budd, the Brooklyn Bridge runs from lower Manhattan to (yes!) Brooklyn,

not New Jersey, which is also out of sight several miles behind the camera!

This is not just an innocent "typo", folks; it is typical of the "research" done by Hopkins, who, according to the treatise by Hansen/Stefula/Butler, has not even made a thorough search for back-up witnesses among the many tenants in the large apartment complex where Linda lives, nor has he interrogated security guards there - to find out if anyone other than Linda and her family noticed a very brightly-lit UFO hovering outside her window at about 3 a.m. on November 30th, 1989 - three and a half years ago! As we understand it, there simply are no such back-up witnesses, or at least none have come forward. But apparently Hopkins' vision of "reality" does not need such mundane reinforcement.

IUR, a supposedly scientific journal, devotes about 19 of its 24 pages to the Linda case. Of the 19 pages, a total of 11 are devoted to long diatribes by Clark and Hopkins, in which for the most part they attack the character and personality of their sworn enemies, Hansen, Stefula, and Butler, while ignoring the factual evidence brought out by these three men. Supporting articles by David Jacobs and John Mack occupy another 3 pages, and a total of about 4 pages are given to Donald Johnson and Willy Smith to argue against the validity of the case.

It is interesting to note that Jerry Clark and Willy Smith despise each other, so perhaps it was kind of Clark to allow Smith's article to appear. But never mind; Hopkins was obviously forewarned of Smith's line of argument, and successfully devastates it in a rebuttal in this very same issue, leaving Smith to look quite bad! (Ain't Science Grand!)

Your humble "Smear" editor is mentioned only in passing. Clark titles his editorial "Saucer Smearers", for which we duly thank him; Hopkins calls us "a dubious personage" (along with Phil Klass); and further on he refers to "Smear" as a "scandal sheet" and calls its editor "a cynical and parasitic journalist (who) immediately accepts the Linda-as-diabolical-hoaxer theory, perhaps because he himself once perpetrated a successful UFO hoax. Maybe, in this case, it takes one to accuse another of being one, too." No Budd, it's better than that: IT TAKES ONE TO KNOW ONE! Frame that motto and put it on your wall!

Of George Hansen, who impresses us as a rather mild-mannered sort with a good sense of humor, Hopkins writes: "Nor can we let our solemn work squeeze out the natural humor of life. Lighten up, George. Wait till you read the whole Cortile (sic) story, and then we'll talk about the case. Meanwhile, take a deep breath, smile, and have a little fun."

But in an earlier paragraph, Hopkins compares Hansen/Stefula/Butler to the Muslim extremists who blew up the World Trade Center recently, and states: "...Killing American office workers can no more accomplish (their) goal than Hansen's character trashing can accomplish whatever it is he thinks is his goal. The more broadly he indulges his arm-flailing and reputation-bashing, the more the cruelty of his own brand of fanaticism reveals itself."

It is Hopkins and Clark who are humorless in regard to their own agenda and fanatical in their efforts to force the Linda case down the throats of the members of organized ufology. And it is indeed "Smear" that stands as a beacon of sanity, self-criticism, humor, and moderation. Or at least this is what we at "Smear" modestly believe (or half-believe).


Huggins does not claim to have any proof of his statements, but he does seem sincere in making them.

The libel/slander case of parapsychologist Dr. Eldon Byrd vs. James ("The Amusing") Randi is finally being heard in U.S. District Court in Baltimore, Maryland. Randi, who claims he is now broke, has a court-appointed lawyer. Byrd's lawyer is the same man who has previously worked for Byrd's friend Uri Geller in a previous court case involving Randi.

We are told that the infamous "blackmail tape" is now part of the court record. However, when the tape was played for the jury over Randi's very strong objections, the jurors were given earphones so that the courtroom audience could not hear it. The tape, which we have heard and have a transcript of, consists of a series of short conversations between Randi and several young men who call him on the phone. 

that he, always quick to shoot from the lip, was further emboldened in 1986 by winning \$272,000 tax-free, in an award from the prestigious MacArthur Foundation, in recognition of his lifetime of work exposing psychic fraud, etc. In a newspaper interview shortly after that victory, Randi stated: "It's so wonderful....No one can take it (the Grant) from you - not even the IRS for back taxes. There are no responsibilities, no strings. You don't even have to continue in the same field. You can announce that you are a communist, transvestite, child molester, and no one can touch the money...."

As of this writing, there is no verdict yet in the Byrd vs. Randi case, but - win, lose or draw - Randi's finances and reputation have been ruined by his various ill-advised remarks. Regarding Byrd, Randi called him "the shopping market molester", and also accused him of being one of the anonymous people who sent copies of the "blackmail tape" in recent years to dozens of psychic researchers & others throughout the United States. Our copy of the tape and transcript reached us anonymously by mail shortly after we started a series of articles about Randi in "Smear", in late 1991...



TIDBITS OF TRASH:

Rima Laibow, Director of TREAT, has apparently skipped out on a hotel bill of over five thousand dollars, re the recent TREAT V convention at the Inn of Loretto in Santa Fe, New Mexico. There are also rumors of other financial irregularities. Way to go, Rima!.... Donald Ware, Eastern Regional Director of MUFON, has refused Walt Andrus' request to resign, and is now the subject of a mail vote by the approximately twenty members of the MUFON Board of Directors. We don't yet know the outcome of the vote, but we are rooting for Ware!... Arch-skeptic Phil Klass and anti-CSICOP skeptic Tom McIver are engaged in an extremely complex feud, in which Klass sent McIver, supposedly as a joke, a copy of a letter to the Post Office Dept. complaining about McIver. McIver realized that Klass had not actually sent the letter to the Post Office, but he didn't think the joke was funny, so he complained to the Post Office about Klass. The Post Office people did not take McIver's complaint seriously enough to pursue it; and that's where the matter now stands....

When Vickie Lyons and a group of MUFONites in Pensacola, Florida, started planning a UFO conference for late October, Florida MUFON State Director Charles Flannigan decided that some of the intended speakers were too "far out", and sent a weird negative letter to all of them! Deuley, MUFON's Corporate Secretary, has a background in the National Security Agency (NSA). Strangely, Deuley is also on the Board of Directors of the Fund for UFO Research.... Last but by no means least, Jerome Clark has gotten into still another highly emotional ufological feud, this time with Walt Andrus of MUFON. The two of them had a dispute by telephone. Clark then followed up with a nasty letter to Andrus; and Andrus then got even by sending copies of it to every member of the Board of Directors of CUFOS, together with a copy of his letter of reply!

YE OLDE MAILBAG:

Parapsychologist GEORGE HANSEN writes:

"Thanks for your postcard. I had noticed the error (?) in the photo caption on the cover of the March/April 1993 issue of IUR (International UFO Reporter).

"There are three plausible explanations:

"(1) The aliens moved the bridge during the abduction - this being one of Hopkins' '5000 facts (that) form an extraordinarily consistent account, in which everything makes sense - a complex saga of total coherence.'

"(2) Jerome Clark, living an isolated existence in a small, remote town in Minnesota, has limited familiarity with geography outside of Canby.

"(3) Clark and Hopkins may have accepted assurance from Larry Warren

that the Brooklyn Bridge connects New York with New Jersey."

ROBERT ANTON WILSON writes as follows:

"Excellent issue! I loved the alien ladies, who made me think of what could have happened if Ed Woods and the Mitchell Brothers ever collaborated on a movie!

"I must point out, however, that either you got the picture of Jerome Clark upside down or else all the other photos of him I've ever seen were upside down. One more UFO-related mystery for me to ponder on those long nights when the TV isn't working....

"In answer to your inquiry of May 9th about the False Memory Syndrome Foundation:

"FMSF consists of a number of psychotherapists (exact number unknown to me) plus over 3,000 middle-aged-to-elderly couples who have been accused of sexual abuse by their 'adult children'. In all of the parental abuse cases, the memory - or 'memory' - was recovered under hypnosis when the adult child was around 30 to 40 years old. In most cases, Satanic ritual and human sacrifice were also remembered (or 'remembered'). In all cases, the matter either never came to trial, or the parents were acquitted. In many cases, the parents passed lie detector tests. In almost all cases, other children denied the charges and claimed the accusing child had gone nuts. In several cases, the accusing child later switched therapists, got a different view of things, and recanted the charges.

"The FMSF is concerned with publicizing cases where juries failed to convict and/or the accuser later recanted, and with publicizing the fact, - long accepted by the majority of psychologists but not known to Hopkins, Jacobs et al - that things 'remembered' under hypnosis are not necessarily true. They also publicize the fact that, even without hypnosis, people can often be convinced that they 'remember' things that never happened - e.g. in one experiment, after being told that as a child he suffered acute anxiety when he got lost in a shopping mall, the subject, or victim, not only 'remembered' that fictitious incident but spontaneously 'remembered' additional vivid details of the terrors in the mall.

"'False memory' and 'substitute memory' have been terms used in psychology at least since I was in college nearly 40 years ago.

"My own opinion, formed long before I read any of the literature on UFO abductions or Satanic rituals, is that memory is much more creative than most people suspect. Or, as Dr. Ernest Rossi says, we continually 'reframe' (add to, subtract from, re-edit, re-orchestrate) the past in terms of our current beliefs. Or, as Nietzsche said even before modern psychology appeared, 'We are all greater artists than we realize.'

"None of this passes judgment on any specific case, but merely indicates the degree of caution with which we should approach all such matters. In criminal cases, I would not convict anybody on the basis of one person's 'memory' alone, but would want some hard and objective confirming evidence. In tales of demons and grey sex maniacs from other worlds, I would also want more than 'memory' before I believed a yarn.

"Incidentally, in all the really big Satanic cases, the FBI's Behavior Science Unit has exhumed the alleged mass graves. They never found a single body in the graves, nor even a shin bone. Of course, some will immediately take this as proof that the FBI is in on the cover-up."

TOM BENSON, former MUFON New Jersey State Director, writes:

"The March/April 1993 issue of the International UFO Reporter (IUR) contains a series of linked articles defending the 'Linda Cortile Case of the Century' and denouncing the investigators who have questioned the veracity of the claims made by Budd Hopkins and 'Cortile'. Jerome Clark leads off with an editorial calling the New Jersey researchers (one of whom is a former MUFON State Director, the other a former State Section Director)

'saucer smearers', apparently equating them with what to Clark is the lowest form of ufological life, Jim Moseley, publisher of 'Saucer Smear'.

"The IUR articles resound with a dogmatic tone, emotionally - but not objectively - challenging the work of researchers Richard Butler, George Hansen and Joe Stefula. This trio simply did what UFO researchers are supposed to do, but seldom accomplish: a great deal of hard, time consuming, common sense investigation. They followed all reasonable leads, found a multitude of 'real world' discrepancies in the 'Cortile' story, and then published their findings in a lengthy report.

"For that they should get a gold medal in recognition of their exemplary investigation, which among other things has saved ufology from the devastating results of having the 'Case of the Century' exposed by the media. But Hopkins (and Andrus, Clark, Mack, Jacobs, et al) wants them kicked out of ufology, stating "I have heard that Stefula and Butler have resigned from MUFON - saving, I suspect, director Walter H. Andrus Jr. from the job of having to get rid of them."

"Whitley Streiber (one of the legion of 'former' associates of Budd Hopkins) says that the 'Visitors' have a beehive behavior, and act as if they are part of a linked group intelligence. It appears that the pro-Cortile crowd is similarly linked, react as if some strange animal crossed their territorial boundary, and mindlessly attack the intruder.

"This strange mind-linked brotherhood seems to think that evidence doesn't count, that their joint pronouncements are enough, sheltered by an angelic force field immune to fact or discussion. Eventually, they must lift the Veil of Isis and answer the real world question about 'Cortile': Where's the beef?"

The semi-amusing MONTY CANTSIN writes as follows:

"...How many times do I have to explain (that) I resent slobs like Wilson exactly because he is so boringly normal, and he is filling one of the niches in society that rightfully belong to us real non-conformists... The miserable bores who run ufology, like the miserable bores who run art, entertainment, & media, must keep the real talents out at all cost. That's how the System 'works'....

"What's really poor about Huggins' painting is that it shows the same defects that trick photography shows. In a bad trick photo you can see how the false superimposition of an alien's or a celebrity's face doesn't quite mesh with the body. But in good surrealist painting, the imaginative artist can combine incongruities to make them look real. What's bad about Huggins' painting is that it looks like he painted a fantasy of himself as a kind of David Koresh with half a dozen wives and babies, and then later decided to turn it into an 'alien' scene by whitening out their faces and adding 'Communion'-type eyes and some stiffly-rendered praying mantises. (Or maybe Huggins' sex fantasies always involved large praying mantises.) I myself think that sex is much more enjoyable when there is an audience of large bugs present.

"If Huggins is just a normal fellow, why do all the alien chicks want to have their babies with him? It sounds pretty fishy (or do I mean buggy?) to me. One would think that a sincere man would at least keep track of how many children he has produced, even if he doesn't visit them regularly, or even remember what planets they live on.

"Re the man with an alien implant in

his penis: The aliens offered to install the same make of implant in my penis, but I told them I have enough trouble already. Ufology used to be a wholesome science, but these aliens really are starting to show what perverts they are!...

"I'm surprised that you sympathize with Donald Ware. After all, isn't MUFON free to do as it pleases? When MUFON constantly demotes you because of your lack of Achievement, you don't complain, because you see that it is just. If MUFON is dissatisfied with Ware's Achievement based on their system of values of Achievement, what does it matter to you?....

"Anyone who can help you win at gambling must be psychic, and his powers must come from the devil, or at least especially perverse aliens...

"I don't know how Uri Geller's predictions for the British royal family can be mostly negative if they manage to bring world peace, feed Somalia and cure baldness! Queen Liz said she would abdicate for Charley when he turned 21, so that he would not suffer the same fate Victoria's son Edward faced: not getting onto the coinage until old age. But of course old Liz is too egotistical to do any such thing. Here we have a profound philosophical problem: If Liz were a Libertarian, would she step down for the sake of anti-Statism, or would she remain Queen for the sake of selfishness? This is one of the deepest questions of Libertarian thought....

"What happens to a farmer if he shoots down a U.S. military helicopter for mutilating his cattle? Surely the shock to his belief system would be greater than if he shot down a saucer full of aliens!...

"I believe Christa Tilton's letter (in 'Smear'). Unlike so many ufologists, my scientific impartiality is not biased just because I know her to be a very unpleasant person. But I'm surprised that she thinks she was artificially inseminated. Huggins can tell her that the aliens enjoy their experiments, and treat their hybrid offspring like - well, if not like human beings, then at least like hybrids, which is only natural - or do I mean unnatural? Anyway, the aliens would probably let her see her children, as they let Huggins see his, if she weren't so nasty....

Woman sat dead for two months

If everybody in China jumped up and down at the same time they would knock our Earth out of orbit, and that's exactly what the monsters plan to do just weeks from now—on June 27!
