JERRY CLARK MISSES THE POINT, AGAIN:

In his latest editorial for the International UFO Reporter (IUR), called "Into the Mystic", Clark laments the fact that some ufologists who consider themselves "adventurous, forward-looking thinkers" have abandoned the extraterrestrial theory in favor of more complex ufological solutions which he mistakenly traces directly back to Meade Layne and his Borderland Sciences Research Associates (BSRA) of California.

Meade Layne is long deceased, but BSRA, founded back in 1945 or 1946, still exists under a new director. It can claim to be the oldest UFO organization in existence, though it deals not only with 4-D (or "etheric") flying saucers but also many other "borderland" (or borderline?) concepts. The trouble is that it is doubtful that contemporary 4-D thinkers, such as John Keel, Jacques Vallee, Allen Greenfield, etc. have been influenced by BSRA in any way at all, if indeed they have even heard of it.

In going beyond present-day science, no one is saying that UFOs are in any way miraculous entities not subject to the laws of nature. They are merely saying that UFOs, like other frustrating mysteries (ESP, ghosts, etc.) seem to be unsolvable in the straitjacket confinement of our present scientific structure. And yes indeed, all these mysteries may (or may not) be linked to each other. Why not?

Clark himself used to believe in or at least take a great interest in mysteries other than UFOs (fairies, for instance!); but now that he has matured (?) and become as respectable as he is capable of becoming, he sneers in his supercilious way at those who theorize beyond the accepted norm. What a pity!



RE-HASH OF THE 30TH ANNUAL NATIONAL UFO CONFERENCE:

On the weekend of October 15th-17th, the 30th National UFO Conference (NUFOC) was held at the scenic Days Inn in Bordentown, New Jersey, with ufologist Pat Marcutilio as the local host. Your humble "Smear" editor, who is Permanent Chairman of the NUFOC, acted as Master of Ceremonies and also gave a short presentation centering on some of his own weird experiences during his 40 years of studying the UFO enigma.

Other speakers included Tom Benson, a former N.J. State Director of MUFON, who has been a leading light in New Jersey ufology for many years. (He also sells UFO books & periodicals, including back issues of "Saucer Smear".) Because Benson's contributions to the field have not always received the recognition they deserve, the Governing Board (also called the Permanent Organizing Committee) of the NUFOC chose him as this year's recipient of our Ufologist of the Year Award. (See photo below.) Benson's lecture topic was "Some Implications for Humans Derived from UFO Close Encounter Reports". In essence, Benson believes as we do that whatever the reality behind UFO encounters may be, it is something more complex than "nuts and bolts" spaceships from other planets.

Rick Hilberg, a co-founder of the NUFOC, gave a slide lecture of sightings from the early years of the UFO phenomenon. Together with Al Manak, Rick will sponsor next year's NUFOC at the Airport Pierre Radisson Inn in Cleveland Ohio, September 16th-18th, 1994.

Another very interesting speaker was Bob Oechsler, who has brought the highly controversial Canadian "Guardian" case to the attention of the American public. The first of two sensational "Guardian"-related UFO landings occurred in eastern Canada in November, 1989, and the second was on August 18th, 1991, accompanied by a close-up video and reams of semi-incoherent written material from the ever-mysterious "Guardian" - whose identity Oechsler claims to know. A female employee of the Canadian government was taken aboard the craft that time, and saw a human Oriental man in a business suit in charge of a group of slave-like aliens. Also present at

this landing, according to Oechsler, were a Canadian medical doctor and his wife, who is a dentist, plus "Guardian" himself, who was the photographer of the video. It's a long, complex story, but the most interesting aspect to us is the way it has been rejected out of hand by MUFON, even though they easily accept and promote the Linda Napolitano case, which is just as hard to swallow as this one! More about all this in future issues of "Smear".

Also on hand at the convention was David Huggins, who related his lifetime of sexual encounters with attractive female aliens (see photo below.) We were amused by the fact that "The Trentonian" newspaper managed to put Huggins' photo at the top of its second page the next day, but never mentioned the naked alien ladies in their write-up, even though paintings (by Huggins) of some of them were prominently on the walls of the lecture hall. Is this an example of Censorship??

Parapsychologist George Hanson gave an excellent talk on the astounding similarities between MUFON and CSICOP, the debunkers' organization; Joe Stefula gave a very well-presented speech updating the Linda Napolitano case; Pat Marcatilyo spoke on brain-scam anomalies of two UFO abductees; Cope Schellhorn came all the way from Wisconsin to give us a slide presentation of mutilated cattle and such; Antonio Huneus gave his well-known ufological slide lecture; Mohammad Ramadan, who is connected with the United Nations in New York City, spoke on alien abductions and their meaning; Tim Beckley ("Mr. UFO") covered unusual Fortean cases in his presentation; and a ufological "unknown" named Alex Fedorov gave a deliberately hilarious talk on UFO skepticism. There were also several other speakers.

Unfortunately, in spite of valiant efforts at publicity, only about 50 people attended this year's NUFOC. We can attribute this largely to poor planning by the local host who, for example, kept changing the lecture schedule during the convention without even notifying the Master of Ceremonies of the changes! More professionalism was sorely needed, and we sincerely trust it will be present next year in Cleveland.

The National UFO Conference, organized in 1964, has a governing board which always consists of nine people, who at present are: Antonio Huneus, Tom Benson, Ed Komarek, Al Manak, Rick Hilberg, Bill Moore, Jim Moseley (Permanent Chairman), Tim Beckley, and Pat Marcutileo.

From time to time, changes are made, according to circumstances. At present, Pat Marcatilio is being replaced by Al Greenfield of Atlanta, Ga., who is a long-time ufologist & parapsychologist, and one of the original co-founders of the NUFOC. In 1995 Greenfield will come out of ufological semi-retirement to host the NUFOC convention for that year. It will take place at a location in Atlanta which will be announced later.


Operation Right to Know held a reasonably successful demonstration at the United Nations building in New York City this past Nov. 19th, the purpose of the event being (to quote from their press release) "to call upon the United Nations to acknowledge that the UFO phenomena (sic) is extraterrestrial".

Probably no one in Operation Right to Know realizes that this was not the first UFO-related demonstration at the U.N. Way back on Feb. 4th, 1962, a long-forgotten crackpot named Andy Sinatra staged a one-man demonstration there, accompanied only by one friend and the editor of SAUCER NEWS - predecessor of "Saucer Smear". Sinatra, also known as the Mystic Barber, wore on his head a weird metallic device of his own invention, which he claimed to use for getting messages from other planets. The June 1962 issue of SAUCER NEWS featured on its front page a photo of the Mystic Barber being asked by a New York policeman for his ID. He was not arrested, and this unique UFO protest/demonstration then passed into history...

A man who said he discovered the snow-covered location of Noah's Ark high on Mount Ararat in Turkey, and who displayed what he claimed to be an ancient piece of wood from inside the ark as proof on a CBS special earlier this year, now says it was a hoax. George Jammal, an out-of-work Israeli actor living in Long Beach, California, has admitted that he made up the story to expose those who produce and broadcast what he considers to be poorly researched religious propaganda...

According to a recent article in The Wall Street Journal, the tabloid newspaper Weekly World News now has its own one-hour weekly show on network television. We have heard nothing further about the show, and wonder if any of our readers can offer further info. (We don't watch much TV here at our "Smear" Headquarters. UFO CRASH SECRETS AT WRIGHT/PATTERSON AIR FORCE BASE

Why is it that even Senator Barry Goldwater—who holds a Top Secret security clearance—has been unable to enter the mysterious "Blue Room" where the bodies of several space aliens are believed to be preserved in a specially-built chamber? Moseley, who is the former editor of the widely-read *Saucer News*, is one of the few UFOlogists allowed on the base. Here are stories of crashed saucers recovered by the military, ETs (both dead and alive) in captivity. And as an extra bonus a worldwide exclusive—photos released by Soviet researchers said to show the aliens recovered from the famous Roswell UFO wreckage. Our old friend ALLEN GREENFIELD of Atlanta, Ga. writes:

"...Although ufology has in recent years achieved a kind of respectability unheard of in 'the good old days'...the field long ago fell into a deep rut which guarantees that no solution to the mystery, which has haunted the world since 1947, will - or ever can - be found. This is because the conceptual framework in which ufology operates is arrested in a false paradigm and a false 'either-or' dichotomy. Despite valiant efforts by Keel, Vallee and yourself to place things in a broader perspective, no alternative conceptual context has been offered since the heyday of Tom Comella (a/k/a 'Peter Kor'), on the one hand, and the late great Gray Barker in his little-appreciated metaphorical period (best exemplified by 'The Silver Bridge'), on the other.

"I propose to break the impasse with new, aggressive organizational approaches and entirely new conceptual tools. I consider myself to be in possession of the late Ray Palmer's 'Fact' - but unlike that master of mystification, I intend to reveal it in such a way that others will feel highly motivated to pick up the glowing ball and run with it. The greatest mistake ufologists and skeptics have made is that tendency, noted long ago by the immortal Charles Fort, to isolate any one thing from any other thing. The UFO mystery, seen in a vacuum, will always remain an unsolved enigma. But, as the Rosicrucians tell us in their mysteries, 'Nequaquam vacuum' ('a vacuum exists nowhere'). Once ufology lore is integrated with other strains of historical research, truth begins to emerge...

"The Solution to the UFO Mystery is neither physical nor psychological. On the border between phenomenology and Jungian metaphysics, there emerges a Definite Pattern which, once discerned, can be documented, analyzed, and predicted. I ask nobody to accept this on 'faith' - there has been far, far too much taken on 'faith' in ufology already. I will offer solid evidence and practical tools. The searcher can take it from that point..."

Greenfield refers to info he will give at the NUFOC conventions of 1994 and 1995 - Editor.

ROBERT ANTON WILSON writes as follows:

"I read with awe and wonderment the statements by Randi and Byrd in your Vol. 40, No. 8. As I understand it, the dispute between these gents began from a disagreement as to whether or not certain events do or do not occur in scientific experiments on the so-called 'paranormal'. This scientific issue should be resolved scientifically, but somehow the debate now seems to center on whether Randi or Byrd has a more unsavory sex life. Could this kind of debate possibly be what the Ancients meant by 'the Feast of Pure Reason?' (For that matter, does any scientific controversy in which CSICOP gets involved ever remain on the level of reason for very long before descending rapidly to character assassination and McCarthyism?)

"I have a growing sympathy for Randi. I noted that his rhetorical style resembles McCarthy's the very first time I heard him speak, and said so in print; but today, twelve years later, he has some of the pathos of Senator Joe's final days, deserted even by Roy Cohn. No, the tragedy has higher dimensions than McCarthy ever reached. As CSICOP speedily backs away

from him, crying out, like Prince Hal to Falstaff, 'I know thee not, old man; Randi, just like Falstaff, looks less like a jester and more like a poor old man who deserves better from those who claimed to be his friends.'

CAPTAIN KEVIN RANDLE writes:

"...Without reservation, I can say that Simone Mendez's source, who claimed to have Roswell debris, is not our source. The man who showed me the material from the impact site is a witness whom we found through long investigation. We went to him rather than his coming to us. We know he was in Roswell at the appropriate time because we have seen the records establishing it. His story is consistent with that given by others and is corroborated by those others. In other words, we have no reason, at this time, to doubt what he is telling us.

"On the other hand, the material he showed me has not been analyzed. It could be, literally, anything. There have been promises that we'll be allowed to test it, but at this time it just hasn't happened..."

Mars Observer Update:

Three days before Mars Observer was to go into orbit around the red planet, disaster struck. The craft's transmitters were turned off during fuel tank pressurization.
