ONCE AGAIN, STILL ANOTHER ROSWELL UPDATE:

Well, the GAO (General Accounting Office) Report on Roswell is finally out, and needless to say, it solves nothing. The Mogul Balloon explanation still stands, but the records for RAAF (Roswell Army Air Field) for a period of over three years, including June-July 1947, have somehow been destroyed. Says the Report: "The document disposal form does not indicate what organization or person destroyed the records, and when or under what authority the records were destroyed."

Thus Roswell conspiracy buffs are free to speculate that this long period of records was destroyed just to cover up one event. We prefer to speculate that (1) It was done to cover up something else, long-range and more important, such as atomic secrets from the only U.S. base that had atomic weapons at that time; or (2) More likely, it was done in a typical

meaningless act of military incompetence, and thus has no significance. We would welcome informed opinions on this subject from our readers, as we may well be missing something here.

Now we turn to the infamous Roswell video discussed in detail in our April 15th "Smear" and other recent issues. We have ordered copies of this video from two sources, and are hoping to receive at least one of these in time for our Oct. 14th-15th UFO convention in Atlanta, Georgia. The copies must be sent all the way from England, and their release is apparently controlled by Ray Santilli, the British TV/movie producer who owns the alleged 1947 film footage from which the video was made.

Meanwhile, the video has been shown at an Aug. 19th-20th UFO convention in Sheffield, England, hosted by Philip Mantle of BUFORA (British UFO Research Association). The last we heard about this, the convention was completely sold out ahead of time because of public interest in the video.

The Fox TV Network has apparently bought the American rights to the video, and will show it on the evening of Monday August 28th, in a program called "Alien Autopsy: Fact or Fiction". UFO "experts" Kevin Randle, Bruce Maccabee, Stanton Friedman, Linda Howe (of cattle mutilation fame) and Dr. Jesse Marcel (son of deceased Roswell witness Jesse Marcel) are seen on the program with their comments about the video. By and large, they think it is a fake, as do the real film and medical experts who have seen the video in England. But it's still a crowd-pleaser! (See also Bill Moore's comments on this subject in the Letters section of this issue.)

Finally, an August 2nd item from Prodigy informs us that an unnamed person has a fragment from the Roswell debris site which has been "authenticated as being extraordinary material not of any known origin". The only trouble is that he wants fifteen million dollars for this fragment! That's more money than we clear at "Saucer Smear" in an entire year! (Our thanks to Tom Benson, Bill LaParl, Kevin Randle, Simone Mendez and others for the material in this article.)

#### TIDBITS OF TRASH:

It looks like Harvard University psychiatrist & abduction researcher John Mack has beaten the rap, regarding the effort to censure (and censor!) his UFO work. The details are clouded in academic top-secret security, but the announcement has been made that Mack will not be censured, though he was issued "an unusual public warning from the Dean not to let his enthusiasm for UFO research steer him from the path of professionalism!"



tigious House of Lords, which occasionally had guest speakers such as Tim Beckley of New York's Global Communications - no doubt a great embarrassment to the conservative & noble Lords!...

A man named James Wolcott, in the course of a generally pro-UFO-abduction article in the July 31st issue of the New Yorker Magazine, quite rightly has this negative comment for Budd Hopkins: "Someone like Budd Hopkins, who frequently hypes abduction stories to the press (he's been pushing a doozy about a woman being whisked past the Brooklyn Bridge - a story so implausible that even the pop-science magazine OMNI was highly dubious), really ought not to be bumbling around in other people's psyches" Wolcott refers here to the Linda Napolitano abduction case, about which we have raved at length in past issues of "Smear".

Incidentally, rumor has it that Hopkins has finally found a publisher for this yarn....

We are informed that, sadly, Dr. Richard Neal had a life-threatening stroke while visiting his patients at a hospital in California on July 19th. He is recovering slowly. Dr. Neal and Dr. John Miller are the two medical doctors who have researched the "missing fetus" syndrome, re UFO abductions; and to the best of our knowledge, neither has yet found any conclusive evidence that such a thing has ever really happened. We wish Dr. Neal a speedy recovery!...

Abduction researcher Dr. Richard Boylan of Sacramento, California, a clinical psychologist, has been stripped of all his various state licenses because of alleged sexual misconduct at his therapy sessions. (Sex and Saucers, once again!)

Boylan's practice was shut down because of misconduct with three female patients, including "imposing his views of space aliens into the dreams and memories of two patients, nude hot tub bathing with patients, and bartering nude massages in return for psychological therapy." Boylan

even took one female patient to a UFO convention in Las Vegas in December of 1992, and she stayed (eek!) in the same hotel room with him.

Dr. Boylan is a past president of the Sacramento Valley Psychological Association in California, and is the author of many books. The investigation of his conduct has been going on for about two years. "Smear" knew about it from past newspaper stories but chose not to print anything. We have met Dr. Boylan and found him to be pleasant but unusually "Far Out". He is a "Smear" non-subscriber, about sixty years of age. (Well, at least he's not a homosexual!)

A letter written by ufologist Richard Hall (but not to us), dated July 22nd, confirms a rumor we had already heard: Las Vegas businessman Robert Bigelow has terminated his financial help to the three major UFO organizations - MUFON, CUFOS, and FUFOR - due to "irreconcilable differences". We are told that Bigelow wanted more control over how his money would be spent. We also hear that one leading ufologist went so far out of control at the final meeting with Bigelow that he had to be gently escorted from the conference room.


Bigelow's flirtation with the Offbeat is not over, however, as he is still apparently funding cattle mutilation investigation by Linda Howe....

John Alexander, who is vaguely associated with ufology and with PSI-TECH, is director of the U.S. Government's non-lethal weapons program at Los Alamos Laboratories in New Mexico. England's Armen Victorian, in (another) critical tract about Alexander which we have obtained, has this to say:

"...One of the most impressive findings of a certain 1965 Air Force report is the question of 'nonlethality' - one which Alexander is adamant is true in its essence, and refuses to accept that it might not be so. Says the Report: 'The definition of nonlethality is also not a clearly defined one when applied to specific weaponry. Many bullets do not kill, and therefore are nonlethal in nature, but since the presumption is that most bullets are discharged with intent of killing, they are lethal weapons. Certainly the presentation of many noxious stimulus agents normally considered to be within the nonlethal domain, can if carried to extreme also cause death.'

"It would be closer to the truth if Alexander and his colleagues in the Pentagon's pantry redefine some of their 'nonlethal weapons' to 'slow to kill weapons'. Even then, it would be interesting to hear the opinion of the International Red Cross or Human Rights Campaigners on the ensuing nightmares they might cause in modern battlefields."



**LANDING TRACES**


In their pasture

BOOK REVIEWS:

We have now actually read (most of) John Keel's classic book "Disneyland of the Gods", which was recently reprinted by IllumiNet Press (P.O. Box 2808, Lilburn, Ga. 30226). It's a catchy title, but the book is largely a re-hash of articles Keel wrote for Saga Magazine some twenty years ago.

We were very disappointed in the book. It purports to be a discussion of Fortean events of all kinds, but there is no index and no bibliography - just an endless stream of unproven assertions, ranging from the sublime to the ridiculous. As he does in his lectures, Keel spiels on and on without documentation. Sweeping generalizations are made from insufficient data, and specific statements are made which in some cases we know to be untrue, while many others are made that we strongly suspect to be untrue. All this makes worthless whatever valid insights the author may accidentally have stumbled upon, regarding UFOs, archaeology, Men in Black, etc.

Sometimes Keel is wrong just out of pure stubbornness. He is the only researcher on this planet who still believes that the 1947 Roswell Incident (not mentioned in the book) was caused by a World War Two Japanese "Fugo Balloon"!

Well, if you enjoy "tripping out" with a master weaver of yarns, buy "Disneyland of the Gods". If you are looking for a solution to the UFO Mystery or anything like one, look elsewhere.

Next - how do we review the book "Zen in the Art of Close Encounters - Crazy Wisdom and UFOs"? (The New Being Project, P.O. Box 3070, Berkeley, 94703.- Price: \$14.50). The book is a compilation of short works by 35 contributors, less than half of whom we have even heard of. There's no bio on the book jacket, but the editor, Paul David Pursglove, is a legitimate psychologist of some sort whom we should have heard of - especially as he is a "Smear" non-subscriber, and tells us that we promised to do a review. Well, we'll try.

The contributors we know or at least have heard of are: Contactee Steven Greer; philosopher Michael Grosso; ufological psychiatrist Rima Laibow; psychedelic authors Timothy Leary and Terence McKenna; astronaut Brian O'Leary; Harvard psychiatrist John Mack; abduction researcher Leo Sprinkle; medical philosopher Dennis Stillings; contactee Whitley Strieber; UFO researchers Keith Thompson and John White; and, alphabetically last but by no means least - philosopher/author Robert Anton Wilson.

For us, one of Wilson's contributions (Page 296-297) is the best of the lot, not only because we happen to agree with it, but mainly because of the fact that it is a reprint of a letter to the editor, published in "Saucer Smear" in 1993. (Credit is duly given.) Here lies the final proof of the great and ancient Zen adage, "The text of a letter remains the property of the sender". Amen!

What we get out of all this is that "Zen in the Art of Close Encounters" is a highly intellectual, highly rarified attempt to see deep meaning as well as humor in the chaos of present-day ufology, particularly as it relates to the abduction phenomenon. Does this attempt succeed? "Humor is in the mind of the recipient, just as beauty is in the eye of the beholder!" (Moseley, 1995.)

The aliens communicate through mental telepathy and pay for the goods with precious stones and gold, the nomads say, but they never explain what they do with the manure.


