

Malcolm Brenner Chronicles His Sexual Relationship With Dolphin In 'Wet Goddess'

READ THIS AMAZING AND PROBABLY TRUE STORY ON PAGE 3.

THE INCREDIBLE STORY OF TWO CANADIAN NURSES AND TWO FLYING SAUCER ENTITIES:

This is a ufological incident that we would definitely put in the "classic" category, even though we had never heard of it at all until a detailed version appeared very recently on the Net. It occurred in the pre-1980 time period when real names of real people were included in the original write-ups. Also, the specific facts of this particular case make it almost impossible for it to be anything except a very truthful account.

The two principal nurses involved were named Doreen Kendall and Frieda Wilson. In the dark early morning hours of January 1st, 1970, following New Year's Eve, these women were nurses on duty at Cowichan District Hospital on Vancouver Island, British Columbia, Canada.

As she pulled back the drapes in one of the wards, Nurse Kendall saw a large brilliant object hovering about sixty feet away, just above the children's ward to her left.

Said she: "The object was circular. The bottom was silvery, like metal, and was shaped like a bowl. There was a string of bright lights around it like a necklace. The top was a dome made of something like glass. It was lit up from inside and I could clearly see right into it."

As if this was not bizarre enough, Kendall stated that she could make out the shapes of two masculine masked figures standing within the bubble atop the craft.

Nurse Kendall's account continues: "They looked like fine, tall (human) men. They were dressed in tight-fitting suits made of the same material that covered their heads, but their hands were bare and I noticed how human they looked. Their flesh seemed just like ours."

At this point Kendall observed that the odd craft was tilting toward her. As it leaned forward she also noticed some sort of instrument panel which was filled with small circles (or dials) of various sizes, all of which appeared to be illuminated from below. She later remarked that she had always been interested in mechanical devices,

and this is why she paid a great amount of attention to these instruments, etc.

Interestingly, Nurse Kendall felt no fear whatever because of the hovering craft. Indeed, she felt only curiosity and calmness. This is why she stared at the scene alone for about five minutes before calling anyone else over to take a look. Eventually, she became aware that one of the entities was looking right at her, and she said that "if the man had spoken to me, I would have answered quite naturally". It sounds possible that Kendall was in some sort of benign hypnotic trance during this period of time.

Kendall was so captivated by what she was seeing that she neglected, for quite awhile, to call over Nurse Wilson, who was standing behind her, not far away. Unfortunately, by the time Kendall finally waved her over, this other woman was only able to catch a glimpse of the vehicle as it slowly pulled away from the area. It is not clear whether Wilson saw the entities for a moment or not, but she definitely did not see the many details that Kendall described. Two other nurses in the ward also got a glimpse of the object when it was even further away, but still in plain sight.

There were other very good UFO events in that same area later on New Year's Day, and still more of them in the next few days. Space does not allow us to give you the full descriptions, but the main point is that, out of all the many witnesses to these various events, only Doreen Kendall was able to see and give a detailed account of the two entities. Also, we should note that from the descriptions, it is not likely that these other sightings were of the same object - though they might have been.

After the UFO sighting, Kendall was unusually quiet and subdued for about a week, and then returned to her normal self. For some reason neither she nor anyone else made a big deal about any of these sightings, so that media coverage was not nearly as great as one might expect. However, we nevertheless wonder why we never heard of this unusually interesting "flap" till now!...

REMOTE SCREWING??

We were very surprised to see that the lead article in the October 2011 MUFON Journal is called "Views About Remote Viewing". It is written by someone named Janice Currie and features a prominent "psychic spymaster" named Joseph McMoneagle, who is the author of at least four books on the subject.

We know extremely little about "Remote Viewing", but we have heard of McMoneagle. Other important names in this esoteric field are Ed Dames and Ingo Swann. The latter is one of our long-time non-subscribers, but we have never had the opportunity to talk to him about the subject. He is the only one of this psychic clique about whom we have never read anything negative.

Under various code names, the U.S. Government's "Remote Viewing" efforts ran from 1978 to 1995. It is generally agreed that the program was begun because we had Intelligence reports during the Cold War that the Russians were experimenting in this field, and we certainly did not want to fall victim to a "psychic research gap". In our humble opinion the research programs in this country were eventually ended because the information gained this way was very unreliable. Presumably the Russians had the same problem.




According to the dictionary, intuition is "The power or faculty of attaining direct knowledge or cognition without evident rational thought inference."

UFO ACTIVIST LARRY BRYANT RECEIVES UNEXPLAINED VISIT FROM LOCAL POLICE!

THE PERSECUTIONS BEGIN!

For many years now, we have been receiving copies of researcher Larry Bryant's endless requests for Freedom of Information material about flying saucers, plus the less-frequent replies he receives from the governmental agencies involved. The man is indeed persistent, and we admire his determination.

Together with his latest missive, Larry sends us a copy of a formal complaint he made recently to his local (Alexandria, Virginia) police chief. Says he:

"At about 3:00 p.m. on October 17th, 2011, a member of your police force, a rookie in blue uniform, knocked on my front door and announced that some 'friend' of mine had contacted your department to determine the status of my welfare. The young officer, who was accompanied by an older man clothed in black fatigues, told me he had no name for the concerned 'friend'."

Larry, who lives alone, wants "a photocopy of the entire contents of your department's case file on this visit", and he gives numerous details explaining exactly what kind of material he is looking for.

Breathlessly, we awaited his next communique!

P.S.: A few days later, Larry phoned to say he had solved this case in a mundane way. He admitted that he had "over-reacted". Darn!...

THE ATTACK OF THE PSYCHIC GLASS; Here, sooner than you were led to believe, we give you another of our own psychic experiences.

Back in 1975 or 1976, your editor was living in Fairview, N.J., usually accompanied by our young daughter Elizabeth. One Sunday (?) morning, at about noon, while alone in the apartment, we suddenly woke up hearing the unbelievably loud crash of breaking glass, coming from the nearby kitchen.

When we looked, we saw only one broken drinking glass on the floor - not nearly enough to cause such an almost deafening noise. To make a long story short, all of the broken pieces were together in one small area in the middle of the floor, but almost half of the drinking glass was permanently missing - not hidden anywhere nearby. The cause of the crash was never determined.

If we really want to be believed, we should omit the next detail, but our aim is to tell the Truth: Elizabeth and your editor remember the incident identically, but in her version she was alone in the apartment one evening - not your editor experiencing the incident alone one morning! One of us is mistaken (or lying for no reason), but why? Is this a case of the fallibility of human memory?

MORE ON THE CASH-LANDRUM CASE;

Researcher Curt Collins has continued to be of great help to us, as he keeps looking for more information on the famous Cash-Landrums case in various places on the Net. We'll never prove just what happened that night, but we are obtaining more clues as to what probably happened. The following, regarding the craft itself, is from a 1991 newspaper:

"Cash and Landrum have been besieged with telephone calls (after appearing on a TV show), including some from anonymous tipsters telling of a top-secret project, WASP-2, allegedly discontinued after radiation accidents...

"Other tips are coming from callers who recently saw the UFO story aired on the 'Unsolved Mysteries' TV program. Still others, claiming to be military people or their relatives, have called to say they flew helicopters that night, despite the Pentagon's denial. At least two callers linked the UFO to a classified project, WASP-2, which they said was an experimental nuclear-powered craft abandoned after 1982 when it couldn't stop irradiating people."

From another source: "The doctor who examined Betty Cash and talked on the 'UFO Hunters' TV episode, Dr. Brian McClelland, said several military people told him and described what happened...and that the craft was an experimental nuclear powered personnel carrier called the WASP-2".

And, Curt Collins writes, regarding the approximately 23 helicopters involved in this UFO case: "I came across some information on the Army Special Forces team Task Force 158 (and found you reported on it in 'Saucer Smear' back in 2003). Finding out about this operation removes all doubt in my mind. Previously I had the same kind of questions that Kevin Randle and John Alexander had. Why were so many helicopters flying at night in the holiday season? What about their fuel range?

"Almost all those questions are answered by the presence of TF 158. Their operation was secret. They were training for night flight in close formation using night vision goggles. They used the right kind of helicopters, which had been modified with larger fuel tanks for longer missions. They were Special Forces, waiting to go on a hostage rescue mission - no holidays for them.

"If there were helicopters in the air on December 29th, 1980, I believe it had to be Task Force 158..."

More to come, hopefully!...


THE "DREAM TEAM" IS ON THE BEAM!

Very recently we received surprising new Roswell info from the Net. Among the best-known investigators of this long-ago event are Kevin Randle (who is absolutely obsessed with the subject), Don Schmitt, and Tom Carey. They have been in touch with each other, and have jointly decided that Roswell needs to be re-investigated from top to bottom, so to speak, and hopefully they will come up with some answers that have not emerged so far. At that point they will, together, write still another book!

This group modestly call themselves "The Dream Team". Missing will be other important Roswell investigators such as Stanton Friedman, and also Bill Moore, who co-authored the very first book on the subject, back in 1980.

In the current blog, Randle writes that the falling out was over "research techniques and matters unrelated to the investigation. In time we re-evaluated these issues".

Meanwhile - there is no further word about the alleged extraterrestrial material which, as discussed in our last issue, was sent out by a Roswell scientist (?) to be analyzed. We have our doubts that anything positive will come of this, but one never knows!... Our next glorious issue will hopefully be out in January...

"Smear" Contributing Editor VINCE DITCHKUS writes:

"The theory that the Cash-Landrum case can be explained by a terrestrial U.S. experimental nuclear aircraft, noted on Page 4 of the Oct. 10th, 2011 issue of 'Smear', makes perfect sense. Annie Jacobson cites what appears to be wildly risky development and testing of a Nuclear Engine Rocket Vehicle Application (NERVA) in her 'Area 51' history. "Delays in establishing Argonne led Compton to authorize construction of the first nuclear reactor beneath the bleachers of Stagg Field at the University of Chicago. On 2 December 1942 a team led by Enrico Fermi initiated the first artificial self-sustaining nuclear chain reaction in an experimental reactor known as Chicago Pile-1. The point at which a reaction becomes self-sustaining became known as 'going critical' Compton reported the success to Conant in Washington, D.C. by a coded phone call, saying 'The Italian navigator (Fermi) has just landed in the new world.' In January 1943, Grafton's successor, Major Arthur V. Peterson, ordered Chicago Pile-1 dismantled and reassembled at Argonne, as he regarded the operation of a reactor as too hazardous for a densely populated area...."
