

ADIOS TO AZTEC, NEW MEXICO;

We intended for this rant to appear in last month's "Smear", but it turns out that we took up too much space with Cash-Landrum and other topics.

Anyhow - the annual UFO convention in the little town of Aztec, N.M. held its last event in 2011, after a 14-year run. The focus of this series of conferences was the little-known UFO crash/landing that allegedly occurred in that vicinity way back in 1948 - one year after Roswell. However, Aztec never achieved more than a small fraction of the Roswell hysteria, for various reasons.

Our friend the late Karl Pflock lectured at Aztec at least one year in the early 2000s. Your editor was also invited to speak, but declined. The trip was only a couple of hours' drive from Pflock's home near Santa Fe, whereas for us it would be a cross-country journey. Not really worth all that effort!

A founder and key member of the Aztec convention sponsors (mainly the local library) has been researcher Scott Ramsey, who for a long time was the prime investigator of the original Aztec story. He has put much time, money, and effort into this, and plans to co-author a book (with blogger Frank Warren), which has been continually delayed for several years, for some reason.

It is very likely that Ramsey withdrew his support (which may well have been partly financial) from the convention because he saw that the speakers in recent years were becoming more & more "far out" than previously. However, by any rational standard, the Aztec crash/landing is pretty "far out" in itself!

Scott Ramsey seems like a bright and pleasant guy, but the odds are strongly against him ever proving anything positive after over sixty years! There are some interesting obstacles. The case was first mentioned in Frank Scully's classic 1950 best-seller, "Behind the Flying Saucers". However, Scully's source was a con man named Silas Newton who was later convicted of oil fraud. Long ago your editor met and had in-depth interviews with both Scully and Newton, in late 1953. In Scully's book, Aztec is mentioned at length, but Roswell is not mentioned at all, for some reason.

Then came the notorious MJ-12 papers, originally released to the public by ufologist William Moore about 1967. There in the supposed 1952 "Briefing Document" for incoming President Dwight Eisenhower, is a long account of the Roswell Incident but no mention at all of Aztec. Strange indeed!

It tickles our Ego to tell you (again) that we had private interviews with Dwight Eisenhower in early 1947 (?) and with Harry Truman in 1954, during our initial saucer-seeking journey across country. For various reasons, we had no incentive to ask about Aztec, Roswell, or "MJ-12". We had read about Aztec in Scully's 1950 book, but had never heard of Roswell (which was not investigated till 1978 or later), or "MJ-12". It is not at all likely we would have received meaningful answers to such questions, had we asked them.

Finally, is there any strong evidence ... for the authenticity of a major UFO event near Aztec in 1948? There is, apparently, still a very large concrete block all by itself in the New Mexico desert which has been dated to that period. It was supposedly built to support a huge crane sent in by the Government to carry away the mysterious craft.



P.S: We almost neglected to mention that your editor was strongly turned off from belief in Aztec from the very beginning, for a reason that doesn't seem to have been noticed by anyone else. Scully mentions a mathematical "system of nines" regarding the crashed spacecraft. If we remember correctly, the mysterious object was 99 feet, 9 inches long. Unfortunately, this does not represent an authentic "system of nines", plus the fact that visiting spacemen are not at all likely to use the archaic English measurements called feet and inches. The whole concept is absurd!

We pointed this out to Scott Ramsey in our only phone conversation, and the above facts made no significant impression on him whatsoever. It is very hard indeed to discourage a True Believer!...

SECRET SAUCER??

It's not really a secret, but the MUFON Journal's November 2011 description of this picture gives so few details that there is no way to make an informed decision regarding its authenticity. This plus a second very similar photo was taken by a young girl in Arizona in 2009, but no exact date or location are given, and of course no name!

There's definitely something strange in the sky, but might it be from the planet Pieplate? If the girl had been with others about her own age, we would suspect this, but we will never know for sure.

A more detailed account of "Case 19210" (above) apparently exists somewhere in the vast MUFON files...

UNIDENTIFIED GROUND OBJECT IN KANSAS:

According to the trusty Internet, the residents of a small town in Crowley County, Kansas are (as of last December 18th) buzzing over a recent UFO sighting. The object was seen in broad daylight and strangely enough, on the back of a flat bed truck cruising down U.S. highway 70, headed toward Maryland.

The object, wrapped in a silver tarp, measured about 32 feet from front to rear, and even appeared to be equipped with flashing lights. A bystander snapped several photos of the strange craft, one of which is reproduced with the Net story. It shows no detail at all, so we don't show it here.

The local sheriff had been contacted by the trucking company and was asked to keep news of the craft to a minimum. (Why, we ask.) This was hard to do, as the object proved to be a little too big to get through the town without a hassle. Some road signs had to be temporarily removed, and the whole ordeal took over an hour - more than enough time for a crowd of onlookers to gather around and gawk.

We are reminded of the story from the Kecksburg, Pa. classic case, having to do with the acorn-shaped object being driven through town under a tarp. (Many residents claim this never happened.) Also, a rumor we heard very recently from a trusted source tells us, for the first time, of a similar tale from (where else?) Roswell....

Incidentally, the December 2011 MUFON Journal tells of a huge UFO flap in and near Kansas City, Missouri, during the later months of last year. Actually, this has nothing to do with the above story, but we read of 85 sighting reports just for the month of October. Of these, about half remain unexplained after MUFON's investigation. As usual, there is little if any pattern regarding the appearance and actions of these mystery objects. (YAWN!) ...

Above is the current heading of a little-known UFO zine, usually of only two pages, published "every so often" over a period of many years by a retired Maryland businessman named James (Jim) Wales. He is a follower of Laura Mundo, who in turn was a follower of the famous UFO contactee named George Adamski.

Note that the masthead of "Update" includes the names of exactly seven people. We are dismayed to realize that all of them except your "Smear" editor are deceased! Wales himself is obviously alive but even older than we are.

It is not clear why these particular seven people were chosen. The text of his letter below gives a clue. Here we have Laura Mundo; George Adamski; the late contactee Howard Menger; Moseley; Carmela (?) Falzone, an obscure deceased follower of Laura Mundo; The late UFO contactee George Hunt Williamson; and the world-famous scientist of roughly a hundred years ago, Nikola Tesla.

Very recently we asked Jim Wales about these choices, and he wrote:

"...I have said before that you are a 'MAJOR Player' in all this saucer stuff. Sixty years now. WOW! And isn't it interesting that you are fourth in a field of seven? That makes you in the middle of all this. Are you satisfied now?..."

We only know Jim Wales from his writings over a long period of time. He seems like a very sincere though unusual sort of person. The philosophy expressed in his zine is, to say the least, hard to understand or believe. But the zine is free, available at the address given above. Why not give it a shot?...

SEX AND SAUCERS - AGAIN!

Over the years we have run several articles about the Raelian UFO cult, which was started quite awhile ago by a French contactee who believes that the human race was seeded (= created) many centuries ago by an extraterrestrial race. In 2002 the Raelians received a great amount of publicity because of their claim to have created the first human clone. The overwhelming probability is that this claim was merely a publicity stunt, i.e., a hoax.

The Raelians are better known because of their atheism and their devotion to sexual freedom. The article we most recently read about them uses the term "pro-orgy", which may well be an exaggeration.

Anyhow, it is easy to understand that Iran would not by any stretch of the imagination be a friendly environment for such beliefs. Iran is firmly committed to "Sharia Law", which is an extremely harsh Muslim legal code in which women in particular have almost no rights or freedom.

It is thus not surprising that Negar Azizmoradi, pictured here, who is leader of the the Iranian branch of the International Raelian Movement, is facing persecution in her home country. The article tells us that she has recently been granted political asylum in the United States. Had she actually been arrested in Iran, she probably would have been put on trial and eventually sentenced to death.

Her crime was publicly stating her beliefs. Women in Iran have often been persecuted for much milder infractions. Egads...



May the Farce be With you!...

"REFLECTIONS OF A UFO INVESTIGATOR"

This is the title of the latest book by Kevin Randle, a legitimate "doctor," who by his own statement (which we overheard in person) admits that his Ph.D. is of the mail order variety. Said He: It's not as good as a Ph.D. from Harvard, but it's better than no Ph.D. at all." He is right about that!

Randle is also a recently-retired military officer - either a colonel or a lt. colonel. Randle and your editor have not communicated in recent years, so we are not sure which. He did serve honorably in various wars.

He also has written dozens of books, of which at least 20 are about UFOs. The present one is from Anomalous Press, whose co-directors are good friends of ours.

This book is peculiar in that it has no table of contents, introduction, or index. It does have a "Conclusions" section, in which Randle re-affirms his strong belief in Roswell as an ET event. He does not even consider the possibility that it could be truly anomalous without being ET. Of course, your editor believes that it was almost surely a train of Mogul balloons. Our late friend Karl Pflock wrote a book promoting this solution.

Randle discusses his investigations into, and his opinions concerning, at least a dozen fairly well-known UFO cases, several of which turned out as hoaxes or unbelievable for other reasons. Randle appears to be an extremely thorough and relatively unbiased researcher, and his accounts are very interesting. He is amazingly good at being able to tell a real military man from a fake.

However, over one third of the book is devoted to his obsession - Roswell! Here he loses his objectivity as usual.

This case is so utterly complex that even these approximately one hundred pages are not enough to go into all the tedious details of who said what, when, and why. Nowhere is there the claim that any of the first-hand stories of alien bodies (dead or alive) are true. Thus, it all boils down to just what was the material found in the well-known debris field. It sure doesn't sound to us like pieces of a spaceship!



We may have found something very important in this book that others will overlook. We refer to the testimony of Bessie Brazel, daughter of rancher Mack Brazel. She was 14 years old in 1947, and says she helped her father collect the somewhat mysterious debris. Randle expresses various problems with her version of events, but he makes no comment on her description of the wreckage.

Says she: "The flower-like designs on the tape looked like Japanese flowers, where the petals are not connected...They were very, very light pastel, pinks and blues and yellows...The tape was about two inches wide..."

This is almost the identical description given by Mogul balloon project chief Prof. Charles Moore (whom we interviewed in person in 1996) and others associated with the 1947 Mogul flights. (These men are named in Pflock's book.) Moore told us personally that the tape was made for them by members of the Lady Garnet Workers Union in New York City. The Mogul people did not ask for an unnecessary flower design, but that is what they got!

Unless Bessie Brazel was somehow in touch with Prof. Moore long ago, which seems very unlikely, she apparently described the flower design completely on her own.

What say you to that, Dr. Col. Randle????..






Again we should say that we appreciate the vast amount of info sent in recent weeks by researcher Curt Collins. See his recent letter, quoted in part further along in this issue.

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MISSIVES FROM THE MASSES :

Nationally-known aviation writer CURTIS PEEBLES writes:

Regarding the nature of the object seen in the Cash-Landrum incident, there were two sets of witnesses. Cash-Landrum saw both the helicopters and the diamond-shaped object. The other witnesses were a Dayton police officer, Detective Lamar Walker, and his wife. They reported seeing 12 Chinook-type helicopters near the area where the Cash-Landrum event reportedly occurred and at about the same time. They did not see the diamond-shaped object, however.

Cash-Landrum described the object as climbing and descending according to the size of the flames being emitted from the underside of the object. The implication is that the flames were part of the object's propulsion system. It is tempting to suggest the object was a hot-air balloon. When the burner is used to increase altitude, the balloon envelope is illuminated. When the burner flame is reduced, the envelope is illuminated with a smaller glow.

This theory has problems which I believe eliminate it as a possibility. The first is that a hot-air balloon is carried along by the wind. The balloon pilot climbs and descends to find winds which will carry the balloon in the proper direction. If it was a hot-air balloon, therefore, the helicopters crossed paths with it by accident. Whatever the helicopters were doing, making a simple night proficiency training flight, or practicing for a second rescue mission into Iran, had nothing to do with the object. I would add that night hot-air balloon flights are uncommon. If the propane ran low, the balloon crew would have to make a landing in the dark, potentially on rough ground.

If the diamond-shaped object was some type of classified U.S. vehicle, there still is a major problem. The helicopters presumably had their red and green anti-collision lights turned on for safety. On a night combat mission, they would be turned off. If we assume the flame was the propulsion system, the vehicle could be easily spotted. It would be a target for anyone with an AK-47 on up to surface-to-air missiles.

One possibility is that the diamond-shaped object was actually a misinterpretation of a helicopter fitted with a high-power searchlight. I have seen police helicopters use such searchlights to look for suspects or illuminate crime scenes. This could potentially be used for illuminating the ground in a rescue attempt. When the police detective and his wife saw the Chinook helicopters, the light had been shut off, and they only saw the formation. I offer this as a possibility for further investigations, rather than as a solution.

CURT COLLINS, ace Cash-Landrum investigator, writes:

"There is a seemingly minor thing that is a big clue to how this case was handled. In the MUFON Journal of June, 1986, there is a letter from Scottish skeptic Stuart Campbell, who cites an article by Schuessler called 'Blind Terror in Texas', published by 'The Unexplained' UK magazine in 1982. He says the witnesses mentioned seeing the Moon, and goes on to document the fact that the Moon didn't appear until after midnight; and, supposing the event happened much later, analyzes what celestial objects the witnesses could have mistaken for a UFO.

"Finding a copy of 'The Unexplained' article in the clippings, I was able to read it for myself. The witnesses do not put the Moon in the sky, Schuessler does (emphasis added.) He says, 'Light from the third-quarter Moon, supplemented an airglow from the lights in the surrounding area, made the sky bright and the visibility good.'

"I'm guessing that he looked at an almanac and saw a 3/4 Moon listed, and added it as a background detail. I got an astronomical program that recreates historical night

skies from around the globe and checked the Moon position as seen from the area for Dec. 29th, 1980, and Campbell seems to be right about the timing of the Moon. It appeared at about 1 a.m.

"This mistake about the Moon may indicate that there could be other, bigger problems with wishful thinking around the way evidence was gathered and presented..."

We should add that the C-L UFO sighting took place well before 1 a.m. - Editor.
