FLYING SAUCER BASE IN FOOTHILLS

A flying saucer base - complete with at least three space ships and two interplanetary pilots - is allegedly tucked away in the mountains above Sunland-Tujunga, California.

And, from their Big Tujunga Canyon base station the two spacemen have been calling quite regularly on several Foothill residents, bringing messages from outer space.

Mrs. Maris De Long said she had repeated contacts with two space people.

Her 12-year-old son, Charles, and a man, Charles Kisner of Montrose, have also seen, listened to and talked with the visitors from outer space.

Mrs. De Long said several of the contacts have occurred in the Big Tujunga Canyon area, near a reservoir.

Because of the repeated contacts in the same area, Mrs. De Long maintains that spacemen are using the area around the dam as their Earth base of operation.

To fortify her claim, Mrs. De Long cites the recent experiences of a Los Angeles couple who followed a flying saucer across the foothills and into the canyon area.

The pair were found by sheriff's deputies, lost near Big Tujunga Canyon Road.

They told officials they had followed the large saucer-shaped object into the area and became lost when it disappeared with the approaching dawn.

Mrs. De Long supported by her son, said the space ship was probably the one she and four other witnesses had seen.

According to Mrs. De Long, she, her husband, Kisner and Charles were first contacted in July while traveling through the isolated canyon at night.

She said a bright light appeared to be following the car, and that the four occupants "began to feel uneasy."

The space ship then appeared behind the car, traveling along close to the ground with three multi-colored rays extending from the rounded contours of the UFO.

Sure that something big was coming their way, the group returned the next night to the same general Foothill area.

Again the saucer-shaped object appeared.

This time, however, the frightened occupants of the Rambler were introduced to "Kronin."

Introducing himself in a blaze of bright light, the spaceman told them

not to be afraid, that he meant no harm.

Mrs. De Long said that in spite of the spaceman's easy manner, she was "very frightened."

After reassuring the car's occupants again, "Kronin" chatted briefly about atmospheric conditions and the food he ate on "Clarion," his home planet.

"Kronin" then disappeared, promising to keep in touch, Mrs. De Long recalled.

The next night, Mrs. De Long, Charles, and Kisner travelled again to Big Tujunga Canyon, hoping to catch a glimpse of the space travelers.

Their hopes were not for nothing.

Mrs. De Long said "Kronin" appeared outside the car, materializing in a cloud of vapor. As the car moved along the highway, "Kronin" kept pace, chatting in a low-pitched voice with the three Foothills residents.

This time, Mrs. De Long had her tape recorder along, and was able to record the spaceman's conversation.

In a gravelly low voice that would be expected of a spaceman "Kronin" spoke about his visit to Earth.

Mrs. De Long said he called her an Earth Angel and said he was contacting people on earth to try to forestall a possible world war.

He reported that people on other planets were concerned with the war-like activities on Earth.

Before disappearing the spaceman asked the car's occupants to face their left and see the beautiful beam from his space ship.

"It was absolutely fantastic," Mrs. De Long said. "This multi-colored ray stretched from his mother ship and right through a large mountain in the canyon."

She said "Kronin" was a large man, about six feet tall and that he had no eyes.

"He told us he saw through thought control," Mrs. De Long said.

After disappearing "Kronin" said he would contact them again when atmospheric conditions were just right.

"We later heard from a spaceman named Karaff who told us more about the planet Clarion and life there."

MYSTERIOUSLY SLAIN ANIMALS V.S. U.F.O.'S

Mass of reports from all over the world indicates that many people are convinced that those elusive UFO's are busily stealing and dissecting dogs, cows and horses.

Irate farmers and pet owners everywhere are confusing local law enforcement agencies with these far-out claims backed up by the dismembered carcasses of hapless animals. Strangest of all, the blood, bone marrow and certain vital organs have all been expertly removed from the bodies.

Last November, William Watson of Gallipolis, Ohio, discovered his missing German shepherd dog in the center of an isolated field. The knee-high grass around the dog's body was pressed flat in a perfect circle, 20 feet in diameter. Every bone in its body was crushed and there was no blood in evidence. Residents in the area had reported seeing low-flying, saucer-shaped objects shortly before the dog's carcass was found.

A few months earlier, a registered nurse living alone on a nearby farm had complained to the police and the F.B.I. about mysterious "cattle rustlers" who were slaughtering her cows late at night. She said that she had seen strange luminous objects hovering at treetop level above her pastures on a number of occasions.

One night she glimpsed a tall male figure dressed in white coveralls in her field. She ran out with a shotgun and the figure left hurriedly, leaping over a tall fence with astounding ease. The cow carcasses had been expertly butchered in part and the bodies were bloodless.

Weird reports of unearthly cattle rustlers have appeared again and again since 1897. In April of that year, Alexander Hamilton, a farmer in Le Roy, Kansas, signed an affidavit swearing that he and his family had observed a huge cigar-shaped object "occupied by six of the strangest beings I ever saw" hovering over a two-year old heifer in his fields. A noose was lowered around the animal's neck and it was hauled into the sky in full view of the amazed farmers. A few days later the hide of the stolen creature turned up in a field about four miles away.

On September 7, 1956, three men near Twin Falls, Idaho, reported seeing a saucer-shaped object, 200 feet in diameter, settled near a luckless steer. The object took off before they could reach it. The steer was gone when it flew off, they declared.

Another case was recorded on April 1, 1963, at Chileno Valley, California, when a bewildered farmer told police that a flying saucer had stampeded his herd of cattle. Aroused by the rumpus, he said he reached the scene just in time to see a group of short men in white coveralls grab a calf and haul it into the object.

Early in September, 1967, a baffled veterinarian was called upon to examine the bodies of several strangely butchered cows near Allentown, Penna. Parts of their hides had been removed, and all of their blood and bone marrow was inexplicably missing. Ordinary animals of prey, insects, etc., were ruled out as the culprits.

It was about that time that "Snippy," the pet horse of Mrs. Berle Lewis, was found in a similar condition near Alamosa, Colorado.

Flying saucers had been reported consistently in the area for over five years, according to Alamosa County Sheriff Ben Phillips. But he theorized that "Snippy" was the victim of a stray lightning bolt. A pathologist from Denver examined the horse's carcass, however, and found that all of the fluid had been drained from the brain and spinal column. All of the animal's blood had also been extracted in some manner. He rejected the lightning theory.

Cows and horses have not been the only victims reported in these bizarre incidents. A farmer in Isola, Italy, accused "three dwarves in metallic diving suits" of stealing several of his pet rabbits on November 14, 1954. He claimed he caught the thieves red handed near his hutches and tried to fire a rifle at them but it wouldn't go off. The "dwarves" gathered up his rabbits, he said, got into a cigar-shaped machine and flew off.

At South America, a perpetual hotbed for unusual UFO tales, police officials investigating extensive flying saucer reports in Barcelos, Brazil, in September, 1962, learned that 17 chickens, six pigs and two cows had all vanished during the UFO wave.

Several pigs also reportedly vanished from their well-protected pens at the Agricultural College in Farmingdale, Long Island, this August, at a time when there were repeated power failures in the area and UFO's were allegedly appearing nightly.

There is a growing suspicion among UFOlogists that Pied Pipers from outer space are also zeroing in on dogs. During the massive wave of UFO reports in November, 1956, there were several well-documented cases of dognapping.

Group two (of UFOs) is a very different type altogether (from the space ships), people who dislike those humans upon the surface of the earth. They are not benevolent people at all; they have instead a horrid dread of those who dwell in the sunlight. They are a small colony of people who live inside the Earth. It is fortunate that their Flying Saucers are merely a glorified type of air vehicle not a great deal better than the puny aircraft which we surface people possess, and these "in-worlders" cannot travel to any great distance into space, probably no further than the Moon.

Much has been discovered about the "in-worlders," but again everything has been wrapped in official secrecy and the whole parcel tied up with miles of red tape. There are a number of natural orifices on the world which give access to the inner world. One is in the Andes, another in the Gobi Desert, and another -- if you leave the British Isles and go steaming up into the cold cold sea, passing Scotland and going on beyond the Shetland Islands, you will come to an area which is eternally wrapped in swirling fog, to an island which is known as Ultima Thule, the Last Island. It is forbidding, volcanic, and not at all prepossessing. It is surrounded by an atmosphere which causes cold shivers to dance up and down the spine of anyone who so foolishly decides to land on its inhospitable shore. One lands with a feeling of extreme reluctance, one struggles along against boulders and harsh pebbles feeling all the time that "someone" -- "something" -- is looking over one's shoulder, spying upon whatever one does. Officially the island is uninhabited.

Some years ago a ship of the British Royal Navy went there to make a survey of some kind, and in the course of their official duty landed a party of sailors under the control of highly experienced officers. Very strange happenings indeed took place, and in the secret, reports of the British Admiralty there are records of truly fantastic happenings on Ultima Thule, happenings which are so incredible that the reports have long been suppressed and kept under close guard.

On the island an extinct volcano is the dominant feature. Through the empty galleries by which molten lava used to flow in white-hot streams occasionally come people of another race, not unlike humans, but with subtle differences. They can also get their small vehicles through certain of these channels, and then they scout the land which they dislike so much, the land of the upper world. However, fortunately, their numbers are small, they are in a minority, and knowing that their craft are vulnerable, they do not attack but merely try to defend themselves. Often they take flight, and with their abnormally high speed they can outdistance anything which the surface people have at present.

A Dante, Tenn., farm boy, Everett Clark, told reporters that he saw four people get out of an oblong object on November 6, 1956, and make an effort to catch his dog, Frisky.

Hundreds of miles away on that same night, John Trasco of Everittstown, New Jersey, complained that a strange little man with frog-like eyes tried to take his dog. Trasco said he angrily ordered the creature off his property and it got into a luminous egg-shaped machine and flew off.

A new outbreak of dognappings began in November, 1966. Newell Partridge of Doddridge County, West Virginia, testified that he saw two glowing red objects in a field near his house and that his dog Bandit "started carrying on something terrible." The dog ran out into the field. The objects vanished...and the animal was never seen again.
