DAN MARTIN SPEAKS FEBRUARY 8: Dan M. Martin, a 60-year-old Detroit man, will tell the UFO Study Club of his experiences with space craft. The lecture, as usual, will be at Drexel Hall, Linwood and Baltimore, 2:30 p.m. Sunday, February 8.

For more than 20 years Mr. Martin has been receiving what he terms "unorthodox information". He was born and raised in a small town in Texas which no longer exists. It was only in recent months that Mr. Martin made his home in Detroit.

Due to the things he told, Mr. Martin's family and friends turned against him. His property and money were taken from him and he was directed to go into Mexico where he continued his study.

Mr. Martin stated his first contact with a space craft was in August, 1955, at which time he was told he would be contacted again. He was contacted again June 11, 1956. At this time he was taken aboard a large space ship. He spent approximately seven hours as their guest, and attended a lecture by the master of the ship.

He said in a letter to the club, "I heard and saw many things of interest, and I shall be glad to tell these things just as I saw and heard them. What I saw and heard has caused me personally to completely readjust my mode of living and thinking. I am not a preacher nor a religious fanatic in any way, since I do not belong to any religious group. I'll simply tell it as it was told to me."

He has written three books, "The Watcher," "Seven Hours Aboard A Space Ship," and "Seal of Daniel Broken."

OF SCIENTIFIC INTEREST

Some interesting articles have been appearing in the news lately that seem to have a familiar ring to them.

In the January 6 Kansas City Times appeared an article by Arthur J. Snider, Chicago Daily News science writer, about a new refrigeration and heating principle. It is thermoelectricity.

The article said the principle of thermoelectricity has been known for many years, but the efficient materials to permit its practical application are only now being discovered.

The new development is founded on the knowledge that when two dissimilar metals, known as semiconductors, are joined end to end and heated, they will generate an electric current.

If a drop of water is placed on the junction and the current made to flow in one direction, the water will freeze. When the current direction is reversed the ice will melt. Thus the junction liberates heat in one case and absorbs heat in the other.

Listed among the merits of the principle was "keep cold foods cold on dinner plates and hot foods hot."

This item has a familiar sound. At the Buck Nelson convention last June, Lee Childers, a Detroit baker, spoke. Among other experiences he related eating in a dining hall on the moon, and told of a rotating table on which hot foods were kept hot, frigid foods kept frigid, and vegetables that need a drink were kept in proper condition.

Its interesting to note comparisons as we look through the news. Where do we go from here? Utopia next stop?

Another interesting item of the news, though a little bit old, comes from the December 13 Times. Bearing an Oklahoma City dateline of December 12, it states that Otis T. Carr, president of O. T. C. Enterprises, Inc., Baltimore, Md., filed an application for a license to pilot a space craft with the Civil Aeronautics Administration at Oklahoma City.

Those who heard Mr. Carr speak here a few months ago will recall he stated he intended to build a space craft and make a trip to the moon in December of this year.

Speaking of inventors, here is an interesting little paragraph. In Los Angeles a self-educated inventor who has a device to prevent plane collisions finally is found in a hobo camp where he had fled because he couldn't sell his idea. Now the government will spend 5 million dollars developing the invention. Which shows -- patience always pays, even if you don't have it.

CLAIMS U. S. HAS CAPTURED FLYING SAUCER

(This article comes to us without dateline and without source. We have no means of checking on it, but give it to you for what it may be worth.)

The United States Air Force has captured at least one and possibly two flying saucers--unidentified flying objects from outer space--A top Washington official said yesterday.

It also is "believed on excellent authority" that France has at least two, England one, Russia one, "and there's a distinct possibility" the Brazilian air force has another.

The highly placed Washington source, who refused to be identified, said a rumor to the effect that the USAF has a saucer "stashed away at a secret base has persisted for quite some time but no one has been able to confirm or run it down as far as I know." However, the fact that the Air Force is known to have designed its own saucer-type craft according to flying saucer specifications "lends definite credence

to the rumor," the source states. It would be "virtually impossible," he pointed out, for the Air Force to duplicate such a craft unless "it had one in its possession."

The Air Force saucer, he said, has been undergoing "tests and experiments" at the Wright Patterson Base at Dayton, Ohio, but to date it hasn't been able to come anywhere near the high speeds and fantastic maneuverability of unidentified flying objects (UFO) sighted by competent pilots and others and tracked by skilled government radar men thousands of times.

Further credence is given the rumor, the source said, by the Air Force's "original anxiety" to "get a UFO by any possible means." Military pilots, he says, were ordered to accomplish this by shooting one down or, if necessary, "even ramming it and bailing out."

Added to this, it was pointed out, are public statements by William Lear, a world authority on aerodynamics and winner in 1950 of the coveted Collier Trophy for outstanding contributions to aviation. The Collier Award was presented by President Truman. In these statements, carried by the wire services several months ago, Lear disclosed this country soon will be turning out saucer-type craft that eventually will attain speeds up to 10,000 miles an hour.

Authority for the report that England has a flying saucer is Lord Louis Mountbatten. No one willing or able to be quoted on, reports France, Brazil and Russia also have flying saucers in their possession could be reached, although a wire service story from London yesterday stated the Soviet plan to build a jet-powered saucer in the near future. The Soviets have admitted, the story stated, that in recent tests a model of the planned craft has proved "extremely maneuverable."

It was also learned yesterday of the existence of a special Senate sub-committee (as yet unnamed) and two Congressional committees, one of which is working on space legislation and related matters, all formed for the purpose of investigating "The UFO Problem" from every conceivable angle. The Senate group, headed by Sen. John N. McClellan, (D-Ark.), has had the matter under study the past 18 months.

It is expected this committee will go into action after a powerful congressional body, just after the first of the year, launches a study of the government's guided missiles program.

Word is the latter investigation has been sparked by a feud between Wernher Von Braun, the scientist heading the program, and Secretary of Defense Neil McElroy over certain delays in the schedule of firings and the "general confusion" that has surrounded the United States missiles program from the beginning.



LIBRARY NEWS


