STUDY GROUP MEETINGS: WHAT MARCH HELD WHAT APRIL PROMISES

At the March meeting of the UFO Study Group of Greater St. Louis, members were treated to a fascinating talk by David H. Childress, author of five books (His Lost Cities ... series) and editor of The Anti-Gravity Handbook and Anti-Gravity and the World Grid.

Mr. Childress focused on his latest book, Lost Cities Of Ancient Lemuria And The Pacific as it related to ancient civilizations which used fabulous flying machines and weaponry. In particular, he focused on the lost civilizations of the India subcontinent, how they lived and how they died. He carefully left any conclusions as to the source of these civilizations and their achievements up to his audience, but the discussion definitely was related to UFOs. For more information on this lost, ancient Indian civilization and its aircraft technology, an excellent paper appeared in the 1987 MUFON Symposium Proceedings.

The next meeting of the UFO Study Group of Greater St. Louis, Inc. will feature more video tapes of several television interviews. Interviews with Budd Hopkins about his abduction research, as well as interviews of Stanton T. Friedman, Phillip Klass and several others will be shown. These interviews are conducted by such personalities as Sally Jessey Raphael, Oprah Winfrey and Geraldo Rivera.

The viewing and following discussion of these tapes will take place at 2:00 p.m., Sunday, April 10 at the Farm and Home Savings community room, 110 West Lockwood (corner of Lockwood and Gore) in Webster Groves, Missouri. All members of the UFO Study Group of Greater St. Louis, Inc. and many of their friends will be interested in learning more about what's in the news and on television concerning Unidentified Flying Objects.

YELLOW ALERT!

EDITOR'S NOTE: Mr. Palermo is the Missouri Director of Public Information and Education for MUFON as well as Librarian, Historian and Board Member of the UFO Study Group of Greater St. Louis.

I had my first UFO sighting in the summer of 1973. It was also in this year, I believe, that the UFO Study Group of Greater St. Louis (Some of the grassroots from which our now acclaimed Mutual UFO Network Inc. was born from) hosted Stanton T. Friedman lecturing on the realities of UFOs, specifically referring to Project Blue Book and Betty Hill.

Life guided me elsewhere for quite a few years. In the summer of 1984, I met

Bruce Widaman, now our MUFON State Director, and before too long, I was recommended as State Director of Public Information and Education for Missouri MUFON. Going towards my fourth year in ufology, I have learned a tremendous amount in various categories. I've met and talked with those considered the "Big Wheels" in ufology. Going on four years, I have proudly and seriously engaged local television, cable systems and radio in studying the information most currently available in ufology. Now, I am forced to say, I see a yellow alert going off. I see a "descent" between ufologist occurring - ufologists who have been working towards or SEEMINGLY working towards the same goals for years.

What has energized me to write is the article by Barry Greenwood in the December, 1987 issue of MUFON Journal entitled "MJ-12 MAGIC ACT". The acknowledgments to this went to Peter Gersten, Robert Todd, Robert Hastings, William Steinman, John Lear, Jim Melesciuc, Peter Geremia, Dr. David Jacobs and Marge Christensen.

I have great respect for Clear Intent. However, I have almost no respect for the "MJ-12 MAGIC ACT" article. I am surprised that people with judicial and legal backgrounds would take such a compromising stand as to say "We can now report to you that, regrettably, the MJ-12 affair APPEARS to be a grand deception, and consequently a black eye on the surface of ufology." Along with ufology, I've been a martial artist for 11 years. You don't get a "black eye" by appearing to be hit. My first statement to the writers is stop riding the fence! Either call it an out and out solid fake, or don't. But don't say it "SEEMS to be". "Seems to be" is what Philip Klass has said from the beginning.

The second paragraph comments on the validity of the document needing support by knowing the source. I see that as reasonable. I also see it as reasonable that the source may have to wait for a particular time to come forward, or wait until he / she feels ready to deal with all the prodding and scrutiny they will undergo by people or agencies we may not even know exist! We know from past experience how easily people can be made to look non-credible.

Next, why Shandera instead of a Cronkite, Rather or Sagan? Ohhh pleassse!

The week before the 1987 Washington D.C. symposium, Bill Moore sent a package of MJ-12 information to Paul Harvey, who spoke at great length about the information he received and at the end of his broadcast simply said without more evidence, he couldn't lend credence to the stories.

As far as the other three mentioned, in just the last couple of years Dan Rather had to live down the unprofessional acts of walking off a set in a tantrum because his show was delayed for a football game. After that, Rather couldn't afford to be the one to come out with UFO information of the MJ-12 nature. Rather, Cronkite and Sagan all would have to face serious investigations and scrutiny not to mention the networks or producers they work for.

I've been told that ABC NIGHTLINE was at the Nebraska Symposium in 1984, shot all kinds of footage and nothing was ever aired! And doesn't it make great sense, indeed, for the source of MJ-12 to send the information to Shandera, Moore and Friedman, three people with the ufological backgrounds, collectively, to be able to know where and how it fits and its historical significance.

As far as Bill Moore's statement on where the burden of proof does or doesn't lie, I suspect that at the 1987 MUFON Symposium he was declaring that those calling him personally a liar or a hoaxer would have to shoulder the burden of proof in that respect. He also stated at that symposium (I was there and have it on tape) that he cannot claim 100% authenticity without not only the identity of the source but a thorough research and investigation of that source.

The last point I'll make about this "seeming" character assassination attempt on Shandera, Moore and Friedman concerns the comments about deletions in the documents. Yes, Moore admitted that they had blocked out certain information. My understanding is that those knowledgeable enough about governmental workings could, by careful examination of a clean copy of the document, trace where it came from and possibly who it came from. If I had such information without first securing 100% accuracy of my source, I would have done the same thing. Greenwood and his group, by examining a mere photo copy of the same information distributed to those interest-

ed at the 1987 Symposium, have come to conclusions like the ones in the rest of the "MJ-12 MAGIC ACT" article.

I will not attempt to comment on the probable authenticity nor the possible forgery of the MJ-12 information. I will say, however, that I feel confident that if there was any forgery involved, it was from the source and not from Shandera, Moore and Friedman.

In conclusion, it is my personal assessment that there may be some serious jealousies occurring between ufologists. We are all crucial to ufology and it's future. I am surprised that CAUS would take such a harsh and demeaning approach to their article. I understand their concerns with the information they researched. However, surely it is reasonable and logical to envision any and all representatives of any agency or library to simply report negative sounding information as a deterrent to what has happened. What a laugh those covering up ufological information, documentation, artifacts or bodies would have if they knew of this feud. "Good God, the ufologists are somehow given information we've been working to keep from them and all we did was say it's fake and the other ufologists crucify them! This was the easiest thing we've ever done!"

Perhaps the information CAUS has accumulated has convinced them that the MJ-12 documents and supporting evidence is a hoax. They will not commit to this idea on paper, but they certainly point that way by everything else they say. I have been in two work situations where I have been framed in order to force me from my job. I know how easy it is for misinformation to be planted. Considering CAUS moves from a judicial philosophy, their comments are predictable when you read of their research. Things are not always the way they seem. Before I accept or reject 100 percent the MJ-12 information, I want to give the time needed for the source to come forward and complete the picture for all of us.



FAITH: FIRST DEFENSE AGAINST PSYCHIC ATTACK

Four members of the Parapsychology Committee met on Wednesday, March 2, to discuss apparent psychic attacks and possible physical symptoms manifested when UFO investigators worked on a case.

It was noted that in Intruders by Budd Hopkins, Communion by Whitley Strieber and Night Siege by J. Allen Hynek, John Imbrogno and Bob Pratt, that those controlling recent UFOs (and -- as evidence indicates -- controlling unwilling human victims of painful experiments) seem evil, not good. It was noted that massive evidence of UFO incursions which brought 1,500 witnesses to one New York site, declassification of some government documents admitting UFOs exist, and newsworthy long period sightings by credible observers, still are met by official government denial of UFO existence.

Then postulations raised in the Rendelsham Forest Case and in Andrew's book, Extraterrestrials Among Us were discussed: Is the government really cooperating with an evil superior technological society which our officials deny as part of what they perceive as a beneficial, nonaggression pact? Mutual exchange of war materials between enemies in World Wars I and II and the impact of the Illuminati -- a demon worshipping coalition which some trace in philosophy to the Trilateral Commission today -- were adduced to support the theory that in our century a satanic core government in several nations has exercised a policy which is primarily aimed at annihilation of Christians and secondarily at the destruction of any who believed in "God."

Citing the power of Jesus Christ (Son of God, Savior from Sin, Conqueror over Satanic evil), several participants indicated that they found in Him a victorious deterrent to evil spirits as well as their source of discernment between good and evil spirits. (Psalm 91:11-12, John 8:44, 2 Peter 2:4, Phillipeans 2:9-11 and Ephesians 6:12)

One man present believed that UFO occupants, even while forcefully exercising painful experiments and demonstrating fearful power, might have some positive influence. He told of a missing time

event when he was fishing alone as a school dropout at age 12. Subsequently, subconsciously, he knew that UFO vehicles used electromagnetic - ion shields to ride interstellar gravitational fields. His intellectual curiosity was so piqued that he returned to high school, read omnivorously, and went on to complete college with high grades.

"I have enough problems to deal with in the present without having hypnotic regression reveal others in past missing time," the narrator concluded with a laugh.

All agreed that faith in Christ was our first line of defence against psychological, spiritual, emotional or physical attack by negative spiritual or Ufological forces.


Everything is run by crystals. People on earth do not understand yet the importance of crystals. Crystals play an important part in the mechanism of their ships.

UFO MUSEUM! A PROPOSAL BY GEORGE FAWCETT

For the past 42 years, George Fawcett has been a civilian UFO investigator, researcher, organizer, writer, lecturer and teacher in the exciting field of the scientific study of unidentified flying objects (UFOs).

For 22 of those years, George has seriously entertained the dream of establishing a UFO Museum somewhere as both a tourist attraction and as a research

center.

Possessing one of the most extensive UFO libraries anywhere, George has become a respected authority and historian of the UFO phenomenon. Among his many credits, George addressed the 1985 MUFON Symposium held here in St. Louis.

The following is the first of two parts of this fascinating and detailed proposal for just such a museum. The following is copyrighted 1986 by George D. Fawcett and is presented with permission.

WHY A UFO MUSEUM?

- 1) It would help preserve the history of UFOs for all future generations.
- 2) It would capitalize on the widespread public and private interest, belief and awareness, as has already been detected by the 1978 Gallup Poll and other polls and studies on a global basis.
- 3) It would serve as a collection center for all past, present and future donors of UFO materials, some who have already willed their collections to me and to others. The potential for financial, material and human resources cannot be overestimated.
- 4) It would enable us to educate the public on current facts and discoveries concerning UFOs worldwide.
- 5) It would serve as a "reporting center", where eyewitnesses could report their experiences without fear of ridicule, censorship or other recriminations.
- 6) It would not compete, but rather cooperate and coordinate with all other existing UFO organizations and UFO publications, etc.

WHAT'S IN A UFO MUSEUM?

- 1) It would include the following rooms and facilities to begin with: (a) Classrooms, (b) reading room and library, (c) lecture room auditorium, (d) exhibit room, (e) research room, (h) storage and utility room, (i) offices, etc.

HOW WOULD A UFO MUSEUM FUNCTION?

A) The classroom would be used for teaching UFO courses, conducting workshops and Board Meetings, and holding UFO study group meetings.

B) The reading room and library would be used for viewing UFO books,

journals, scrapbooks, clipping services, magazine articles, worldwide UFO studies and publications, Freedom of Information UFO documents, etc.

C) The lecture room auditorium would be used for UFO symposiums, conferences, movie films, visiting UFO speakers, training sessions and a community rental meeting room (when not in use for UFO events).

D) The exhibit room would be used for group tours such as schools, community service clubs, bus tours, private and public visitations, etc. Exhibits would include eyewitness sketching and paintings, display boards, announcement bulletins of coming events, clipping displays of recent reported UFO sightings, slide presentations, artifacts, sculptured models of UFOs and their occupants documented along with landing marks, framed photographs, UFO trivia pursuit questions and answers.

The exhibit room would also have private stalls and / or small theatres for seeing and hearing audio recordings of eyewitness accounts, UFO video cassettes, UFO documented movies, tape recordings, etc. Visiting UFO photographic exhibits would be on display from time to time, as would permanent exhibits of UFO investigative kits and IFO displays (things identified that were not UFOs) such as planes, planets, balloons, meteors, hoaxes, fake photographs and flares.

If in future years those reported Retrievals of the Third Kind (crashes of UFOs with the bodies of aliens) are confirmed, you can rest assured that room will be readily available for these exhibits too. In fact, a separate museum could quickly be built for these items alone (with private booths for skeptics to weep in).

E) The research room includes filing cabinets, case histories, specialized research, field investigations, computers and printers, copying machines (to share information with visiting field investigators and students), global UFO catalogs, correspondence, eyewitness questionnaires, study results and state UFO histories.

F) The publications and information room would include for retail sales such items as old and current UFO books, a UFO Museum newsletter, global UFO journals, a booth for taping your own UFO experience (both audio and visual), UFO tapes,

cassettes, T-shirts, bumper stickers, pennants, cookbooks, sound recordings, slides, UFO catalogs, photos of you and your favorite UFO or UFOonaut booth (using models), UFO written exams, recommended publications, organizations lists, UFO investigator's kits and equipment. Free UFO information handouts and questionnaires for eyewitnesses can be distributed as well as UFO Museum brochures.



G) The snack bar and registration room would include food featuring space doggies (hot dogs), UFO burgers, (hamburgers), UFOs (Unidentified Frozen or Fried Objects - fruit salad and french fries) and the like. The snack bar would have chairs and tables available for guests. This area of the museum would include other vending machines, a registration book for guests, video games and a lighted five cosmic quizzes on UFO experiences with selector buttons, as well as selected statements by world figures

and their photographs and names on the walls. Information brochures on nearby area motels, hotels, eating spots and other area attractions can be made available for those who may wish to stay overnight or for longer periods of time in the area.

H) Storage and utility room would include office supplies, cleaning supplies, incoming exhibits and donated UFO collections.

I) The office would include the usual telephone, desk and chairs, secretarial supplies, typewriter, mimeograph machine, an answering machine for off hours, book shelves, a personal filing cabinet and extra promotional materials such posters. Toilets should be nearby for both the staff and visitors to the UFO Museum.
