

1989 MUFON SYMPOSIUM ONE OBSERVERS VIEW

The 1989 MUFON UFO Symposium, held in Las Vegas, Nevada, proved to be informative and entertaining, despite some "rock throwing" by certain members of the audience. I found this unprofessional and disturbing, but given the disinformation that is continually surfacing, numerous opinions will always be present. The study of ufology must always be treated in a scientific and logical perspective, otherwise personal and irrational beliefs will just confuse an already disbelieving public. Overall, I was pleased with the professionalism and scientific approach of the speakers (discounting the unofficial speakers who presented their views the following morning). I am confident the thoroughness and determination exhibited by these people will one day soon lead to resolving the UFO enigma.

Recalling many of the enlightening and lively speeches, Jennie Zeidman, student and assistant of Dr. J. Allen Hynek, touched extensively on the 1973 Mansfield helicopter / UFO encounter which was observed by multiple witnesses from varied locations. Considered a well documented case, Philip Klass has of course maintained his one sided outlook and explained the incident away as a simple meteor sighting. Mrs. Zeidman's thorough treatment of the topic left little doubt about the encounter and dispelled Klass's remarks and put Klass in his place by calling him a ninny.

Donald Johnson presented a very interesting correlation of UFO data ranging from 1952 to 1978 involving ignition system interference effects on cars, trucks and motorcycles as a result of close encounters by UFOs. This phenomenon has been duplicated with extremely large magnetic fields greater than 100 Tesla (a measuring unit for magnetic fields) through independent research experiments. His "cluster analysis" has developed seven major groupings which lead to the general conclusion that UFOs of similar appearance behave in a similar manner.

Don Berliner laid out a hypothetical plan for retrieving crashed UFOs by the U.S. Government. This plan is extremely

compartmentalized, giving only those persons involved in the retrieval, enough information to perform their duties. Organization, rapid response, efficiency and above all, secrecy are the key elements here. Based on the rapid cover-up of the 1947 New Mexico crash, Mr. Berliner believes such a plan was already in existence. No system is perfect. Security leaks occur and we will eventually learn the real truth to the crash cover-up. After all, faults in the alien craft are what led to the creation of the retrieval program in the first place. Sooner or later a crash is expected to occur in a well populated area. If so, get the press!

The afternoon session brought Robert Oechsler to the podium to discuss the Chesapeake Connection. He presented the results of the Annapolis Research and Study Group who investigated the numerous UFO sightings on the western shore of the Chesapeake Bay. Their findings point to a government cover-up and the development of an advanced defense program, not for traditional enemies, but for extraterrestrials.

A Fascinating lecture was prepared by Linda Moulton Howe, author of the recently published book, "An Alien Harvest". She was accompanied by pathologist and hematologist, Dr. John Altschuler and Jim Williamson, editor of "Little River News", in Arkansas. All have been involved extensively in examining animal mutilations that have occurred since the late sixties. Primarily centered around cows, these mutilations represent first hand evidence of extraterrestrial visitation. The tissue samples examined by Dr. Altschuler show microscopic alterations in the cells, caused by extreme heating with pinpoint accuracy; definitely not the product of a renegade cult! Current laser technology would barely rival these surgical techniques. Questions were raised on the logistics of performing such precise surgery in the field with the cumbersome and expensive equipment required. Ms. Howe pointed out the striking feature in most all cow mutilations - there is no blood in the carcass or the area surrounding the animal. She concluded by suggesting that this "alien harvest" is for sustenance and genetic experimentation.

"Above Top Secret" was the topic

presented by Timothy Good, author of the book by the same name. Timothy presented intriguing evidence of UFO cover-ups that occurred from the early forties through the recent past. He explained that the reasons behind the cover-up are probably aimed at developing technological advancements for defense purposes and concern over a fearful public reaction.

Stanton T. Friedman gave an update on his research into the Majestic-12 (MJ-12) operation which was established at the time of the Roswell, New Mexico crash in 1947. Their purpose was to deal with the technological, physiological, psychological and other aspects of the alien bodies and wreckage discovered. He focussed his research into the backgrounds of the twelve men chosen for the task as well as establishing the validity, format and style of the MJ-12 documents. Mr. Friedman included amusing written dialog between himself and Philip Klass concerning type styles used in that era. The result was a payment of \$1,000 by Klass to Friedman to cover a lost bet. One for our side! For the moment, the documents appear to be authentic.

The greatest attention of the first day of lectures centered around William Moore, who by request, spoke last. His speech, scheduled for one hour, lasted two. He spoke defensively in an attempt to dispel rumors concerning his accused role of government disinformant. Mr. Moore would not divulge the names of his contacts or the results of his findings except to say that UFOs are real, and abductions are taking place with little understanding of their intent. Despite shouts from the audience, Mr. Moore persisted. He spoke of the disinformation passed by Paul Bennowitz some years ago and those who chose to continue the spreading of falsehoods (referring to John Lear and Bill Cooper). Once his work is complete, Mr. Moore will tell his story, but until then, he will continue his research, with or without public support.

Dr. Jacques F. Vallee, during his travels to Brazil in July 1988, investigated stories by villagers having close encounters with UFOs. His lecture focused only on those reports involving injuries, most of them resulting from light beams. Dr. Vallee reported in at least one case, a death occurred.

The last speaker on Sunday afternoon

was Dr. John E. Brandenburg who suggested a past humanoid civilization once lived on Mars. Dr. Brandenburg based his "Cydonian Hypothesis" on the careful examination he and others made on several large geological features photographed by the Viking spacecraft in 1976. Large seemingly symmetrical faces were photographed, including a number of nearby pyramids suggesting monuments similar to those constructed by Old Kingdom Egypt. Future years and new data will provide an answer to these questions.

Also present at the symposium were four unofficial speakers who presented discussions on topics certainly interesting, but nevertheless void of substantiation. Until these data can be proven, or sources of information divulged, these stories need to be shelved right next to the other stacks of disinformation. Despite the controversy that arose among supporters of the different UFO factions, one commonality was certain; no one liked Philip Klass.

SPEAKING OF MUFON "PUBLICITY"

As Public Information Officer of MUFON in Missouri, I've had the opportunity to watch and listen to many of those associated with Ufology to speak publicly.

As a former radio news / sports director, one time talk show host and member of Toastmasters International, I feel compelled to: 1) Offer a few suggestions that may enable those speaking for MUFON to deliver a more exciting, informative and uniform presentation on UFO's. 2) To ask you, the members and particularly those speaking to the media / public to give me input on what you feel is important to mention (my address will be at the end of this article).

Now picture this, you are representing MUFON, the nations largest private organization dedicated to the scientific investigation of UFO's. Tonight you'll be speaking before a mixed public group about

UFO's. The group is blue, white collar, professionals, laborers, the old, the young, a real cross section (The same applies to those appearing on TV or radio). The chairperson of the group thought it would be an interesting topic for a presentation on UFO's. The chairperson gives you a free hand with the presentation, maybe even claiming that he / she has seen a UFO and further elaborates on believing in UFO's.

Excitement is high, the time draws near, you're well read on the topic and have better than average recall of the facts. Perhaps you've prepared a few slides, photo's, a display of books and maybe (hopefully) a written outline for your presentation. While the 45 minute time limit is flexible this limitation includes a question and answer session - FEEDBACK - from the audience! (How much time do you allow?)

In the event you are not properly introduced, always have a few interesting facts about yourself (you are interesting) ready to hand to the person introducing you. This will enhance your credibility even before you say the first word. NEVER speak without a proper introduction.

When greeting the audience always thank those responsible for inviting you. As an icebreaker you may wish to relate an amusing story of how you became involved with MUFON or to the group you're addressing.

Checking the UFological IQ of your audience may well be your next step. Asking, "How many books have you read on the subject of UFO's, more than 5-10-20?" could be a logical way to get participation.

According to a recent (delete the year) Gallup Poll, "13 MILLION AMERICANS SAY THEY'VE SEEN A UFO." Following such a statement instead of blatantly asking, "Has anyone here ever seen a UFO?" It may be more diplomatic and productive to say, "Some say UFO's are controversial, so I won't ask you if you've seen one. What I will ask, is if you did see a UFO, would you tell someone / anyone about it?"

Then inquire, "Who would you tell - police, Air Force, a relative, neighbor, trusted friend or MUFON?" In all probability fewer hands may go up for MUFON than the aforementioned. Do take it in stride, pause, verbally note the lack of hands for MUFON and say, "Now that, ladies and

gentlemen of (name of group), that is why I'm here tonight."

At that point, a brief explanation of MUFON, it's history and purpose would be due. After all, that is why you're talking, to inform, educate and offer the public a credible avenue to report their experiences (that number again is ---).

Naturally, MUFON provides a media policy guideline regarding any public presentations. Please review it if you have not already taken the time. The following represent a combination of MUFON guidelines and additional suggestions from myself and others concerned:

- 1) LIMIT SUBJECT MATTER TO UFO'S
- 2) PROVIDING AN INACCURATE OR INCOMPLETE INFORMATION TO THE PUBLIC / MEDIA IS PROHIBITED (IF YOU DON'T KNOW THE DETAILS, DON'T BRING IT UP)
- 3) RESTRICT YOUR REMARKS TO THOSE THAT CAN BE VERIFIED. "A CLAIM OF IGNORANCE IN RESPONSE TO A GIVEN INQUIRY IS FAR LESS DAMAGING THAN OPEN ENDED SPECULATION OF DATA.
- 4) PERSONAL VIEWPOINTS SHOULD BE MINIMIZED AND AVOIDED IF POSSIBLE. SINCE EVERYONE HAS OPINIONS, OURS IS JUST ONE MORE UNLESS WE SUPPORT IT PROPERLY. OPINIONS CAN EASILY BE TAKEN OUT OF TEXT BY MEDIA (AS WE'VE SEEN BEFORE).
- 5) IDENTIFICATION OF UFO WITNESSES / ABDUCTEES MUST REMAIN ANONYMOUS UNLESS PERMISSION HAS BEEN GRANTED IN WRITING.
- 6) ANY DETAILED DISCUSSION OF ABDUCTION CASES SHOULD BE CONSIDERED VERY CAREFULLY. WHILE THE ABDUCTION ISSUE IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT, WE MUST KEEP IN MIND THE AUDIENCE WE ARE ADDRESSING. ONE MUST PASS GRADE SCHOOL BEFORE GETTING INTO HIGH SCHOOL.
- 7) SMOKING, GUM CHEWING IS NOT GOING TO WIN FRIENDS AND INFLUENCE ANYONE DURING A PRESENTATION. IN ORDER TO PROMOTE AS PROFESSIONAL AND SCIENTIFIC AN ATTITUDE AS IS POSSIBLE, WE NEED TO GIVE PEOPLE EVERY REASON TO ENJOY LISTENING TO US. IF YOU NEED TO SMOKE YOU NEED A BREAK.
- 8) BE ORGANIZED - WRITTEN OUTLINES. YOU CAN'T GET TO THE FINISH LINE IF YOU DON'T KNOW WHERE IT IS. USE MONTHLY MUFON OR STUDY GROUP MEETINGS TO POLISH AND CRITIQUE YOUR PRESENTATION. A POLISHED PRODUCT GATHERS

PEOPLE, THAT MEANS MEMBERS, FIELD INVESTIGATORS, GRASS ROOTS SUPPORT. WE CAN USE THAT!

- 9) NOW I NEED YOUR FEEDBACK. OF THOSE WHO HAVE SPOKEN BEFORE, IF YOU'VE KEPT YOUR EGO IN CHECK, THEN YOU BECAME "AUDIENCE AWARE". DID THEY FIDGET? GO TO THE BATHROOM? OR YAWN DURING YOUR SPEECH? PLEASE WRITE ME WITH ANY INPUT REGARDING WHAT YOU CONSIDER PERTINENT FOR IMPROVING SUCH PRESENTATIONS. WHICH THREE OR FOUR CASES DO YOU FEEL STRONGEST ABOUT? WHICH GOVERNMENT MATERIAL DO YOU MOST OFTEN MENTION? WHAT ABOUT DEBUNKING?

Also, if you would share with me how you answer some of those annoying inane questions like, "Have you seen a UFO?" or "If there are extraterrestrial civilizations, why no contact?" or "Do you believe in UFO's?"

The latter has best been answered by our Missouri MUFON State Director, Bruce Widaman who when asked if he believes in UFOs, simply says, "No." Naturally, this raises an eyebrow and mixes up a puzzled look but needed attention is gained for your reply. "We do not believe in UFOs because we acknowledge them as a scientific fact, a reality. To believe implies a religious perspective. UFO'S ARE REAL and are well worthy of serious scientific study." You can take it from here.

A heartfelt thank you to those of you who wish to correspond regarding our public face. The correct delivery of our message can certainly send the right signals to those who are watching our every move.

PARAPSYCHOLOGISTS "DEEP BLACK" IN "PUZZLE PALACE"

Fourteen members of the Parapsychology Committee met June 7 to hear Alex Horvat's perceptive reviews of "The Puzzle Palace" by James Bamford and "Deep Black" by William E. Burrows. First, however, almost everyone had special information to share.

Walter Palmer told of a fisherman from Yubatuba, Brazil who saw an unidentified object explode and recovered metal shards. A private laboratory identified the metal as nearly pure magnesium castings; but the Armed Forces failed to identify the metal in their tests.

David Rapp discussed theoretical "worm holes" which -- with proper magnetic acceleration -- allow time travel (perhaps to parallel universe without changing the future.) "Worm holes" are based on theories developed by abstract mathematician Steven Hawkins. Marjorie Sherrill hopes to locate a speaker qualified to review Hawkin's speech on "Imaginary Time" for the September meeting of the UFO Study Group.

Marjorie also shared more data on the Sorratt Group's telekinetic experiments. Psi contactees have dramatic changes in their lives, new jobs, residential relocation and the urge to communicate new insights. She showed photos of an apparent energy field above such a person. She also noted that Brent Raynes, Editor of Parapsychology Forum, asked for reports on plasmatic creatures observed near Cahokia Mounds in the St. Louis area. Anyone with such experiences to divulge?

Forrest Crawford related that TV's "Inside Edition" had adduced evidence that a state department executive was devising international laws on citizens dealing or not dealing with "aliens from space." According to "Inside Edition", humans need to get clearance from their government's equivalent to the State Department; and -- even if fired upon -- humans may not legally shoot back. (International collusion to cooperate with invading aliens?)

Ernie Joyce, early Thursday morning June 1, heard a whirring-clicking sound from his phone answering machine. It should not have operated at all since the

power switch was in the off position. At 7:45 a.m. he turned the machine on and saw the red call light. When he put the recorder on replay, he heard Jane say, "Ernie, I'm home." He phoned Jane Reed. She was at home, too sick to go to work, but she asked Ernie how he knew that. His answer did not satisfy her. She had not phoned Ernie's home. (Another Uri Geller phenomenon, since he claims aliens operate his recorders, radios and phone answering devices?)

Alex Horvat's review of "The Puzzle Palace" by James Bamford, Doctor of Investigatory Journalism, 532 pages, published by Penguin Books, copyright 1985, gives "evidence of an intelligence network so huge as to rival Orwell's version of the world in "1984". By law, for example, the National Security Agency has the right to deny its own existence and to cover any of its activities. President Truman formed the 10,000 employee agency on November 4, 1952 in complete secrecy without congressional debate. According to Physicist Stanton T. Friedman, Truman also assembled scientists secretly as Majestic 12 to investigate UFO's. NSA's headquarters is more than 600,000 square feet larger than CIA headquarters. NSA is entrusted with coding and decoding messages, satellite transmissions and virtually any and all communications to protect government rights. Apparently this included violating citizens' civil rights since the Church Committee in 1975 revealed, according to the "New York Times", that the NSA had routinely monitored all commercial cable messages for five years.

To compound the matter, President Ford instructed the chief executives of ITT, RCA Global and Western Union not to comply with Church Committee subpoenas. (Five witnesses were cited for Contempt of Congress.) Bella Abzug, one member of the Church Committee, called the NSA's secrecy "obsessive and unfounded." The CIA controlled less than 10% of national tactical intelligence with staff cut by half to 4,000 during the Vietnam War, while the NSA grew nearly seven times to 68,203 by 1978. Its CRAY computer occupying five and one-half acres ins capable of one quadrillion (1,000,000,000,000,000) multiplications and input capacity 320 million words per second.

"Deep Black" by William E. Burrows, 405 pages, published by Berkeley Books, NY

complements "The Puzzle Palace" when it offers interesting data on the politics of spying and the salutary use of misinformation. Placement of a nuclear physicist in charge of the prestigious USSR Institute of Physical Problems misled our spies into concluding he would develop a fighter plane capable of downing our U2 spy plane. We invested \$100 million to \$250 million to develop the YF-12A operating at Mach 3 at 100,000 feet or more. It was never manufactured. Instead, the General Dynamics F-111 was built. This plane is too heavy for carrier duty, too unmanageable for a fighter and too short ranged for a bomber or reconnaissance plane. Recall that 18 F-111s, 3 radar jamming jets and 28 KC-10 and KC-135 tankers raided Libya in April 1986, refueling the bombers four times on their 2,500 mile flight.

Secrecy can be used for political ends. In December 1985, President Reagan claimed the Soviets were violating Salt II by deploying more ICBM's and long range bombers. The Joint Chief of Staff's February 1986 report totally contradicted Reagan's statement. The administration admitted that his statement was political, not military. Burrows seems to conclude that secrecy in CIA, NSA and other intelligence gathering agencies may -- in fact -- be most effective in covering the growing problem of incompetency in government. More of Orwell's "doublespeak"?

Alex Horvat raises a final question concerning security agencies, "Are their goals desirable to America in general or not?"

LIBRARY COMMITTEE PLANS FOR NEXT YEAR

The Library / Archive Committee recently submitted it's plans for the upcoming 1989 - 1990 year to the UFO Study Group Board of Directors. The Board of

Directors enthusiastically approved the plan and hopes all members will actively support it. The Library and Archives represent a major asset of the UFO Study Group of Greater St. Louis, Inc. It is one of the prime objectives of our organization along with public education and UFO investigations. The plans for this coming year are:

Submit a budget of \$10.00 per month to the Board of Directors. This will be divided between copy cost and book purchasing. Very few new books have been added to the collection in recent years.

Fund raisers will be run from the Library table at each monthly Sunday meeting. Proceeds will be divided between the Library / Archive Committee and the UFO Study Group's general revenue fund.

Proposed fund raisers include:

- Book / Tape Raffles
- "This Date in History" - leaflets containing items in the news for past years on the date of each meeting.
- Scrap Books - Most probably will be sold at the Show-Me Conference on October 21.
- Sale of excess copies of books from our collection.
- Sale of bookmarks.

The Archive Collection tasks planned include finish sorting of present files, mount and categorize clippings, complete current categories in progress (Commentary - 13 books and England - 3 books).

The Library Committee will solicit supplies such as glue, paper, notebooks and unwanted books related to our studies. The committee also would like to acquire a 3 or 4 drawer file cabinet.

Proposed work on the library includes sorting and cataloging books, weeding out excessive material, establishing a viable checkout system for periodicals and determine gaps in our collection.

The committee intends to develop a title column for Archive articles to appear in The UFO Enigma alternating library and archive news from month to month.

The Library and Archive Committee also proposed that the UFO Study Group's office of Historian be eliminated. The duties of the Historian would be assumed by the Recording Secretary. The Board of Directors agreed to pursue this change in accordance with our By Laws.
