FEBRUARY AND MARCH REPORT

The February UFO Study Group of Greater St. Louis held its meeting at 2:00 in the Tyler Place Presbyterian Church at 2109 South Spring and Russell.

After standard opening statements of the group's history and recognition of the organizations' officers present, John Schroeder, President, opened the meeting to a time of sharing. Study Group Marshall, Frank Brown, shared his usual headlines from various tabloids.

John Schroeder next announced that a vote was needed to change the day the Parapsychology

Committee meetings would convene. A show of hands accepted changing the meeting day from the first to the third Wednesday of each month. Parapsychology meeting dates are April 17 and May 15. It is open to all.

J.L. Palermo, editor of the Enigma, apologized for the no show of the publication over the last two months. Palermo's word processor (PAL) was in need of repair. The problem has been taken care of and the Enigma should be arriving to you in a more timely manner.

Palermo next reported that there seems to be a high level of UFO, and possible alien activity, in the Collinsville area currently. In the last two weeks,

Palermo has discovered two people that reported some very startling experiences. One woman made mention of a time she and some friends were out driving when she was confronted by a presence. Possibly already known by her, she asked, "You're not going to do this right here in front of everybody, are you?" The answer was, "Yes. Nobody here will see us." When these times occurred (there have been several) she felt that blood was being drawn from her arm. The other experience was told to Palermo over a lunch with a friend. The only thing he can share at this time is that the woman said she was startled awake one night by a presence in her room. She opened her eyes to the face of a creature in very close observance of her

face. (She has since identified the appearance of the creature as that of the being illustrated by Rosemary Osnato from the book, "Intruders" by Budd Hopkins.) She screamed and a moment later her husband came into the room, turning the lights on and asking what was going on. She told him she saw something standing at her bedside staring at her. Of course, the thing was gone as he arrived on the scene.

After the break for refreshments, a discussion in the round ensued that brought out some very interesting comments. In brief, items discussed were as follows:

*Reported on by both J.L. Palermo and Ken Hanke, we learned about Bob Lazar, a young scientist in propulsion physics who was requested to work at a facility at Groom Lake, Nevada. Once there, his work was back engineering on several types of UFO/IACs concerning their mode of propulsion. Though given strict orders of secrecy, the stunning reality caused him to talk with a friend about it. With some effort, they managed to video tape some evening test flights of a UFO/IAC. Receiving death threats from his superiors at the Groom Lake facility, Lazar went public with assistance from a local news station. A five or six part series resulted from this breaking news and is titled "Best Evidence." Some of the Missouri MUFON officials have gained a copy of this series of news reports.

*Element 115, a power source spoken of in the above mentioned series, "Best Evidence," was then discussed. An apparent power crystal, it is used in certain UFO/IACs to create gravity. It is reported to be a small, dense, triangular item which when placed in a particular type of interactive container creates an enormous gravity effect for propulsion use. Reported experiments resulted in time distortion, the slowing down of light and even causing a flickering candle flame to become motionless and "frozen" in time. While the candle was in the gravity field

J.L. Palermo briefed the audience on the Saint Charles UFO Research Committee meeting from February. The 1991 Show Me UFO/IAC Conference was mentioned as well as the pulling together of guest speakers and the need for volunteers to assist on Committees. This years Committee for Publicity is led by Co-Chairpersons Alex Horvat and Sheryl Jacobs. Also the start of a college level UFO course, as an elective course, was discussed. Alex Horvat is working on a variation of a similar class now in progress in the eastern United States. The class would be 14 weeks of two hour class time taking students from early UFOlogy up to the most recently documented reports concerning abductions. Guest speakers and past conference videos are planned as learning tools for the course.

Wade Havlat, an Illinois MUFON member and regular attendee of the Collinsville UFO Group (those of you who haven't yet attended are missing out on some great meetings. - Editor), mentioned that he is a short wave radio listener and will be passing on hot UFO news items to Palermo for the Enigma. (See "The Russian Report" in this edition. - Editor).

The afternoon program was filled in by pinch speaker Alex Horvat, Public Information Officer for Missouri MUFON. His talk revolved around the "TAU CETI CONNECTION" case (see last issue of Enigma. - Editor). To avoid the chance of redundancy, Horvat made the point of speaking of aspects of the case that weren't covered in the article written and published by Forest Crawford, Assistant State Director for Illinois MUFON. Horvat explained

created by the 115, it did not flicker, it did not consume either its waxed rope or the wax.

The topic shifted as Frank Brown commented on a talk show claiming that some people are paid by the government to say they were hypnotized and had it implanted in their mind to say that they have seen UFOs, or had implants, become pregnant, etc. The implication of course being that UFO abductions are simply hoaxes caused by the hypnosis.

Another topic was the possibility of efforts being made to attempt towards discrediting UFO

groups and organizations. Computer bulletin board networks are a prime example.

The last item brought up was that of Forest Crawford's attendance of a "by invitation only" conference held in January. Some topic material revolved around implant technology and some unusual abduction cases. (For more information on this conference, refer to "The Philadelphia Story" in this issue - Editor)

The March 10th UFO Study Group Meeting began with a request from the Group's treasurer, Spencer Wolling, for members who had not

yet sent in their \$8.00 membership dues for 1991 please do so. Those who haven't paid will have to be taken off the mailing list of The Enigma. (I know it's easy to take \$8.00 for granted folks, but it really is needed to help defray the cost of this publication. - Editor)

Next came a recap from Walter Palmer, Chairman of the Parapsychology Committee. Last meeting they watched segments from the television series, "Unsolved Mysteries," that re-enacted hauntings on the good ship Queen Mary. Also,

one of the most unusual items in the case, that being the existence of what was referred to as "tunnels" which, though actually underground, did not carry the journey physically through to the other end thousands of miles away (ie; from California to North Dakota to Washington D.C.). These "tunnels" are structured around some kind of time/space window allegedly learned about from alien technology and utilized for top security clearance assignments needing such travel mode.

Horvat then went on to make a comparison of an episode from "Star Trek: The Next Generation," whereby the occupants of a planet captured the "alien" Commander Ryker. The discovery of this "alien" caused them great distress because they thought themselves the center of the universe. Horvat tossed out the notion that perhaps our leaders are working to cope with this fact from their encounters with aliens while keeping it from the public. He also commented that one of the series writers, Tracey Torme (Mel Torme's daughter), had a strong background in ufology.

Expounding on the idea of vast underground tunnel travel, Wade Havlat mentioned the fact that a deep tunnel system project has been going on in Chicago for ten years. German and Japanese engineers who have observed the system have marveled at its complexity. The question was raised if this tunnel could have any remote connection to the tunnels mentioned in the Tau Ceti Connection.

An audience member said that she had heard a Paul Harvey radio program that was referring to a large sighting of a UFO. When she listened to other news programs later in the day and evening, she heard nothing about it. After making some

phone calls, she was told that a bill had just been passed that forbade such reports from being news items.

"THE RUSSIAN REPORT"

Skies over Uzbekistan are teeming with flying saucers. Locals, who are said to have grown used to the space invasion suspect the aliens are after their gold.

Ufologist's, however, are serious about the sightings, discarding quips that humanoids are attracted by the region's vast gold deposits.

In the latest twist to the space mystery, newspapers Vecherny Tashkent and Molodezh Uzbekistana reported a visit by alien robots to the town of Daugyztan in central Kyzyl Kum.

Three local teenagers spotted what they described as "truncated pyramids, covered with metal scales." The creatures were topped with two metal sprouts, resembling antennas. They had on their sides what looked like wings, covered with scales or plates. They moved in jumps, soaring up to one and a half meters and coming down after hovering 4 - 5 meters, the boys said.

Spotting the newcomers the children got scared and pelted them with stones. The stones stopped short of their target as if striking an invisible obstacle.

One of the creatures rushed to the youngest boy and tried to get hold of him. The screaming

children ran into the house of a drilling foreman who later discovered 20 centimeter wide and five centimeter deep round imprints on the sand. The distance between the imprints was about five meters.

The story could be the result of the boys' rich imagination, but UFO experts inspecting the site detected powerful magnetic fields in a place pointed out by the children.

Local newspapers are now writing about a "parade of unidentified flying objects" over central Kyzyl Kum desert.

The Soviet Astra Centre, which researches UFOs, has set up a branch in Zarafshan to study anomalies.

Dear Editor:

In the February 27th edition of the RiverFront Times reported on a meeting of the Society of Professional Journalists at which time three local news directors discussed their duties while KMOX's Anne Keefe acted as moderator. The question of the meeting was "In a ratings driven business, can local news tell the truth without alienating its' audience"?

The concensus was in the form of the comment "We're trying hard, but NO". KPLR Channel 11's Shane Moreland and KTVI Channel 2's Bill Berra indicated that their newscasts are balanced but at times less than equally between the news that needs to be seen and news that will attract viewers.

Keefe warned, "Don't trust the American public". Another concensus as the panel nodded their heads. Though the public may demand hard news, marketing studies show the public tunes out when tough questions are presented. Keefe said "If you're probing the truth that alienates the public you can lose your shirt".

Perhaps it would be better stated that if you probe the truth about any subject that tampers with those in or associated with the power elite you will draw heavy flak. A handful of multimillionaires can buy a lot more influence than a couple of hundred protestors holding up signs or writing nasty letters to their congressmen.

Compounding the

reporting problem is the way ratings are monitored for television. St. Louis, as well as other markets, is a "metered" market meaning that ratings are monitored and reported on a DAILY basis. "I hate meters. They can often force you into knee jerk decisions," stated Berra. One day you're a media hero, the next week you're a media goat and you get cancelled or fired.

Fortunately, some television news people are willing to put forth the questions that are challenging. News Director George Klass of KLAS-TV in Las Vegas, Nevada produced the nine part documentary "UFO's Best Evidence" which ran consecutively in December of 1989 (not to mention the three or four part news report from CNN back in the early 80s with Chuck Cairo concerning the Bentwaters Case - Editor). It's rare that a television station will take the personal risk of producing such a series and place it in a prime time slot as Klass did. Just in case someone from local media outlets
