

MORE BLACK TRIANGLES AT LUCKY POINT

June 8th was an unusual day in southern Indiana. I'm not superstitious. They say that Apollo 13 had problems on the 13th day and the 13th hour. I can't explain that. But 13 years ago on June 8th we had one of the worst storms I've ever seen. And near noon, mind you, it was too dark to see a tornado if one had been lurking over Posey and Vanderburgh counties. On the same date, 13 years later, on June 8th, 1995, we had another very bad storm. Trees were down everywhere. Forty thousand people were without power, some for almost a week.

Just minutes after that devastating storm, about 9:30 PM, and just 50 miles to the north of us, there were sightings of black triangles at Lucky Point. There probably was no connection, but the circumstances made this an unusual day to say the least. Two witnesses observed an object, small top-shape, flat on top, rounded edges and pointed bottom. It was a white light form only that approached from the SSE. When a small airplane came over the ridge to the west the object streaked east on a flat trajectory at supersonic speed until lost from sight. There were two witnesses.

Right after that the black triangles returned to Lucky Point. First observed in the ESE, the object was wedge-shaped, black, with the base of the triangle inverted or on top. Around the outside were smaller black triangles. The large object had inset lights on each corner. There was a white light on its left, a red light on its right, and a blue light on the bottom. The objects were seen against the lightning storm to the south, moving at a leisurely speed on a parabolic flight path with a flat

turn. They disappeared as they travelled ESE again. The lights on the main object did not blink, but pulsed at a one second interval. No sound was ever heard during any of these visual sightings. Cases under investigation by UPRO at Vincennes, IN, FI Jerry Sievers.

ABDUCTEES OR EXPERIENCERS?

Many would argue that they were abducted, raped and abused by alien beings, not simply contacted by them. A GREAT LOSS FOR UFOLOGY

One of my greatest joys is communicating by phone with serious UFO researchers. I am temporarily unemployed (have been for two years) and use to spend a lot of time with potential investors. Now it is mostly communications with current investors on the three projects I helped to get funded. That is strictly business. The UFO subject is quite another thing. If it's UFOs and you are serious about the research, I love to talk about it. My wife and I, and the youngest children (14 & 19) just got back from a trip and six days at FAN FAIR in Nashville, TN. When we returned I was saddened by the news of a fellow researcher who had suddenly passed away on June 3rd.

There are several people who I would say I like to spend hours on the phone with. Don't get me wrong if you just call with brief information or requests. I appreciate how we expeditiously handle the UFO matter as quickly as needed. Time is something we don't have enough of. And, since I have no real income these days, I cannot return many long-distance calls.

Anyway, as you know, we had lost Leonard Stringfield last December. I thought that was bad enough. But to hear that Pat Packard had passed away was a total shock. I didn't know he had even been ill! He had been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer just two weeks before he died!

What can I tell you about someone who I barely knew, except what we always talked about? I didn't know how old he was, somewhere in his 40's, I'm told. He was married, with one child. I have no idea what he looked like. We never met. We talked about some get-togethers in the future, but they never materialized. They will have to wait until the "Ultimate Encounter".

What I can tell you (and that's one of the frightening aspects of his sudden death) is that Pat Packard was a walking encyclopedia on the Roswell case. He could have been a "strategy coach" for Kevin Randle, Don Schmitt, Stanton Friedman, etc. He knew the subject so well. The one thing I remember the most, besides his uncanny memory, was his urgent quest to get world-wide attention on the Roswell case. He and I put out a plea and a press release to all the readers and every MUFON State

Director in the United States early in 1994. We were dismayed by the seeming lack of interest or priority of many persons in the UFO field who tried to imply that Roswell "was just another UFO case".

Because of Pat and his associates in Ohio, and a few others, the Roswell case was given a fair hearing. We have a long way to go. And it's a shame that Pat and Leonard aren't around to see what happens. One thing for sure, I will sorely miss the phone calls and the little "post-its" that stated that Pat had called. I always knew that what he had to say was well worth the time and effort. I cannot believe he is no longer with us.

I just learned that Pat was born in 1948. He was just 47, five years younger than myself. For those who weren't aware, he was from Hamilton, Ohio, and was the Assistant State Director for Southwestern Ohio, State Section Director, and Field Investigator.

Bill Jones, Ohio State Director, had this to say in memory of Pat. "Pat was probably the hardest working MUFON member in Ohio. He organized a fine group in the Cincinnati area, produced a periodic public television show that was viewed around the state, and truly became an expert on the Roswell case. He will be missed by me and the rest of those he worked with to help increase the human race's knowledge of the UFO phenomenon. The discipline of UFology is less because of Pat's passing."

A COSTLY DIVERSION?

One of the last things Pat & I talked about was the purported 1947 Roswell film in the possession of a company in London, Merlin Productions, owned by Mr. Ray Santilli. Rather than waste any more space than necessary on these films (the reason for these frauds and diversions are probably to waste our time and resources anyway) I will suggest you read the article in the MUFON UFO Journal (June 1995, page 7-10).

The film is a fraud. If the media picks it up in the United States and plays it up very big, then finds out the truth, the entire Roswell event may suffer. Too much has gone into the Roswell incident investigation to allow it to be dragged down by those who want it out of the public eye. I'm not saying that Mr. Santilli or anyone else is the perpetrator or that the timing of the release of the fraudulent footage is known to be planned to kill Roswell. It may well be, but the effects will be the same. The truth about the films needs to be put on a press release, possibly spearheaded by the Fund for UFO Research, and disseminated to the media and all responsible and respectable UFologists as soon as possible. Then the media and the people will know that we were not gullible as many think we are.

ALIENS CAN BE "HUMAN"

A perfectly round, 30' deep, 20 foot in diameter hole had been discovered near Jefferson City, MO, within walking distance of an abductee's home. Scientists from nearby Rolla, MO, had even investigated it.

The key to its formation comes from a session with the nearby abductee. She had been recalling her abduction under hypnosis, remembering being led to the craft by an alien on each side of her. Suddenly they let go of her and returned quickly to the craft. She bursts out laughing because she sees their ship sinking into the ground. Apparently it had set down on top of a Missouri sinkhole; the weakened earth gave away, the craft sank out of sight.

DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE - Francis L. Ridge

TO BE OR NOT TO BE? - I never tell anyone that I am a "UFO investigator". If it is necessary, or the subject comes up, I tell them that I am a field investigator for the Mutual UFO Network and the Center for UFO Studies. I want to know more about UFOs and why they are here. That's why I am involved. I don't just want to read about the subject. I want to talk with other researchers and compare notes. I want to talk with actual witnesses. I want to go where UFOs have been seen and reported. There are times when I feel that someday I could eliminate 95% of the work and "retire", just reading what others are doing. I don't think that will ever happen. As long as I'm able, I plan on digging deeper, comparing notes with others, doing whatever research seems to be appropriate with my skills. Something will have to give, however, because my time may become more limited, either with job or family, or both. In that case, my leadership in the State of Indiana may have to be transferred to someone else. The same goes for processing reports from FI's all over the state. It's always had its good points and bad points. It would be a difficult choice. How would I be able to collect the intelligence information without being the Investigation Coordinator or State Director? I've given it a lot of thought. I don't have the answer as yet. Maybe the answer comes under the heading "To File Or Not To File".

TO INVESTIGATE OR NOT INVESTIGATE? - But before we get to filing, let's consider the investigation priorities. Dr. Hynek had the answer many years ago and it was dictated by a budget of time and finances. He suggested we concentrate on close encounters, spending less time on distant ones. We spend too much time on nocturnal lights. These could be important cases in conjunction with other sightings, especially close encounters, but it seldom works out that way. I know. After cataloging and studying over 4,000 cases in six states, only a few distant encounters amount to anything. It's the close encounters and other special evidence cases (such as the Mongo, IN, photo case) that really provide us anything worthwhile. So, what do we do? The problem is in the processing, documentation, and copying stage. With all the paper work going into this thing and usually nothing coming out (except in cases where photos or videos are taken, etc.), we could really improve the operation on the HQ level. On the field level we simply cannot eliminate the investigation on distant encounters. We can't afford to pass up potential evidence, nor need we reduce the time being expended. This is an integral part of the training program. The on-the-job training deals mostly with investigation of IFOs anyway, 90% of the sightings! And most of the actual UFO reports are of the distant variety. Where can cut time and finances without hurting the overall program?

TO FILE OR NOT TO FILE? - Maybe it is better stated as "What To File?" In any case I think I have the answer for the problems that Indiana is having. At present we have about 40 cases that are listed as "Under Investigation", most of which are completed except for processing. The ones which, no matter how much time is expended or how thick the final submitted report will be, remain as limited merit cases and should simply be marked on the computer here as concluded, and filed away. This will clear up a backlog of cases that has been bugging me for a long time. The question is, should copies of the reports be sent to the MUFON Central Regional Director for processing? And since we send duplicates to CUFOS, is it really worth the effort? I think not. I personally think that these cases should be reported in a narrative caselog form only and retained on the local level only. Those persons that have seen Indiana submittals in the past know what we are capable of doing and consistently do on each and every case report. It would be a disappointment to those that have been the recipient of our earlier efforts to view such scant reports,

comprised of a Form 1 and series of checklists only, and little evidence worth inputting into the MUFON database. And that's another story. Should all UFO reports submitted by FIs all over the world be inputted in the MUFON database? There needs to be some entry level criteria.

As for Indiana, if I was a field investigator staring at a report on my desk, I would ask myself, "Is this as complete as I can make it based on my checklists?". If so, I would then submit that report ASAP. Being a somewhat inexperienced trainee, I would then expect the State Director to respond with some requests for additional materials or information I may have overlooked. I would consider the report as potentially important scientific information and good training experience.

I will consider these reports as concluded and completed, enter them on the local database as such and file them away. If MUFON or CUFOS wants copies of them, I will provide them. In the meantime, hours of processing, reams of copying, and ridiculous shipping costs will be eliminated or at least reduced. Most of all, the embarrassment of submitting scanty, limited merit cases will also be alleviated.

FROM THE TRAINING OFFICER - JERRY SIEVERS

We have several new members in the training program who have not responded to their first letter. This is not due to negligence, it is simply that they haven't had time. As soon as they do that, however, we will announce these new personnel.

As a reminder to others in the program, if you are an FIT (Field Investigator Trainees) you must send me a self-addressed stamped envelope for further training materials. After you go over that material and digest it, you need to send another SASE. The mailings cease when the SASEs stop coming. Anyone who has a Manual, and has studied it and the other materials, can request a copy of the FI Exam.

The new FI Manual is available for those who do not have one, or those who have the old one and want the updated one. It is nearly a complete revision, with an entirely new format, compared to the third edition which had been accepted as the standard manual in the English-speaking nations. It is composed of 24 sections. The 311-page manual is being delivered in a 3-ring loose leaf hardback binder. The price for MUFON members is \$25 plus \$3.50 for postage and handling.

Remember, if you sent money for the Manual earlier, send a note and only the difference you owe. Make checks payable to MUFON, but send them to the State Director at the address on page one. We will note on your "201 File" that you have ordered it.

Close encounters?

Residents believe White Water Valley explored by UFOs, aliens

It was 7:30 p.m. on a bitter December day in 1978 when Pamara Johnson and her family left their Richmond home for a visit with an aunt in Brownsville.

As the car cruised down Abing-

ton Pike, Johnson and four others listened to the radio and admired winter's fury in rural Indiana. On one side of the road, large cornfields resembled seas of snow. On the other, trees were coated in a glaze of ice.

Then suddenly, the music on the radio turned to static. Johnson

worked the knobs, but the radio was dead.

The car soon approached a curve just south of Abington when Johnson, who had returned to staring out the window, noticed a lighted quadrangle-shaped object hovering above the treetops.

"Keep on driving," Johnson yelled to her mother. But the car sputtered and died.

Sitting on the empty road, the

peaceful drive turned to panic as the object landed in a nearby field. Johnson vividly recalls the screaming inside the car. Then she blacked out.

What happened over the next four hours remains a mystery, although Johnson — through dreams — believes 4-foot-tall gray aliens poked and examined her body with needles and other instruments.

science rules out the possibility that many of these often sensational cases are occurring.

With UFO sightings, for example, unrecognizable stars and planets are frequently mistaken for alien saucers, Hively said.

He said a planet or star close enough to the Earth's atmosphere can appear to change colors. Add a thin layer of clouds and a light breeze, and those objects seem to move.

As for ships that supposedly move in different directions before bolting off in a flash, Hively dismisses those sightings as rare bursts of lightning known to create images that seem to dance in a night sky.

"Most people don't know enough about astronomy to know it's natural," he said. "No one would be more excited than I if this turned out to be true. I think people may have convinced themselves there's something there.

"But one shouldn't be too quick to believe (the existence of aliens) without physical evidence. The general position of most of the scientific community is that this is improbable."

During the 20 years Sheriff Burton Cole has served with the Wayne County Sheriff's Office, he's fielded a handful of calls from residents claiming to have seen something bizarre floating in the sky. While many sightings were confirmed by airports as airplanes passing through the area, other observations never were identified.

"I think with most of the calls, there's probably a reasonable explanation for them," Cole said. "I can't say it's impossible there's life on another planet somewhere, but I haven't seen it."

Johnson, who believes she has been abducted at least five times since 1978 and rarely discusses her experiences, wants answers.

"You feel like a guinea pig," she said. "I don't believe they (the aliens) are evil. They just want to find out what we're all about."

doubt the existence of UFOs and extraterrestrials.

Traci Baker, 22, said she's never seen anything out of the ordinary during the two decades she's lived in Richmond.

"Those are things that just don't happen," Baker said. "(Johnson) probably belongs in the state (mental) hospital somewhere."

Richmond resident Erna Jacob doesn't doubt tales of UFOs or aliens but would like proof before saying whether she believes in other life forms.

"It's kind of hard to believe unless you see it," she said.

But Don Worley, a Connersville native who's considered one of Indiana's authorities on UFOs and alien abductions, says Johnson's experience is just one of a number of similar incidents that have occurred in the area.

In the 30 years he has studied the phenomenon, Worley said he has chased countless spaceship sightings and tracked some 15 abductions in the Whitewater Valley.

He began working with Johnson last summer after she said she saw a UFO while playing with her children at Fairview Elementary School near her Boyer Street home. Worley, who believes Johnson has had contact with space beings, supplies her with information on the aliens and their patterns.

Worley, 73, said he had hoped to leave the alien business years ago, but his interest in the subject renews whenever he learns of another incident.

"They're not crazy," said Worley, whose only income for his work with abductees comes from occasional articles he writes for UFO magazines. "With the total amount (of cases) through the years,

there's no doubt it's possible that they're here. I've had some stories I thought were on the edge, but you recognize the legitimate ones pretty fast."

Compared with areas in southern and northern Indiana, the five-county Whitewater Valley isn't considered a hot spot for alien activity, UFO trackers said. But more sightings unexplainably occur in the region than in many sections of the state.

Yet, after years of gathering information, chasing leads and talking with numerous abductees, no one from state to international investigators seems to understand why the presence of other life forms continues to be reported around the world.

Researchers have offered several possibilities, though.

Cataclysmic events

Worley, for instance, wonders whether aliens are here to help humans prepare for future disasters. Many of the abductees he has talked with say they receive telepathic messages from other beings describing cataclysmic events that will occur between 1995 and 2000, beginning with tidal waves and earthquakes in California and Japan.

Some say aliens are studying humans so they can create another life form. Still others feel extraterrestrials are simply curious and want to learn about Earth.

Evidence lacking

However, lack of physical evidence has left many scientists skeptical as to whether foreign creatures have made their way to our part of the galaxy. And some, such as Earlham College physics and astronomy professor Ray Hively, say

UFO network

Some Midwest alien enthusiasts believe in the phenomenon so much that they created the Mutual UFO Network in 1969. The group gathers data on sightings and tries to ease citizens' concerns by helping them understand their encounters.

Over the last few years, MUFON, headquartered in Seguin, Texas, has been so overwhelmed by reports that its 36 Indiana investigators now only handle encounters occurring within 500 feet of humans.

"We're backlogged right now," Indiana MUFON director Francis Ridge said. "The more bizarre they get, the more time-consuming they get. Some cases are several years old."

For decades, believers in the phenomenon have contended that the science community and the government have conspired to keep the existence of aliens secret.

In 1962, an employee with Avco Manufacturing in Richmond was snooping around the plant one night when he spotted three lifeless, unusually proportioned midgets lying on tables in a section of the building leased to a unknown agency, Worley said. As he started back to the Avco side of the building, someone zapped him on the neck with a square hand-held box.

The man awoke several hours later in an office at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton, Ohio, where he claimed he was tortured by government officials and ordered not to discuss what he had seen, Worley said.

It wasn't until the early 1980s, after the man had developed cancer on the area of his neck where had been shocked, that he broke his silence. He died a short time later.

While Wright-Patterson officials say there "never has been and never will be" any truth to rumors that the base once housed a UFO and that abductees were threatened to keep quiet about their experiences, some say the government is still keeping tight-lipped about the existence of extraterrestrials.

A Wright-Patterson spokesman said the Air Force has made information gathered from its Project Blue Book study available to the public. The 22-year investigation into UFOs, which recorded more than 12,000 sightings throughout the U.S., ended in 1969 when the military's top brass decided UFOs weren't a threat to national security.
