

HIS "VISIT" HERE WAS UNFORGETTABLE:

Last April 23, 1965, GEORGE ADAMSKI, 74, (born April 17, 1891), one of the foremost pioneers in Flying Saucer research, left this earthly life. Mr. Adamski was well known to most students and investigators of the Flying Saucer subject. He had made a name for himself around the world as a lecturer and teacher about space craft, people from other planets, and Cosmic Philosophy.

For several years prior to his historic meeting with a space ship in the California desert, Mr. Adamski had observed and photographed space ships through his telescope --- from his home at Mt. Palomar, in California.


He first made news, however, after his experience on Nov. 20, 1952, near Desert Center, Calif. At that time he met a Venusian Scout Ship and its pilot. From that time on, his life was completely changed. With subsequent contacts and with increasing new knowledge, he felt that his responsibility was to reach the public with as much information as he could give them about the Space People and their mission to Earth.

He became world-famous as the author of several of the most-read books in the Flying Saucer field, plus many articles.

It was while Mr. Adamski was lecturing in the east that he contracted pneumonia. He died in a Washington, D. C. hospital. In accordance with his wishes, there was no funeral. As a veteran of World War I, his ashes were interred at Arlington National Cemetery, in Virginia.

Although he was a man of simple and humble origin, George Adamski became great in quiet, dignified service to his fellow man. He taught what he loved and knew best, giving generously of his time and energies to all who would listen. For he had learned that the Universe and all that it encompasses is an infinitely wonderful place, and that we are not alone in it.

He knew that the world was undergoing great change, and that the minds of men must expand to unprecedented new horizons in order to cope with world problems and to be receptive to their solutions --- in order to accept and to understand some of the "mysteries" of life and of the Universe, and our place in it.

THE PAUL VILLA SAUCER PHOTOS

Most of the saucer photos we have seen previously have been of inferior quality, mainly because the photographer had to grab a shot in a hurry while he had the opportunity.

But Apolinar (Paul) A. Villa, Jr., 49, (born Sept. 24, 1916), a mechanic of 601 Niagara, N.E.; Albuquerque, New Mexico, holds a unique privilege in the annals of Flying Saucer research. He has had pre-

arranged meetings with Space People for the specific purpose of taking pictures of their craft.

Apparently, contacts of one kind or another with the Space People are not new to Mr. Villa. He says that he has been taught telepathically by extraterrestrial intelligences since he was 5 years old.

Although he did not complete the 10th grade of school, he seems to have a good knowledge of such subjects as mathematics, electricity, physics, and mechanics, and has an unusual "gift" for detecting defects in engines, generators, etc.

Villa says that prior to photographing his first series of saucers in 1963, he had seen about five Flying Saucers in the previous five years, and that he had talked with a spaceman previously. He said that his first picture-taking contact was his second in-person meeting with extraterrestrial beings.

The first was in 1953 while he was working for the Department of Water and Power in Los Angeles. While on the job one day in Long Beach, he had a strong urge to go down to the beach, a feeling he did not then understand. There he met a man about 7 feet tall. At first Villa was afraid and wanted to run away. But the man called him by name, and told him many personal things about himself. Villa realized that he was communicating with a very superior intelligence, and he then became aware that this being was a spaceman. "He knew everything I had in my mind and told me many things that had taken place in my life," Villa says. "He then told me to look out beyond the reef. I saw a metallic-looking disc-shaped object that seemed to be floating on the water. Then the spaceman asked me if I would like to go aboard the craft and look around, and I went with him."

He said the saucer occupants were entirely humanoid in appearance, although better looking in general than Earth people, as they were definitely more refined in face and body. Also, they had an advanced knowledge of science, as evidenced by their craft, and by their talk with him.

They told Villa that the whole galaxy to which our Earth belongs is as a grain of sand on a huge beach, in relation to the unfathomable number of inhabited galaxies in the entire Universe. Because of their technological advancement, their spaceships can penetrate the Earth's radar detection system, so that they are picked up on our radar screens only when they choose to call attention to their presence in our skies. It seems that their craft are constantly active over our surface, and that they plan more

sightings and landings in order to increase public awareness of their existence. They said they were here on a friendly mission to help our people; that they have bases on our Moon; that Phobos, one of the two Moons of Mars, is hollow and is artificially constructed; and that there is a Superior Intelligence that governs the Universe and everything in it.

For his first series of pictures (shown in issue #20 of UFOI), Mr. Villa says that his space contacts told him, telepathically, to drive his pickup truck on June 16, (1963), to the meeting place, alone. There he saw a landed Flying Saucer which he estimated to be about 70 feet in diameter. There were 9 people aboard the ship: 4 men and 5 women. They disembarked through a hermetically sealed door. These beings, he says, ranged in height from 7 to 9 feet and were well proportioned. Some were blond; some were red-headed (like polished copper); and some had black hair. They told him they came from the galaxy of Coma Berenices, many light years distant. They were able to speak many languages, as well as to communicate telepathically.

Villa was told the craft operated as a mother ship for its 9 remotely-controlled monitoring disks which were 14" in diameter, and were controlled from instrument panels in the mother ship. They could pick up pictures and sounds from any area to which they were directed, and could then relay them to TV panels aboard the mother craft.

They permitted Villa to take photos of their ship which posed and hovered close to the surface between 2 and 4 P.M. while he took various shots of the craft framed by the trees in the foreground. He used a Japanese-made Rokuoh-Sha camera with an f4.6, 75mm lens loaded with 120 Kodacolor film. Two of the photos show the ship in a verticle position, on its side, to indicate that the Space People have created an artificial gravity within the craft, and thus are completely comfortable no matter what position the ship is in, relative to a planet's surface.

Incidentally, in photo #7 (see our saucer post cards), the vents in the hull, thought by some to be portholes, are not windows, but are openings directly concerned with the propulsion of the ship. Villa says they told him that the vents are opened only within a planets' atmosphere --- never in outer space.

Your editor was formerly a professional photographer and feels that these pictures are unusually good for several reasons: 1. They are quite sharp, compared to most saucer photos we have seen. 2. The image size of the saucer is large enough to show good detail without extreme graininess. 3. There is a series, instead of just one photo, which provides more details for evaluation. 4. Villa's truck is in the foreground of some of the photos, providing a known object with which to compare the size of the saucer and to judge its distance away. 5. The degree of sharpness of other objects in the near foreground and the clouds and trees in the distance, indicates that the object had to be very large in order to achieve the depth of field observed to exist in the photos, thereby ruling out the possibility that a small model may have been used to fake the photos.

Soon after the time these photos were released to us, there was a rash of saucer-sighting reports in the newspapers. They began on April 24, 1965, when Socorro, New Mexico policeman, Lonnie Zamora, saw a landed egg-shaped object take off from a gulley and speed away. Soon after this account, other sighting and landing reports came from several western states simultaneously. So much new interest was stimulated in the saucer subject, that we felt it appropriate to release Mr. Villa's photos to the wire services. Bob Flora, local United Press International photographer, was so impressed with the authentic look of the photos that he put three of them on the UPI wires. They were subsequently printed in hundreds of newspapers throughout the world. The Los Angeles NBC news program also ran the pictures on their color TV newscast for three nights in a row.

As for his second set of pictures (see pages 8 and 9, this issue), Villa was guided, telepathically again, to another area near Bernalillo, New Mexico --- about 15 miles north of Albuquerque. This was on Easter Sunday, April 18, 1965.

The ship seen in photos #1, 2, and 3, projected a ray which caused a small brush fire. The smoke from the fire is visible (more clearly in color) in the trees just below the craft, and just above and to the left of the tailgate of Villa's truck.

In photo #3, they singled a tree-top --- extreme left of tree grouping --- by use of a ray directed from their ship. These things were done to demonstrate some of their capabilities.

The ship landed and Villa judged it to be 300 feet in diameter. It had telescopic, tripod landing gear, which are protruding from the bottom of the craft in photos #1, 2, and 3.

The three crewmen had light brown hair and tan skin. They appeared to be about 5'8" or 5'9" tall. Villa talked with them for nearly two hours about personal as well as general matters.

They told him that our astronauts, Edward White and James McDivitt, on their now-famous GT-4 flight, were really seeing a spaceship when they reported sighting the Pegasus-like object. They also said that our government won't release the Mariner-4 photos because they show pumping stations for the canal systems on Mars. They added that by 1966, 17 nations will have the Atomic Bomb.

Villa says they conversed both in Spanish (his native language) and in English.

On their advice, the contactee says, he stopped smoking so as to enhance his ability to receive telepathic communications.

Photos #4, 5, and 6 were taken later that same month about 9 miles west of Albuquerque, near the Volcano Mountains. Villa says the ship looked like a Navajo Indian Shield, and there was a clear cloud-formation of an Indian lying on his back. The head and the feather shape can be seen at left center of the clouds in photos #4 and 5. Also, many people have seen an Indian profile in the cloud at the extreme top left corner of these same photos (much clearer in color). Villa says he understood, apparently telepathically --- since the ship didn't land, that the Navajos are going to come into prominence in some manner.

Photo #4 looks like a sphere from this position and shows the three tripod landing gear on the bottom of the craft, which is actually saucer shaped, as can be seen from the profile view in photo #5. The clear color enlargement of photo #4 makes it one of the most impressive saucer photos we have seen to date.

Photo #5 was taken shortly after photo #4, and the Indian-shaped cloud is still visible, although just starting to break up. Like photo #5, the objects in the foreground seem to be blurred, apparently from camera movement due to a slow shutter speed.

Photo #6 was taken about 5 minutes later after the craft had left and returned again, and the cloud formation had changed considerably. It is interesting to note the blurred, double-exposure effect, created by the craft changing its angle relative to the camera during the short time the camera shutter was open.

Photos #7 and 8 were also taken in April, 1965, over a 2 1/2 hour period. The area was about 10 miles east of Albuquerque near the town of Sandia (just south of Bernalillo). The craft did not land. The only other information we have is that the Space People created a dust storm in photo #8, (not shown), indicating that they can control and create weather conditions.

Mr. Villa seeks no personal publicity for himself, and we feel that he is doing a great service to the public in releasing these pictures. We would like to give more details to our readers, but this is all the information we have at present.

We are told that more pictures are forthcoming, in time, as Villa has had more contacts and has taken other pictures. The photos will be released, he says, at the direction of the Space People. So, until that time, we offer what we consider to be excellent evidence of the reality of Flying Saucers --- in fact, the best photographic evidence we have yet seen.

Paul Villa's saucer photographs have made such an impression that opposing forces frequently try to discredit them. We are well aware that some people will be quick to say that they are fake. We have noted that the majority of these accusations come from people who do not believe in the first place that there are such things as extraterrestrial space craft. Therefore, from that viewpoint, any photograph of such an object would have to be "phoney." However, objective analysis by professional photographers (in addition to your editor) indicates differently. (The End)

Flying Saucer 'Proof' Offered

SANTA ANA—Rex Hefflin doesn't believe in flying saucers. Never has. But he has photographed a saucer-shaped flying object that has still to be identified.

Skeptics may say his pictures are products of trick photography, but Hefflin is prepared to submit to a lie-detector test to prove their authenticity.

Hefflin, 37, county highway department investigator, was working on Myford Road between the Santa Ana Freeway and Valencia when a circular, silver object caught his attention. He estimated it to be 30 feet in diameter and 8 feet thick.

It was visible about 15 seconds, he said.

It silently moved from west to east then accelerated "about the same speed as a jet" toward Saddleback.

The only sound heard was the helicopters at the Santa Ana Marine Corps Air Facility, said Hefflin.

A beam of white light rotated underneath the saucer, said Hefflin. (Under a magnifying glass, the beam is discernible in one of the photographs.)

Despite the mysterious object's proximity to the Marine base, radar operators failed to report any unidentified objects on Aug. 3, the day Hefflin saw the saucer.

Hefflin said he tried to communicate with his supervisor via two-way radio in his vehicle when the saucer was near, but his radio was inoperative.

'Saucers' Sighted Over 4-State Area

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla. (AP)—Authorities in portions of Texas, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Kansas were deluged Sunday night and early today by reports of unidentified flying objects (UFO).

The Sedwick County sheriff's office at Wichita, Kan., said the Weather Bureau tracked "several of them at altitudes of 6,000 to 9,000 feet."

The Oklahoma Highway Patrol said Tinker Air Force Base was tracking as many as four of the unidentified flying objects on its radar screen at one time, estimating their alti-

tude at about 22,000 feet. A Tinker spokesman refused to confirm or deny the radar observations.

Spokesmen at Tinker and McConnell Air Force bases are referring all queries to the Air

Force in Washington.

Saucer? --Experts Guessing

James Bond would feel right at home in Santa Ana today, in the opinion of Orange County highway investigator Rex Hefflin, whose file has changed drastically since he took three photographs Aug. 3.

They showed a "saucer" flying near El Toro Marine Base in daylight.

In the last two days he has had conferences with representatives of the Air Force's Project Blue Book team from Wright-Patterson AFB in Dayton, Ohio, whose assignment is to study sightings of UFO's (Unidentified Flying Objects).

Also Naval Intelligence, NORAD (North American Air Defense) and NICAP (National Investigating Commission on Aerial Phenomena).

Several others are yet to come.

"They call or arrive at all hours of the day or night," Hefflin said. "And a bunch of cranks do everything from threaten to blow up my home, to identifying themselves as the 'Flying Saucer People,' who don't like to be photographed."

Hefflin was most perturbed, however, over an Air Force interview yesterday. He said a captain arrived in his office about 4 p.m. and stayed until 7:45

p.m., discussing the sighting.

"He suggested kites, stretchers carried by helicopters, flying children's models and hallucinations," Hefflin said, "and before he arrived to talk with me the Air Force released a press statement."

It said Hefflin's pictures indicated that the unidentified flying object was only 3 feet in diameter — rather than the 30 feet that Hefflin claimed — and that it was only 15 feet off the ground — rather than 150 feet as described by the photographer.

The service admitted, however, that the cursory analysis was made from newspaper pictures, not the originals, and "it was impossible to be absolutely certain about size or distance."

Hefflin told The Herald Examiner a Marine Corps Intelligence officer returned his original pictures and told him other sky objects were seen in the area on five occasions, including a sighting by a civilian pilot Sept. 4.

"He said there was at least one other sighting on the day I took my pictures in this area," Hefflin reported.

Marine G-2 personnel were not available for comment.

Camera Catches 'Flying Saucer'

Yesterday Rex Hefflin, of Santa Ana, Cal., didn't believe in flying saucers. Today he says he has a photograph of one.

Mr. Hefflin, a highway department investigator, said he was working near the Santa Ana marine corps air facility when he saw the UFO (Unidentified Flying Object).

It remained visible for 15 seconds and he photographed it.

Mr. Hefflin estimated it was 30 feet in diameter and eight feet thick.

Meanwhile a new wave of UFO sightings has been reported in the western U.S. and Canada.

The Yorkton Enterprise reported a sighting by Mrs. J. J. Kuzma, of Norway, Saskatchewan, on Sept. 3.

Mrs. Kuzma, whose story was supported by neighbors, said she saw a silver-grey object with three layers, the bottom appearing like two saucers clamped together.

The middle section was smaller and, through binoculars, appeared to have a row of lighted portholes. The small upper section

was topped with a red flashing light. When the object moved, a green light flashed.

Mrs. Kuzma said that a hum similar to that produced by generators came from the object. The hum increased when it moved.

It spun "like a revolving dish," Mrs. Kuzma said, as it crossed the village three or four times.


It moved "about the same speed as a truck driving through town" and traveled at heights ranging from tree level to about the top of grain elevators.

The Canora, Sask., Courier carried an account of a bright orange light said to have descended through low cloud late at night to hover over the golf course.

Witnesses said it was disc-shaped, dark at the bottom but glowing orange in its domed top.

A similar sighting was reported near Chanterly Island in Lake Huron.

David Powell, an artist, of Paris, Ont., his brother Steve, 8, and two cousins, Carol Powell, 23, of Ingersoll, and Terry Hook, 13, said the UFO emitted a greenish glow "like a light-bulb" and was within view for 45 minutes.

Mystery Flying Object Also Sighted at Paine

3 Photos Air Saucer Mystery Stirs Row

Controversy continued today over pictures of a "flying saucer" reported taken near El Toro Marine Base by Rex Hefflin, Orange County Highway Department investigator.

Hefflin told The Herald-Examiner he had received a call from a man identifying himself as a colonel with NORAD (North American Air Defense), asking him to refrain from comment at present.

The highway investigator said he intended to check the validity of the call later today.

Hefflin, 37, Monday released three photos of a "silver object" he spotted at 11:30 a.m. Aug. 3 while working in an area between the El Toro Base and the nearby Marine Corps Air Facility.

Neither air station reported any unidentified objects on the radar that day.

He told investigators he "glimpsed the silver object and estimated it to be 30 feet in diameter and about eight feet thick."

"NO SOUND"

Hefflin said it was visible for about 15 seconds and moved from west to east, accelerating at about the same speed as a jet plane.

"It made no sound," he said, "but a beam of white light rotated underneath the saucer."

Authoritative sources confirmed his claim that "the light was visible in the last of the three pictures, using a magnifying glass." The "saucer" was slightly tipped in the third picture, revealing its underside.

The county employe said he carried the camera as part of his work. Photographers said it would have been possible to take the other pictures within 15 seconds with the camera Hefflin carries.

"RADIO DIED"

Hefflin, who says he "doesn't believe in flying saucers," said that during his sighting of the object he tried to contact his base station in Santa Ana.

He said: "The radio went dead twice while I was trying to contact the station, but it has worked ever since without trouble."

The incident occurred during a period when numerous sightings of UFO's (unidentified flying objects) were reported throughout the Midwestern and South-eastern sections of the country.

Hefflin said he is willing to take a lie detector test regarding the pictures.

He said the NORAD officer tentatively set up a meeting for tonight on Thursday night in Santa Ana.

Officials at the El Toro Base said they were copying the pictures for a full report to the 11th Naval District in San Diego. The report will eventually reach Washington.

ANOTHER FLYING SAUCER!

THE flying saucer craze gripped Argentina yesterday as sightings were reported from widely separated parts of the country, says an A.A.P.-Reuter message from Buenos Aires.

This followed sightings of white objects in the last weeks in places as widely separated as Portugal, Antarctica, Ecuador and Canberra.

A leading astronomer who examined pictures of a strange flying object taken by a professional photographer over Argentina said it was neither a known heavenly body nor a man-made satellite.

Newspapers published pictures taken by a Press

photographer in Bahia Blanca, about 275 miles south of Buenos Aires, of a bright object sighted on Wednesday.

Senior Enrique Ferraz, director of the Bahia Blanca Observatory, said the object was not a known planet, star, satellite or aircraft.

• A blinding light

The fact that such objects are usually sighted near the north and south poles may be linked to the Van Allen radiation belt that girds the earth.

Objects from space might approach the earth through the polar areas with a minimum of risk, he said.

The photographed object was sighted by several hundred people, who said it gave off a blinding light.

The commander of the Chilean Antarctic base took colour photographs of a white object and said: "No apparatus constructed by man to date is anything like this."

In the Azores, weather bureau electro-magnetic clocks stopped for 45 minutes while a "cylindrical white object" was overhead in the sky at 30,000 ft.

This week "The Sun-Herald" sent a reporter to Canberra to talk with men who saw "the thing" there.

His story is below:

CANBERRA, Saturday. — The arrival of "the thing" this week has plunged Canberra into a great flying-saucer mystery.

Everyone I spoke to here said they were certain that flying saucers don't exist, but they would sleep a little more easily at night if someone could prove what "the thing" was.

The brilliant ball of light that hung low on the horizon outside the city has everyone guessing — from housewives to the scientific staff of Mt. Stromlo Observatory.

Meteorological balloons, planets, reflections from a lake, sun shining on a small plane are only some of the theories that have been put to the test and blown out.


Science fiction dreams or not, the Canberra light is only one of a dozen "sightings" over the past few weeks in all parts of the world.

In some places electro-magnetic clocks have stopped and other instruments have gone "haywire" when the mysterious objects have been seen.

Call from U.S.

What makes Canberra's "flying saucer" so unusual is that the seven men who saw it are all trained experts—men who watch the sky for a living.

When they announced that they had no idea what the hovering light could be, Canberra Airport's switchboard was jammed by curious callers and a special

man had to be assigned to handle the inquiries.

"What was 'the thing'?" caller after caller wanted to know.

An American newspaper in Memphis, Tennessee, spent 12 minutes on the phone trying to fathom the mystery.

Air control officer Mr T. Lindsay told me he saw the light first when he was looking for a small plane north of Canberra Airport at about 10.50 a.m. on Thursday.

'Smaller than the moon'

As he pointed out of the control tower window, Mr Lindsay said: "I've been in this job for two and a half years and I've never seen anything like it before."

"My first impression was of a large yellow luminous balloon rather like the moon but much smaller."

"It wasn't Venus as has been suggested—I'm sure of that from the position. Mind you, I don't necessarily think it was a flying saucer."

He snapped his fingers dramatically and said: "After all that time—nearly 40 minutes—it was gone just like that."

"It was like something rolling over with one side

dark and one side light and then vanishing."

Another controller, Mr Tony Frodsham, picked up a pair of powerful binoculars and said: "With these we can spot a jet seven or eight miles up, but I couldn't pick out the shape of the light with them."

"In colour it looked like a metallic object glinting in the sun."

"But if it had been an aircraft flying away or towards us we could have picked out something like the undercarriage with our glasses."

"And no aeroplane would have stayed at that low altitude so long."

"The puzzling thing about the whole business is that bright light being stationary for so long."

In the control tower the officers have been joking about the "saucer" for two days.

"There it goes again" one called out to Tom Lindsay. "No, no—don't say it," he replied.

"I wish I had never seen it now."

Mr Frodsham said: "I was frightened last night that a little green man would come knocking

on my window and accuse me of turning him in to the newspapers."

The Officer in Charge of Civil Aviation in Canberra, Mr A. B. Lindeman, said: "I wish Mt. Stromlo would tell us it was a planet. I don't like something in the back of my mind I can't understand."

"I carry a colour camera with me normally but I left it at home that day — it would have been wonderful to have a photograph of the light."

"To me it looked like a circular light without any beam."

"It wasn't a pinpoint — you didn't need binoculars to see it."

"Someone said to me, 'What's that?' and I said, 'Blessed if I know.' I couldn't even identify it with the glasses."

"It disappeared just like that—zork."

"Steel Disc"

Mr Lindeman said the air control officers were looking at the sky every day and could judge distance and size of an object if they knew one of the factors. "It's a bit silly to talk about sizes in this case," he said.

"But whatever it was it was not a regular phenomenon. A bright planet is the only possibility."

At the R.A.A.F. base near the airport, a senior officer said: "You can't rule out the possibility of a fly-

ing saucer, but for God's sake don't use my name. I'd be a laughing stock."

Mr Paul Todd of the Meteorological Bureau, which is based inside the control tower, said: "To me the light looked like a steel disc revolving so that it caught the sunlight."

"Then when it lost the sunlight it would disappear completely."

"The only queer thing about it to me was that we were all looking into the sun as well."

Dr B. E. Westerlund of Mt. Stromlo Observatory said that if the light was coming from the north-east it would almost certainly be the planet Venus.

"We average about two 'mysterious light' calls a year which turn out to be Venus," he said at his home.

"But if the observers say it was due north and it was so bright, then Venus is doubtful."

MARTIANS OR MIRAGES?

BUENOS AIRES — A police corporal was reported yesterday as saying he and his whole family saw a flat, blue-coloured object hovering over the north-eastern Argentine province of Chaco.

It reportedly hung in the sky for several minutes on Friday night before shooting off southwestward with a trail of flames.

In Montevideo, a local news agency reported some 100 people

seeing a luminous flying object changing colour above a beach along the River Plate.

One eye-witness was quoted as saying it hovered for several minutes at midnight, revolving on its own axis before flying off at high speed.

The crew of an Ecuador air force plane say they are convinced they sighted a flying saucer last Thursday. — Reuter.

Other reports came in that a flying saucer had landed in a remote province and the army

was guarding it. The army quickly denied it.

The air force just as quickly denied that any unidentified flying objects were flying around over the country. But just in case, the high command emphasized that air base commanders have standing orders to intercept and force down any

UFOS in their area.

Residents of the Texcoco area, on the edge of Mexico City, swore they saw a saucer land on Lake Texcoco. The lake is a vast expanse of dry flatland most of the year, having dried up many years ago. During the current rainy season, there are several lake-sized pools in the low areas, and residents say the saucer sank in one of these.

Strange Object Seen in Sky

FRAMINGHAM, Mass. (UPI)

—About 20 residents in the Boston suburb of Wayland reported seeing a round, silver-white unidentified flying object last night, a Framingham radio station said.

Station WKOX said three separate groups of residents had called to say they had seen the round object moving through the sky and hovering over the community.

They said the object, traveling from South to North, appeared to pause and hover for about 20 minutes, then danced from side to side before setting off again toward the North.

It was the second sighting of an unidentified flying object in Massachusetts in two days.

Residents of the coastal town of Hingham, 20 miles from Wayland, said they watched a circular luminous object with four arms for nearly an hour Monday night as it hovered over the area. It finally drifted westward and disappeared.

Both objects described were similar to others reported in the Antarctic and in southwest Europe in recent weeks. At least five persons said they observed the Hingham phenomenon.

One unfortunate Mexico City reporter was assigned by his editor to spend the day on the wind-swept lake bed, which is lashed daily by small dust storms. He reported no sign of the submarine-saucer.

Another Mexico City resident says he held a long conversation on philosophical topics with an intellectual spaceman in his backyard. This spaceman too was a blue-eyed blonde.

Unlike the visitors from the third moon of Jupiter, this spaceman said there was no way his people could intervene in the affairs of earth. He described himself as a "something akin to a scientist, as you on earth use the term, but this is only a simplified description of my identity."

He said his people were from "another system" and had been in contact with earthlings for many centuries, hinting that the ancient Greek gods and stories of archangels and other supernatural phenomena were based on visits of his ancestors.

Despite all the opportunities, no one seems to have found out why Mexico is such a favorite landing spot for the saucer-travelers.

Maybe they like chile peppers and frijoles.

Saucer-Type Object 'Seen'

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — South African police and scientists investigated yesterday a report that a flying saucer-type object had landed on a main highway near Pretoria, the country's administrative capital.

Two patrolling police officers reported seeing the flaming "saucer," about 30 feet in diameter, shortly after midnight. One of them, Koo de Klerk, said the shiny copper-colored object resembled a giant spinning top.

The two men claimed that as they approached the object, it took off silently at great speed with flames shooting out of its underside.

Scientists who examined the spot where the officers said they saw the object are reported to have found a six-foot wide section of the tarred road had been badly burned. Grass on either side of the highway also was reported slightly scorched.

Telephoned reports of unidentified flying objects seen in the Seattle area Tuesday night continued coming to The Post-Intelligencer intermittently all day yesterday.



Other telephoned reports were similar.



Sky Objects Reported In Globe-Miami Area

GLOBE — Those Texas flying saucers apparently made a detour over Arizona Monday night, according to reports made to police agencies here.

The Arizona Highway Patrol's Miami office, sheriff's office, and Globe police said they received calls reporting two "red and white, long-tailed objects."

Deputy Sheriff Charles Roberts said a tourist reported the first sighting about 10 p.m. at 7-Mile Wash 25 miles northeast of Globe on U.S. 60. The second sighting, by two youths in Central Heights, followed a few minutes later. Central Heights is between Globe and Miami.

The distance between the two sightings is an estimated 30 miles.

One resident summed up the situation:

"The Air Force said there's no proof of these things coming from outer space.

"But Air Force officials did not say they didn't come from outer space."



"Flying saucer on Sydney beach"

Man's eerie story

A Sydney businessman claims he saw a green, glowing object last night on Vaucluse beach. (The Sun, Sydney, Australia) 7-20-65

He claims he watched it for about 10 minutes before it took off and vanished in clouds over Manly.

It was shaped like a disc, about 20ft across and 9ft high, he said.

Mr Denis Crowe, 44, of Coolong Road, Vaucluse, said he saw the object about 5.30 p.m.

"I had just come home and I went out to the letter-box to see if there was any mail," Mr Crowe said.

"It had just stopped raining, so I thought I'd go for a walk to get a breath of fresh air.

"I walked about 50 yards down Coolong Road when I saw a greenish glow coming from the beach.

"It had been pretty windy and I thought the glow must have come from the tarboard-light of a yacht aground on the beach.

"It was too dark to make it out properly, so I walked down to the beach.

Three legs

"About 50ft from the object I suddenly realised the glow was coming from a big disc sitting there.

"It was about 20ft across, and about 9ft high. "I was sitting right over where a little fresh water stream runs down to the beach.

"It looked as though it was sitting on three legs, but I may have been mistaken and the legs could have been shadows.

"The rim of the object was glowing a greenish-blue, while the top and bottom halves were a dullish silver-grey.

"There was no sign of movement, and no port-

holes or doors that I could see.

"As it took off a yellow or orange glow came from underneath.

"It gathered speed fairly rapidly and disappeared in the clouds.

"It wasn't a sudden disappearance—it just gradually became fainter.

Dogs barked

"I suppose I stood there for half a minute—I was rather dazed—before it took off.

"It didn't go straight up like a helicopter, but took a run of about 60 feet along the beach before gathering speed and rising toward Manly.

Mr Crowe said he could not see any other people about.

"One thing I did notice, though, was that all the dogs in houses near the beach started barking at the same time," he said.

"They all quietened down after the object took off.


"After it went I walked home—it had started raining again—and sat down to write out everything I saw.

"I was an aeronautical illustrator for English aviation magazines, so I think my drawing is pretty accurate.

Mr Crowe said he came to Australia six years ago after serving as a diplomat at the British High Commission in Delhi, India.

He was an Army captain before that.

Martians Watching Australia?

7-16-65

CANBERRA, Australia (AP) A mysterious glowing object—hovering near Canberra Airport while the U.S. Mariner space probe was taking pictures of Mars—has baffled experts in Canberra. Air traffic control officers and other expert aircraft observers said they spotted the object Thursday.

Six members of the traffic control tower crew said it hung suspended at about 5,000 feet for 40 minutes. When the sun glinted off it, it became clearly visible, they said. It disappeared when an air force plane was sent out to identify it.

EXPERTS ARE now wondering if it was coincidence that the object was sighted shortly before nearby Tidnibilla tracking station was scheduled to pick up Mariner signals. The station had unusual difficulty in locking on to Mariner at the time.

The sighting also came as Goldstone tracking station received irregularities in messages while Mariner was photographing Mars.

MR. CROWE said he watched the object in flight for 10 seconds before it disappeared in cloud over Manly.

Mr. Crowe at his home in Coolong Road, Vaucluse, told a Daily Telegraph reporter last night:

"It took off with a noise like air forcibly released from a balloon.

"The noise was quite unlike any made by jet engines."

Mr. Crowe said that the object a giant disc, was bathed in a glow.

He saw no sign of movement within the craft or any portholes or doors.

He said he became aware about 5.30 p.m. on Monday of a glow coming from the beach.

He went to investigate and saw that the glow emanated from a huge disc resting on the beach.

Near disc at take-off

He was within 50 or 60 feet of the disc when it took off.

"Its diameter appeared to be about 20 feet," he said.

"I estimate its height at nine feet, including what appeared to be legs protruding from the bottom.

"Its rim was glowing a greenish blue, while the top and bottom halves were dullish silver-grey.

"A hollow in the top could have been a glass dome."

Mr. Crowe said that as the object took off, a yellow or orange glow appeared beneath.


After a take-off run of only 50 or 60 feet, the craft climbed rapidly in the direction of Manly.

"I looked around hoping to see someone else who saw what I saw but

my only company was about a dozen or so dogs," Mr. Crowe said.

"While the object was stationary, they were all barking loudly at it.

"After it took off, they were all strangely silent."

Mr. Crowe said that when he returned home he sat down to collect his thoughts.

He had dinner, then wrote down what was still vividly in his memory, and sketched the object as he recalled it.

The sketch is reproduced above.

[Mr. Crowe, an Englishman who has been in Australia for more than four years, was formerly a technical and illustrative artist with British aircraft companies.]

"At first I wondered whether I should say anything about what I had seen," he said.

"The natural reaction of most people might label me a crackpot.

"But I could not keep silent.

"I felt I had a moral obligation to speak of what I had seen."

Man Sights

Object in Sky

A Rochester man last night reported seeing an unidentified flying object that was reported seen earlier by about 20 persons in a suburb of Boston, Mass.

Nicholas Abraham of 141 Grand Ave. said he was driving toward the city on Spencerport Road near Howard Road when, at 10:25, his wife called his attention to "a circular-shaped object that turned from glowing white to a bluish haze and back again."

"It was going at a terrific speed about 45 degrees above the southern horizon, headed in the direction we were and certainly moving too fast to be a satellite or an airplane," Abraham said.

According to Abraham, the object was visible about 35 seconds.

Abraham said he has seen Echo and airplanes at night in the sky, "but this is neither."

Radar Tracks Zipping Objects Near Air Base

8-2-65

OKLAHOMA CITY (UPI)—Air Force radar tracked four unidentified flying objects zipping along in a diamond formation at high altitude in a 50-mile radius of the sprawling Tinker Air Force Base Sunday night, authorities said.

At least eight law enforcement officers spotted the objects during the two hours immediately after the first sighting report which came just before sundown.

The sightings followed by less than 48 hours a Wynnewood, Okla., policeman's report of a UFO that emitted red, white and blue light near Wynnewood. The object was tracked on two radar screens early Saturday before it disappeared and then reappeared about 29 miles south of Tinker Base, officers said.

Wynnewood is about 29 miles south of Purcell, where the UFO's first were sighted Sunday night.

The Oklahoma Highway Patrol said a security officer at Tinker informed the patrol that the base's radar picked up from one to four UFO's at various times during the evening.

The objects were moving erratically, at an altitude of about 22,000 feet, the patrol quoted the officer as saying.

A base spokesman later would neither confirm nor deny that radar had tracked the objects. He said only that the Air Force would investigate the UFO reports.

FLYING OBJECTS STOP CLOCKS

2 Tell of 'Flying Saucer'

7-13-65

OPORTO, Portugal (UPI) — A Portuguese couple yesterday described an unidentified Flying Object they saw flying overhead like "a deep dish turned upside down."

Manuel Fernandes, 53, and his 49-year-old wife Laura, saw the cylindrical-shaped object from their village of Paico Sunday.

The sighting followed reports Friday of a similar object over the Santa Maria Airport in the Azores, 800 miles to the west.

The Azores "flying saucer" hovered over the airport for 45 minutes before moving off and out of sight.

The sighting on the Portuguese mainland occurred at 4:30 p.m.

"It appeared at my right going slowly," said Mrs. Fernandes, the first to spot the object. "I had the impression it was gyrating and was shaped like a somewhat flattened sphere."

"Then it stopped. From that position, it appeared different to me. It was like a big deep dish, turned upside down, and it was intermittently luminous," she said.

Her husband also said he saw the object.

"The device came from the northeast, according to my wife," Fernandes said. "But when I saw it, it had already stopped. Then it flew on to the north."

"It was at an altitude of about 6,500 feet. It remained stationary for three minutes. It had a reddish color with a blinking ray of light coming out of one of the sides. Then it left at a fantastically giddy speed."

In the Azores, 10 electromagnetic clocks stopped for 10 minutes while the unidentified Flying Object, described as "white," hovered overhead.

The Fernandes couple said radio static increased while the object remained over their village.

"The noise stopped as soon as the object disappeared," Fernandes said.

Air Crewman Claims Flying Saucer Picture

8-3-65

ANCHORAGE, Aug. 3. — (AP)—An airline crewman today produced a picture which he said shows an unidentified flying object taking to the air from a point near the Russian River on Alaska's Kenai Peninsula.

According to the crewman, Barty Andersson, 41, a purser for Scandanavian Airways System, the picture was taken July 5, about 6 a.m., across the Russian River from the Sportsman's Lodge.

He said he told no one about the incident at the time because he did not believe what he had seen. When his film was processed, however, it showed what Andersson described as the mysterious aircraft's ascent.

THE COLOR picture shows an orange spiral that appears to depict motion, fast-rising motion. A ship is not distinguishable.

Flying Saucer Stops Clock, Say Reports From Portugal

LISBON, Portugal (AP) — Strange objects moving through space were reported sighted in two widely-separated areas of Portugal Sunday.

The Azores Weather Bureau claimed interference from one stopped its electromagnetic clocks.

Descriptions of the objects were strikingly similar to official Argentine and Chilean military reports of sightings in the Antarctic last week.

THE FIRST REPORTED mysterious flying object appeared in Motosinhos, near the northern city of Oporto, where Manuel Fernandes and his wife at first saw "some sort of luminous flattened balloon."

"The thing was very luminous, and had orange coloring and was nearly red at times," the couple said, "and at times green rays shot out from a side."

"The saucer stopped at rather high altitude, near the coast, for about three minutes. Then, with an incredible velocity, it sped towards the north."

FERNANDES SAID his radio



was playing while the object circled over a forest near the house, but that heavy interference interrupted the music.

A similar type of interference stopped the electromagnetic clocks of the Villa do Porto Weather Bureau in the Portuguese Azores archipelago, a spokesman said.

FLYING OBJECT SIGHTED IN ANTARCTIC

Chile's Department of National Defence is checking reports today about a strange object seen flashing in the Antarctic skies.

According to the reports, the shiny object was seen on July 3 by personnel of Chilean, Argentina and British bases in the Antarctic.

The Argentine Navy Ministry confirmed in a communique that a flying object was seen and photographed in the Antarctic by navy personnel at bases here.

'Something real'

Mario Janh Barrera, commanding one of the Chilean bases, said it would be inaccurate to say that "all of us saw a flying saucer, one of those science-fiction things. However, it was something real, an object that moved at amazing speed, manoeuvred quickly and gave off a blue-green sheen. It also caused interference in the electromagnetic apparatus of an Argentine base which is facing ours, on a nearby small island."

"The object was yellowish red, changing to green, yellow, and orange," he said. "It was near, at an angle of 45 degrees from our position, over the north end of the island."

"It would zigzag quickly. Then it stopped and we promptly reached for field glasses, telescopes, theodolites, anything at hand to sight it. And we watched, as it remained quietly there, for about 20 minutes."—AP

Official Reports Describe Flying Object in Antarctic

SANTIAGO, Chile (AP) — From the Antarctic yesterday came official reports that a mysterious lens-shaped flying object, maneuvering and moving at great speed, was sighted last Saturday.

A Chilean base commander in the antarctic reported the object was "yellowish red, changing to green, yellow and orange."

In Buenos Aires, the navy issued a communique saying personnel at Argentina's antarctic base saw the flying object and photographed it.

Mario Janh Barrera, commander of the Chilean base, told the defense ministry by radio that it would be too much to say that "all of us saw a flying saucer, one of these science-fiction things."

"However," he continued, "it was something real, an object

that moved at amazing speed, manoeuvred quickly and gave off a blue-green sheen. It also caused interference in the electromagnetic apparatus of an Argentine base which is facing ours on a nearby small island."

The interference was confirmed by the navy communique issued in Buenos Aires.

Janh said a corporal took color pictures but there are no facilities for developing the film. The men must wait for eight months to be relieved to have the film developed on the mainland.


New sightings of unidentified flying objects were reported in South America Saturday.

'FLYING SAUCERS' SEEN OVER CITY

BUENOS AIRES, Sun. — Another unidentified flying object was spotted yesterday over the River Plate, the 28-mile wide river between Argentina and Uruguay.

Several similar objects were sighted over Buenos Aires, the Argentine capital on Friday and yesterday.

Yesterday's flying saucer was spotted by six people walking along a deserted beach near Colonia, Uruguay, across the river from Buenos Aires.

One of them, a 17-year-old youth told police that the object he saw was cigar-shaped, reddish in color and about 32 feet above the river and not far out from the beach.

It moved upward when he started running towards it and left behind a trail of white vapor similar to that of a jet engine.

The other five people in the party, two of whom were adults, confirmed his story.

"Very bright"

Several people reported spotting unidentified flying objects over Buenos Aires shortly after sunset on Friday.

They described the objects, some of which were photographed, as cigar shaped and emitting colors ranging from reddish greens to blues.

All said the intensity of the light emitted by the objects was "very bright."

"What I saw was an enormous parabola, three or four times brighter than the brightest star," said one observer.

The objects seemed to remain stationary for 10 to 15 minutes before moving away to disappear towards Uruguay.

During the time the flying saucers were over Buenos Aires, broadcasting by one of the city's television channels was interrupted.

Air Force planes found nothing.

Reports from Canberra and Perth last Thursday are among a spate of unidentified flying object stories this month.

Air traffic control officers and the pilot of a TAA aircraft at Canberra saw a metallic object glinting in the sky 10 miles away.

Mystery Flying Objects Reported

7-18-65

BUENOS AIRES (UPI) — An unidentified flying object was sighted Saturday over the Rio Plata, the 28-mile-wide river that divides Argentina and Uruguay.

Six persons walking on a deserted beach near Colonia, Uruguay, saw the object. The sighting from Uruguay followed by 15 hours sightings of several unidentified flying objects over Buenos Aires, the Argentine capital situated across the river from Colonia.

Scattered reports of flying objects were reported elsewhere this month. On July 10, a peasant couple in a village near Oporto, the second largest city in Portugal, reported seeing a pinkish unidentified object at about 3,000 feet in the sky. They said they saw the object at the same time some static broke out on their radio.

The day before, members of the staff at the Santa Maria airport in the Azores, said that for 45 minutes they observed an unidentified object at an altitude of 33,000 feet. The deputy airport manager was among those who reported seeing it.

Airport authorities said electro magnetic clocks stopped for 10 minutes while the cylindrical white object was overhead. A plane was sent up to observe the object, but it reported no success.

The sightings here Friday and Saturday brought fresh interest in "Platos Voladores" the Spanish term for "flying saucers" that have been reported for the past month in various parts of the southern tip of South America.

One of the six who spotted the flying object from Uruguay, Jose Luis Alvarez Larrauma, 17, of Colonia, told Uruguayan police that the object he saw was cigar-shaped, reddish in color and about 10 meters (32 feet) above the river and not far out from the beach. He said it moved upward when he started running toward it and left behind a trail of white vapor similar to that of a jet engine. The other five persons in the

party, two of whom were adults, confirmed his story.

Several persons reported spotting unidentified flying objects

Argentines See Queer Flying Objects in Sky

BUENOS AIRES — The Argentines, who are not renowned as heavy drinkers, are seeing things — queer things that turn up suddenly in the sky, then as suddenly disappear.

Some of the sightings have been explained quickly and logically. Others seem to defy explanation.

The rash of reports on what the U.S. Air Force classifies as unidentified flying objects began last May and spread rapidly over the country.

One of the first reports came from Mendoza, 600 miles west of here in the Andean foothills. Four hunters said they had seen a strange object over the area. A police patrol sent to investigate reported seeing a large metallic saucer shaped object. The officers said they could not get close enough because of the terrain to determine its size or additional details.

New Report From Chile

Skeptics promptly pointed out that the Argentine State Oil Corp. was prospecting near Mendoza and that what the police saw might well have been drilling gear.

The incident was accorded little space in Buenos Aires newspaper. But scarcely a month later, they devoted a column after column to a new report. This came from Santiago, Chile, where the commander of Chile's base in the Antarctic was quoted as saying he had seen "something real that moved at frighten-

ing speed zigzagging and giving off a blue green light."

The officer, Air Force Comdr. Mario John Barrera was further quoted as saying that it was "something solid which caused interference in the electronic equipment" at Argentina's naval base in the South Orkney Islands.

The report was carried in the Santiago newspaper El Mercurio and was confirmed by officials at the Argentine base. Jahn said personnel at a nearby British base told him they also had seen the object.

This week, a spokesman at the La Plata Observatory here announced that what had caused all the fuss was no more than an artificial satellite called Echo 2, which had been launched into orbit by the United States on Jan. 25, 1964.

Officials Disagree

Uruguayan officials disagreed. At a research station set up near Montevideo to investigate reports of unidentified flying objects, a spokesman said Echo 2 was nowhere in the area at the time of the sighting.

Whatever the case, the incident touched off a wave of similar reports, some of which were immediately discounted. One sighting at a small town deep in the interior turned out to be the setting sun's reflection on a water reservoir.

Others remain unexplained, and scientists have opened a running debate on the subject.

Port Orchard Man Reports On 'UFO'

4-20-65

An unidentified flying object was reported seen Monday night by Dave Bollman of Port Orchard.

Bollman said he spotted what appeared to be at first a bright star at 11:55 p.m. He said he had just returned to his home from Bremerton, and as he was approaching his house glanced up at the evening star (Mars).

Bollman said the object was moving in an easterly direction from Mars. He said it was a single bright light and appeared to be too high for a plane. It moved erratically, Bollman said, stopping, then starting again.

He said he called his mother from the house and after both watched it for a short time, Mrs. Bollman called the sheriff's office. The sheriff's office said there were no other reports of a UFO.

Bollman said he watched the object for two to four minutes before losing sight of it. The object moved about 15 to 20 degrees during the time, he said.

Thousands In Tizzy Over Objects In Sky

An unidentified flying object was reportedly seen hovering just above houses north of Markridge road, between Lauderdale and Dunsmore avenue in La Crescenta at dusk Sunday.

Mrs. William B. DeLong of 3712 El Caminito said she sighted a cigar-shaped object speeding east toward Pine Tree Lodge. "Then it slowed and hovered for about half a minute," she said.

"My son and I rushed up the hill," Mrs. DeLong continued, "but it sped away and hovered again further east. We started after it, but it suddenly disappeared.

"I've seen one or two before," she added, "but this is the first time I was close enough to really see what it looked like. It was shaped like a cigar and was between four and five feet long.

"It made a strange whirring sound," stated Mrs. DeLong. "I've never heard anything like it before."

The craft, which Mrs. DeLong said was "right over the tops of houses and trees," was not reported by anyone else — although a great many Midwesterners have allegedly seen UFOs during the past two weeks. Highway patrolmen in Oklahoma are among the witnesses.

The Air Force admits having tracked unidentified objects on their radar screens, but the official USAF comment is that they are falling from space — not flying.

THEORY

Mrs. DeLong, however, said, "It had the appearance of a metallic substance. It was very bright. The front and back were red. The middle was silver. It had twinkling lights."

She said it had "fins" instead of wings.

Rather than coming from space, Mrs. DeLong thinks "they're from a subterranean world underground — probably 800 miles below the crust of the earth." She made reference to a book entitled, "The Hollow Earth", which is certainly food for thought.
