

Implanted IC monitors farm animals

Heverlee, Belgium — In an unusual application of custom CMOS technology, a research team at the Catholic University at Leuven has developed a technique to monitor farm and herd animals' stress and body temperature by

implanting an IC under the animals' skin. The Leuven team developed the chip with Eureka Co., a British firm.

The research, carried out under the auspices of a Common Market agricultural research program, is of major importance in commercial animal husbandry, according to Patrick Wouters, a member of the Belgian team. Wouters announced details about the biotelemetric CMOS chip at the European Solid-State Circuits Conference in Milan last month.

After the IC is injected into the animal, it is activated by an antenna, which transmits data on the

animal's status and temperature up to a range of 1 meter. The information is decoded and sent on to a data-acquisition and control system.

The integrated circuit is made up of two main parts. A custom-designed analog-to-digital device converts a pulse-width-modulated temperature signal ranging from 35°C to 41°C into a 6-bit code with an accuracy of 0.1°C. The second part is entirely digital, consisting of the code memory, which contains 42 bits, and a transponder.

When activated by a 132-kHz carrier, the IC transmits a 50-bit

code containing the temperature and identification data to a nearby receiver at 66 kHz. Laboratory tests show that over 200,000 readings are possible using a small lithium battery integrated with the chip.

The IC measures 2.6 × 5.8 millimeters, and has been implemented in 3-micron CMOS n-well technology. Research is under way to encapsulate the electronics into an injectable cylinder. "The final goal is to place the entire system into a device measuring 40 mm long and with a diameter of 5 mm," Wouters said.

No improvement seen!


- A CONTINUED EXPANSION OF THE GROWING WORLDWIDE COOPERATION IN UFO STUDIES.
