

## FROM IMPLANTS TO MOTORS

Ref. *R&D Magazine*, January 1995

Abductees often report that they believe they have had strange devices implanted in various parts of their bodies. Detractors then question how anything that small could be a useful working device.

Now we have a report of human technology capable of making a miniature engine having a gear with a diameter less than that of a human hair. This is evidence that implants could be small and still do useful work. The article follows:



### Fastest, Toughest, Smallest Engine from Sandia

With a diameter less than that of a strand of hair, a new rotating output gear is part of what researchers at Sandia National Labs, Albuquerque, N.M., believe is the world's fastest engine. The toothed gear—50  $\mu\text{m}$  in diameter—is driven by a linkage which converts linear motion to rotary motion.

The engine reaches record speeds of up to 500,000 rpm.

Backers envision this technology powering microsurgical tools and microsafety devices for nuclear weapons.

## METALS FOR USE IN SPACE

Artifacts reportedly from UFOs found after the UFO incidents at Aurora, TX in 1897, Roswell, NM

in 1947, and others have been described to be lightweight, metallic, strong and stable. Often the data has been discounted because manmade aircraft and spacecraft don't use such materials for structural members.

Researchers at Japan's Technological University of Nagaoka have developed a metal so light it floats in water. "The material consists of 57% magnesium and 38% lithium. The other 5% is of aluminum or zinc, which is added for strength and stability. The material can be molded and rolled at room temperature. Potential uses include space station structural panels manufactured on-site from allow ingots launched in bulk. Rolling and forming could be performed in-orbit using simple machines."

Maybe someone else has already been making space vehicles out of this family of materials.

## ULTRASONIC GUN

Animals often react to UFOs long before humans are aware that anything strange is going on. Guard dogs cower and hide rather than attack. Horses rear up and throw their riders. And night time insects become quiet. UFO researchers have speculated that the cause is ultrasonic sound which cannot be detected by the human ear. The *Huntsville News* describes how a device made by humans affected a horse in a similar manner. How many other similar devices that are in use is impossible to determine. The newspaper report follows:

"A James Bond-style ultrasonic gun disguised as a pair of binoculars was used to stun a top thoroughbred during a race, and could have become the key tool in a massive drug and betting conspiracy...."

"The high-pitched sound emitted from the grandstand caused Ile de Chypre to veer suddenly to the left and throw jockey Greville Starkey as it was heading for a victory.

"Defense attorney Jonathan Goldberg said his client, London car dealer James Laming, invented the gun and it was used only once. But he said it had been projected as the centerpiece of a scheme in which millions of dollars in drug profits would be laundered at race tracks, with the participants ensuring the success of their bets by using the ultrasonic device.

"Laming, 49, is a self-educated man who left school at 15 and invented a stun-gun based on bright light when he was younger. The device was banned by the British government.

"Goldberg displayed the 'Mark-II' stun-gun used against Ile de Chypre, telling jurors in a London criminal court it 'would attract no suspicion to the user' because it looks like an ordinary pair of binoculars.

"But take off the lens caps and you see what looks like the backside of a jet engine of an airplane," he said. "In fact, the lenses of these binoculars have been removed and replaced by two high-power ceramic transducers."

"The transducers were a pair of high-power loudspeakers and the device also had a 22-watt amplifier. The gun could be aimed from up to 50 feet away, and humans would not notice the ultrasonic noise because they have less-sensitive hearing than animals.

"This device subjects the passing racehorse to a sudden and terrifying noise which no human being can hear at all. It is equivalent in suddenness to the horse to a loud fireworks exploding in its ears, although the actual noise would be more equivalent in human terms to a hideous ear-piercing shriek best compared to the noise of a very loud microphone that has gone wrong.

"The device could be focused into a horse's ear and would leave no evidence of its use and no permanent disability for the animal."

### YOUR CONVERSATION IS NOT PRIVATE!

UFO researchers are called paranoid when they say their phones have been tapped, their investigations thwarted in unusual ways, and their evidence tampered with. Attempts to find the source of the phone taps are usually unsuccessful. Perhaps that is because a new form of technology is being used as evidenced by the following information reported in the *Vancouver Sun*. Also, consider that if the technology is being reported in a Canadian newspaper now, then the actual technology must be lightyears beyond what is being reported. The *Sun* report follows:

"An elite wing of Canada's spy agency is secretly developing devices that can monitor and identify voices carried through the air by phone and radio signals, CTV reports, citing government documents.

"The Communications Security Establishment is a super-secret branch of the defense department that specializes in gathering signals intelligence -- SIGINT to insiders.

"Since 1989, the CSE has awarded three

contracts worth \$1.1 million to a Montreal firm to make machines that can quickly isolate key words and phrases from the millions of signals CSE monitors each day, CTV reported.

"In May 1993, the CSE awarded Centre de Recherche Informatique de Montreal a contract to develop a "Speaker Identification System," which can pick voices from the electronic haze and identify them.

"It's frightening," says Bill Robinson, a researcher with peace group Project Ploughshares. "It has Orwellian potential to sweep through everybody's conversations. As computers get faster and faster, theoretically, one would be able to keep records of all conversations.

"CSE is supposed to provide Ottawa with foreign intelligence but parliamentarians have often voiced concerns about the agency's potential to violate the privacy of Canadians.

"Defense Minister David Collenette said he was unaware of the CSE's latest electronic snooping projects.

### THEY DIDN'T BELIEVE THE INDIANS EITHER
