



MORE FUEL FOR THE SAUCER FIRES

Many times your editor has heard the opinion expressed by the saucer skeptic that if anybody who is anybody would lend their name to the saucer investigation, that the whole thing would be a more palatable pill to swallow.

Well... FATE magazine has just announced (March 1957 issue) the nine-man board of governors of the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena. The NICAP, which has headquarters in Washington, D.C. is going to launch a detailed scientific investigation of flying saucers because they feel that "there exists more than enough evidence of certain and obvious aerial phenomena to justify independent evaluation."

The board of governors is comprised of the following men: Dr. Charles A. Mancy, professor of physics at Defiance, Ohio, college; Rear Admiral Delmer C Fahrney, USN-retired; A.M. Sonnabend, president, Hotel Corporation of America; the Rev. Albert H. Baller, Robbins Memorial Congregational Church, Greenfield, Mass.; Brig. General Thomas B. Catron (retired); Frank Edwards (famous radio-TV commentator) Indianapolis; Talbot T. Speer, Speer Foundation, Baltimore and Maryland Publisher; the Rev. Leon C. Levan, New Jerusalem Christian Church, Pittsburgh; and Col. Robert Emerson, USA-retired, nuclear physicist of the Kaiser Aluminum Co., Baton Rouge, La.

General Albert C. Wedemeyer, USA-retired, will sit with the committee as an evaluations advisor. The committee's first investigation will be known as 'Project Skylight!'

The committee states that: "Under no circumstances shall there be any form of so-called secret classification of the committee's findings, or restrictions as to their dissemination."

Add to the above list such men as William P. Lear of Grand Rapids, Clyde W. Tombaugh, famous

astronomer, and Air Chief Marshall Lord Dowding of England, and we have a very impressive list without going any further. There are other well-known people interested in the mystery of the saucers but let us see what some of the aforementioned men have to say regarding unidentified flying objects.

Rear Adm. Fahrney, who was once head of the Navy's guided missiles program recently stated that reliable sources indicate that there are "objects coming into our atmosphere at speeds and accelerations...which" neither Russia nor the United States are able to achieve "at this time".

Fahrney said that he had never seen a flying saucer, but has talked to a number of scientists and engineers who reported seeing strange flying objects which seem to be directed by "an intelligence."

William P. Lear, Grand Rapids industrialist, stated in February of 1955 that he believed "flying saucers are real" because of numerous manifestations over long periods of time, because of many observations made simultaneously by reliable observers, because there are great possibilities of scientific reality if the latest theory of electrogravitational field is proved and because actual serious efforts are now in progress to prove the existence of anti-gravitation. He was also quoted at that time as saying that he believed in saucers because he and his pilot had seen one.

Clyde W. Tombaugh, discoverer of the planet Pluto, who has just completed a survey of the skies for the government, said a couple of weeks ago that unidentified flying objects seen in recent years may be coming from outside our own solar system.

Tombaugh's recent satellite search drew a blank, but he believes that "these things, which do appear to be directed, are unlike any other phenomena I ever observed." He said he had seen phenomena in the sky which he could not explain, but not since 1951 or 1952.

Air Chief Marshall Dowding stated in London in 1954 that he believes in flying saucers because of cumulative evidence in such quantity (10,000 sightings) that for him it brought complete conviction. He stated that the majority of the sightings could not be accounted for by any "scientific" explanation.

Paul Harvey News(caster),said in November, 1956 that the Pentagon has been censoring flying saucer information. Magazine articles submitted for clearance---articles that apparently had nothing to do with military secrets---have nonetheless been blue penciled by Pentagon security officials.

Why ?

The House investigators want to know.

One report on flying saucers was released...

Then it was stamped secret...

Then it was unclassified again.

A former Intelligence officer wrote a book.

All of the information had been previously published.

All of it.

But the Army refused to allow publication of that book. (A.P.R.O. Bulletin -- November,1956)

Paul Harvey and Frank Edwards, who is on the board of governors of NICAP, are two **nationally known** newscasters who have expressed interest in the flying saucer mystery.

George Van Tassell, who was in Grand Rapids recently and spoke before the Grand Rapids Flying Saucer Club, states in the latest issue of his publication "Proceedings" that the "hush-hush" group is trying to get all saucer groups to join a national organization (such as NICAP...?,ed.) so that they can be divided against each other.

George advises that all saucer groups should remain as they are, separate and autonomous, because spontaneous cooperation is the key to their strength.

OUT OF THE MOUTH OF BABES...

Why are there apparently so few Saucer sightings made by children? Going back through the files of UForum, your editor found that an extremely small percentage of UFO sightings and reports were made by children.

Is it that adults, who spend most of their time indoors, see more of these objects than do the children who spend most of their time outdoors? Or is it that children **who** do see such things are told by their elders to stop making up a lot of wild space stories?

A child's mind is not nearly as clouded as an adults when it comes to believing or disbelieving. The child does not have a lot of preconceived ideas about what cannot be possible. The child does not have to worry about losing his job or prestige if someone finds out he is "one of those space crackpots" (medical term: psycho-ceramic).

Art Linkletter recently asked a twelve-year-old what she thought was the basic difference between children and adults. The girl immediately replied that, "A child's mind is open and an adults mind is closed."

Admittedly some children exaggerate to gain attention and not being schooled in the scientific method are apt to draw improper conclusions, but as a teacher of three dozen ten-year-olds your editor began to wonder if any of his charges had seen any unusual sky phenomena.

So without any prelude, I asked the class if there was anyone in the room who had ever seen something in the sky that they were certain could not be explained as a conventional object such as an airplane. I had hoped that perhaps I might pick up a sighting or two that could be added to the UForum files, but I expected nothing like that which follows. I received twelve different reports, some of which were accompanied by drawings of the objects.


1. It was 9 P.M. and dark, sometime in August. My family and I saw two silver lights going over fast from west to east. One was flying a little below and behind the first. There was no sound.

2. I was at my cousin's house. It was August, 1956 at about 10 P.M. I looked out the window and saw a steady red light moving fast. Being inside I couldn't have heard any sound if there was any.

3. I was on Plainfield with my mother, father and sister. It was about 6 P.M. on an evening in October, 1955. The Sun was just setting. The object was round and silvery-gray. It was about half the size of a full moon. It flew straight from south to north at about 600 miles an hour and made no sound. I estimate that it was 150 feet wide and 8,000 feet in the air.




4. It was the night of October 7, 1955 at about 7:30 P.M. I saw this object coming out of the southwest heading northeast where it disappeared. About two minutes later it returned and then finally it disappeared again in the southwest. Another boy who was with me saw it too. It was round and was orange, black and silver in color. I would estimate that it was 50 feet high and 250 feet long and it was flying at about 500 feet altitude. The object seemed to make a ticking sound like a clock ticking. And it ticked about once every three seconds. The Sun was setting and it was getting rather dark. The object was about half the size of the full




BOTTOM VIEW

5. I was on _____ street in the middle of May, 1955. It was about 4:25 P.M. The object came out of the northwest, and went southeast and then returned and disappeared in the northwest. I would say it was going 90 miles an hour. It was big and silver and made a noise like a jet motor. It was a little bit smaller than the moon.



6. It was during recess one day that I saw this object. It was about 10:30 in the morning of an October day. I was down the hill behind school and was facing east. The object flew fast and straight. It was a fairly bright, orange color and it made no sound. The color was steady. The object flew from northeast to southwest and I only saw it for 4 seconds overhead and then it disappeared in the clouds.



7. In April 1955, my mother and a man were at Marne , Michigan. It was about 10 P.M. I didn't see it myself, but my mother told me about it. They saw what looked to them like a small white cloud that left a vapor trail. It was the only cloud in the sky and was moving very fast. It made no sound.

8. It was Tuesday, October 23, 1956 at about 4 P.M. The sky was cloudy. I was in a field, by myself. The object, which was a bright orange steady light, moved fast in a straight line from west to east. It made no sound.




9. I was in my backyard, on June 9th, 1956 (my birthday). It was 8:30 P.M. The object came from the south and was headed in a northwesterly direction. It was green and made no sound. It appeared to be traveling at 5,000 mph. It looked about one and a half feet wide, and was smaller than the full moon. The steady green light circled once in mid-flight blinked once and was gone. It was about 700 feet in diameter



10. On September 7, 1956, I was at Tawas on Lake Huron. It was 9 P.M. My cousin Richard was with me. We saw this object which was a steady red light. It came out of the southwest, whirled around and disappeared into the northeast. It was moving fast, was smaller than the full moon and made no sound.

11. It was a Saturday night in September, 1956. I was in my bed near the window. The object was red and was moving real fast. It looked about ten inches in diameter. It was very small in comparison with a full moon. It was headed northeast and it stopped near moon, waited fifteen minutes and then returned southwest. It was red on top but there seemed to be a green light coming out of the bottom of the object. It made no sound.



12. The time of day of this sighting was 9:30 P.M. I don't know what day it was, but it was in July of 1956. I was at camp (Wilder's lodge,

at 3 Mile road just outside Comstock Park, Michigan.)

There were no clouds. Three ladies at the camp saw the object, too. The object was round and had one or three red lights which were steady. It seemed to fly straight down, circled three times, and then seemed to take off again straight up and disappeared. The object itself seemed to give off a red-orange light and there were three lights around the edge. It made no sound. It was smaller than the full moon.

This last sighting was witnessed by Mr. and Mrs. John R. Landefeld. According to both the Landefeld's, who live on Coit N.E., they saw a red ball pass over the camp on a Saturday evening in July, 1956. Mr. Landefeld's description, which follows, differs slightly from that of the student.


The object was a red ball with a little yellow and was moving from east to west. It was flashing off and on. It was not moving very fast, and seemed to have a pulsating motion. It made no sound. (At this late date, it is possible that the object which Mr. Landefeld saw was not the same as was seen by the student. He reported that he has seen numerous objects in the skies and he perhaps is thinking of a different one than the girl. The girl stated that Mrs. Landefeld was one of the witnesses)

A sketch of the object seen by the girl is reproduced below.

Mr. Landefeld also reported that just a few nights ago, on January 12th, 1957, he was driving towards town on Plainfield when he and his son saw an object, yellowish in color moving in a pulsating fashion from north to south.

It was sighted at about 9:30

P.M. It made no sound according to Landefeld.





BUCK NELSON

MY TRIP to MARS, the MOON and VENUS

FLYING SAUCER ROUND-UP
(condensed extracts from CRIFO 'ORBIT')

The following sightings were taken from the last year's 'Orbits'. 'Orbit' is one of the finest monthly UFO publications and is available @ \$3.00 a year from Len Stringfield, 7017 Britton Av. Cincy, O.

Case 145-(5-20-50)-an unidentified location- A prominent scientist (unnamed) reports, "I saw the object between 12:15 and 12:20...moving SE to NW... extremely prominent...looked like a parachute tipped at an angle...no exhaust gases...calculated its size at 3-5 ft...speed 100-200 mph...no engine noise.

Case 146-Yonkers, NY, (8-28-30, 1955)- Leo Wieggers a civil service employe, tells of his sighting by telescope (30x)...8:30pm (8-28)...looking in a SW'ly direction, I blinked my eyes at what seemed a fuzzy bright object...focusing, the object became a clear-cut, bright image which I thought was Saturn--rings and all...but that was impossible with my magnification...it was moving slowly due west...I watched it for ½ hour, along with my family and 2 neighbors... it was pure white...very sharp in outline...the dome on top appeared too large for the planet Saturn... no portholes...milky white in color...a faint haze of a delicate blue tint slowly emanated from the whole left side and opposite to its direction...On 8-30-55, Wieggers witnessed a similar UFO.

Case 147-El Paso, Tex (3-7-56)- J.W. Thompson, only witness to object, shaped like a small pipe, and which fell ablaze to the ground, scattering a grayish ash about the area...AF had no comment.

Case 148-Pecos, Tex. (2-10-56)- Military and civil authorities unable to account for an aerial explosion about 25 miles NW of Pecos...no wreckage.

Case 149-Helmville-Ovando, Montana (2-15-56)- Three women reported an airplane trailing smoke and

parachute-like objects falling from it...a ground search turned up nothing...2 days later a boy reported a big explosion with red and yellow flames and gray and black smoke billowing up from the hillside ...no planes missing.

Case 150-Anderson, S.C.-(2-17-56)- Frank Ack-er, columnist reported...Friday at 4:15pm, Hugh Phil-lips was riding along the hiway...when millions of blackbirds came flying out of the south headed north ...they seemed panicky...exhausted birds fell in the field...about 2 hours later, we remembered a phone call, who didn't identify himself but said he saw a peculiar looking thing at about 4pm which looked like a highly polished metal wheel...which seemed to re-volve, but I didn't get a good look at it because of dazzling sunlight.

Case 151-Cincinnati, O-(3-20,21,22-'56)- The Cincinnati "Enquirer" of Mar.22, reported: An uni-identified object burned like a bright beacon for at least 45 minutes high in the western sky...to the naked eye, the object appeared to be an extraordi-narily intense bluish-white light, suspended at about a 30° angle above the horizon...thru binoculars, the object appeared to be a compact galaxy of lights, changing form as they revolved slowly...the object moved almost imperceptibly away to the northwest,.. until it disappeared at 9:45pm...residents reported that it was the third consecutive night 'the thing' had appeared...as it turned out, the mysterious ob-ject was the planet Venus...Dr. Paul Herget, direc-tor of the Cincy observatory, said, "The planet Ve-nus will keep getting brighter until the middle of May and every fool who goes out and looks at it for the first time will see a flying saucer"..CRIFO felt that of 17 UFO reports during this period, 6 were definitely not Venus and defied all conventional ex-planation.

Cases 152-158 are missing from UFOrum files.

Case 159-Ottawa, Can. (5-15-56)- The defense ministry blamed a false alarm for sending up the jet plane that crashed into a nun's rest home and killed 15 persons...the plane that fell gave no indication of trouble...(this may typify cases where the true facts are hidden.)

Case 160-Pueblo, Colo. (5-11-56)- Air Force reported sightings of UFO for six successive nights near Pueblo...Sgt. Gilbert Nelson reported 6 appearances of the objects between 9pm and midnight Monday. 'They were dull...fluorescent glows'...mostly triangular in shape, but one was round and brighter than the rest...they were only visible for 5-6 seconds, so great was their speed.

Case 161-Salt Lake City, Utah (5-10-56)-Three uranium prospectors saw a large silvery colored object 'spinning or floating' in the air...said Harvey Mecham...I looked at it thru 8x30 binoculars...it was no light reflection...it looked like the bottom of saucer, except that it was elliptical rather than round...It was the brightest silvery thing I have ever seen...a strong wind was blowing the clouds to the west but the object went out of sight to the east.

Case 162-Jacksonville, Fla. (5-9-56)- Joan Frost reports in a letter that she and her girl friend Gertie Wynn left a dance on the outskirts of J'vil' and were waiting for a bus ... when we looked up and saw 2 stars moving very high...flashing on and off, following each other...traveling at a terrific rate of speed...15 minutes later (about 11:15pm) they came back and one went up into the other...It came over towards us and dropped lower and lower until it got just over us...It was round and red and had 3 lights on it...it didn't make a sound...just then the bus came and the object rose again...the other object came out again...the bus driver and a few other people on the bus watched the objects go for about 10 minutes.

Case 163-Bromley, Ky. (7-1-56)-With this case, the early summer saucer 'lull' was broken...Mr. and Mrs. Harlan Grimes saw a huge glowing object about $\frac{1}{4}$ the size of the moon shining thru their bedroom window about 3am...they watched again the next night & saw nothing.

Case 164-Cincy, O. & Northern Kentucky (7-10-56)-Two Cincinnatians witnessed a circular object, "lit up like a lantern" pacing an air transport...and was bigger and brighter than the landing lights of the aircraft...when the plane landed the object continued its course, swerved and blinked out.

Case 165-Conway, Mass. (7-2-56)- Jack Pease reported an object which...appeared to be composed of one light and altho traveling at what appeared to be a high rate of speed, was able to reverse its course completely...a low pitched hum was detected.

Case 166-Yonkers, NY (June 29, 30, July 3, 1956)-An orange-red object moving at considerable speed reported by Leo Wieggers who caught it in his 30x60 B&L telescope...a silvery-whitish object was seen by Wieggers the next night...3 nights later others in the area reported seeing an orange UFO.

Case 167-Los Angeles-(7-16-56)-A mysterious light that glowed brilliantly in the sky...hundreds of calls to police...Control tower at International Airport estimated altitude at 2000ft...They said it emitted a strong reddish glow similar to the red nose light on a Constellation...the light moved in a SW'ly direction 7-8° above the horizon...at a blimplike pace and was visible from 11:02-11:06pm...blazoned forth in an orange glow and vanished from sight.

Case 168-Hutchinson, Kans. (7-19-56)-Radar at the naval air station picked up a ball of fire traveling east at a high speed...Brian Coyne described the head of the object he saw as green or 'bluish green' in color.

Case 169-Cincinnati(6-17-56)-I am Mr. & Mrs. Ed Tasset awakened and watched a strange object through an open window, which at first was a stationary, silent, brilliant spot in the NW sky, about 15° above the horizon...then it seemed to move closer...and grew in size...it appeared almost twice the size of the moon, was fiery red and shaped 'like a bowl facing downward.' Dangling from the bottom were bright red streamers. In view about about 10 minutes, the object then retreated rapidly...and disappeared.

Case 170-over Pixley, Calif.(7-22-56) Major Merwin Stenvers, pilot of an AF C-131D transport described a mysterious mid-air incident...Suddenly, there was a loud bang, a severe vibration and we went into a dive!...while Stenvers and his co-pilot battled to bring it out of the spin, the two other crewmen were struggling to regain their feet in the cabin...just as the nose began to come up the whole crew blacked out...when they came to, the plane was going almost straight up...Stenvers was unable to explain what had happened...when he inspected the plane on the ground he discovered that the tail section was badly damaged...36 sq. ft. of left elevator was missing...the remaining portion was hanging shredded and torn...Stenvers said that he had seen no other planes around him...one official said it looked like something 'had struck it from above, but we don't know.'

Case 171-Hong Kong, China (11-28-55)- At 9:40 ~~am~~ another person and I witnessed a bright light about a few thousand feet over Lyemun Pass...it appeared to remain stationary until a Meteor jet took off from Kai Tak airfield and flew towards it...the light...brighter than before, moved westward, diminishing in size and brightness until it disappeared...it was changing all the time from a bulging line into a brighter white disc and vice-versa...the surrounding mist was illuminated producing a mysterious effect.

WILLIAMSONs and LAUGHEADs LEAVE for PERU

Ric Williamson and his wife Betty and son, Mark and Dr. Charles Laughead, his wife Lillian and two children left Prescott, Ariz. by plane Dec. 2, 1956, on the first leg of a trip that will take them into the uncharted regions of Peru.

Grand Rapids Flying Saucer investigators may remember Ric for his lecture on flying saucers which he gave in Grand Rapids Feb. 11, 1955. He is an anthropologist and author of "The Saucers Speak" and the recently published "Other Tongues-Other Flesh".

Dr. Laughead will be remembered for his prediction while at Michigan State University in 1955, that the earth would be hit by a great catastrophe or cataclysm on December 21, 1955.

The second leg of their trip took them from Mexico City to Lima, Peru where they may be reached c/o the American Ambassador in Lima.

They will do research work in anthropology and missionary work in a valley, 2 air hours from Lima, known as Valley "X". They will also investigate reports of "flying saucers" in the Lake Titicaca area.
