



whereas I do not necessarily agree with all the religious interpretations therein, I was nevertheless quite impressed with your evident sincerity and your honest search for truth in regard to the great UFO problem.

I am writing you in regard to another UFO researcher, named James Moseley, who is undoubtedly known to you. For very important personal reasons I do not wish to reveal to you who I am, but I can safely tell you that for a number of years, I have been closely associated with one of the Military Services. In the course of my work, I have come across Mr. Moseley a number of times. Knowing that he too had a connection with the UFO problem, I was immediately suspicious, and I decided to use certain Military contacts I have, in order to check into the true background of Mr. Moseley.

In my research I learned that Mr. Moseley is in reality a reserve First Lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force. From 1950 to 1953 he was working in Intelligence, in connection with some highly secret work the CIA was then doing in Germany. Since 1953 he has held the position of a liaison officer with the ATIC in Dayton, Ohio, which as you must know has been connected with the Air Force's investigation of the UFO problem. I first met Mr. Moseley here in Miami in 1955, at a private meeting of the Southern Aeronautical Association, and since then I have had the opportunity to meet him three more times, at aeronautical and military conferences here in Miami and elsewhere. Due to my personal interest in the UFO problem, I have for several years subscribed to the various amateur UFO publications, such as yours; I can tell you that it came as quite a shock to me when I first learned that Moseley was publishing a UFO journal, and the shock was all the greater when I saw his journal and learned the type of erroneous mate-

rial he was trying to mislead the public with. I can tell you with absolute certainty that should Moseley wish to do so, he would be in possibly the best position of anyone in the United States to expose the true nature of the UFO mystery. The reason he does not do so should be clear from all I have said so far. In short, Mr. Moseley is nothing more or less than a paid tool of the U. S. Air Force.

I have kept these facts to myself for quite some time, and had felt that it was best to continue to do so. However, just yesterday I saw Mr. Moseley again (we have checked and find this DOES correspond with the date on which Moseley was in Miami, allegedly enroute to Peru--G.B.), at the very same hotel where I am staying now. Naturally he still does not know that I am familiar with his UFO publication; he knows me only in my official capacity. Seeing Moseley here again at still another military meeting made me realize that it is high time that someone spoke against this farce. However, please realize that I am giving you this information in this letter in absolute confidence, and for your information only. Under no circumstances would it be wise for you to publish this information in your UFO magazine.

Incidentally, before closing, I should tell you a little more: From personal correspondence with Moseley, I know that he pretends to his UFO followers to be about 25 years old and to be interested in treasure hunting in South America. In this way he excuses his long absences from the New Jersey area. I can tell you that Mr. Moseley is 32 years old, and that his long trips south are not to South America at all but to an Air Force Base in this area to which he has been attached in a civilian capacity for the past two years. Just what Moseley's present work there consists of, I do not know for sure.

However, I do know that his services to the Military consist of several other important duties, in addition to his work of confusing the public on the UFO problem in which capacity he is known to you.

Moseley' "earth theory" regarding UFO's is so flimsy that it is hard to understand that the Air Force seriously expects anyone to believe it. One example from my own experience should serve to prove this point. Last September, at an Air Force Base in this area, five jets spent almost an entire night chasing a formation of 8 to 12 UFO's that were performing fantastic maneuvers at fairly low altitudes in the vicinity of the Base. I happen to know about this as one of the jet pilots is a friend of mine. Naturally, no word of this incident leaked to the newspaper. I ask you in all seriousness - could these UFO's possibly be made by any power on Earth? You know better than that, I know better than that, and of course Moseley, who is in the best position to know also knows better than that!

Moseley claims he is in Peru "treasure-seeking", but if this letter is true, he will have to think up some alibi fast. Moseley, who is a near-fanatic for the theory that UFOs do come from the Earth, even went to the extent of offering a \$1,000 reward to anyone who could prove that the saucers come from outer space. As far as your editors know, this offer is still valid.

Mr. Moseley was also mixed up, it was told, with George Adamski, who hinted that Moseley might be the tool of the "Silence Group". Apparently Moseley got an interview with Mr. Adamski by using a false letter of introduction. After questioning Mr. Adamski all day with an attitude that was reported not to be very nice, Moseley topped it off by keeping some 1000 envelopes

with him for two weeks, which he had been entrusted with by the photographer who made copies of Mr. Adamski's pictures for him.

Moseley also wrote an article in the May 1957 issue of Fate, called "Curse of the Quishuarani Treasure". That story and the letter printed above certainly do conflict in regard to dates.

The letter, of course, could be a deliberate 'plant' by Moseley himself, or someone trying to do harm to him. In any case, your editor will be very interested to know the outcome of this for it should prove interesting. 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#### USING THE PLANCHETTE

During the past few years there have been invented several different devices to aid in the development of writing mediumship. One of the most widely used of these has been the Planchette.

The Planchette is a little heart-shaped board which has two legs with small ballbearings at the end allowing for free writing. Near the bottom of the heart is a small hole into which is inserted a pencil.

The sitter places the Planchette upon a large piece of paper, puts his fingertips lightly upon the top of the Planchette and awaits results.

If the sitter is mediumistic the Planchette will begin to move slowly and then faster with definite direction. After making a few preliminary circles and lines, the Planchette seems to be gripped by some spirit hand and will begin to write words and sentences. After the writing has started, questions may be asked of the spirits. Sometimes you will have to wait longer for the writing to begin than at other times. It means nothing.

Be suspicious and cautious of

all messages received while using the Planchette. If you receive messages from spirits claiming to be Julius Caesar, Napoleon Bonaparte, Socrates and others you may disregard them for most such messages will be completely false.

A word of advice - do not start asking questions as soon as the writing begins. Also, sit at a regular time according to your own schedule. Valuable information can be gained through the use of the Planchette.

"KEEP YOUR EYE ON THE SKY"

"AIME MICHEL"

We bring our readers a letter from Aime Michel. It was written to a lady in the South, and was translated by Jim Villard. I might add that I (J.V.) can do any translating work on photo work you might have for me. Here is the letter in full:

Aime Michel St. Vincent les Forts (BA)  
France

Dear Madam,

Excuse my writing you in French --I can read English but cannot write it. I hope that you can translate these few lines.

Thank you for your interesting letter. I have thought a lot when I received the reports of Mr. Adamski's two books. If it is true, he certainly constitutes without question the most important contribution to the question that occupies us. Have they been verified? There is the question which, of course, has not been established to its fullest point. I have thought very hard on this subject and I am sending you the results of my research.

In France we have not heard much about Adamski. His books give no details about him personally. (Integrity, etc.) One could consequently judge only his books, of the various matters in them:

1st-The Photos: They are very interesting. I have showed them to various well-known experts, among them the Chief of Photography for the Bulletin of the Astronomical Society of France, a professor of the Optical Institute, and many other experts in the field of Photography. Their answers were always the same: "I cannot tell if they are real; what I can tell you, however, is that it is easy to make false photos identical to those of Adamski. So, they could be real, but it is impossible to prove it. It is impossible to know the truth. Far from being the real thing, you couldn't say that they weren't false, either. One of these people, to explain well, has added this: "Suppose you were to show me a cane and tell me that it belonged to Napoleon. How would I know if it were true? I have no way of knowing. It could belong to Napoleon, but you couldn't prove it, because anyone can present a cane under certain conditions (belonging to the period of Napoleon), and affirm that it was Napoleon's, and I couldn't prove against it. Adamski's photos belong to the same category. Only Adamski knows whether they are real or not. What I can tell you, however, is that with a bit of work, I can make identical photos to those of Adamski's and no one could prove anything against their authenticity, barring all possibilities of proof.

2nd-The Story Itself:(a) At the first look, it is very suspicious. Why? Because Adamski describes the Venusians on a human aspect, with legs, arms, eyes, ears, and hair, etc. On our earth, the people are very different (color, etc.) In the history of time, they are even more different. Neanderthal, Cro-Magnon, Sinensis, etc. The deduction that

seems to come from this is that the planet from which the Venusians come from is exactly the same as our earth, and that it had the same history, which ISN'T the case of Venus. (b) The Paleontology shows that there is an infinite variety of life on this earth and two identical beings have never been produced by different organs. This is one of the most certain laws of science. It is therefore impossible that beings born in a different evolution from that of human beings have the same human aspect. And, if the Venusians exist they couldn't in any way resemble the description Mr. Adamski gives them.

One could answer to this that the Venusians have attained a scientific level so high that they could change the forms of their bodies at will, and that they have taken the human form by coming among us. This discussion can go on endlessly. Because it is not certain that man is the most adaptable to our planets, and so the Venusians have no reason at all, on the contrary, to adapt the human form, etc. etc.

3rd-The most questionable thing in Adamski's book is that he wants to prove what he has seen, (pictures, sworn testimonies, etc.) As some of the scientists I have met have said, that if he really had had these extraterrestrial contacts he would have absolute and indisputable evidence. For instance, an unknown scientific fact, (cure for cancer) which would be very easily proved. Or, even better, for an example, a demonstration of the famous theory of Fermat that the mathematicians have lost in the 17th century, and that has never been found again. This theory has no use, since it can't harm man in any way. But this demonstration would prove undoubtedly Mr. Adamski's story.

In summary, I don't think much of Adamski's story. Apart from his respectability, his religious mind, of which you spoke, how can we tell? People that are equally respectable

and religious think Adamski hasn't seen anything. In this uncertainty, I choose to be open-minded as to what Mr. Adamski says, in the hope that he will give us proof, soon, and without difficulty. I'm sure he can, if he wants to, so that all this would prove to be true. Until then I reserve my judgment.


I met a seer.
