THE NEWS.....

Baltimore, Md.- "Carr sets date of Aho Moon flight!" Otis T. Carr, President of CTC Enterprises, Inc., told the Associated Press that he intends to go to the Moon on December 7, 1959. Carr will personally pilot and navigate his own craft, the OTC-X1, with the help of one other crewman, and will take Major Wayne S. Although we don't claim to know who wrote it, we shall prove once and for all that it is not from any Government agency in the U. S. As you may know, your editor is in connection with the U. S. Government, as has conclusive evidence to back his claims.

Washington D.C.- Mrs. Rose A. Cambell, former assistant to Major Keyhoe and NICAP, has finally left that organization, for the reason that Major Keyhoe refused to give equal investigation to "contact" reports. NICAP supposes that Mrs. Cambell will now conduct a campaign against NICAP. James Mosely, in his latest SAUCER NEWS, came out with a controversial article saying that NICAP would fall before the end of the year, and with it would fall CSI of New York.

Senator Goldwater, of Arizona, defeated his Democratic opponent in the elections Nov. 4, one of the few Republicans to win. Thank goodness we in saucerdom still have one of us in Congress. Senator Goldwater has openly come out with statements to the effect that he believes in the reality of flying saucers.

George Hunt Williamson, author of "Other Tongues-Other Flesh" and "Secret Places of the Lion", has just completed a British lecture tour, where he had an audience with the Queen and Prince Phillip. It was there that your editor had to inform him of his wife Betty's death in Lima, Peru August 11. Ric will pick up his small son this month in Indiana.

Your editor had an interesting interview with Dr. Lloyd V. Berkner, who is one of the men who signed the well-known document released early this year by the AP stating that saucers were not hostile. Many took this to mean that saucers existed, but Berkner, Chairman of the new Space Science Board, and Pres. of International Council of Scientific Unions, said that he didn't mean that at all, and that he believed saucers were a natural phenomena. He refused to comment on who formed the panel.

Propaganda from behind the Curtain- Radio Peiping said that "4% of the Voice of America's broadcasting time is devoted to slanderous and agitating propaganda against the Socialist countries." It also said that the Voice of America had an evil history, and that "its foreign propaganda programs are formulated by a 'advisory council' composed of a number of executives of industrial circles... (who) are representatives of two giant capitalists, Morgan and Rockefeller." This sounds a bit International Bankerish to us! We have, as our readers know, on our Staff, Associate Editor Dan Washburn, who is connected with the U. S. Information Agency, of which the Voice of America is an important part. I am sure that he can say that all the above is false and untrue. We are monitoring Radio Moscow and Peiping here in Geneva, and from time to time will publish transcripts of these.

A new book out on the stands has been attracting a lot of attention lately----The Pentagon Case, by Col. Victor J. Fox. Now in its 2nd and 3rd printings, this book has a lot for saucer fans in it.

Your editor attended the 2nd International Atoms-For-Peace Conference held in Geneva Sept. 1 - 14. Your editor had chats with many important dignitaries, among them Dag Hammarskjold, Secretary General of the United Nations. Lewis Strauss, Chairman of the US Delegation to that Conference, former AEC Chairman, and now new Secretary of Commerce, said that he thought "flying saucers are BUNK!". Also in Geneva, from the Warren Light Center, was Bill Dye. Your editor and he had a good time together. Much was learned at the Conference, and we hope to be able to publish the many photographs that we now have in the next issue.
