## NICAP exposes Air Force Cover-up

In a recent issue of the National Investigations Committee on Aerial Phenomena **UFO Investigator** (December, 1958), proof was disclosed that the Air Force has been deliberately issuing false information about UFO's, or flying saucers.

According to NICAP, this fact, long claimed by saucer investigators, was revealed by Mr. Buckley Griffin, chief of a Washington bureau of several New England newspapers. It was also discovered that Arthur Godfrey and Dave Garroway are co-operating with the Air Force in an official debunking program.

After investigating the UFO problem for four months, Mr. Griffin arrived at some startling conclusions, which he published in a series of articles for several newspapers. Mr. Griffin cited a few examples of this false information:

a) In the famous sighting of a cigar-shaped object by Eastern Air Lines Capt. C.S. Chiles and his co-pilot, both pilots repeatedly stated that their plane was rocked by the turbulence caused by the UFO; this was confirmed in an AF press released dated April 27, 1949 (a copy in NICAP files) and in 1955 by former AF chief of Project Bluebook Capt. Ruppelt. Now the Air Technical Information Center is flatly denying the former AF admission. An ATIC report given Mr. Griffin states: «No disturbance was felt from air waves; nor was there any wash or mechanical disturbance when the object passed.»

As Mr. Griffin points out, turbulence would be a significant factor in proving the object came close and was no hallucination. Apparently counting on the public's short memory, they might have gotten away with this debunking, but for Mr. Griffin's checking.

b) In the 1957 Levelland, Texas sighting of an egg-shaped object which reportedly stopped cars by electrical interference, the AF declared the object to be St. Elmo's Fire, and stated: «Object visible only a few seconds; not sustained visibility as has been implied.» This obviously false and misleading statement can be proved incorrect by merely examining the many witnesses' reports, including one by Sheriff Weir Clem, who stated (in a recorded phone conversation with **The Ufologer's** editor) that the object was observed up to five or more minutes. ## Ancient solar system model found

An interesting bit of news that has come to our attention is the discovery of a model of the solar system some 2000 years old. According to the Associated Press, the model was brought up in 1900 from a wrecked Greek ship of the first century B.C.; and was left in a museum, unnoticed until just recently.

«Finding a thing like this is like finding a jet plane in the tomb of King Tut,» said Dr. Derek Price of Cambridge, England. The object seems to represent a stage of technological development perhaps more advanced than that of Europe in the 18th century.

But then came the debunking squad: Dr. Franz Mohr, a retired professor of German at the University of Virginia, said the model was undoubtedly used in elementary schools in Austria around 1890.

However, Dr. Price proved his claims by pointing out that the model is covered with ancient Greek inscriptions. This would be rather unusual for an Austrian machine of 1890. Said Dr. Price, «There's no doubt it's authentic.»

The above item received a small covering in an English language newspaper published in Europe. But the significance is obviously great enough to cause a sudden and drastic change in the current theories pertaining to the Greek culture. But your editor hasn't noticed any such change — and is wondering why.

Scientifically, St. Elmo's Fire is projected from an object, such as a ship's mast, and cannot take off and land all over the place.

Finally, Mr. Griffin published (with the approval of Rep. Carl Vinson, Chairman of the House Armed Services Committee) part of a letter sent Mr. Vinson by a high Air Force official:

«We are attempting to get articles placed in the public magazines with large circulation, and both Arthur Godfrey and Dave Garroway have agreed to help us in our program to put the UFO subject in its proper perspective.»

We feel both Mr. Griffin and NICAP are to be highly commended for their work in exposing this underhanded maneuver, and for bringing in the «actual proof» skeptics so often demand.

## UFO's, men and government

Ufologists characteristically vent much ire toward «officialdom» for its refusal to make a long-awaited Announcement that flying saucers are piloted by men from other worlds. We seem to expect a fresh new epoch of happiness to begin as soon as everyone accepts UFO's and interplanetarianism. In this article I shall discuss some potential imports of UFO's for Earth, and our governments' probable public reactions to each of these possibilities. This analysis may provide some basis upon which to judge whether we should expect a UFO Announcement from officialdom.

(First, we must recognize the possibility, however slim we think it, that the UFO problem may have been dismissed legitimately by ATIC Investigators — or that the Air Force could actually be mistaken in its negative conclusions, honestly discrediting saucers even though they existed. In neither of these two circumstances could Ufologists expect a confirmatory Announcement from the United States, simply because the Pentagon would have nothing to announce.)

Perhaps the vast majority of saucer fans feel certain that extraterrestrials could not be hostile toward Earth. However, this remains to be proven. There are about as many «contact» stories which would attest to saucerian hostility, as vice-versa; but it is easy to suppress or dismiss these tales of fright, aggression, and downed planes as «imagination, misinterpretation, or hoax», while longing to believe contact stories which seem permeated with brotherly love and concern. The evident fact that «99 44/100 per cent» of the observed UFO's are «harmless» does not say a thing about a possible ultimate goal of hostility which might come to the horrible fore whenever their home base was able to send several thousand attack ships here. In the meantime, the «scouts» might be just feeling us out (Although realizing that UFO's have been spotted for centuries, I am herein discussing the major, and perhaps portentous, concentration of UFO's within the past 10—12 years), getting a line on our defences and (... con't page 2, column 1)

## Editorials...

The editor believes a few words of explanation are needed about **The Ufologer**: what it is doing, where, and how.

This is our first issue in some time: so long a time, in fact, that it makes us embarrassed just to think about it. But the reader must understand the rather abrupt change that took place in June, 1958: namely, the moving of the editor to Geneva, Switzerland. This in itself created many problems but at last we have been able to overcome them. But there is still one problem — a very serious one — which we have not been able to solve yet. It is this problem which shall be discussed here.

At the time of the last Giant Rock Convention, **The Ufologer** decided to take a chance, risky though it was, and invest a large sum of money in publishing many extra copies of the current issue. We counted on the fact that they would all be sold and that we would break even. Unfortunately, it did not work out thusly — and **The Ufologer** found itself in debt. It is still in debt. This is the reason for the delay in printing this issue: lack of funds. Therefore, your editor felt that in this issue he would make an announcement of **The Ufologer's** financial state; and leave it up to the readers whether or not they wished **The Ufologer** to continue. This issue is being done on credit — thereby indebting us further — and unless we can meet the deficit and get ourselves on our feet again... **The Ufologer** may have to cease publication.

We are relying therefore on the support of our readers — support which has been given in the past; we hope it will be given again now.

retaliatory abilities while carefully courting the illusion that we have nothing to fear from them.

For analogy, we might compare this supposed campaign with those of the Communists. For instance, some American correspondents in China during World War II reported that the Communist enclave in northern China was better-administered, less corrupt, and enjoyed greater popular support, than did Chiang's government. But from this comparatively beneficent beginning, the Chinese communists soon were able to take over all China and ruth-

## Inventions not used

According to the Associated Press, an article in **Pravda**, Soviet Communist newspaper, assailed bureaucracy, apathy and inefficiency, saying they were standing in the way of the development of inventions in the Soviet Union.

A special committee on inventions, which is under the Council of Ministers, was singled out for criticism in an article by D. Kiselev, a noted Soviet inventor and Stalin Prize-winner.

Mr. Kiselev demanded that the committee modernize its operations and prevent the stifling of inventions.

Many excellent inventions designed to increase efficiency and reduce costs of industrial operations never saw the light of day after the inventor submitted details to the committee, he complained.

«Despite the great number of inventions in our country,» he continued, «we so far do not have an intelligent, precise system for getting them into use.»

Mr. Kiselev recalled that one of his own inventions for the oil industry is still not used, although the press hailed it and a film was made about it.

This seems to be the same situation we have in the U.S. Very often one hears about a new invention which would benefit humanity — but it never seems to come into production. It is known, for instance, that a certain chemical company in the States has withheld certain inventions because they might destroy the market for certain other more profitable materials. But Phil Harris, of Houston, Tex., has started a new company for the production and development of New Age inventions. We hope to have more information on this in the future.

## Clue to UFO propulsion?

There should be no more doubt flying saucers are real and that they are made by intelligent beings from other planets. There is already enough evidence that people do not have hallucinations of these flying objects. Sightings have been recorded dating back to the 6th century before Christ. The transformation of matter into energy, as we call life in a broad sense, exists throughout the universe. In this ever-changing world there are many forms of life, from the atom to the super-human; each form of life well adjusted to its environment. Even in the 6th century B.C., the great prophet Ezekiel had been contacted by men from outer space; and his vision, so well described in the Bible, coincides fully with the sightings of recent years. Surely in the 6th century B.C. such spaceships could not have been built by earth people: they must have come from outer space.

The similarity in Ezekiel's accurate description and those of recent years is amazing; because when we compare them, we have a clue as to the make

lessly subjugate the peasants to the communist way. It would not be impossible, or even improbable, that a similar — though interplanetary — imperialist movement could subtly promulgate through authentic personal contact and thought transference, a powerful expression of love for Earth, the desire to «rescue» us, and an impression that other worlds are far ahead of Earth spiritually and want to help us toward their own concepts. The possible significance and goal of this tactic should be clear to those who wish to draw further analogy with the benign means communists may use to ingratiate themselves to an underdeveloped nation preparatory to gaining malignant control.

Actually, it seems rather improbable that the government has identified UFO's as hostile. Post-sputnik Congressional recriminations have emphasized that the United States had not been devoting its fullest energies to defence development, which would probably have gone more quickly if the Pentagon had felt compelled to prepare for war with both Russia and extraterrestrials. And in order to muster the fervor and appropriations necessary to prepare to battle extraterrestrials, the government would have found it necessary to make the American public acutely aware of the danger — just as Congress has been doing since sputnik in order to arouse us to spend more for missile defence against Russia. One essential to war and war preparations is that public fear and distrust be focussed sharply against the enemy. Since the Western defence chiefs have not been developing armament fast enough to stay ahead of even Russia alone, to say nothing of other planets; and since no nations have identified UFO's as hostile, then I conclude that government does not recognize UFO's as hostile. (However, the totalitarian bloc would be able to develop its armed defence against extraterrestrials much further than the democracies before finding it necessary to identify the new peril to its people.)

Hostile extraterrestrials might attempt to push the East-West conflict into an abortive hydrogen war and then easily take over a devastated and helpless world; they might align themselves with one coalition and aid in the destruction of the other, only to decimate the victorious Earth faction in turn; or they might use any other device of subterfuge and force in order to subvert Earth's energy and minds to its own ends. They surely would realize the rapid progress Russia and the U.S. are making in rocketry. If they intended to conquer Earth outright, the logical time would be now, before we perfected a large arsenal of solid-fuel missiles which might be efficacious against attacking UFO's.

(Of course, evidence may be adduced that both hostile and non-hostile UFO elements exists. Such duality would complicate the above hypotheses, especially if the two UFO elements were belligerent toward each other.)

## Book reviews...

WORLD ROUNDUP OF UFO SIGHTINGS AND EVENTS, by the **Flying Saucer Review**; Citadel Press, N.Y.C., 3.75 dollars, illustrated. This book, edited by the Hon. Brinsley le Poer Trench (editor of **F.S. Review**), is a 224 page collection of all the important sightings and events of 1956 and 1957. It is highly recommended by the editors as a reference book, as well as for plain reading. It is undoubtedly the best collection available for the years covered.

THE STRANGE CASE OF T. LOBSANG RAMPA, by Dana Howard; Llewellyn Publications, Los Angeles, 1.50 dollars, illustrated. This book, the only one ever written about the famous «Lama», is well worth reading. Containing not only the complete story about the «Lama», but also some interesting and enlightening studies of Universal Law, this book should be on every saucer fan's shelf.

FLYING SAUCERS AND THE STRAIGHT LINE MYSTERY, by Aimé Michel; Criterion Books, N.Y.C., 4.50 dollars, illustrated. Aimé Michel has brought out a fantastic new science which he calls «orthotenology» — the study of straight lines; the straight lines in this case being ones that line up saucer sightings all over France. This is one of the first really scientific books to come out — ones that are badly needed — and we consider it to be a tremendous asset to the saucer problem. Here, at last, is real, tangible evidence and proof which can be shown to skeptics. Your editors give this book their highest possible recommendation — an absolute must.

SECRET PLACES OF THE LION, by George H. Williamson; Neville Spearman, Ltd., London, 3.00 dollars. When the editor sat down to read this book, he found that it was impossible to stop reading it until the end. It is written in a style which captures the reader's interest and holds it throughout the book. The theories presented in it are fantastic — in the usual Williamson way — but very interesting. It is certainly different from any other book your editor has ever read. The book itself presents history the way Williamson believes it really happened — we highly recommend the book for interesting reading.

FLYING SAUCERS OVER SWITZERLAND by Lou Zinstag and Dr. T. Allemann; UFO-Verlag, Zurich, 80 cents, illustrated, in German. Presents all UFO sightings made over Switzerland from 1949 to 1958, and includes several interesting saucer photos. Highly interesting and informative.

In writing letters to Congressmen urging them to support full dissemination of UFO news, we might keep in mind that, even at this space-conscious time, lawmakers may unconsciously discredit the writer who appears too assured about flying saucers. It is naturally right that we should express both the irritation and the optimism we feel; however, we must consider the effect of our letters upon the Congressional recipients, and ask ourselves whether they would react better to a restrained letter pointing out suppression of information and only hinting at the possible significance of UFO's, or one charged with frustration and interplanetary prophecies.

and fuel of these «wheels» or «UFO's». The metal of the UFO's structure is described by Ezekiel in the following words: «The appearance of the wheels and their work was like unto the color of a beryl...» (Ezek. 1—16). The explanation of the Universal Standard Encyclopedia verifies: «Beryl consists chemically of beryllium aluminium silicate, and it is the chief commercial ore of beryllium. Beryllium is a gray metal, harder and more brittle than other common light metals. Beryllium tarnishes slightly in air, becoming covered with a thin layer of oxide. Pure beryllium is of importance in the field of atomic energy as a moderator and reflector in nuclear reactors.» (The reaction between phosphorus and oxygen reflected from beryllium = propulsion of UFO.)

Ezekiel then says further: «For the spirit of the living creature was in the wheels» (Ezek. 1—20). The latin word for spirit is **spiritus**, meaning breath. The breath of life is oxygen. Oxygen is a gaseous element and the most abundant of all the elements. It plays a great role in nature. Could it play a great role in the propulsion of spaceships? Oxygen can be condensed to a pale blue liquid, which is strongly magnetic and is used for artificial breathing. While it is already known that spaceships are powered by magnetism, it must be this magnetic power, then, that explains the stalling of cars and then cutting-off of car radios. «Oxygen combines vigorously with phosphorous causing it to ignite spontaneously (thus creating a tremendous force). Phosphorous is a crystalline, translucent, waxy solid with specific gravity which glows faintly in moist air.» — Universal Standard Encyclopedia. Phosphorous also changes colors depending on its exposure to heat, pressure and other elements.

The prophet Ezekiel's account of sighting such a crystalline object is indeed striking: «The color of the terrible crystal stretched forth over their heads above» (Ezek. 1—22). And further on he says: «And I saw the color of amber, as the appearance of fire round about within it...» (Ezek. 1—27). The display of many colors, the faint glow, the aurora borealis, the startling brightness, and the vapor trail has been described again and again in recent sightings. (The vapor trail is toxic.) Phosphorus turns light yellow when exposed to sunlight, thus accounting for the color of amber, as the appearance of fire round about within it.

When heated, phosphorus gives a white glow, and, when heated furthermore, it turns black. It is then no longer combustible, thus accounting for the sudden disappearances of flying lights.

**Weltraumbote**, one of the best saucer magazines published (unfortunately in German) will cease publication with its next issue, due to the editor's ill health caused by working for saucers so much. We are sorry to see a fine magazine leave.

## Flying saucers and the new age

Space ships are not incident to this age alone. Both history and tradition report their presence in centuries long gone from our day. However, their appearance in our age is an incident of major importance; one that concerns every human being living on this earth.

In order to get an understandable view of flying saucers and what they mean to us we need to get a historic prospectus which will enable us to see saucers in their relation to the history of the world and the race which now inhabits this earth.

The description of the elephant given by the seven blind men was inadequate and misleading. None of them saw the elephant and each of them described it according to that part which each came in contact with. This story is typical of much human thinking and reasoning, and it will give no better picture of flying saucers than the blind men gave of the elephant.

This civilization which promised so much a half century ago is now bent on destruction. The inventive genius of the world is now working overtime to find more effective ways to kill and destroy. There is nothing in the present setup to indicate that the powers that be will bring us into a new and better age.

Let us take a brief look at the past half century. Sure, we destroyed Hitler's military power, we toppled Mussolini, and wrecked the machine of Japan; and now we live in mortal fear of our major ally Russia, who helped us to do it. ## The flying saucer scene in the United States

Part III

In the last issue of *The Ufologer* we discussed the various classifications into which we might group the people in the flying saucer field and the methods they used to fulfill their positions. We mentioned the concept of «light centers», saying, «...they are being gathered together all over the US. The space people have termed these groups «light centers» because, they say, when groups of people are discussing saucers and kindred subjects, they actually create a vortex of light which is visible to the UFO's in the sky above.»

Keeping this in mind, let us for a minute seemingly digress to consider a topic of current debate in the UFO field. There are some who are putting a great deal of emphasis on the «materiality» of physical natures of their particular contacts and in some instances implying that those claiming other methods of communication are hoaxers or characterize them as being «self deluded». No doubt the UFO field has not escaped the hoaxer or the self deluded, but to imply this in such a way that it more or less blankets the field seems unreasonable. The reality of mental contact (ESP) has been firmly established as possible to a good degree of accuracy by psychical research. Also, if we may believe that the visitors from space are highly advanced in their technology, then certainly there is a probability that they are able to communicate or intensify communications on the mental level, i.e., amplify the frequencies of thoughts. It has been said that the brain is one of the best mechanical transmitters and receivers we could possibly have. Thus there is firm basis for us to consider the probability of communications from space on a mental level. The next point to be desired is evidence that such has taken place. If we can firmly establish that it has taken place consistently with one individual then we can assume that other reports of this nature warrant our attention, and that certainly the one that has proved itself warrants study by all serious students of the space craft.

The second point of contention in the materialist arguments is concerning the ships themselves. There has been much controversy between those who felt that the space craft were entirely «etheric» or «physical». This entire question is a rather important one at present and the dissonance created by the controversy has done much damage to the flying saucer field; so much so that at present we must be

come aware of it and attempt to settle the dispute with an understanding of the actual facts. From talking with many people well versed in physics, metaphysics, UFO's and other fields, I have found that almost all agree on this point. They agree that the ships are of **necessity** etheric-material! They are not one or the other, but both; and in fact could not function as true space ships unless they were. It is a matter of frequency. (To be continued next issue — Ed.)
