# UFO COVER - UP IS OVER...

**The Air Force has revealed that the bodies of nine space aliens were recovered from the wreckage of three flying saucers that crashed in New Mexico — more than 20 years ago!**

The shocking disclosure of a widespread government cover-up came to light with the recent declassification of top-secret reports on UFO activity in America.

The documents — especially those dealing with the three downed spaceships — pose damning evidence that the FBI, CIA, National Security Agency, as well as the Air Force, went to great pains to keep the truth about UFO activity from the American people!

The documents are among those obtained by the persistent prodding of the highly respected Fund for UFO Research in Mount Rainier, Md.

They detail a number of unusual events in the Southwest, but one of the most astonishing is the one revealed in a 1950 FBI document.

It declares that Air Force investigators assigned to the "Project Blue Book" UFO probe reported that three so-called flying saucers had been recovered in New Mexico. The

spaceships were circular in shape, 500 feet in diameter and with raised centers — the exact configuration described in many of the hundreds of UFO reports received by private investigation agencies each year.


"Each was occupied by three bodies of human shape but

only three feet tall, dressed in metallic cloth of a very fine texture," the document said.

"Each body was bandaged in a manner similar to the black-out suits worn by speed fliers and test pilots."

And the documents speculate that the saucer-shaped spacecraft had crashed be-

cause of high-powered government radar that probably interfered with the "controlling mechanism of the saucers."

Officially, the Air Force closed the cover on Project Blue Book in 1969, after investigating 12,618 reported UFO sightings dating back to 1947.

Air Force spokesman Lt. George Jamison conceded that 701 sightings were not — or could not be — explained.

But a top-secret National Security Agency report written in 1968 tells a different story.

"The fact that UFO phenomena have been witnessed all over the world ... by consider-

able numbers of reputable scientists has indicated rather strongly that UFOs are not all hoaxes."

The report also carried a grim warning that disregarding a possible UFO threat could prove dangerous to the security of life on Planet Earth.

"If UFOs, contrary to all indications and expectations, are, indeed, hoaxes — hoaxes of worldwide dimension — hoaxes of increasing frequency, then a human mental aberration of alarming proportions would appear to be developing."

# UFOs DRIVE BIRDS NUTS

**UFO ACTIVITY is jamming the radar of homin pigeons and dozens of the valuable birds have been lost forever, frustrated owners complain.**

An alarmed breeder who lives near the top secret Pease Air Force Base in New Hampshire told the SUN:

"I've lost about 15 of my best birds — and every time it happens I find out there's been UFO activity around the Air Force Base."

Breeders of racing pigeons in other parts of the country where UFO reports are common have also reported frequent loss of birds — and they're convinced that there is a connection.

## Research

Several organizations of pigeon fanciers are donating to a research project at Cornell University in upstate New York where scientists are seeking to unravel the mysterious phenomena that causes homing pigeons to become disoriented in certain areas.

The study team is zeroing in on areas in the state around the city of Hornell, and the Tug Hill region of Cattaraugus county, leading to speculation by senior research assistant Irene Brown that some valley surrounded by magnetic hills might possibly be confusing the pigeons.

"If we have funds, we'd like to spend a lot of time in the Hornell area," she said. "It seems to be a mystical place."

Miss Brown said that magnetism seems to be the

most obvious cue for homing pigeons, but their ability most likely is tied to a complicated combination of many factors.

Tests are underway by the researchers to determine how important smells, solar flares and solar wind are to the baffling navigational skills of the birds.

The New Hampshire pigeon breeder is convinced that the pigeons are innocent victims of deliberate efforts to confuse sophisticated tracking equipment at top secret military bases, which UFO are believed to be spying on.


## Returned

"A couple of my pigeons were returned to me by people who found them weeks after they were lost, and they're no good any more," he said. "I tried sending them up and they flew around in circles."

"They were completely disoriented. They were two of my best birds, but something very strange has happened to them — and you can bet that it has something to do with those UFOs."

Until the responsible parties face up to the possibility they may be doing harm to the pigeons, the hapless owners will continue to see the birds unable to function properly.

# UFOs terrorize White House

**UFOs SO terrorized our nation's capital that the president had it all hushed up to avoid causing panic among the populace.**

The mysterious alien spacecraft were first spotted by the pilot of a supersonic F94 jet interceptor as he was soaring over the District of Columbia.

Korean War veteran Lt. William Patterson threw a switch in his fighter to give it an explosive thrust as he soared over Washington. The fierce acceleration rammed him flat against his seat, leaving him motionless.

"I've got one bogie at ten miles and closing fast," Patterson radioed back to the air traffic controllers at Washington's National Airport.

The massive jet engines whined at full speed and blazed a trail toward the unidentified target.

Just as Patterson was closing in to within a distance of two miles, the object disappeared into the thick, misty air. The radar operator confirmed the object had suddenly vanished from the radar screen.

"It just flew right off the scope," recalls the radar operator. "I didn't even see it change its position. It just evaporated. It's the most remarkable thing I've ever seen in my life."

That was just one of many unexplained incidents in Washington that month. UFO invasions became a nightly event.

"Most of the sightings involved lights over the capitol building," according to noted UFO expert Dr. Allen Hynek.

## CHAOS IN CAPITAL HUSHED UP

### Sightings

"Pilots coming into National Airport reported them, but the Air Force tried to dismiss the sightings as weather inversions."

According to official reports, the lights were some sort of mirage caused by a

sudden blanket of warm, cloudy air coming in from over the Gulf of Mexico and settling over the eastern seaboard.

"There have been a lot of weather inversions like that since," notes Hynek. "But there has never been another incident of pilots seeing those kind of lights."

The UFO researcher claims the only explanation for these lights that makes any sense whatsoever is a visitation from outer space.

"You must remember, though, at that time people did not believe in UFOs. And there probably would have been a national panic if the government said beings from outer space were visiting the capital," he comments.

"Also, people at that time were not as distrustful of the government as they are today," adds Hynek noting that back in the '50s people believed anything the government said whether it made sense or not.

Today, the government could never get by with this type of coverup, he claims.

According to some reports, by the middle of July, a number of air traffic controllers had recorded these objects traveling at speeds of up to 7,000 mph, and they

were regularly passing through the prohibited air space above the White House.

"If the public had been informed of this, it would have been a national disaster," comments one government official who recalls the incident.

### Baffled

President Harry Truman himself was reported annoyed by the constant light show and finally told his security officers to find out "what the hell is going on out there!"

Finally, after nearly an entire month of sightings and illogical explanations for what was going on, the government's chief expert on UFOs, Captain Edward J. Ruppelt, was ordered to investigate the 1952 sightings.

Like every other objective observer of the mysterious lights, Ruppelt admitted he was baffled and mystified by these unusual sightings.

Then on the nights of July 19 and 20, the most amazing spectacle took place.

Air control operators insisted they were picking up solid objects on their screens, and they were warning pilots about to take off to keep an eye out for anything unusual.

As one pilot was clearing from the airspace over National Airport, he radioed back to the tower, "Yep, there is one. It looks like a solid ball of light, and it's just to the right of me."

Then the object took off at lightning speed. By the time the pilot had climbed to his cruising altitude, he had reported seeing at least six more lights that were identical to the first one.

Ground controllers saw a huge fiery orange sphere that vanished without a trace within a couple of seconds.

### Radar

"The craft appeared on three radar station screens," says the air traffic controller.

For ten more days, the sightings continued. These bizarre objects were seen not only by pilots and radar watchers, but also by people living around the Air Force bases near the capital.

In spite of public affirmation that something extraterrestrial must be happening in the sky over Washing-

ton, the official Pentagon report glossed over the possibility that the UFOs were anything other than meteorological mirages.

They were officially classified as "unknown."

One government official who became a top administrator in the Federal Aviation Agency comments that he always believed there was something from another world in the sky that July.

"We were definitely get-

ting a return on the radarscopes, and only a solid object can do something like that," he says.


"I don't intend to shoot down any official reports, but I took the position then and I take it now — we were watching something."

Controversy over the government's handling of this series of sightings led to the founding of the Air Force Project Blue Book.

# Space Aliens Terrorize Tiny Mountain Village



**FRIGHTENED VILLAGERS** threw stones at tall aliens in shimmering suits, but the rocks didn't harm the bizarre visitors.

A huge hat-shaped UFO and two towering space aliens — who can leap high into the sky like Superman — have been terrorizing a small rural village, reveal stunned eyewitnesses.

In one incredible incident, frightened villagers hurled rocks at the spacemen, described as almost seven feet tall — and the aliens suddenly shot straight up into the air and disappeared.

Even the town's mayor and police officials confirm the terrifying encounters.

The bizarre events began to unfold last March 2 and 3, when residents of Ckolo, a tiny Andean Mountain village in southern Bolivia, saw a huge UFO with flashing lights streaking across

the sky. Witnesses said the eerie object was shaped "like a sombrero."

Then on March 4 the aliens made their startling appearance.

"I was walking home from work," Juan de Dios Condori told The ENQUIRER, "when I heard my wife and kids screaming in terror."

"I ran toward my home — and saw two beings at my front door. They surely weren't human beings.

"They were each more than 6½ feet tall, and wearing silvery suits that shone with blinding brilliance.

"I yelled out to them. The two beings turned around and started approaching me slowly. I screamed for help.

"My neighbors came running. About 10 of us formed a circle around the two giants and we started throwing rocks at them. They showed no signs of pain, although we stoned them for three minutes.

"Suddenly the two of them leaped up. We saw only a slight motion of their legs, as if to jump. But they went straight up, like they were floating.

"We could still see their shiny suits and silhouettes when they were about 60 feet high. Then they simply disappeared."

That night, like the two previous nights, a hat-shaped UFO hovered over the village, then whizzed away at incredible speed. People in four other area villages reported it, and police from the city of Potosi investigated the sightings.

A university student who assisted the police investigating team, Rosario Carreno Mulch, told The ENQUIRER: "While I was helping police interview the villagers, the UFO passed through the town and was visible to everyone. It moved faster than anything that exists here on Earth."


Maj. Williams Fernandez Teran of the Potosi Police Dept. told The ENQUIRER: "A large luminous object, about 50 yards in diameter, has been seen by our investigators."

Potosi Mayor David Vila Gonzalez added: "Official investigations have proven that UFOs are appearing in the sky over our villages."

# UFOs kidnap 18 planes

**A SECRET UFO base in the Arctic is responsible for the mysterious disappearance of 18 aircraft that have vanished without a trace since 1978, according to experts, who say the aliens fear being detected.**

The Canadian government's Search and Rescue (SAR) division is at a complete loss to explain the disappearances.

But top experts in the field, such as Nigel Dempster of the University of Northern Manitoba and Oliver Shillings of the Institute of Northern Studies in Edmonton, Alberta, have other ideas.

"It's the only possible logical explanation for the disappearances," says Dempster.

The SAR, with an annual budget of \$134,000,000, has spent millions of dollars on vain search missions by aircraft equipped with the latest in search and rescue technology.

Their pilots have gone over the great, barren Canadian northland with a fine-toothed comb and come up empty handed, despite the fact that some of the missing aircraft had emergency transmitters to guide rescuers to them.

## Evidence

"Although many may laugh at the idea, there is a lot of solid evidence to support the theory that UFOs have kidnapped the aircraft," says Shillings.

"When you consider that

there have been countless reports of the same type of occurrence from all over the world, it is an almost inescapable conclusion that this is the work of UFOs. We say there's a base up there because of the scale of the operations."

Dempster and Shillings agree that the motive behind the kidnappings may be that the aliens seize the aircraft in mid-flight to protect the base from discovery.

## ALIENS SNATCH AIRCRAFT RIGHT OUT OF THE AIR

This would also help explain why no trace of any of the planes has ever been found.

"We all know the aliens to be quite secretive, so it comes as no great shock that they would go to any length to protect their hideaway," says Dempster.

Consider just a few of the still unsolved cases:

- Two Royal Canadian advanced CF-104 Starfighters disappeared December 3, 1982, near Cold Lake, Alberta. Radio communication had been perfectly normal until they mysteriously

vanished into thin air.

- A float plane carrying a hockey player and a dentist en route to a fishing trip in the far north of Ontario has never been heard or seen of since disappearing August 26, 1951.

- Two men in a four-seater Commander Aircraft vanished in November, 1977, near Marathon, Ontario, en route to a crane repairing job in Ontario's desolate

northern wasteland.

• Two men in a Piper Cub that vanished were last seen refueling at a stop in Northern Ontario on September 16, 1973, before continuing their flight north.

Dempster and Shillings have gone over all the records of the vanished aircraft, the government's SAR operations and interviewed those close to the men who disappeared.

Their conclusions are these:

• In every instance, the planes that disappeared could have posed a grave security risk to the UFO base.

• There was no threat of mechanical failure to any of the planes, and each plane had ample fuel supply.

• There was perfect flying weather on the day of each disappearance.

• The government could be concealing information about the disappearances so as not to alarm people about the existence of the base.

The case of the two CF-104 Starfighters is of particular concern to Dempster and Shillings.

The planes were equipped with the latest and most sophisticated devices to aid in locating the aircraft should they be lost.

The two pilots both had

more than 1,000 hours each logged in those planes. Emergency signals would have been transmitted both on radio and radar. Ejection would also have automatically sounded an emergency on an ultra-high international distress radio frequency.

The Starfighter also has an underground acoustic beacon triggered by water. Special equipment was flown to Cold Lake immediately after the disappearance of the two aircraft and lowered through the lake ice, but to no avail.

Dempster and Shillings believe the UFO base may be

a surveillance base that alien use to monitor human behavior and culture.

"I think they're keeping an eye on us so we don't blow ourselves to kingdom come," says Dempster, co-author with Shillings of 'Earthwatch' (Octagon Press).

"The Arctic is the perfect place for the aliens to set up shop, as no one but the Eskimos — and a few stray airplanes — would be likely to see them."

The two rescuers are petitioning the government to send the SAR to the North Pole to locate the secret base

Vazquez, who is overseeing construction of the structure, said the lights will help the extraterrestrial spaceships land on top of the mountain.

The small airport will also have a center to administer natural medicine to local residents.

"This place was chosen by the extraterrestrials themselves so they could come to the earth. This was communicated to members of the group during telepathy sessions," said Vazquez.

The UFO watchers say the area surrounding Oriental is frequented by strange, luminous phenomena.

"I often see brilliant red objects at night that pass and then disappear," said the mayor of the nearby town of Oriental, Antonio Luterillo Hernandez, who said he was not sure the curious things were beings from another planet.

The futurologists also planted about 70 seeds inside the airport. They said extraterrestrial beings gave the seeds to peasants Guadalupe Flores and Pedro Miranda last November.

The seeds allegedly produce a highly nutritious vegetable "that was a gift of the space brothers to combat world hunger," said Vazquez.

The seeds were shown during the press last March during an international

## Building of Mexican UFO airport begins

ORIENTAL, Mexico — Occultists began building the first UFO airport in Latin America Saturday near Mexico City in an attempt to entice extraterrestrial beings to land in their country.

Witches marked spots on the site of the airport, 80 miles south of Mexico City on the slopes of Oriental Mountain, where they said red lights would signal to

spaceships from other galaxies.

# Scientists discover crashed UFO in Antarctica

**With 5 dead  
aliens aboard**



# THEY'RE HERE!

**THE FROZEN bodies of five dead aliens from outer space have been found encased in eerie coffins of ice in the barren wilderness of the Antarctic.**

Charred and shattered chunks of the spacecraft that carried the unfortunate visitors from the stars to their icy deaths were scattered for nearly a mile near the site where it finally came to rest.

"It was an incredible scene of destruction," confided an awed physicist who was among the team of scientists who discovered the aliens and the crashed UFO.

"Reconstruction of the wreck indicates that the spaceship struck a huge column of ice a glancing blow, then skipped end over end across the frozen landscape — breaking apart and tossing out the occupants.

"A couple of the aliens were badly torn up, but the other three bodies are in good shape — and are perfectly preserved by the ice."

## Mysterious

Although excited scientists from several nations are known to have had a look at the mysterious star people, their governments have clamped a lid of secrecy on the story to prevent a world panic over fears of an invasion by creatures from outer space.

The SUN's informant reluctantly consented to talk after he was confronted with known details of the case — but only on condition that his identity be protected.

The earth-shaking discovery occurred late last summer as a team of scientists were searching the forbidding continent near the South Pole for meteorites.

More than 5,000 of the precious bits of rock have been recovered from the chilly region of translucent blue ice during the past 20 years, more than doubling the num-



ber of known meteorites available to the world's scientists.

It is not only the large number of meteorites that are being found in Antarctica's frozen wastes that is exciting scientists however, but the surprising variety.

Two specimens recently recovered from the forbidding sheet of ice are believed to have come from Mars.

Now the amazing discovery of aliens and the wreckage of what unquestionably was their spaceship, has added a new dimension to the scientific quest for knowledge.

## Surprising

The remains of the space men were described as surprisingly human like.

According to the physicist, they were all males and have unusually large heads that would be grossly out of proportion on a human body — "probably three times the size you would expect."

The eyes were described as having an "oriental slant," the mouths were human-like, with 32 teeth, slightly pointed ears that were well proportioned to the size of the head — and nostrils but no noses.

The bodies, averaging about four feet tall, were described as slender, with arms, legs, feet, and hands similar to those of humans.

The informant said the flesh had a slight bluish tinge to it, but it hasn't been determined if that is their nor-

mal color or if the quick freezing is responsible.

"And I know it sounds incredible, but one of the unfortunate little fellows had what appears to be the worst case of acne I've ever seen," he added. "His face looked like my teenager's."

He said that close scientific analysis of the bodies has been held up because of bickering between scientists and government officials from the United States, USSR, Japan and Argentina.

"An American team made the discovery, but it's become a hot political football because of conflicting claims to the Antarctic or areas of the continent," he explained.

## Settlement

Concerned about the possible consequences, he refused any further discussion of the political aspects surrounding the amazing discovery.

Other informants indicate, however, that the tiny corpses remain in the Antarctic near the crash site and are unlikely to be moved until some settlement is reached between the nations.

## 'I was chased by alien,' claims girl

A 17-year-old Tyrone girl claims she's been chased by an ET-type space alien.

And last night her father, an Ulster aristocrat-turned-author, told Sunday News: "Aliens may have landed here, and an ET-type creature could be walking among us."

Desmond Leslie, one of the famous family who live in Castle Leslie at Glaslough, not far from Caledon, Co Tyrone, has told us that his 17-year-old daughter Samantha has been chased by a UFO.

"It was a most frightening experience for Samantha," he said last night. "Her mother heard a hysterical scream and discovered that she had been pursued from the basement up to the ground floor by this thing which was like a ball of light.

"Her description of it was identical to that of the small flying saucer in Close Encounters — But she saw this thing before she saw the film." The pulsing ball of light gave Samantha a violent electric shock before disappearing.

According to Mr Leslie, his daughter's close encounter happened within two hours of his appearance on a radio phone-in programme about extra terrestrial (ET) beings.

"The timing of it was most peculiar," he said. "I believe there was some connection with what I had been saying in the radio."

Mr Leslie said the thing described by Samantha was similar to a device which had been discovered in a field in America.

"This ball of light had

become a metal sphere when it cooled down. It was examined by the astronomer Professor Alan Hynick who discovered that it had three magnetic poles when he used a process of high voltage X ray examination on it.

"But, when it was handed over to the U.S. Naval Research Laboratory in Washington it promptly disappeared and we don't know what has happened to it."

Both Mr Leslie and his wife Helen believe the strange lights reported over Lough Neagh earlier this year may have come from objects from outer space.

"I have seen flying saucers while on holiday in France," said Mrs Leslie. "On one occasion near Nice as I was coming home after having a drink in a local pub I saw

strange lights in the mountains. They certainly weren't aircraft or anything that could be explained by natural phenomenon.

"The locals in that part of France are well used to seeing strange things in the night sky. There is a sort of Bermuda triangle around there which they just accept."

And her husband says strange things can be seen in the Ulster sky.

"The famous orange ball which is seen over Lough Erne from time to time has never been explained. It may be some natural occurrence, but no one has yet given a satisfactory explanation, yet it has been seen scores of times."

Desmond Leslie, author of the well-known book "Flying Saucers Have Landed" says the Ulster

skies are not good for sighting UFOs.

"There is too much mist and low cloud about for most of the year. That's why there are few reports about UFOs locally, but it doesn't mean they are not there."

The author also believes that aliens are living among us — having taken on human form.

And he says that many of our ancestors could have been extra terrestrial beings.

"I know a chap who met a man who drew an absolutely perfect circle with a fountain pen. It was done in a way that no human hand could have done it," said the author.

"I believe there are a lot of people like that around — so far above the run-of-the-mill type person that one must suspect their origins."

## KIDNAP VICTIM WAS 'OUT OF THIS WORLD'

A HOUSEWIFE who caused a sensation with her claim that she was kidnapped by UFOs 15 years ago says she is still being visited by creatures from out of this world.

And Mrs Betty Anderson's amazing story has been supported by witnesses, including a disbelieving policeman who was flabbergasted by the weird things he saw when he investigated the case.

Mrs Anderson claims that a creature who looked like the creature in the film ET suddenly appeared by her bed.

She also says that technical formulae for gases, metals and other pieces of scientific data are sent to her by thought waves.

Balls of light fly through the air at her Connecticut home, electrical things like washing machine and TV start to work without being switched on, and venetian blinds open and close without being touched.

Mrs Anderson says one of the

creatures appeared at the side of her bed one night. It had a large head and wide eyes. It looked a bit like the creatures who were in the space ship that abducted me in 1967, but it was different."

The first encounter she had with the aliens came when she was whisked away from her former home, she claims. After being taken into a space craft she was given a number of painful examinations, and the aliens told her that information they had locked away in her mind would come back to her.

Since then she has been able to produce all sorts of complicated scientific knowledge.

Later, she was given tests while she was under hypnosis, and she managed to relate more details to UFO expert Raymond Fowler.

And police officer Larry Fawcett who probed the affair has seen some of the strange things connected with it.

"I grilled this woman and found I couldn't shake her story," he said.

# UFO seen by 2 men in Springs

They don't care if anyone believes them. But they do want to know if anyone else saw the immense flying triangle that made their flesh crawl for seven seconds Saturday night.

Russell Hughes and Tommy Holland said they reported to the North American Aerospace Defense Command post Sunday that they'd seen the UFO fly over their Palmer House Motel room at Interstate 25 and Fillmore Street.

"The stars are different now. Every night since then, I sneak out and take a look at the sky," said Hughes, the chief executive officer of the Scherling Film Club of Denver, rolling his eyeballs.

"Ha! I have been doing that, too," said Holland, a salesman with the company. "I want to see it again."

The two talked about the UFO Wednesday night. The men are Denver-area residents in Colorado Springs on business, selling their company's film processing services out of two motel rooms.

Hughes and Holland gave this account of what happened Saturday.

At 9:30 p.m., they took a break from the stream of customers and strolled outside onto the lawn. It was a clear night.

"I said to Russ, 'Look at those five jets over there,'" said Holland. "Did you ever see any in such a perfect pattern?"

"They are really moving," said Hughes. The five white lights were very dim, he said, and were flying in a V-shaped formation.

Then, when the lights were overhead, both men noticed something.

"It wasn't five jets. It was five lights on one thing," said Hughes.

"It blocked out two stars of the Little Dipper at one time."

Hughes said it was a huge aircraft of some kind, "so black it was like a cave, only triangular."

Holland said, "There was no noise, no jet trail."

Hughes held his arm out straight, and put his hand facing the UFO. The outline of his hand wouldn't fit inside the triangle, he said.

"It was as big as 10 747s," he said. "As big as a city block. I was stunned."

The lights were visible for about seven seconds, said Hughes, from the time they appeared on one horizon to the time they vanished on the other.

"I said to Tommy, 'Did you see that?'" said Hughes. Holland said the same thing to Hughes. They stood outside for several minutes, then dashed inside.

One of the customers was a lieutenant colonel at Fort Carson. He told Hughes and Holland to write a statement about what they'd seen to give to NORAD.

"We even had to have it notarized," said Hughes. He gave it to a NORAD official Sunday, he said.

Are they worried about people believing them?

"I am not one of these kooks in the Ozarks that will tell you they went up in one of these things. I know that if I said there were bright lights and they were on a saucer, more people would believe me. But that's not what I saw."

An Army veteran, Hughes said, "I have seen MIGs in Korea, weather balloons, 747s. The only explanation I could dream up as to what it could have been is someone made a kite as big as a city block, put five battery lights on it, and somehow it traveled 2,500 miles an hour or more in a perfect pattern.

"I will take any polygraph test, or sodium pentathol, or any test you want. I know what I saw."

The two said they hadn't been drinking and were not taking any type of drug at the time.

"The main thing I want to know is if anyone else saw this," said Holland.

# Hundreds Watch Massive UFO

<sup>1124</sup> A monstrous UFO — “bigger than two football fields” — was seen by more than 200 people as it soared through the skies over Wales.

The silent spacecraft, dazzling in its brilliance and trailed by a smaller UFO, was described by various witnesses as banana-shaped, triangular or shaped like a boomerang.

The incredible sighting around 6 p.m. last January 19 was one of the best-witnessed UFO incidents in Great Britain, according to Ian Mrzygold, a spokesman for the British UFO Research Assn.

Two Welsh police officers, Detective Constable Gethin James and Detective Sgt. Michael Troake, watched the gigantic UFO for almost 10 minutes as it flew over Morriston, a town near Cardiff, Wales.

“It was the most incredible thing I’ve ever seen,” declared Constable James. “It was very, very big — bigger than two football fields.

“We first saw a mass of lights, maybe a half-mile long, about 3,000 feet up. It was moving in a straight line. The unusual thing about the object was that it was quiet. There was no sound at all.

“If an aircraft had been flying that low, I would have heard something. It was very strange not to hear anything.

“As it passed overhead, we were able to see a second craft following the larger one. The smaller one was about the size of a British Vulcan bomber (about the size of a Boeing 747 jumbo jet).

“There were so many





it was impossible to see its shape clearly. The lights nearly blinded me. But it was elongated.

“I could see the smaller object. It was in the shape of a V, and as it passed over I could see three lights — one on the nose, which was a steady light, and one flashing light on each tip of the V. The lights were all white, but not as bright as the ones on the big ship. Both objects moved in perfect unison.

“Suddenly they abruptly

“And the reports they wrote were similar, too.”

Amanda Lewis, 6, described the UFO as “a triangle of flashing orange lights.”

Jonathan Hutchins, 7, observed: “It was sort of banana-shaped, with lights on it, and it moved funny.”

And Mark Lee, 7, added: “It was boomerang-shaped, with lights on the tips, lights

in the middle and they were flashing. If you looked straight up at it, the lights probably would have blinded you.”

According to Constable James, the Royal Air Force station at West Drayton, Wales, reported that there was no aircraft in the vicinity at the time of the UFO sightings.

# UFO?

## Some folks think so

**KINGSTON** — A suspected unidentified flying object sighted along the Hudson River was no more than a tight formation of four planes doing maneuvers, according to a student pilot who was monitoring the planes on his aviation radio.

The alleged UFO, described as bigger than an airplane, had four groups of lights of red, green, orange and white and seemed to be rotating, according to John Kuhn, a Kingston resident and IBM programmer who reported seeing it at 9:30 Wednesday night.

Kuhn said the object was flying lower than a plane, about helicopter level. He spotted it as he was driving along Route 32 from Saugerties to Kingston near the IBM recreation center.

But Warren DuBois, a student pilot who works in the parts department at Colonial Lincoln-Mercury and lives in Port Ewen, said he saw four distinct airplanes and heard maneuvers being broadcast over his radio between 124 and 125 megacycles.

"They made a few series of slight turns. I listened to them ... about eight minutes," said DuBois. He said the planes made several banks toward the right before flying south down the Hudson at about a 1,500 foot altitude.

Kuhn said he called the Sheriff's Department and was told it was an aircraft owned by a government agency that maps the weather in the first five days of the month. Similar (See UFO, page 5)

Interest in UFOs and life from other planets has risen again with the block buster movie, ET. Against all the odds, he is a star. His image is implanted on hundreds of posters and dolls and he is the delight of children the world over.

But is there a more sinister purpose behind ET?

Was he created simply to entertain the human race or was he created to prepare the human race for more of his kind?

As unbelievable as that may sound, an amazing number of people do agree with that theory.

The Earl of Clancarty, chairman of the all-party UFO study group in the English House of Lords is one such advocate.

The earl claims that real extra-terrestrials have already landed on Earth and the world's superpowers know all about them but are keeping the knowledge secret.

He has accused the American, British and Russian governments of a cover-up where UFOs

are concerned.

"There is a race by the super-powers to find out how UFOs work and that is why there is a big cover-up," he said.

One of the Earl's more startling claims is that President Dwight Eisenhower met aliens by arrangement at the US Edwards air force base in 1953.

Eisenhower decided that the aliens were so advanced that the world was not ready for open contact.

"The aliens suggested an education programme should be put in hand to prepare the way," the earl said.

"I believe ET and Close Encounters of the Third Kind are part of that education programme."

Dr Cyril Ponnamperuma, a top NASA advisor and leading scientist in America, is convinced of the fact.

"The large head and brain area would indicate high intelligence. And it would be sensible to have two large eyes and not just one, for stereoscopic vision," he said.

"The colour of the skin would probably depend on the environment he came from and so would the size and shape of his body.

"I don't think we should be too surprised at all if we landed on another planet and a little fellow like ET came over and put his hand out in greeting."

But NASA scientists and British politicians are not the only ones who believe in UFOs and life from other planets and UFOs.

Right here in WA there are groups and organisations which actively expound their belief in Ufos through group meetings and serious data collecting.

The Perth UFO Research Group (PUFORG) is one such group and the WA Science Fiction Association is another.

The latter is holding a convention in Perth from January 28 to 31.

Members of the association will discuss parallel worlds, future wars, medicine and ETs.

The convention will have panels on specialis-

ed subjects, emphasising their scientific nature.

The panels will examine the work carried out in the past on contact with other intelligent worlds.

Three years ago the right of an ET if it landed on earth were discussed at length.

It was decided that an ET would have no rights at all.

If an ET landed, anyone was entitled to

kill it and seize its equipment.

A startling and controversial decision.

In February the space flight operations manager for the NASA shuttle programme, Mr John Schuessler, will visit Australia on a lecture tour.

Mr Schuessler, will discuss space technology and space war, death-ray technology, and the need for a global approach to solving mankind's problems in areas such as welfare, energy resources, environment, food production, population control, and the current world-wide economic depression.

Also to speak on tour is Perth-based scientist and author, Stan Deyo,

who organised Mr Schuessler's visit.

Mr Deyo's book the Cosmic Conspiracy has become a best seller in Australia with sales already exceeding, 60,000 copies.

The book predicted the present rising unemployment,

economic chaos, energy shortages and rising food prices as a result of both a global conspiracy and unavoidable climatic changes.

It also predicted that a global economic depression would begin around 1982 and would cause the people of the world to submit to a new economic order which would be implemented by a global dictatorship.

# UFO—new reports are coming in

**SOMETHING strange is going on in the night sky, and puzzled residents want to get to the bottom of the mystery.**

A huge bright ball of orange light is reported by several people to have been hovering over homes and lighting up bedrooms with a blaze of light.

Now others, who thought they were "just seeing things," have also come forward following a report in some *Kentish Times* editions last week of sightings on April 27.

There is growing pressure for an investigation.

Centre of activities has been Bickley and Chislehurst, but this week the mystery spread to Biggin Hill where a resident believes the object came to earth.

In Chislehurst, Mrs Gladys Austin, of Lower Camden, said: "I thought I was going mad. But now I know from the *Kentish Times* that other people have seen these lights, I think someone should find out what is going on.

"My bedroom was lit up at about 11 p.m. It was such a bright light I thought I'd left my bedroom light on. But when I looked out of the window there was a ball of bright orange light hovering outside above the trees. I was petrified."

The light hovered for a few minutes, then moved towards Sidcup. "I just prayed it would not come any nearer to me," said Mrs Austin. "I just pulled the blankets over me that night, and hoped the object would go away."

The UFO was spotted earlier that evening over Summer Hill by Mr John Newcomb, of St Michael's Close, Bickley, who stopped his car to watch the lights hover.

And the "bright orange balloon-shaped UFO" was seen by Mr Anthony Adams, of Lower Camden, at 9.25 p.m. while driving down Elmstead Lane, Chislehurst, with passenger Mr Chris-

topher Crouch, of Beckenham.

The lights were still in the sky when they arrived at Mr Adams' home and watched for 10 minutes by Mr Adams and his family.

"One balloon disappeared—the other went in the Bickley direction," said Mr Adams.

It was also that night that something landed in Biggin Hill.

Mrs Phyllis Ryan, 75, was looking from the bedroom window of her home in Lusted Hall Lane across the valley at around 9.30 p.m.

"I saw a great light. It was round or oval, and a brilliant white / yellow. It came towards me and got lower until I imagined it was a plane coming in to land at the airport—but it was too far to the left.

"It kept coming lower and I thought it was going to crash, and it touched down and through the trees I could see that brilliant light. There was no bang; nothing."

An account of a separate sighting has come this week from student Miss Patricia Terry, of Clarence Road, Bickley, who wrote: "On April 12 at 11 p.m. I was leaving a friend's house in Bickley when I noticed what looked like a large ball of fire above Chislehurst."

## 'FIZZLED OUT'

"As I watched it grew slightly smaller and divided into two. The smaller part dropped downwards and fizzled out. The other part moved slowly away.

"By this time I had got my friend, and we both watched it slowly disappear over the horizon."

Reports of similar sightings started in Chislehurst last February when residents' bedrooms were lit up by objects in the early morning.

The Ministry of Defence premises in Bickley, police, Army and RAF units, all say the sightings are a mystery.

## 3128 MY UFO SIGHTING

I WAS very interested to read your front page news item on the orange "U.F.O." lights.

I saw an almost identical incident on the evening of Sunday 25 February 1979 at around 8 p.m. at the Whitehall Recreation Ground.

It was a crystal-clear night with the temperature probably hovering around freezing.

I was facing west when I became aware of a bright orange light to my right (on my north side). I watched this for a short time before I noticed an even brighter orange light to the west, just to one side of St Luke's spire.

The western light grabbed my attention but I still glanced occasionally at the northern light which was heading due east, until suddenly it wasn't there any more.

The western light which had been static for perhaps 10-15 minutes suddenly moved eastwards at a considerable speed, then slowing quite dramatically.

I walked towards it to a point halfway between the clinic and the Cowper Road entrance, where the light appeared to turn to the north, and as it did so I remember seeing very small, much fainter lights (I believe, two were red and one white) which gave me the impression of an ordinary aircraft; but for me to see these lights in such detail, it would have been impossible for me not to hear the roar of engines — there was no noise at all except a low pitched "hum" (which could have been the noise from the A21 traffic).

The speed and manoeuvrability of the craft would surely rule out a glider.

However, I didn't see any smoke, as your witnesses have suggested.

Naturally, over the four years my memory has faded over the smaller details, but I reported this incident the next day or two to the British U.F.O. people, and I guarantee you that everything I have written in this letter is true, and I was in no way influenced by alcohol or drugs.

## I SAW THE 3128 UFO

I WRITE to confirm that I, too, saw the unidentified flying object at about 9.30 p.m. on the evening of Wednesday, April 27 (your front page article last week).

From my house in West Chislehurst, I observed a bright orange light to the east proceeding in a direction from south towards the north. There was fairly low cloud covering about 80 per cent of the sky and, like Mr Newcomb, I confirm that it moved too slowly to be a meteorite (besides which it was too bright and the wrong colour). Satellites or meteorites must in any case be ruled out because they would have been above the cloud cover, whereas this sighting was quite clearly below.

Nor could it have been an aircraft as there was no noise and aircraft lights are white, red or green but never — to my knowledge — orange.

Obviously, one would not necessarily equate UFOs with flying saucers, but I wonder whether the light could have come from a hot-air balloon or similar device.



U.S. is capable of disrupting weather conditions in outer space makes it conceivable that E.T.'s could do the same to earth.

One atmospheric scientist at the University of Washington in Seattle

claims a mysterious shift in the trade winds is wreaking havoc worldwide.

Because of this strange phenomenon, says professor David Halpern, the warm equatorial trade winds which normally blow to the

west in the Pacific Ocean started blowing to the east early last year.

"Sea-surface temperatures are 7 to 8 degrees Fahrenheit higher than normal," adds Halpern who says this isn't the first time this has happened "but never to such extremes."

Everything else — warm and dangerously dry winter weather in the northeast; heavy rains in South America, droughts in Africa and Australia and deaths of millions of birds on Christmas Island — is also caused by the mysterious change in the trade wind pattern.

Christmas Island, which is 190 miles south of Java,

normally is inhabited by 17 million adult birds of 19 species. Last November bird expert Ralph W. Schreiber visited the island and found that 18 of the species were gone.

### Threaten

Neither Halpern or Schreiber have any explanation for the bizarre weather changes that now threaten the world.

"UFOs travel at such incredible speeds that they cause eddies and whirlpools in the atmosphere, like speedboats on a lake," claims nationally-known UFO expert, Paul Orwell.

# Real E.T.s visited Earth many times

E.T.s VISITED Earth many times before the hit film was made, and amazingly enough, the filmed version of the interplanetary traveler looked very much like the aliens spotters claim to have seen.

A leading authority on extraterrestrial visitations, Dr. J. Allen Hynek, an astronomer and professor emeritus at Northwestern University, in Evanston, Ill., reported as far back as 1980, "Intelligent beings from other planets regularly visit our world."

He even described one extraterrestrial as looking a great deal like the figure which later portrayed E.T.

"One person who told me he was picked up by a UFO said the creatures had wrinkled skin and claw-like hands," according to Dr. Hynek. The being also had a slit-like mouth, similar to E.T.'s.

There have been a number of instances when beings from other galaxies who appear similar to E.T. visited our planet, he said.

"In one instance, a midwestern farmer was ploughing his field as usual when he suddenly froze, gripping the steering wheel in terror.

"There through the dust, little figures were beckoning to him. He knew they were beings from outer space," says Hynek.

This incident took place

ten years ago, says Hynek, and the farmer said he followed the aliens as if he was in a trance. They took the farmer to a barn where there appeared to have been a fight because there was blood all over the place.

## Description

"The farmer described the beings as being a little taller than four feet, and his description of how they looked is similar to how one would describe E.T.," says Hynek.

In another incident, a couple claimed they were abducted by spacemen while driving to their home in Portsmouth, N.H.

The couple claim they saw a strange light following them that eventually landed in front of them on the road and blocked their way. While they were stopped, humanoid creatures in silversuits came toward them.

Although the incident happened in 1961, the creatures were described as looking remarkably like the loveable alien who came to Earth in the film released nearly 20 years later.

# Mystery object in Stockton sky




DIAGRAM OF solar system shows hidden position of mysterious battlestar planet: "Almost impossible to detect"

# HIDDEN UFO STATION CONTROLS OUR SOLAR SYSTEM

AN ARTIFICIAL planet teeming with extraterrestrial spies and a flying saucer fleet is orbiting the sun just beyond the rim of our solar system — and altering the movement of at least three planets, an astronomer declares.

In fact, this "battlestar" is unquestionably the 10th planet astronomers have been seeking for the last 200 years, Dr. Jon Horvath, of El Centro, California, told GLOBE.

"It's the only explanation that makes sense," says the former NASA and U.S. Naval Observatory employee. "It ties everything together — the powerful, mysterious force affecting our three outermost planets and the source of UFOs in our solar system."

Scientists have searched for this "mystery force" since 1781, when it was noticed Uranus and Neptune were being disturbed by a

powerful gravitational pull.

And while it was widely believed the source of the disturbance had been found with the discovery of Pluto, our ninth planet, in 1930, experts have since learned little Pluto is affected by the force as well.

What's more, Dr. Ray Reynolds of the Ames Research Center in Mountain View, California, says scientists are so sure a 10th planet is located beyond Pluto that the only thing left is to name it.

But Horvath says the existence of a 10th planet "isn't nearly as mysterious as the fact that after all this time, no one has even a clue as to where it might be.

"There's only one sensible answer," he adds. "Whatever it is, it doesn't want us to know it's there.

And if it doesn't want us to know it's there, it's influenced by intelligent beings."

"Think about it," he continues. "Aliens from another solar system wouldn't bring a huge fleet of UFOs across billions of miles. They'd come in a huge space ship capable of carrying thousands of smaller craft — or equipped with assembly plants capable of building them.

Meanwhile, U.S. astronomers have vowed to find what's causing the eerie disturbance — and they're using powerful telescopes, space probes and an incredibly sophisticated satellite.

But Horvath insists the answer lies in his battlestar theory — and scoffs at those who cling to the belief that a natural, 10th planet could so powerfully affect one-third of our solar system.

"It would have to be just about where Pluto now is," he says. "Of course, if it was, there's no way we could fail to find it because it would have to be at least as large as Jupiter."

But the existence of an artificial planet twice the size of Earth would solve the problem, he says, because it would have to be made almost entirely of metal.

"That would make it many times heavier than Earth, giving it gravitational strength to influence other planets," says Horvath.

"And a dark, artificial planet, capable of maneuvering to hide behind Uranus or Neptune whenever it pleased, would be almost impossible to detect."
