



Cabbie tells of dramatic chase with 'UFOs'

A YOUNG woman and the taxi driver who was taking her home are convinced they spotted UFOs above the Royal Aircraft Establishment in Farnborough.

And a local UFO expert has said their description of three bright orange lights is consistent with other mysterious objects sighted throughout the area.

Miss Danielle Mansbridge (20) and cabbie Mr. Gerry Hurn were both puzzled by the lights in Keith Lucas Road last week.

The taxi driver quickly turned his car around and they chased after the hovering lights, but they suddenly disappeared.

Danielle, of Pennine Way, Cove, said: "I really don't know what they were. The lights were very bright — you couldn't miss them. They were there just as I as getting into the cab.

Danielle, who works at Dialogue Distribution in Camberley, had been visiting her boyfriend, Mr. Brian Knight (23) at his home in Keith Lucas Road.

Danielle and Mr. Hurn even drove around by the Southwood golf course and RAE to try to trace the source of the lights, but without success.

Amazed

"There was no noise at all, but they were blazing orange, very bright and big," Danielle said.

"I have never seen anything like it before — that's why I was so amazed."

Mr. Hurn (31), of Brookhouse Road, Cove, who works for Ace Radio Cars of Farnborough, said: "It was like a helicopter formation, just hovering.

"They looked about 25ft. apart, but it's difficult to guess distance in the sky.

"There might be an explanation for it — but they were definitely not helicopters or aeroplanes. I can't explain it."

Mr. Hurn said the lights "just veered away" and vanished without a sound.

"It is intriguing — I would like to know what it was."

He said the lights were so bright and big that someone else in the area must have seen them too.

There have been many sightings of mysterious flying objects and strange lights in the "News" area.

Probing


Experts investigating aerial phenomena have been probing local reports of UFOs for more than 15 years and some of the sightings have remained apparently unexplained.

Mr. Omar Fowler, a local UFO expert, said the description of the lights was consistent with UFO activity in the area.

"There has been quite a lot going on in the Farnborough area," he added.

Mr. Fowler is currently compiling a report on sightings.

He said he was still receiving reports from people who had seen mysterious objects in the skies two or three years ago, but who had been reluctant until now to come forward.

Did UFO snatch crew of blimp?

TWO NAVY aviators who mysteriously vanished while on a routine patrol may have been abducted by aliens and taken aboard a UFO!

Investigators say Lieutenant Ernest Cody and Ensign Charles Adams spotted an apparent oil slick about five miles east of the Farallon Islands, near San Francisco, California.

Flying aboard their Navy L-8 blimp, they radioed headquarters that they would investigate, but the doomed pair were never heard from again.

Crewman aboard a Coast Guard cutter, a Navy patrol boat and several fishing vessels in the immediate vicinity told investigators the blimp hovered a few feet above the oil slick and then dropped two smoke flares.

Suddenly, the blimp gained altitude as if its pilots had been frightened of something they had seen in the murky waters —

then they flew into dense cloud cover.

Shortly afterward, the blimp drifted into Daly City, a small suburb of San Francisco. It was empty!

A salvage crew said the blimp was in perfect operating condition, but two life preservers were missing. An exhaustive search failed to locate the missing pilots.

If they had drowned that fateful morning 44 years ago, their bodies would have then washed up on local beaches, Navy officials

have concluded.

The pilots may have been abducted by aliens after they discovered a UFO that had crashed, claim in-

vestigators at the Imperial Institute of Astronomy in Tokyo, Japan.

They believe that when they saw the UFO submerged in the shallow waters, they hid in the clouds above, but were snatched by another UFO that was hovering there.

Eric Gairy believes in astral travel, UFOs and himself

ST. GEORGE'S, Grenada — He is a bizarre political specter who believes in flying saucers and astral travel and asserts that "God is my constant companion."

But Sir Eric Gairy also has an important if somewhat sinister place in Grenada's history that still haunts U.S. efforts to rebuild democracy in this Caribbean nation.

In a turbulent political career spanning three decades, he created the island's first trade-union movement and led Grenada to independence in 1974.

As the Grenada's first prime minister, he handed out land to poor farmers, crushed his opposition with hired thugs and acquired hotels, nightclubs and a taste for extravagant living until his overthrow in a 1979 Marxist coup.

"I did too much talking with women. I played tennis and cricket, and maybe I could cut down on those three items. Less playing all around," he says when asked what he would have done differently.

And, he added darkly, "I have been too lenient with Maurice Bishop and his gang."

It was Maurice Bishop and his New Jewel Movement who toppled Gairy on March 13, 1979. Gairy's defense force, popularly known as the "Green Beasts," dropped its guns and fled when Bishop's men attacked the main military barracks.

The "Mongoose gang," the thugs Gairy used to intimidate his opponents, was rounded up and thrown in jail.

Grenadians poured into the streets to celebrate — just as they did four years later when U.S. troops invaded after a palace coup in which Bishop was killed.

Gairy is back now, living in a big pink house that overlooks St. George's harbor and trying to find a way back to power. In official circles here, he is regarded as a pariah.

"He's weird," one U.S. official told me. "Don't take my word for it. Talk to him yourself."

But even Gairy's detractors admit that, as the U.S. official put it, "Uncle Gairy can still touch a certain current in Grenadian life."

His party, the Grenada United Labor Party (GULP), won 34 percent of the vote in last year's parliamentary elections even though (his detractors say because) Gairy himself was not on the ticket.

The overall winner in the balloting was a coalition of three parties formed with the encouragement of the United States. The head of the new government, veteran politician Herbert Blaize, had previously defeated Gairy in

only one election in the 1950s.

The coalition's durability is still untested. If it were to come apart, the chances of Gairy recapturing power would greatly increase.

Whatever his prospects, Gairy certainly hasn't been humbled by his fall from grace.

"I have another part of my personality," he said when asked if his five years in exile in San Diego, Calif., had been difficult. "I have a greatly developed mind, even though I say so myself.

"My head does not grow big when I'm prime minister on a state visit and being treated like President Reagan. And when I was in California my head didn't grow small."

He attributes his unpopularity with the United States to other Caribbean leaders who envied his achievements as prime minister.

"Eugenia Charles, (prime minister of Dominica) went to Washington and said 'Don't let Gairy or other undesirables come back,'" Gairy said. "They say 'that man overshadow us. That country overshadow our country.'

"There's no one who knows Caribbean politics as much as I know. I've been in this before. I've been honored 31 different times by different countries, I've been knighted five times, I'm also a member of the Queen's privy council."

"They don't go dishing out honors and on people like me unless there is some degree of justification," he says.

Among his achievements he listed land distribution, having organized in Grenada "the largest water extravaganza in the Caribbean," having been a juror in the 1978 Miss World contest in London and having been the keynote speaker at the 1st World Congress on Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOs) in Acapulco in 1975.

Gairy's belief in UFOs also led him to propose in his first address to the United Nations in 1974 the formation of a committee to study flying saucers.

Of this, he now says, "That one has been blown completely out of proportion.

"I spoke about UFOs at the United Nations three times out of five times. I spoke about God five times and no one seemed to question that."

In his address, he said, "I added on what people never seem to talk about. So I talked about flying saucers. I believe they exist just as those opposed believe but don't have the guts to talk about it."

On astral traveling, Gairy explained: "When we speak of astral traveling, we speak of another dimension in the spiritual plane . . . When you go out of body with full consciousness and are able to go where you wish."

Gairy grinned when asked if he'd ever done any astral traveling of his own and said he didn't want to start another controversy like the one surrounding his flying saucer speech at the United Nations.

"I'm involved in metaphysics. I'm involved in anything involving the inner man," he said. "The spirit of man can do a lot.

"I don't think of God as a part-time associate. I think of God as a constant companion. I go beyond where religion starts." //

PRINCE Charles is at the centre of a bizarre UFO mystery.

The Prince had a close encounter during a flight home from the United States last week.

The pilot of his RAF VC-10 radioed air traffic control to say he had been startled by a "glowing red object" in the sky.

Incredibly, FOUR other aircraft reported sighting the "UFO" over the same stretch of the Irish Sea.

An immediate investigation was launched—but no trace of the unidentified aircraft has been found.

Other explanations—such as meteors or debris from a satellite—have also been ruled out by experts.

Charles was nearing the end of a 12-hour trans-Atlantic flight after a five-

day visit to the U.S. when the incident happened.

A source at West Drayton air traffic control near London's Heathrow airport said: "The object was reported by five different aircraft, including the Prince's.

"The pilot described seeing a red glowing object. The light from it lit up his cockpit.

"We just don't know what it was. It's a complete mystery."

And an air traffic official

at Ireland's Shannon airport said: "The pilot saw a bright flash in the sky.

"An immediate check was made on all aircraft, but none was missing.

"Whatever the pilot saw, it certainly was not another aeroplane."

A Ministry of Defence spokesman confirmed: "Prince Charles's pilot did report seeing a bright flash, but we are satisfied there was no danger to the Prince's aircraft."

Philip's a 'saucer' watcher

PRINCE PHILIP has been a keen UFO follower for the past 30 years.

He is a keen reader of the magazine, Flying Saucer Review.

And he once invited a man who claimed to have seen a UFO landing to come to Buckingham Palace to tell his story to a Royal aide so the official could report to Philip, who was on tour in Australia.

Creature

UFO expert Tim Good, an author and lecturer, said last week: "It may not be pure coincidence.

"It is likely that any creature from outer space that is more advanced than us would be aware of the significance of a Royal flight."

And former diplomat Gordon Creighton, the editor of Flying Saucer Review magazine, said:

"I've no idea what this object could have been, but it would be wrong to dismiss it. There are beings in space watching us very closely."

...and UFOs — hopefully

PEOPLE in Tottenham are a pretty optimistic bunch when it comes to Unidentified Flying Objects and extra-terrestrial attacks by aliens, according to a survey carried out by a science fiction publishing company.

The survey was carried out by new Era Publications last week, in the High Road, Tottenham, by a man dressed as an astronaut. He asked shoppers about: earth's defence, life on other planets, east and west co-operation and the survival of mankind.

Tony Baziuk, a spokesman for New Era Publications, said: "On the whole people we spoke to in Tottenham seemed to be pretty optimistic."

More than half the 35 people polled said they thought earth had a strong enough defence system to resist alien attack.

Seventy per cent of people believed that there is life on other planets and 58 per cent that East and West would combine to resist alien attack.

And 60 per cent believed that mankind could survive an alien attack.

If the questions seem a bit warlike the reason is that the survey was aiming to publicise a new science fiction book, Battlefield Earth.

Survey

Said Mr Baziuk: "We are carrying a national survey and hope to publish our results in April. So far people in Tottenham are a bit more optimistic than those in other parts of the country. Just 30 per cent believe that the earth would be able to defend itself in the event of alien attack."

The firm will pass on its information to a House of Lords study group on UFOs.

FOOTNOTE: The Journal has reason to believe that the firm may be using supernatural powers to conduct the survey. Despite being given precise details beforehand as to where the survey was to take place, we could find no trace of the mysterious astronaut in the High Road, Tottenham last Monday.

Palace Sources Reveal . . .

Prince Charles Has Amazing Encounter With Blazing UFO

Prince Charles had an incredible close encounter with a UFO while flying from the U.S. to London on February 23 — and the pilot of the royal jet even reported the mind-boggling event to air traffic controllers, sources reveal.

"I am convinced that what we saw was a monstrous craft," Charles told family members after his return. "We were all shocked by this close encounter — but at the same time we experienced an incredible thrill."

The astonishing sighting took place off the south coast of Ireland at 8:30 p.m.

"The object was reported by five different aircraft, including the one carrying Prince Charles," said an air traffic control supervisor at London's Heathrow Airport.

"The pilot of Prince Charles' aircraft described what he saw as a bright, glowing object. The light from it lit up his cockpit, and those of other aircraft.

"We just don't know what it was. It is a complete mystery."


Because of the brightness of the object, neither Charles nor his pilot could make out the shape or size of the UFO. But they were overwhelmed with the intensity of its

and seemed to engulf our aircraft. "We could not make out the object, but it must have been enormous.

It didn't flash across the sky, but appeared like a giant lighthouse beacon hanging in the sky. I felt I was in the presence of something outside our knowledge and control."

Said a royal insider, "After arriving back in London, Charles could talk about nothing else. He said he was in the cockpit of the plane when the cockpit was suddenly brilliantly lit. They were traveling at about 500 m.p.h., but the object appeared to remain the same distance ahead of them as they watched it.

"Charles said he tried to convince himself that it wasn't an alien craft,

but something like a meteorite.”
However, a spokesman for the Royal Greenwich Observatory at Hurstmonceaux told The ENQUIRER, “I can confirm that there were no meteor or comet sightings in that area or at that time.”

The Royal Greenwich Observatory also dismissed the possibility that the mysterious object was debris from a satellite. In addition, airport radar detected no unidentified craft in the area.

Palace sources reveal the sighting has aroused Charles’ interest in UFOs — a subject that has long been a passion of his father, Prince Philip.

“Philip even once invited the witness of a UFO landing in Lancashire to Buckingham Palace to describe his experience,” said a London source. “Charles’ great uncle, the late Lord Mountbatten, was also fascinated by the study of UFOs.”

Charles always harbored some doubts about the authenticity of UFOs — but not anymore, a palace insider confided.

“He told Princess Diana, ‘I never actually believed I would ever see something like this for myself. Now I know these things exist!’”

The bodies of the two men, Antonio Gualno and Vittorio Gianfranco, were found on their sunken boats with puncture marks on their necks and their bodies drained of blood, reports Roberto Pinotti, of

the Centro Ufologico Nazionale, in Italy.

Ominously, the tragedy occurred in an area that has been a hotbed of UFO activity — and in perfectly calm seas.

Egidio Fava, another investigator, is convinced that the men died at the hands of alien creatures — possibly vampires.

“Whatever it was that

killed those two fishermen was not human,” he says. “There are no creatures of the sea that kill in that manner. The police and biologists know this.”

Gualno had gone fishing off the town of Pedaso on the Adriatic coast, despite

terrifying reports of mysterious phenomena that kept other fishermen ashore.


There had been numerous sightings of columns of water appearing from nowhere and mysterious, dark objects moving through the sea.

Gualno’s sister, Carmella, begged him not to go.

“After a few hours passed and he did not return, I was really worried,” she explains. “I told his friend, Vittorio Gianfranco, what had happened.”

“Then Vittorio went out to look for Antonio. That was the last I saw of him.”

Carmella then called the police, who, with the help of other fishermen, started

searching for the two missing men.

They combed the clear, shallow waters and soon found the two submerged boats.

The two blood-drained bodies were brought

ashore to the morgue.

Autopsies showed that neither man had water in his lungs, indicating that they had not drowned. The only marks on them were puncture marks on their necks.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS OF THE FIRST KIND

ERICH VON DANIKEN says he has discovered startling proof of the theory that sparked an international controversy 17 years ago when he claimed that the gods worshipped in the world's religions were visitors from outer space.

He unearthed the new evidence in ancient Indian documents that describe a prehistoric "star wars", in which extraterrestrials battled for supremacy in the skies over India 5,000 years ago.

Von Daniken's first book, *Chariot Of The Gods* (Souvenir Press) was a bestseller. He has put his new findings in a book called *I Wasn't Wrong*, which has been published in West Germany.

The documents that contain the key evidence are in Sanskrit, the language of ancient India, and are part of a vast collection of stories, legends and epic poems known as the Mahabharata.


Von Daniken explains that his interpretation of the age-old texts is based on studies by Dr. Dileep Kumar Kanjilal, an Indian scholar of Sanskrit.

He adds that the writings contain passages that seem to describe close encounters with extraterrestrial beings, including conversations with alien "gods".

ONE of the aliens even explained to an ancient earthman that they had come from a far-away star to study earth and its inhabitants, says von Daniken.

There are more than 40 references to "flying objects" that von Daniken thinks could only have been spacecraft.

They range from what the writings call "cities in the firmament" — huge starships, in von Daniken's interpretation — to smaller "heavenly chariots" that he believes were shuttles between ships and earth.



The writings tell of people entering the chariots on "glittering stairs of metal" and describe in vivid detail what they saw on rides across India down to the island of Ceylon, now Sri Lanka.

They also include a graphic account of a terrible battle involving the starships, ending when one was struck by a "deadly weapon" and crashed to earth in a gigantic fireball.

The Sanskrit writings describe the crash as "like a thousand meteors falling at the same time."

The manuscript continues: "It was as if the elements had been unleashed. Horses and chariots burned up in thousands, then deep silence descended.

"The winds began to blow, and the earth grew bright. The corpses of the fallen were so mutilated by the terrible heat that they no longer looked human."

Von Daniken says: "All com-

munities in ancient times say the same thing.

"They have different gods with different names, and different stories around them, but the core is always the same — gods came down from the clouds accompanied by loud noise, bright light, fire and trembling."

As further evidence, von Daniken cites these discoveries during his years of research:

- Primitive cave paintings at Tassili, in the Sahara desert of North Africa, that bear an uncanny resemblance to modern astronauts — complete with spherical helmets and spacesuits.

- Carvings estimated to be 2,000 years old unearthed in Guatemala

la recently that show the same thing.

- A carving in a stone column at Tula, Mexico, of a space-suited figure with a backpack, carrying a flame-spurting weapon. Another figure in the same column carries a device that looks like a pistol or ray gun.

• An engraving taken from a tombstone at Palenque, Mexico, that appears to be a primitive attempt to portray a humanoid at the controls of a space module, his hands working levers, with a flaming rocket exhaust behind him. "Who were the models for these drawings and carvings, if not astronauts?" asks von Daniken.

He also is convinced that the mysterious ruined pyramids at Teotihuacan, outside Mexico City, are clear evidence of visitors from outer space.

"Archeologists have found that certain underground chambers were carefully insulated with a layer of mica about an inch thick, sandwiched between layers of stonework."

HE explains: "Mica is highly resistant to extremes of heat, acid and electricity. Stone Age people would not have known that."


"What's more, the mica used at Teotihuacan is Muscovite mica, a substance unknown in South America. How did they get hold of it?"

The "ghost airfield" at Nazca, in Peru, a 37-mile strip of flat land, a mile wide and criss-crossed with long straight lines and patterns like runway markings, also figures prominently in his theory.

Von Daniken points out that NASA put similar markings in the Mojave desert as a landing guide for the pilots of the first space shuttle. "I think we already have enough indications to prove my case," he says.

Calendars from beyond the stars

VISITORS from outer space first landed on earth on Aug. 11, 3114 B.C., says von Daniken.


His calculation is based on the calendars of the ancient civilization of Mayans of Central America.

"In particular, their knowledge of astronomy was quite extraordinary," he says. "They knew things about the movements of the planets that they

could not possibly have found out for themselves.

"In their holy writings, they admit that they got their knowledge from heavenly teachers.

"The Mayans had several calendars, including a calendar of the gods. Each calendar was different, but all fit together perfectly, and all had the same starting date — Aug. 11, 3114 B.C."

Space Visitors

A BIG UFO STREAKED across the pre-dawn sky on a recent Saturday. People over a wide area between Philadelphia and Trenton reported seeing the thing.

It looked like a big comet, the AP story said. When I read this, I knew just the person to call: Mrs. Ruth Norman. Since the 1950s, Mrs. Norman's been in contact with the inhabitants of outer-space.

That's plenty of time to get to know them and make friends. And in fact she sounds as if she's almost on a first-name basis with them. She calls 'em "the space brothers."

They dictated 17 books to her husband, Dr. Ernest L. Norman, before he died in 1971. After that, Mrs. Norman herself started taking down the dictation. So far she's taken down 71 books.

The most recent one is scheduled to roll of the press any day now. It's 24 chapters long. The title is *Preparations For The Landing*. The book reveals that a visit to Earth is in the works.

These books are published by the Unarius Academy of Science in El Cajon, Cal. The academy was founded by Dr. and Mrs. Norman. Unarius stands for "Universal Articulate Interdimensional Understanding of Science."

LUCKILY FOR ME, ON the day before the big UFO was spotted, a package of material containing the above-mentioned info had been deposited on my desk at work, on top of the pile of other unusual communications.

Such communications seem to have a way of winding up on my desk. For now I'll skip over the possible implications of this.

Anyway, when I heard about the UFO, I called the academy to find out what the scoop was on this thing.

I was looking forward to talking to Mrs. Norman herself. In the academy's material, a photo shows her wearing a beehive hairdo and a big orchid. She looks presentably groomed and friendly enough to be the hostess at a Holiday Inn restaurant. Her title at the academy is "Cosmic Visionary."

But a student who answered the phone apologetically informed me that Mrs. Norman wasn't immediately available. He connected me with a member of the faculty, though, a Mr. Charles Spaegel.

A patient, professorial-sounding fellow, Mr. Spaegel gave me an orientation on some of the cosmic basics, "extension of interdimensional consciousness" and so on.

In his opinion, the UFO that streaked our area was something on the order of a party of advancement fussing over the preliminaries of the big visit.

The purpose of the visit is to invite Earth to become a member of the Interplanetary Confederation of Planets, he explained.

Earth, if it decides to join up, will become the confederation's 33rd member, he added.

IN THE MATERIAL LEFT on my desk, Mrs. Norman is quoted saying about the coming visit: "You see, a representative of each of the 32 worlds is coming in a ship; they are building a huge craft.

"One thousand people will come to Earth, and it has only been within the past year that I have known when they shall come ... They (always) said soon but never did say just how soon. Now we have the year of their arrival. They now state, 'We shall arrive on your planet Earth in the year 2001!'"

It's interesting to note that scientists at the the National Radio Astronomy Observatory, at Ohio State University, at Stanford, at Harvard and other places have been scientifically plotting a space search — devising efforts to detect whether there's anybody out there in space.

NASA itself is spending \$1.5 million a year getting ready for the first systematic, widescale, radio-signal search for signs of space life. NASA's search will start in 1988.

Using the most advanced technology available, including "spectrum analyzers," NASA scientists will sweep the sky. They'll "listen" to all sectors of the heavens for three-tenths of a second to three full seconds.

These scientists could have saved a lot of time and money by contacting Mrs. Norman first.

Boy, are they going to be surprised when the message comes in: "Tell Ruth we're on our way!"

UFO's Again--Florida Saucer Hunters Reports Not All "Swamp Gas"

FORT WALTON BEACH, Fla. (UPI) — They're five average folks living relatively obscure lives in northwest Florida, but they all have an unusual avocation they don't discuss much — at least not with outsiders.

They hunt UFOs in their spare time.

"I figured that by becoming an investigator, I'd find out some answers," says Ralph Dalton, 67, a retired soldier and one of five people in northwest Florida who investigate reports of Unidentified Flying Objects. So far, he's had scant opportunity.

"There hasn't been much going on the last year and a half," says Col. Donald Ware, 49, a former Air Force pilot who trained Dalton and heads the team from his home in Fort Walton Beach. In fact, "ufologists" say overall sightings worldwide declined in 1984 and have been spotty this year.

Despite the paucity of local UFOs, Dalton has his truck packed and ready to go. When there's a sighting, he'll take along a tape measure, camera, magnifying glass and 11 forms to record everything from animal reaction to weather conditions.

UFOs have been around for years. The first were reported in the United States in 1896 as "great airships," then popped up as "foo fighters" in World War II. They gained wide publicity after a 1947 sighting at Mt. Rainier, Washington. Alleged abductions, supposed crashes and even rumors that Uncle Sam has alien bodies stored in Ohio hangars have become part of the national psyche.

The Air Force looked into sightings for a while, then publicly dismissed them. The civilian groups that began their own investigative efforts have been called open-minded by some, crackpots by others.

"We don't have a vast radar network, we don't have paid personnel, we don't have laboratories at our disposal," says Raymond Fowler, chief investigator for the Texas-based Mutual UFO Network — MUFON — which has had its eyes on the stars for 16 years.

There are 300 card-carrying MUFON investigators worldwide, including a police chief from a major north-east city and scientists. The organization says its investigators can explain 90 percent of the 20 to 30 UFO sightings it receives daily from around the world. Only two or three a day end up listed as unexplained.

Fowler, of Wenham, Mass., author of several UFO books and the man who developed MUFON's investigative technique, says authorities and witnesses don't always take investigators seriously.

"They take the subject seriously. Sometimes they don't take the investigator seriously," he says. Recognizing that, MUFON's Field Investigator's Manual has

tips on how investigators should present themselves for a professional image.

Ware's crew includes Dalton, a housewife, a corporate pilot and a retiree who worked in electronics. Most of the group declined to discuss their interest, and even Dalton said he doesn't go around telling everyone he hunts UFOs.

"If it comes up, I'd mention it. Other than that, no," he says.

Dalton had eight weeks of training before taking a multiple-choice, open-book test with 100 questions about light and optics, physics, conventional aircraft and what's called "the UFO experience."

Among other things, the test asks for the name of the president who claimed to have seen a UFO, the name of the pilot whose 1947 UFO sighting prompted the term "flying saucer," and the year an inauguration shared headlines with UFO sightings.

The answers: Jimmy Carter, Kenneth Arnold, and 1952.

Dalton says he saw a UFO when he was a child and for years was haunted by a recurring dream of a mysterious "wheel." Seeing the movie "Close Encounters of the Third Kind" made him think the "wheel" might be the underside of an alien craft.

It was after a rash of UFO sightings in the Southeast in 1973 that Dalton asked himself, "Is anybody doing anything? Is anybody writing anything? I couldn't find an answer. I had a gut feeling there was more. You couldn't write it off. I figured being an investigator I would find out some answers."

Another MUFON member, physicist Willie Smith of Longwood, Fla., has spent the last 18 months compiling a computer listing of "exceptional" UFO sightings.

"What we have been doing is building a database with no conclusions," he says, while admitting it's a temptation to try to draw some. Smith says he'll refrain from that until there's sufficient data.

Ware thinks it's time MUFON goes on record. The group's charter says it's dedicated to finding out if UFOs are spacecraft controlled by alien intelligence or unknown physical or psychological manifestations.

Ware says published statements by a majority of MUFON board members indicate they would agree that "at least some UFOs are spaceships controlled by advanced intelligence." He thinks it's time to find out where they come from and how they got here.

In light of that, Ware has prepared a resolution noting that millions of people have seen UFOs and that some have fired on them. The resolution says "UFO occupants" have shown no hostility, and resolves "not to shoot at UFOs no matter how strange they appear or how frightened I may be."

Miało to kształt prostokąta i było oświetlone jasnozielonym światłem. W środku, na połowie wysokości prostokąta, znajdowały się trzy jednakowej wielkości jasnopomarańczowe kręgi. Leżało „to” od strony jeziora kierując się na południe. Z początku leciało wolno, później coraz szybciej aż znikło daleko na horyzoncie.

Tak więc i tym razem tylko jedna osoba może z całą pewnością powiedzieć, że widziała pasażerów NOL. Niemniej rzekł że pozostałych osób nie są tu bez znaczenia, w dużym stopniu uprawdopodobniają bowiem właśnie takie, a nie inne przebiegi zdarzenia. Tu już nie wystarczy powiedzieć, że czterem zupełnie niezależnym osobom wszytkim się przyśniło, jak to próbowano sugerować w przypadku choćby Jana Wolskiego z Emilcina.

Przebieg zdarzenia wskazuje, że czterech pasażerów Człuchowa było przypadkowy świadkami powrotu nieznanego istot do NOL. Najbliższe miejsca, gdzie zauważyła je, znajdują się blisko jeziora i półwyspu, na którym nieśledzi się h. i w okresie wakacji przebywa wielu turystów. Czyżby „władze” tam „zabijały” istoty z „tajemniczą misją”? Być może, choć do tego nie zgłosił się nikt, choć do tego nie widział. Nie sposób w.c. choćby w przybliżeniu określić, jak długo istoty przebywały poza NOL i kiedy obiekt objawiał się po raz pierwszy na leśnej polanie „okolicy jeziora.

Jak zawsze w czasie pojawienia się NOL, tak i tym razem mnożą się pytania, na które brak odpowiedzi. Być może nie byłoby tak wiele wątpliwości, gdyby obserwacja została zgłoszona natychmiast. Choćby, kto wie? Ygrek zaraz następnego dnia bardzo dokładnie penetrował całą okolicę w poszukiwaniu śladów. Na bruzdach, gdzie rośnie młodnik znajdował tylko swoje ślady, szczególnie wyraźne w miejscach, gdzie się spotykał. Na leśnej polanie, gdzie stał NOL, zadanie było utrudnione, ponieważ w niewielkim zagłębieniu i dookoła niego rosła albo się gęsto zarodnięte trzcinałki bukowe. Nie wszędzie więc można było dotrzeć, ale i tu podobnie jak w młodniku nie było wy-

raźnych śladów. „Wszystko zdawało się być na swoim miejscu. A przecież — powiedział — z racji swojego zawodu potrafię czytać ślady. Czyżby więc i tym razem NOL i jego załoga nie pozostawili żadnych fizycznych śladów?”

Przypomnijmy, że nieznanne istoty spory odcinek trasy przebyły po wodzie. W jaki sposób to uczyniły, nie dysponując łodzią? Przecież nie pozostałyby jej na brzegu. Jako widomy znak pobytu w Człuchowie. Gdyby z kolei nieśledzi ją z sobą, zauważyłby to Ygrek. A na łodzi — dlaczego (tu nie ma żadnych śladów)? Czy dlatego, że nieznanne istoty poruszały się po nim w podobny sposób jak po jeziorze, na powierzchni którego nie powstawałoby choćby lekka bryza?

Istotną sprawą pozostaje fakt — na co zwrócił uwagę Ygrek — że przez cały czas pobytu na łodzi nieznanne istoty były w ruchu. Nawet w chwili wykonywania zwrotu w kierunku nadbiegających psów, nie zatrzymały się i „mając cały czas złączone nogi, przesuwały się jak po idealnie gładkiej powierzchni”. Nasuwa się więc uzasadnione podejrzenie, że być może istoty te w ogóle nie dotykały stopami ziemi! Czy to jest w ogóle możliwe? 

Mimo woli nasuwa się spostrzeżenie, że wygląd zewnętrzny istot należy odnieść do specyficznego kształtu samego ubioru, który zmieszkał ich naturalne sylwetki.

Kończąc opis tego krótkiego, trwającego zaledwie około 2 minut Bliskiego Spotkania Trzeciego Rodzaju, wróćmy jeszcze do opisu NO. Z relacji wynika, że świadkowie widzieli dwie sąsiednie ściany obiektu, o kształcie prostokątności, z zaokrąglonymi narożnikami. Przy tym zarówno Ygrek jak i pozostała dwójka przez cały czas aż do



LOOKING AFTER THE TRACES

Allotments near the place where these events took place are situated on the hill. But both Zofia Z. and Wiesław K. didn't see neither the lake nor the young tree growth, where Y stood. The visibility is limited here by the narrow wedge of the dense forest. Wanda Z. have just finished her work and wanted to go home when, unexpectedly, she saw "an illuminated thing" over the hill.

Later she told us that she have seen this accidentally when she was leaving the house. - "I kept my eyes fixed on this" - she said. "I called Wiesław K. whom I have seen earlier on the allotment and we were looking both at "this". The shape of "this" was rectangular, illuminated with pale-green light. In the center of "this", just in the middle of the rectangle, there were three pale-orange discs of the same size. "This" was flying from the lake side to the South. At the beggining it was flying slowly, and later - more and more quickly and it disappeared far over the horizon".

Also this time, only one person ^{WQS} ~~is~~ able to confirm she could see the passengers of a UFO. Nevertheless, the relations of the others, have also its value because they make the description of the event more reliable. One cannot simply tell that the four independent persons were dreaming, like it was suggested with Jan Wolski from Emilcin case.

The course of this event indicates the the four inhabitants of Człuchów, were accidental witnesses of returning of unknown beings to their UFO. Nearest to the place where X have noticed them. there is a peninsula, covered with dense forest where a hotel is standing and where many tourists spend their holidays there. Is it possible that the beings are coming thereto with their "secret mission"? Perhaps, However, till today, nobody came to tell us that he had seen them there. It's impossible to qualify - even approximately - how long time the beings were beyond their UFO and when the object appeared for the first time on the forest glade near the lake.

There are many questions without answer whenever UFO appears. Also this time. Perhaps, there wouldn't be so many doubts if the observation had been notified immediately. But -who knows that? The very next day, Y penetrated all the area looking for the traces very precisely. On the furrow - there were only his traces. On the forest glade, where UFO stood, it was difficult to find anything there because in the small depression and around of it, there was a puddle with dense growing reeds. It was impossible then to enter everywhere and even here, the traces were not clear, like it was in the young tree growth. "Everything seemed to be on its proper place. After all - he said - I can read the traces very well due to my profession. Is it possible that there were no traces of UFO at all? And no traces of its crew also this time?"

Let us remind that the unknown beings have passed over the water a good part of their way. How could they managed to do it, not having any boat? After all they didn't leave it on the bank, which would be an evident trace of their visit to Człuchów. And if they had taken it with them, then Y would see it. And on the land - why there is no traces at all? Maybe, the unknown beings were moving there like on the lake, where there was not a slight breeze over there?

One thing is essential - Y tells - that during their whole stay on the land, the unknown beings were moving constantly. They didn't stop even in the moment they have turned towards the coming dogs and "having the legs connected all the time, they were moving as if they were sliding over an ideal smooth surface". A reasonable suspicion comes into mind - perhaps these beings didn't touch the ground with their feet at all? Is that possible at all? And if so, is there any relation between the way of their moving and the behavior of the dogs? When both dogs have come closer to the unknown beings, they have quiet down suddenly ~~xxx~~ and they have withdrawn afterwards. Is that the behavior of the dogs in case of meeting with some quite strange people? Taking

under consideration all these circumstances, the dogs should have barked at the strangers and, at least, not to leave their master alone with them. There is a very significant fact that after some time, both dogs became sick. It was creeping paralysis of the legs. As the consequence - they had to be put to sleep. Can such behavior of the animals have any relation with the close contact with the unknown beings? Unfortunately, too many time have passed till the moment of notification of this observation, to anable to carry on appropriate examinations. The characteristic aspect of these unknown beings draws attention: a big hump an ~~xxx~~ ^{their} backs, strange arrangement of their pressure suits on their heads and along their hips, which were unnaturally broad and their moving in the environment was exceptional one. Involuntarily, there emerges a remark that the aparition of the beings - should be related to the specific shape of the clothes which caused a deformation of their silhouettes.

At the end of the ~~description~~ ^{account} of this 2 minutes lasting, Close Encounter of the Third Kind, let us go back to the description of the UFO itself: It results from the relation that the witnesses have seen two neighboring walls of the object, cuboid shaped with curved angles. But both Y and the other two persons, they have seen only one wall of the objects during all the time, till the disappearance of the UFO. If this was really true, which confirms the comparison of the replacement of the places in which the observers stood, with the ^{ps}osition of the UFO during observation - it would meant that the object was moving in non-typical manner - as far as its rectangular shape and our habituations are concerned. Approximately, the route of the object, was diagonally to its base. Perhaps, this is the next essential observation and the sum of such observations will help us to resolve the mystery of the UFO in the future.



1381 'Space invaders'

USC professor attributes boost in UFO sightings to rash of novice stargazers

Wayne Bannister of Prosperity was headed home on S.C. Highway 76 two weeks ago when he saw it.

"It was a big white streak in the sky," Bannister said. "It traveled horizontal to the Earth. My first thought was it was a Roman candle.

"But I never saw a Roman candle that was white and this wide. It was like something you see in the movie *Star Wars*.

"I mean, all of a sudden there was this streak. I don't know what it was. It exploded and turned a reddish-looking color, then it just blew all to pieces."

Bannister's not the only one. In recent weeks, several bewildered South Carolinians have reported seeing similar phenomena in the sky — specifically, over rural areas in Lexington and Spartanburg counties.

While the sightings might be wars in the galaxy beyond Earthlings' comprehension, it's more likely that they're simply meteorites and falling stars. They are objects — rocks, for example — hurtling so fast to the Earth that they get hot and explode.

Dr. John Safko, director of the University of South Carolina's astronomy department, says such phenomena are a common occurrences.

But people unaccustomed to staring at the sky aren't aware of them. And these days, there are a passel of uninitiated stargazers staring skyward for a glimpse of Halley's comet.

"There are a lot more people looking at the sky," Safko says. "It's something most people don't normally run into. They just don't even think about it. They just never looked up.

"There's not any more frequency of occurrence. There's probably just better news coverage," and one report triggers another report, which triggers another, Safko says. "People see things. They don't say anything until they hear somebody else talking about it."

Believe it or not, the objects that cause these long streaks and huge explosions are tiny. They are usually rocks or other matter that have been in the solar system since its formation, Safko said, but occasionally they are "chunks of things" that fall from space vehicles.

They get caught in the Earth's orbit and eventually start traveling toward the

planet at a relatively slow velocity. It's the slow velocity and the thickness of the atmosphere that causes the brightness and the explosions.

"The atmosphere acts as a braking fluid, and the object gets bright-hot because of all the friction," says USC physics professor Dr. LeConte Cathey.

They are burning-white and can be huge, exploding with such force that they break windows.

Safko compares the action and reaction to taking a cold glass out of the refrigerator and filling it with hot water.

The object "is very cold, having been in space. It heats up on the outside. The inside is frozen. The stress just shatters it."

The phenomena are more visible in rural areas, where there are fewer unnatural lights to diminish the glow of the heavenly entertainment, Safko says.

Further, people living in rural areas are more in tune with their environment and are going to notice the light more readily than people who live in the city.

Two weeks before Bannister's sighting, residents of the Glendale-Pacolet area in Spartanburg County saw a huge glowing ball that exploded with such force it shook their homes.
