ATLANTIS DESTROYED BY NUCLEAR MISSILES

The lost continent of Atlantis was vaporized in a horrifying nuclear attack by aliens who wanted to destroy all evidence of their landing on earth!

That's the shocking theory offered by a top astrophysicist to explain the sudden and mysterious disappearance of the ancient city state more than 40,000 years ago.


The woolly mammoth, the saber-toothed cat and the giant sloth were among the creatures who fell victim to the deadly ex-

its human inhabitants in the sophisticated sciences and arts," Rubenis contended in a recent article on his theory.


"But the attack literally bombed mankind back to the Stone Age. It took centuries and centuries for

on 27 years of research into the origin and evolution of planets in the solar system. The scientist said his studies reveal normal developmental patterns followed by most planets, but strangely altered in the earth's history.

A cataclysmic and profound change in the earth's environment more than 40,000 years ago coincided with the disappearance of an entire continent once located in the Southern Atlantic, Rubenis says. Levels of radiation rose alarmingly in one brief period at that time, indicating what may have been a powerful nuclear event.

"While there is no way of knowing precisely what occurred on earth at that time, my theory answers many questions raised by archeologists, geologists and paleontologists," Rubenis said. "What's more, there is every indication that space aliens, in fact, do

launched from

alien starships

visit earth from time to time and have the capability of landing and establishing bases.

"I believe that eons ago, alien starships colonized here, mingling with earthlings and helping them. The colony has survived in mythology as the famed continent of Atlantis, a wondrous society that was extremely advanced for its time. Mythology also indicates that Atlantis disappeared suddenly and catastrophically, leaving no trace behind."

Rubenis theorizes that the aliens be-

came alarmed by their earth experience — perhaps when colonists bred with earthlings and their allegiance to the mother planet was weakened. A decision was made to evacuate the colony and destroy all traces of alien presence on earth, Rubenis said.

"The continent was pulverized by powerful nuclear weapons — literally smashed to atoms," Rubenis said.

"There wasn't anything left afterward except the empty ocean. And the cloud of nuclear debris, dust and radioactivity lasted for years."

Colorful flying object startles Sierra foothills residents

GRASS VALLEY — A silent but colorful flying object zoomed across the sky over the Sierra foothills just before dawn Friday, according to some local residents who witnessed the brief event.

U.S. air defense officials said they had no explanation.

"It was a bluish-green light with a large tail," said Ron Talmage, a security officer who was nearing the end of a night shift when he saw the unidentified object.

"It had little pieces flaking off of it like it was something burning while it was coming down," he said. "Working nights, I see meteorites, little ones, all the time. This was spectacular and it seemed like it was just a few miles away."

The blaze of color, reported by most observers to have occurred just before 5 a.m., was seen over a 40-mile area ranging from Colfax to Penn Valley, six miles west of Grass Valley.

Jim Kerr, news director for radio station KNCO in Grass Valley, said callers were lighting up the station's switchboards Friday morning.

"The descriptions varied quite a bit," said Kerr. "One person said it looked like a sudden floodlight in the sky. Another one called it an explosion."

Beale Air Force Base officials could not identify the object, and officials of the North American Aerospace Defense Command in

Colorado said there were no re-entering satellites or missile launches in the area, according to Associated Press reports.

At Vandenberg Air Force Base near Lompoc, Capt. Tom Connell said Friday he received five calls, including one from Redding, from people who had seen strange sights in the sky.

Connell said the base had no aircraft over Northern California Friday morning and had had no missile launches. "There was nothing going on this morning at all," he said.

A bright flash or flying object was reported by several employees of Grass Valley Group, an electronics manufacturer with split work shifts and early-rising employees.

Most said the sight lasted about two seconds, but at least one observer estimated it endured up to a minute.

"I was driving to work. It was so strange," said Betty Lane, an assembler with the company. "It was a big light going across the sky, kind of like fireworks."

Co-worker Jeff Morris said he had arrived at work and was climbing out of his car. "There was a flash of light. I saw what looked like a flare. It was green with trailing white sparks. I saw it really clearly."

Morris said his first reaction was that he was viewing some kind of space debris. "It really lit up the sky," he said.

Jennifer Lincoln, 25, of Penn Valley said she was in bed when "a real bright light" came through the window. "It woke me up," she said.

Jerry Thinnies, who lives near the Nevada County Air Park, said an extremely bright light appeared in his bedroom skylight and then moved downward where he saw it through a window.

"It was like a headlight shining across the road, but much brighter," said Thinnies. "I sure wasn't an airplane."

Sherm Toller, who promotes auto racing at the Nevada County Fairgrounds and spends his early mornings delivering The Bee, said he was delivering papers on Old Auburn Road when he observed a long, thin object with a greenish tint.

"It was close, it was quick and it lit up the sky," said Toller. "It was no meteorite and don't think it was a saucer. It's really got me puzzled."

A Harmless Imagination Takes Off With UFOs

Passengers idly peering out the windows of their Amtrak cars stopped at the station might notice on a nearby building a cheery sign of greeting: "Welcome all people from other planets to Bethel, Ct."

Folks from this planet could be forgiven their confusion, but it is Dante Vaghi's hope that any aliens passing by would appreciate the thought.

Dante Vaghi thinks a lot about people from other planets. More than 35 years ago, he spotted a huge, mysterious craft soaring above his family's woodworking shop; since that moment, his life has been dominated by the prospect of the inhabitants of that spaceship's stopping by to say how do you do.

Many have seen unidentified flying objects, but few approach the phenomenon with Vaghi's gusto. For decades, he has told the authorities of his observations; regularly, he takes out ads in the local papers offering holiday messages to UFO-ites and outer-space visitors; he speaks to anyone who will listen; he has mounted large signs on his car and his brother's shop.

All of which has made him something of a local celebrity in Bethel. And, all of which forces the delicate question of whether, maybe, he has slipped a few gears over this.

He laughs.

"I've heard that. People say I'm all rocked out, cruised out, spaced out. I've been called everything in Noah Webster's dictionary and plenty that would only show up in a dictionary of words considered disrespectful. I thank the Lord that I have two good ears: Criticism like that goes in one and out the other." He laughs again.

Indeed, Dante Vaghi laughs a lot. He is a genial, rough-hewn man of great energy and easy good cheer. Surely such qualities account for the affectionate spirit with which his neighbors greet him — a spirit less likely to be enjoyed by a citizen of a more sour or demanding personality.

"I've taken a great deal of abuse, but I know these things [UFOs] exist. I've seen them. I can stand on my own two feet and say that."

Sitting in the back of the cluttered, busy woodworking shop, he says that. He also says just about everything else that comes to mind, sharing with a visitor his views on life, religion, work. His eyes bright behind rimless glasses, he recounts the accomplishments of his family, discusses his hopes for international relations, details his diet (he is big on milk and Shredded Wheat), recalls how, as a young serviceman, he helped re-

claim the body of actress Carole Lombard, killed in a 1942 airplane crash in Nevada. What he won't talk about is his age. "Just say D.J. is 39, like Jack Benny." He is no more 39 than was Brother Benny, but who cares?

Mostly, he talks about spacecraft and space people.

In a simple but concentrated way, he is almost electric in his animation describing the space machines that have flown his way. The first, back in 1950, was more a flying wing than a saucer. Since, he has spotted the more traditional flashing lights, investigated two possible landings in the area. Last year, a submarine-shaped craft hovered before him deep in the darkness of the night.

Why is Bethel so blessed with visits?

"I really don't know, but it happens. I think there's something to do with the limestone around here. There's also a possibility of

magnetic fields' attracting their curiosity."

Why don't they show themselves?

"I think maybe there's a language problem or maybe they fear we'd be hostile and that someone would try to harm them. I think they're here to study us, to investigate our planet. They're obviously great scientists. They been coming here from Mars or wherever they live for decades."

And what manner of creatures might they be, these space fliers?

"I think they're probably good people. They're probably not monsters in horns with slits for eyes and no ears, like you see in the newspapers at the supermarket. If you look at it, people tend to be good as children and good in their most developed state. These people are at least very developed. I think God would make them that way."

Vaghi has had little success with the authorities over his views and viewings.

"I've gotten some letters back, but they [the Air Force] are out of the UFO business now. I called the airport after my last sighting and talked real fast to get my message across before they cut me off. People jumped out of windows when the stock market crashed; imagine what they'd do when this is revealed.

"I think a lot of people have seen these things but are reluctant to come forward. People are afraid to face the ridicule. I'm not. My family doesn't get so involved. But they think, if that's what you live to do, go ahead. People look at me with a question mark. They wonder about what I say. I welcome that. It makes them think, pay attention. If people paid attention to things, to nature, maybe they wouldn't have time to make things sick."

And so, undaunted, Dante Vaghi continues his vigil, watching the skies over Bethel.

"History will reveal the truth. Hopefully someday, someplace on the planet Earth, they'll come to visit with us. I'd like so much to meet them. That keeps me going."

Well, what if they showed up one day and said, "D.J., let's take a ride."

"I'd probably faint and wouldn't wake up until they got me home. But why not? I've been at this for so many years. Think of what's up there. If they're really peaceful people, wouldn't that be nice?"

So, if this gentle fellow dedicates himself to the proposition that there are friendly, peaceful creatures floating around us from whom we could learn a great deal, where's the harm in that?

Besides, what if he's right? //

Can you throw light on UFO?

THE British UFO Research Association is to investigate the sighting last night of a motionless flashing object in Scunthorpe's northern skies. It was spotted just after midnight at about 15 degrees above the horizon.

Observers in Messingham said it was flashing approximately once every second and remained in the same place for around 10 minutes before slowly moving off to the east.

Today, the national secretary of BUFORA, Mr. Les Sallis, based in Hull, said he would investigate the sighting. Checks with other organisations, such as the RAF, might reveal the cause of the flashing light, but it was too early to say. A sighting over Winterton two months ago turned out to be a weather balloon.

Sighting left him shaken, eyes burning

Not everyone will believe John Long's story about the huge unidentified flying object he and his friend saw over Banksons Lake near Lawton on the evening of Aug. 1.

So far, though, all of the dozen or so people he's told about his UFO experience have taken him seriously, Long said last week.

The believers include Long's fishing buddy, Richard Jandura, whose eyes watered and burned for days after he watched the massive UFO fly low overhead, and members of the Mutual UFO Network (MUFON), who are investigating the sighting.

"It's a very credible report. Very credible," said Shirley Coyne of Flushing, director of MUFON's Michigan chapter.

What Long and Jandura claim to have seen around 10:30 p.m. that clear evening was a giant spacecraft



— about the size of Wings Stadium, Long said — with a bright light in front and three red lights blinking on each side.

As the craft moved slowly from the southeast toward the northwest about 200 to 300 feet over the lake, the white light in front suddenly flashed brilliantly and went out, Long said.

Although there were several other fishermen on the lake, apparently none of them saw the UFO because it moved with absolute silence, he said. The flash of light was beamed toward the front of craft, so it did not reflect off the water, he said.

However, Long said, he and Jandura heard a young boy on the shore yelling "What is it? What is it?" as the UFO traveled slowly across the lake for about 15 minutes. Long and the MUFON investigators are still trying to locate the boy or anyone else who saw the UFO, he said.

As the craft moved off in the direction of South Ha-

ven, Long and Jandura said they noticed a wavy pattern in the air behind it, as though some type of exhaust was being emitted.

Long, who lives in Portage and has been a supervisor at Walgreen Laboratories for 10 years, said he and Jandura had been fishing for about four hours before the sighting, but had consumed no alcohol or drugs.

Shaken by their experience, Long and Jandura immediately contacted the control tower at the Kalamazoo County Airport, but were told that nothing had been seen on radar and no reports of anything unusual

had been received.

They next notified the state police post in Paw Paw. "When I called the police, the first thing I said was 'This is not a hoax,'" Long said. "The state trooper was fantastic. He calmed us down and took the information. At the end he said he believed both of us."

Sgt. James Richardson of the state police confirmed that Long and Jandura made a report and that troopers went to the Banksons Lake area to investigate, but found nothing unusual and no other witnesses besides Long and Jandura.

"The officers that went down there, they were talking about it later, and they said he (Long) seemed quite sincere," Richardson said.

The troopers told Long to call the Federal Aviation Administration in Grand Rapids, and an FAA official gave him the phone number for the MUFON reporting service in Seattle, Wash., Long said. MUFON assigned Virginia Tilly of Stevensville to investigate the report.

Tilly and another MUFON field investigator, Dee Allan, inter-

viewed Long and Jandura about their experience, but so far have been unable to locate any other witnesses, Tilly said last week.

Still, Tilly said the sighting described by the two men "right now is being classified as an excellent report. There are at least two witnesses. There is a great deal of detailed information."

Long said his eyes watered for about two days after watching the UFO, and Jandura reported the same problem for several more days.

Jandura has since moved to Chicago and could not be reached by the Kalamazoo Gazette, but Allan interviewed him four days after the sighting and reported that "the whites of his eyes were completely pink and burning. They were very mattered and puffy. The left eye was in the worst condition with swelling and discoloration beneath the eye."

Allan told Tilly that Jandura's doctor diagnosed his problem as "pink eye" and prescribed antibiotics. However, Long said he and Jandura are convinced their eye problems were caused by the UFO.

He said they have offered to take lie-detector tests to bolster their claims.

"If we can't explain what it is,

we just have to say it's an unidentified flying object," Tilly said. "We can't very well speculate. We have to investigate and make sure before saying it's a UFO."

Walter H. Andrus of Seguin, Texas, MUFON's international director, said his organization - the world's largest UFO reporting group with about 1,500 members - receives about 2,000 reports of UFO sightings every year.

About 80 to 90 percent of those reports, "after a thorough investigation, can be explained as something mundane: satellites, planets, falling objects, planes, etc.," Andrus said.

Although the UFO described by Long and Jandura might fit the description of the U.S. military's top-secret Stealth bomber - a jet fighter said to be able to avoid radar detection - Andrus said "they certainly aren't operating those in Michigan."

Long said he, too, wondered whether the craft was some type of experimental U.S. airplane, especially since the light in front was white and the lights toward the rear were red.

"The investigator said the United States does have a lot of experimental craft," he said. "But why do it in a populated area? Why not


over the ocean or desert?"

"I didn't think it was any kind of craft to my knowledge. A Stealth bomber? No, I don't think so, just from what I know. With no sound, you realize what kind of energy it took to keep it up. And it moved very slowly.

"I'm not saying for sure what it is. It was a spacecraft, but was it ours? It could be. It could be from somewhere else.

"I think anyone well-educated would be foolish not to think there is other life besides us."

Long said he was hesitant at first to go public with his story, but the positive reaction he received from those he told about the UFO helped change his mind.

SOMETHING UP THERE

Last night (July 29) at 11:45 I looked out at the stars and saw a very bright light above the lake. I watched it flash through the trees. It was about four times the size of a star. About an hour later after it shot flashes and was very bright, it came into the clear sky. Above it was an object that hovered over it. This was at least 20 times larger. The smaller object dipped continually, always going back to the space it occupied. After an hour of this behavior they moved to the right and the larger object went to the side - a distance apart. It was steady but the smaller one still dipped. At a little after 2 a.m. when the large one went above the small one the one on top sped away to the right. The little one made dips but kept on lowering itself. A dark cloud covered it and they were both gone.

I was glad because I had watched them far too long a period.

Last year, July 7 while in my back bedroom I witnessed another UFO over the Maxwellton Braes land. This was a different shape and jerked to three sides.

About 25 years ago my husband and I, driving at night to Bethesda, MD, witnessed one in motion for hours. This one seemed to have streamers hanging.

Did anyone else witness the UFO last night? Wished my husband was still alive so he could have seen it too.

P.S. Had to take the letter out of the mailbox to add this:

At 1:05 a.m. I turned in my bed to face the lake on my left side and as I did so I saw a flashing light high in the sky over the lake towards Boynton Chapel's land. I watched it until 1:30 a.m. as it jerked all over the same place as the night before only this time it didn't have the lighted crown above it.

The sole object was much more active and flashed light above it.

There definitely is an alien object up there. Incidentally it was in the same range as the rainbow earlier.

Encounter of the blurred kind . .

A BARNESLEY man is recovering after a close encounter with a flying saucer!

Mr. John Brook fled in fright after the UFO turned a blinding white fluorescent type beam on him. Mr. Brook, of Derby Street, Barnsley, felt a tingling sensation throughout his body for the few seconds he was transfixed by the light coming from beneath the oval shaped, 80 feet wide object.

He has spoken for the first time this week about the experience

which left him ashen-faced. The UFO was hovering at a height of about 50 feet in the night sky somewhere in the direction of the Co-op Dairy in Summer Lane. The object had flashing red and purple lights on its side.

Mr. Brook, an unemployed technical illustrator, said the close en-

counter took place at about 10.50 p.m. on a recent Friday.

He told the Chronicle: "I was on my way home from the pub when I saw the object in the sky. From where I was standing, it looked as though it was spinning on its axis. Suddenly, this bright white light with a fluorescent tint shone down on me. I had to close my eyes, it was so bright.

"I felt this tingling sensation all over and through my body and the hairs on the back of my neck stood on end.

"I just turned and ran as fast as I could towards home. I know that people will suggest that either I was drunk or just another nutter but I had only drunk about three pints that night because I am unemployed and that was all I could afford."

When Mr. Brook got home, he and his wife Josephine watched the UFO from their garden before it

disappeared. Mrs. Brook said: "When John got home he was out of breath and his face was as white as a sheet. I have known him for about six years and I have never seen him so frightened."

This was the third time that Mr. Brook has had an encounter with a UFO. His first sighting was in the early 1970s and the second, which took place last year while he was with his neighbour, Mr. Richard Shirt, was reported to the Royal Air Force.

Baffling tales of mysterious devil lights

MYSTERIOUS LIGHTS that float across the night sky could be spirits of the dead.

That's the startling revelation of top investigators of the paranormal. The phenomenon, called devil light, has been observed in several states, scientists say, but they don't know why it occurs.

The most convincing evidence that the lights could be spirits comes from Richard Crowe, folklorist and investigator of paranormal phenomena.

In 1975, Crowe and a reporter from the Chicago Sun-Times visited a remote spot 11 miles outside of Kenosha, Wisconsin, where local legend has it that mobsters were brutally murdered by a rival gang, weighed down with rocks and dumped into a pond.

The eerie lights regularly appear near there.

Crowe told the EXAMINER: "They were detailed enough to be more than a trick of lights... they were apparitions. They looked like people."

He added: "According to information I have received, strange things are still happening there."

Returned

The investigator said he returned to the site with two reporters, a photographer and a woman who specialized in contacting the dead. The psychic, 19-year-old Molly Brown, made contact with the spirits, but they did not show themselves.

"She didn't know anything about what we were trying to do," Crowe recalled. "She was totally unprepared, so we were pretty satisfied with what she came up with."

The psychic confirmed that the spirits were, indeed, mobsters. She named members of the gang and pointed out the

cottage hideout where they were ruthlessly slaughtered.

Incredibly, two U.S. presidents saw the strange lights at separate locations, historians say.

Presidents

President Dwight D. Eisenhower reportedly saw them near his retreat in Watersmeet, Michigan, and President Grover Cleveland saw them during the summer of 1889 near Maco, North Carolina.

Some scientists believe devil lights near Marfa, Texas, are caused by so-called "swamp gas" — methane gas escaping from the ground — while others insist the lights are caused by phosphorescent minerals.

The explanations are easily disproved, critics say. They claim the Marfa lights could not be caused by swamp gas or phosphorescent minerals because tests by geologists indicate neither are present.

Headlights

Astronomer Eric Silverberg believes that the Marfa lights may be caused by automobile headlights carried over great distances by atmospheric tunneling. The problem is, devil lights were first reported back in 1883, well before cars were

Strange lights may be a prank



Claire, aged 15, said she did not believe her friend at first until she too heard the strange noise and saw the lights.


"There was a deep humming noise like nothing I have heard before," she said.

Manchester Airport, who monitor airspace around Oldham, said nothing unusual was reported on that night.



"Our first goal will be to establish radio contact with the inhabitants," he said. "We hope they will respond in some way. After that we will begin diving. What we find could change all human history."

Dr. Brulet reported the discovery of the maps and documents in scientific journals. But he has guarded the contents jealously "because this is not a matter for scientific debate."

The world-renowned researcher, Dr. Jean-Claude Brulet, said ancient maps found at an undisclosed archaeological dig last July place the Lost Continent about 2,500 miles west of Peru.

Documents discovered at the site one month later suggest that the highly-evolved humans who inhabited Atlantis adapted their cities and themselves to undersea life before the last empire sank.

They were so highly developed that it is inconceivable to think that they have since perished," said Dr. Brulet.

After 80,000 UFO sightings from around the world — experts face the startling truth

A fleet of alien starships is invading Earth, streaking through the skies over places as far apart as Brazil and California in what appears to be a major spy mission from outer space.

The extra-terrestrial raid is so remarkable that for the first time ever, top government officials have publicly reported a brush with alien craft, even ordering a special commission to delve into the frightening encounter.

The pulsating starships — whose speed exceeds 1,350 m.p.h. — were spotted and captured on film over central Brazil on May 19 and seen again near Petaluma, Calif., on May 22.

The Brazilian Air Force scrambled five heavily armed fighter planes to intercept the starships, but pilots were unable to catch the elusive mystery craft.

"It was not a star, it couldn't have been another plane," said one of the pilots, Brazilian Air Force Lt. Kleber Caldas Marinho, 25. "It couldn't be anything now existing.

"It was green, red and white, mostly white. I got to within 12 miles of it before I ran out of fuel. I've flown for years and never seen anything like this."

Only 53 hours later in the skies over California, startled witnesses once again glimpsed the alien aircraft and telephone lines to state police were clogged with reports of the sightings.

"The fact is, aliens are here and they have been here for quite a while now," said nuclear physicist Stanton Friedman, a UFO expert who has studied encounters with starships for almost a decade. "The evidence is overwhelming — recent sightings are simply more proof.

"Since records of UFO sightings have been kept, there have been more than 80,000 sightings around the world from about 140 countries. Many show the same pattern. They are consistent.

These are descriptions of manufactured — not natural — phenomena that are not being made on Earth."

Brazilian officials have been unusually forthright in public

statements over their recent brush with the strange starships.

The story they tell is an eerie account right out of a science fiction movie.

The glowing alien craft were

first spotted by a high-ranking government official as he flew into Sao Paulo. The official, Ozires Silva, reported the phenomena to the air force immediately.

"What I saw didn't look like

the classic flying disc I have seen on television or in magazines," he said later. "They didn't have the form of either a disc or a plate.

"What I saw were more than a dozen colored, luminous

points. It was unearthly, bizarre. I was spellbound!"

Three Mirage F-103 jets and two F-5E fighters scrambled after the UFOs, armed with deadly Sidewinder and Matra 520 missiles. With lights out

They tracked the starships — but although they reached extreme altitudes and speeds, they could not catch them. Pilots of the Mirage jets said the UFO moved in a zigzag fashion at speeds of 3,350 m.p.h. or more. One of the three Mirages got to within two miles of the bizarre craft, but although the starship was visible on his on-board radar screen, he could not find the UFO with his naked eye.

When the air force pilots returned to base, they reported their strange encounter to higher-ups and in an unprecedented news conference the Minister of Aeronautics permitted them to tell their stories to the press. He then established an official commission to investigate the sightings.

Two days after the Brazilians discovered the extra-terrestrial visitors, Californians were shocked by the sight of starships streaking across their skies.

"I looked up and saw several lights hovering in the sky," said one witness, Hue Hart of Petaluma. "I stared at them and they moved rapidly several hundred yards, hovering again, and took off again to the east. We were kind of joking around about it but then started to think and I got scared."

The alien incursion was spotted by a

California Highway Patrol trooper, who reported sighting a flying object crossing the sky at a high rate of speed.

Another eyewitness, radio news director Arlette Cohen, told *The NEWS*: "I saw the UFO on my way to work. I

saw two white lights like the headlights of a car up in the sky. I thought it was a plane about to land.

"It crossed over the freeway, then hovered behind the hills at a dead stop. I thought, 'That's not a plane.' It ducked behind the hills, then rose again and I saw small green lights at the back.

"It was eerie. It wasn't anything I'd ever seen before — something completely unknown."

Starship's SOS

In one of the most super-secret projects in history, a joint Soviet-American scientific team is studying a mysterious radio signal from outer space — a distress call sent from a planet or starship 50,000 years ago.

"This is a stunning breakthrough. Our computers have actually translated a major portion of the radio signal," said one U.S. astronomer, who discussed the research with a French freelance news service on the condition he not be identified.

Portions of the amazing

message were put together in a reasonably accurate form by the team in April, but have not been published.

"Very simply, from a mathematical translation, we can assume this was an ancient spacecraft, or even a planet.

"It was looking for some kind of beacon, a signal, to guide them out

of danger. This whole thing is mind-boggling," said the astronomer.

"My Soviet counterparts have done the majority of computer

translation and we have been working night and day to pinpoint the source of the signal.

"Our initial calculations have shown, and we may be proven very wrong later, that the signal was sent at least 50,000 years ago, maybe longer.

"My colleagues feel we must have more conclusive analysis of the message before we publish a report.

"I disagree.

"Both our governments are briefed on our progress constantly. I feel the whole story should be made public now.

"It is conclusive proof, to me, that mankind is not alone. I only wish that I could go into further detail.

"There is much more to this story and more of the signal to be translated.


"But I will say this, when this goes public, it will have one of the greatest effects on the human race in history.

"It could even bring about world peace."

Both U.S. and Soviet government spokesmen refused to confirm or deny that scientific research into an alien message was taking place.

The Soviet spokesman, however, said that "Our government is constantly seeking new information from space, and that includes scanning for radio signals of any kind.
