FILM DIRECTOR & WIFE SPOT UFO

From: *SOUTH BUCKS STAR*, High Wycombe, England, 1 Dec. 1995

Mel Donovan and his wife Julia had returned to their home in Moor Common, Lane End, when they saw a bizarre triangle of light composed of three golden balls. Mel grabbed his camera and recorded the scene, but one had disappeared.

He said: "It could have been three airplanes, but I have yet to see three airplanes able to stay still in the sky and emit such a bright light. I am not saying they were aliens, I just don't know what they were."

The film director and his wife witnessed the unexplained phenomena on Saturday night. They parked their car and walked around the side of the house where they were confronted with the three UFOs glowing in a triangle formation over Marlow. Julia took the children into the house while Mel watched for a while and then rushed to get his video camera.

The video film shows two lights, one of which moves closer towards the other. One stays bright while the other dances towards it and then fades away.

Dick Thurbin, of the British Airways control tower at Wycombe Air Park, Booker, said there were no unusual aircraft there that night. He said the airport runway had closed before 6 pm.

YELLOW TRIANGULAR-SHAPED OBJECT SPOTTED

Several people reported seeing an unidentified flying object hovering above the town between 2:30 and 3 a.m. on Saturday morning. Revelers and staff leaving Kristies Nightclub claim to have seen a large, yellow triangular-shaped object glowing in the sky for about 30 minutes.

This was confirmed by three men working the night shift at Citylink Parcels depot, on Quarry Hill Industrial Estate, about two miles away.

Kristies boss Chris Hallam said: "Several club goers saw it and so did my assistant manager. It was about 2:30 a.m. when they saw a yellow triangle hovering in the sky."

The manager of Citylink confirmed that three of his employees were involved in the alleged sighting, but he refused to speak about the incident.

RAF COVER UP?

A delegate attending the Town and House Planning conference in Harrogate reported a UFO

sighting to police on Monday night. The man, who was walking up Kings road to his hotel at just before 8:30 p.m., claimed he saw a cigar-shaped object surrounded by hundreds of little dots of lights moving across the sky.

A spokesman for RAF Lemming said nothing unusual was spotted on their radar on Monday night.

Four nights later dozens of people spotted a similar object. They described it as being about 150 feet long and glowing. "It was white with a cloudy edge and lights underneath." Police Sergeant Ken Holmes, of Derby Police, said: "What people saw was almost certainly an airship. It came from Alton Towers across the north of Derby and down towards the south-east. It was visible between 9:30 and 11 p.m."

Some UFO investigators believe the earlier sighting was also caused by the airship. If so, why was the RAF not able to spot an airship on their radar? Are they so accustomed to covering up UFO sightings that they were careless about the airship sighting?

A review of the airship's flight log would verify or reject the police contention that the UFO sightings were caused by the airship. However, confirmation of that fact could prove to be very embarrassing to the RAF.

FANTASTIC LIGHTS IN THE SKY

Motorist Nick Coleman was tracked by a mysterious light on a road near Alysham last Friday. The same night, a motorist called Great Yarmouth police after seeing a spinning disc in the sky over Freethorpe.

And then on Saturday, Glenn Webster from Mile Cross showed his amazing film of a weird biscuit shaped object near his house, recorded on Friday night. His minute of cam corder footage has been sent off to UFO experts who admit to being baffled by the zig-zagging, quick-moving flying disc.

Security engineer James Mason was driving back from King's Lynn at about 4:50 p.m. on the previous Friday when a blue light appeared in his rear view mirror as he passed through Bawdeswell, near Dereham. His car lights went off and on again as the object flew overhead, about 100 feet in the air. He said: "It wasn't flashing, it was spinning. It looked like a Catherine Wheel." He was so frightened that he turned back to see the police.

BRITISH SIGHTINGS CONTINUE

Buckingham Hospital dentist Antonio Peluso, saw a 'silvery ball' in the sky over the A422 near Thornton on Thursday, October 5, at 8:20 a.m.

On Monday, last week, the same night as the Deanshanger sighting, a young woman saw a glowing orange and red light as she looked across the countryside towards Maids Moreton from her bedroom window at Stowe. "It moved gradually up and to the side and then back to its original position. It was there for 15 to 20 minutes. I have never seen it before," she said.

A gentle, oval soft light hovered over a Twyford woman as she searched for her dog in the pitch black night about a month ago. "There was no sound. It was completely quiet everywhere. It could not have been a light aircraft or a helicopter. Sometimes it moved quickly, sometimes slowly."

James Goff, his wife Valerie and father-in-law Ted Williams followed bright, spinning lights with a down-ward beam from Croughton, through Finmere and Tingewick into Buckingham and out onto the A422 towards Leekhampstead on the night of Saturday, August 26. "It was amazing, quite incredible and really quite spine-chilling," said Mr. Goff.

Howard Barrie of Leeson Road, Towcester, saw the two bright lights hovering in the sky along the road from Roade to Northampton at about 10:30 p.m. last Monday. At first he thought it was a plane or helicopter but when he wound down his window there was no noise. "It was the strangest thing. I just couldn't focus on what it was, but I had never seen anything like it before," he said.

IRISH CATTLE MUTILATION BLAMED ON ALIENS

A brutally mutilated cow, said to have been found near the border, has been described as the Province's first animal casualty of extra-terrestrial beings bent on culling humans. Miles Johnston, a member of Quest International which investigates UFO sightings and abductions, claimed that the carved-up carcass was discovered six weeks ago near Camlough, Bessbrook Co Armagh.

He said that it was a sign that Ulster was under threat from unidentified life forms which had been wreaking havoc among livestock across the British Isles and America.

Mr. Johnston said that the animal was reported to him by a farmer who wants to remain anonymous.

"This cow has all the hallmarks of alien mutilation. It had been drained of blood, the flesh had been removed from its head and its vital organs had been removed. The organs were sucked out through a clean incision made by some hi-tech laser device. This has happened to thousands of animals in the U.S. but it's the first reported case in Northern Ireland."

Mr. Johnston was in Province investigating the incident and claimed that witnesses had told of a large, black, silent helicopter and a saucer-type flying machine in the area at the time of the mutilation.

"Cattle are similar in physiology to humans and the aliens are using cattle to develop diseases which they can use to cull human beings."

UFO CAPITAL OF BRITAIN

9,000 RESIDENTS...2,000 SIGHTINGS

In the past three years more than 2,000 sightings of unidentified flying objects have been reported over Bonnybridge, which lies halfway between Glasgow and Edinburgh.

American nuclear physicist Stanton Friedman said: "There are several hot spots for UFO sightings like Bonnybridge around the world. Maybe they form a part of a group of places being intensively studied. To an alien life form one place may be as good as any other to take samples."

Billy Buchanan, Bonnybridge's local councillor, said: There is something strange going on in this place. There are level-headed people I have known all my life telling me they have been abducted by aliens."

Billy, 47, began campaigning for an official investigation after he too saw strange lights. He said: "Hardly a day goes by without someone contacting me about a sighting. These are not cranks but people whose opinion I respect. A lot of people are frustrated that they can't get anyone to listen to them. I urge them to go to the police, that's the only way we are going to get any investigation."

Isa Sloggett and her two children were walking near their home when they saw a spacecraft that chased them. She said: "We saw this circular craft about the size of a house with two blinding lights. It landed in the moorland. I noticed two smaller craft above the first one. Then we heard the sound of a door opening. That is when we got scared and ran back along the road. One of the craft in the sky followed us. Eventually, it gave up, but we didn't stop until we got home."
