

VISIBLE AT ST. KILDA.

"H.L." (St. Kilda) says that the star (Venus) mentioned by Leonard Hindle, of Tallangatta, as being visible at midday, close to the moon, was also clearly seen in St. Kilda for the whole afternoon, though the sun was shining brightly all the time. Several people noticed the unusual sight, though it was apparently not seen from the Observatory, and Mr. Baracchi's explanation in "The Argus" shows that it was not an unusual occurrence. Mr. J. H. Ingham, of Davies-street, Elsternwick, saw Venus at 2 p.m. on Saturday, and 12 noon on Sunday.
