BOMB IN BROKEN HILL

A sensation was created on Saturday night in Broken Hill when at about 11.30 the sound of an explosion was heard in Oxide Street. A contingent of police and a large crowd were quickly on the scene. It was found that a bomb had been thrown on Mr Boulou's shop, blowing a large hole in the roof knocking down the ceiling and breaking rafters. There was no sign of the bomb casing or fuse. The motive for the action is not known to the police who are enquiring into the occurrence. Boulou is offering £20 for the conviction of the offender.
