

STRANGE OBJECT IN SKY.

Observations at Manjimup.

MANJIMUP, Oct. 20.—A strange object was seen in the sky about 4.45 a.m. yesterday by Mr. Andrew Muir, of Fernbank, near Manjimup. The object was shaped like a banjo case, the head appearing larger than the moon and the tail short and rounded at the end. In spite of the daylight it was luminous.

The object was first seen a little west of south and about ten degrees above the horizon, and, unlike a meteor, it moved slowly eastwards and downwards until lost to sight. It was witnessed also by Mrs. Charles Reeve from a point several miles from where Mr. Muir stood to observe it.
