

'FLYING SAUCER'
REPORTS IN U.S.

Wild Tales From 39 States

NEW YORK, Monday.—
"Flying Saucers," the
mysterious things hurtling
across the skies of Ame-
rica, have now been re-
ported from 39 States
stretching from the west to
the east coasts.

The new reports are only
equalled in number by the variety
of theories to account for the
saucers.

In New Jersey people reported
them "thick as mosquitoes." and

them "thick as mosquitoes," and in Glen Falls, New York County, a man said he saw one the size of a car headlight with red fire in front, and blue fire in the rear.

In Essex Fells, New Jersey, Mrs. Harold Doner said, "I saw some like beautiful balls of fire come quite close, very quietly."

"Russian Planes"

The size of the reported saucers ranged from a five-roomed bungalow to a baseball.

The Hearst newspapers, America's most strident trumpet against the Red menace, today came out with a story that the saucers were Russian atom-powered planes, with a speed greater than sound.

They said they received the details in letter from a man who said he was given the information by an officer off a Russian tanker in Los Angeles.

"Principle Differs"

The planes are reputed to be "18 in. thick, with a kidney-shaped outline. The pilot lies flat on his stomach, and is artificially cooled against heat from friction.

"The outer surface of the plane is highly polished. Both upper and lower surfaces are convex, like a giant lens, and the lifting force is an entirely different principle discovered about a decade

principle discovered about a decade ago.

"Energy is required only for climbing. No energy is required when the plane is travelling along the earth's gravitational contour lines."
