

'Saucers' In Infinite Variety

NEW YORK, Wednesday.—*Latest "flying saucer" reports say the objects range from paper plates to circular saws.*

They embrace empty vegetable cans, ash trays, and weather balloons, and are "dropping down" all over America.

Thousands more people, including 100 naval personnel at Pearl Harbor, have reported airborne variations of the saucers.

Air Force headquarters have soundly rebuked Colonel William Blanchard, base commander at Roswell, New Mexico, for issuing the report that a flying saucer had landed there.

The Air Force explained it was a weather balloon, but the man who saw the object declared it was completely different.

Colonel Blanchard is reported to have "gone on leave."

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American newspapers are carrying reports from all parts of the world of flying discs, and the New York "Sun" supports, in a sub-leader, Professor Cotton's Sydney experiment to indicate that they are a condition of the eye.

Imaginative artists are outdoing each other in depicting flying saucers, complete with jet units and pilots' cabins, while photographs have been published of what obviously are phonograph records spinning through the air.—
