

They're Seeing Flying Tadpoles Now

LONDON, Sunday. — Captain Norman Waugh, an air ferry pilot who reported having seen a "flying saucer" over the Bay of Biscay on Friday, gave the Daily Express correspondent at Gibraltar today this story about it.

"I was flying a Viking to Argentina and was at, roughly, 8000ft. at 10 a.m., when I saw a smudge on the horizon. I told the crew and we all watched keenly.

"We were at first worried by the approaching object. It was travelling at lightning speed, and appeared to take the shape of a grey tadpole.

"Within 15 or 20 seconds it had passed to starboard about six miles off, and soon vanished, leaving a vapor trail which was visible for some time. We were travelling at 200 m.p.h. and estimate that the object was going at about 600 m.p.h. at an altitude of about 15,000ft.

"The crew and myself came to the conclusion that it could only have been a flying saucer. It did not interfere with our radio. My radio officer told the air control station at Gloucester about it.

"I managed to get a snap of it, but doubt if it will turn out well."
