

# FLYING SAUCERS SEEN IN UNITED STATES

WASHINGTON, Monday.

The "flying-saucer" era has returned to the United States. Two civil aeronautics administration employees and a farmer report having seen a silvery moon-sized object floating through the air over Yakima, Washington, on two occasions yesterday, while in Portland, Oregon, a resident reported a "big round bright object going west."

At Atlanta, Georgia, two pilots who claimed on Saturday they saw a huge flame-shooting "Speed Gordon" type of sky monster, while flying over Alabama, stoutly maintained that it was a "man-made gadget."

They described it as a wingless affair with a circumference four times that of a Super Fortress fuselage. It was jet-propelled and had two rows of windows.

The pilots are taking cameras with them when flying the same route this week in case the mystery monster appears.

The three Yakima men say they first saw the moon-sized object float over the city just after midday yesterday and again at 4 p.m.

"It could not have been a weather balloon because it was flying low and appeared to have flashing lights like a fog light," they said.

The Portland resident said the object was going west when it suddenly veered south-west "in an awful hurry." It bore no resemblance to an aircraft and was roundish like a disc.

Two other airline crews in the Southern United States report seeing "streaks of light" during Friday night near Blackstone, Virginia, and Washington, D.C., respectively.

"The times indicate that all three crews may have seen the same thing," said one of the pilots.

Hundreds of people at Yakima telephoned the Civil Aeronautics Administration saying they had seen a "moon-sized" blob wheeling across the sky above the city.

R. Dewitt Millet, author of "Forgotten Mysteries," said the strange aircraft, reported of Alabama, might have been space ships from another planet.
