

TELEGRAMS IN BRIEF

SYDNEY, Monray: Army authorities issued a warning tonight against a possible "flying saucer" scare tomorrow.

The army will release about 100 meteorological balloons tomorrow and Sydney people are asked not to panic into a belief that they may be "flying saucers."

SYDNEY, Monday: The haulage of coal from about 18 mines on northern coalfields might be brought to a standstill by a strike of South Maitland railway salaried officers tomorrow night. The men are objecting to the appointment of a new station master at Cessnock.

At a compulsory conference today, Mr. Justice Webb, of the State Industrial Commission, ordered the union to call off the strike. He said the matter was sub judice and the Commission would not inquire into the appointment at this stage.
