

Other Planet Is Watching Us, Says Magazine

NEW YORK, Dec. 27 (A.A.P.).—An article in the American magazine "True" makes the sensational claim that the so-called "flying saucers" are space vehicles from another planet.

The article is signed by Donald Keyhoe, former information chief of the aeronautics branch of the United States Department of Commerce.

He says, "for the last 175 years the earth has been under systematic close-range examination by living, intelligent observers from another planet.

"The intensity of this observation, and the frequency of visits to the earth's atmosphere whereby it is being conducted, have increased markedly in the last two years."

He adds that United States Army Air Force investigators charged with solving the mystery "are receiving evaluating" reports of sighted flying discs at a rate of 12 a month.

The U.S. Air Force to-day discounted the magazine's claim. It said: "Air Force studies of flying saucers lend no support to the view that they come from another planet."
