

# Mr DIMMICK DESCRIBES A "FLYING SAUCER"

Never heard of it',  
says Authority, but—

LOS ANGELES,  
Thursday. — Mr Ray  
Dimmick, a Los Angeles  
businessman, told re-  
porters today that he  
saw an ultra-stream-  
lined flying saucer last  
week.

It had been wrecked on  
a mountainside in Mexico.

He added that he had been  
told that a man 23 inches  
tall died in the crash, and  
that the body had been em-  
balmed for scientific study.

## "46ft. ACROSS"

Mr Dimmick said the craft  
crashed about three months  
ago. He had been taken to  
the scene by business asso-  
ciates.

"The saucer was powered  
by two motors," he con-  
tinued. "It was about 46ft.  
across, and built of a strange  
material resembling alu-  
minium."

Mr Dimmick said senior  
Mexican officials believed  
that the machine came from

officials believed  
that the machine came from  
some other planet. Leading  
U.S. military officials had in-  
spected the craft.

Associated Press says there  
is no confirmation of Mr  
Dimmick's story in Mexico,  
and the Air Force in Wash-  
ington said it had not heard  
of it.

## STANDS GROUND

Mr Dimmick, when re-  
minded that the Air Force  
announced in December that  
it was dropping its investi-  
gation of flying saucers be-  
cause of the preponderance  
of evidence that they did not  
exist, said:

"I am big enough to take  
the consequences of what I  
have said, and stand my  
ground.

"I think the Government  
ought to make its position  
clear. If it does not want  
to disclose these things for  
security reasons why not say  
so?"
