

Man's Story Of Flying Saucer

LOS ANGELES, Fri.—Los Angeles businessman, Mr. Ray Dimmick told reporters here that he saw a streamlined flying saucer last week which had been wrecked on a mountainside in Mexico.

Then he added that he had been told that a man 23 inches tall died in a crash. That the body had been embalmed for scientific study and that high Mexican officials believed the

machine came from some other planet.

According to Dimmick the craft crashed about three months ago. He said he had been taken to the scene by business associates.

"The saucer was powered by two motors," he added.

"It was about 46 feet in diameter and built of a strange material resembling aluminium." There is no confirmation of the story.

But Dimmick, said: "I am big enough to take the consequences

of what I have said, and stand my ground."
