

Claims Midget Died In Flying Saucer Crash

LOS ANGELES (A.A.P.).—Ray Dimmick, a Los Angeles businessman, told reporters on Thursday that he saw an ultra-streamlined flying-saucer last week which had been wrecked on a mountain side in Mexico.

HE had been told that a man 23in. tall died in the crash and that the body had been embalmed for scientific study.

Dimmick said the craft crashed three months ago. He had been taken to the scene by business associates.

"The Saucer was powered by two motors. It was about 46ft. in diameter and built of a strange material resembling aluminium," Dimmick added.

High Mexican officials believed the machine came from some other planet. Leading United States military officials had viewed the craft.

The Associated Press said Dimmick later changed his story.

He said he saw only a strip of

metal which business associates told him came from a space ship.

He was told the wreckage was on a mountainside in Mexico and that leading U.S. military officials had viewed it, also that a man 23in. tall was killed in the crash, which occurred three months ago and that the body had

months ago and that the body had been embalmed for scientific study.

Dimmick added that his business associates described the craft as 46ft. in diameter, built of a metal resembling aluminium, but much harder and powered by two motors.

Dimmick said he would furnish the names of his business associates "if requested by the proper authorities."

The Mexico City correspondent of Reuter says the Government on Thursday put an end to the flying saucers scare by announcing that there is no real basis for the reports that saucers have been flying over Mexico.

Flying saucers have been reported over Chihuahua airport, also Durango City. The alleged flying saucer over Durango it was reported, remained for two hours. The versions of those who claimed to have seen it all differed.

An officer who reported the fly-

ing saucer over Chihuahua airport now said he believed that what he saw was the planet Venus.
