

Alleges Flying Saucer Wreck In Mexico From Another Planet

A Los Angeles business man, Ray Dimmick, told reporters that he saw an ultra-streamlined flying saucer recently which had been wrecked on a mountain-side in Mexico. He added that he had been told that a man 23 inches tall died in the crash, that the body had been embalmed for scientific study and that high Mexican officials believed the machine came from some other planet.

According to Dimmick, the craft crashed about three months ago.

He said he had been taken to the scene by business associates.

"The saucer was powered by two motors," he added. "It was about 46 feet in diameter and built of a strange material resembling aluminum."

Dimmick said that leading U.S. military officials had viewed the craft but Associated Press said there was no confirmation of Dimmick's account in Mexico, and the Air Force in Washington said it had not heard of it.

"I am big enough to take the consequences of what I have said and stand my ground," Dimmick said. "I think the Government ought to make its position clear. If it does not want to disclose these things for security reasons why not say so?"
